Subject: Amendments to Indian Statistical Institute Act, 1959(No. 57 of 1959).

The Indian Statistical Institute (ISI) is an autonomous institute under the Ministry of

Statistics and Programme Implementation. ISI is an institute of national importance declared

as such as per the provisions of ISI Act, 1959(No. 57 of 1959). The Section 4 of the ISI Act,

1959 provides for ISI to grant degrees and diplomas in certain subject areas.

2. To broaden the purview of the existing provisions of the ISI Act, 1959 (Section 4), the

Ministry is considering a proposal for bringing out certain amendments to ISI Act, 1959. A

Proposal for bringing out amendments to Section 4 of the ISI Act, 1959

The Indian Statistical Institute (ISI) is an autonomous institution under the Ministry of Statistics and Programme Implementation (MoSPI) and is devoted to the research, teaching in Statistics and its applications in related subjects, natural sciences and social sciences.

2. The institute gained the status of an Institution of National Importance through Indian Statistical Institute Act, 1959. The Section 4 of the ISI Act, 1959 empowers ISI, *inter-alia*, to grant degrees and diplomas in statistics, mathematics, quantitative economics, computer science and such other subjects related to statistics. It is now proposed to amendment the section 4 of the Act for making provisions that the ISI could award degrees and diplomas in subjects pertaining to natural and social sciences, in addition to the existing provisions. The details are stated in the following table.

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have gained prominence in the changing global scenario and evolving technological advancements in the field of education. Accordingly, the approach of education needs to be geared up to meet the needs of time for going towards multi-disciplinary system. This is also in consonance with the provisions of National Education Policy 2019.

In view of the above and also in order to keep pace with the fast changing education landscape in the changing global scenario, it is proposed to amend Section 4 of ISI Act so as to enable ISI to grant degrees in various multi-disciplinary subjects including in natural/social sciences.
