5.2	After the circulation of nationally accepted Goals and Targets by NITI Aayog, the statistics officers in Ministry/Departments are required to closely work with the respective programme officers in their Ministries/Departments to identify appropriate national indicators for each target along with source(s) of data, periodicity, disaggregation level and method of data collection.  [Action: Central Ministries]	The national indicators of SDGs are still under finalization. After finalization of the indicators, details will be shared.
5.3	Ministries while identifying indicators on SDGs should ensure relevancy of indicators with targets, feasibility with official data and estimation, measurability in terms of statistical measurement, accessibility and transparency. Data for monitoring the SDGs are to be produced through the Official Statistics Systems.  [Action: Central Ministries]	
5.4	In View of overlapping between the data for many goals and targets, there is a need for close coordination between ministries responsible for different targets. This will enable reduction in duplication and avoid generation of contradictory trends and results.  [Action: Central Ministries]	

5.5	Central Statistics Office and the State DESs to work together towards making available reliable and cross nationally comparable data on SDG indicators and in determining the priorities to strengthen their capacities towards bridging the data gaps.  [Action: CSO(SSD), States/UTs]	<b>SSD</b> has forwarded a list of proposed Global indicators and list of draft national indicators to State DES to guide them in formulation of indicators relevant to State and to help in producing reliable and cross nationally comparable data on SDG indicators. Issue of capacity development to bridge data gaps will be addressed after the finalization of indicators.
5.6	The state governments/state DESs have also to develop a monitoring mechanism of SDGs for the States and bring out state-wise progress reports. The Workshop was attended by State DES's, State Planning Departments and Central Ministries. This consultation process will continue.
5.8	State DESs have a major role to play in collecting data for monitoring the SDGs at the sub-national level. Hence, a Cell for SDGs may be set up in the DES for this purpose.  [Action: States/UTs]	The creation of a dedicated cell is under active consideration of allthe States/UTs.

6.2.1	The SOSU of ISI, in collaboration with MOSPI may undertake research in methodological issues towards improvement of official statistical procedures.  [Action: CSO(CAP), ISI]	SOSU, ISI, has identified following research activities to be undertaken in collaboration with CSO and NSSO:  1. Improvement in NSS survey methods 2. Analysis of unit level data from household surveys, methodological improvement in construction of indices such as price and production indices, poverty estimates and other development indices 3. Reconciliation of comparable statistics from different official sources.  On above, ISI has proposed to organize a one-day workshop of officers engaged in the actual operations, administration and management of official statistical systems (senior officials from CSO and NSSO) in ISI, Kolkata.MoSPI would be taking the views of concerned divisions shortly, and would proceed further.
