Monthly Summary for the month of May 2017

1. On the Statistics side, we released monthly Index of Industrial Production (IIP), the Consumer Price Index (CPI) and the estimates of Gross Domestic Product (GDP) for Q4 of 2016-17. The salient features of these are:

- The new Series of All India of Index of Industrial Production (IIP) with base year 2011-12 was released through a Press Conference held at National Media Centre on 12th May 2017.
- As per the Quick Estimates (QE) of Index of Industrial Production (IIP) with revised base year 2011-12 the general index for the month of March 2017 stood at 131.5, which is 2.7% higher as compared to the level in the corresponding month of previous year.
- The General Consumer Price Indices (CPI) for the month of **April 2017** (provisional) for Rural, Urban and Combined showed an annual inflation rate of 3.02%, 3.03% and 2.99% respectively. The Consumer Food Price Indices (CFPI) for the month of **April 2017** (provisional) for Rural, Urban and Combined showed an annual inflation rate of 0.69%, 0.46% and 0.61% respectively.
- GDP at current prices in the year 2016-17 is estimated at ₹ 151.84 lakh crore, showing a growth of 11.0% over the estimate of GDP for the year 2015-16 of ₹ 136.82 lakh crore.
- The GNI at current prices is estimated at ₹ 149.94 lakh crore during 2016-17, as compared to ₹ 135.22 lakh crore during 2015-16, showing a rise of 10.9 %.
- The per capita income at current prices during 2016-17 is estimated to have attained a level of ₹ 103219 as compared to the estimate for the year 2015-16 of ₹ 94130, showing a rise of 9.7%.
Real GDP or GDP at constant (2011-12) prices for the year 2016-17 is estimated at ₹ 121.90 lakh crore, showing a growth of 7.1 % over the year 2015-16 of ₹ 113.81 lakh crore.
- The Gross National Income (GNI) at 2011-12 prices is estimated at ₹ 120.35 lakh crore during 2016-17, as against the previous year's estimate of ₹ 112.46 lakh crore. In terms of growth rates, the gross national income is estimated to have risen by 7.0% during 2016-17, in comparison to the growth of 8.0% in 2015-16.
- The per capita income in real terms (at 2011-12 prices) during 2016-17 is likely to attain a level of ₹ 82,269 as compared to ₹ 77,803 for the year 2015-16. The growth rate in per capita income is estimated at 5.7% during 2016-17, as against 6.8 % in the previous year.
- GDP at current prices in Q4 of 2016-17 is estimated at ₹ 41.51 lakh crore, as against ₹ 36.91 lakh crore in Q4 of 2015-16, showing a growth of 12.5 %.
- GDP at constant (2011-12) prices in Q4 of 2016-17 is estimated at ₹ 32.28 lakh crore, as against ₹ 30.42 lakh crore in Q4 of 2015-16, showing a growth of 6.1%.

2. Our monitoring of the infrastructure sector highlighted the following:

As per the latest Flash Report for the ongoing Central Sector Projects costing ₹ 150 crore and above of March 2017, there are **1231** such ongoing projects, out of which **322** have cost overruns, with average cost overrun being **82.31%** of original cost, which is a matter of concern. Also, **327** projects (**26.56%** of total ongoing projects) are delayed. During March 2017, **2** Projects (2 projects in Petroleum sector) have reported completion. **70** projects have reported additional delays vis-à-vis the date of completion reported in the previous month.

3. Under MPLADS, ₹ **271** crore have been released during the Month of **May 2017** and the total fund released during the financial year 2017-18 **up to 31st May 2017** is ₹ **431 crore**.

4. Status report on Minimum Government, Maximum Governance:

A new integrated MPLADS website, developed on state-of-the-art Microsoft technology platform with built in security features is in operation. This new website provides single point of reference for all stake holders including Members of Parliament and District Authorities. All MPLADS funds releases are being made only through PFMS & information about release of funds is uploaded on the website. The Ministry is regularly organizing training programme for the district officials on the new website.
