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Introduction

1.1 Twenty Point Programme - 2006

1.1.1 Alleviation of poverty and improving the quality of life of the people, especially of those who are below the poverty line, has been the prime objective of planned development in the country. Over the years, the meaning of economic development has shifted from growth in per capita income to the expansion of opportunities. The government, through various programmes/schemes, is helping its citizens to expand their capabilities. In order to achieve these objectives, package of programmes comprising schemes relating to Poverty Alleviation, Employment Generation, Education, Health, etc., called the Twenty Point Programme (TPP), has been in operation since 1975. In view of the changing scenario of the country over the years, the programme has been restructured thrice - in 1982, 1986 and 2006. The present programme now called Twenty Point Programme-2006 (TPP-2006) is in operation since April 2007.

1.1.2 TPP-2006 has various points/items for the benefit of both the rural and urban people, taking cadre of all the requirements of the deprived and adversely affected population. TPP-2006 has 20 Points covering 65 items. These 65 items coincide with various programmes and schemes of the government which are administered by the Central Nodal Ministries/Departments and by and large are implemented through the State Governments/UT Administrations. The Ministry of Statistics & Programme Implementation has been given the responsibility of monitoring all the 65 items, of which some are reported on quarterly basis, and the others on annual basis. The details of 20 Points covering 65 items, the parameters under these 65 items, names of the nodal agencies and the frequency of reporting are available in *Annexure-1*.

1.2 Monitoring Mechanism

1.2.1 In order to effectively monitor the Twenty Point Programme, this Ministry has developed a Management Information System (MIS). The Management Information System (MIS) consists of a Quarterly Progress Report (QPR) and an Annual Report. The Quarterly Progress Report (QPR) covers monitoring of achievements in respect of the 9 crucial items (containing 14 parameters) against pre-set physical targets, whereas the Annual Report presents an analytical review of the performance of all the 65 items under the programme. The sources of information for the Annual Report are the Central Nodal Ministries and the State/UT Governments.

1.2.2 All the States and the Union Territories of the country have a monitoring/evaluation unit under a nodal Department, which has been entrusted with the responsibility of monitoring all schemes/items covered under the Twenty Point Programme. The units have functionaries at block and district levels, to monitor and collect information for the different schemes of the Twenty Point Programme.

1.2.3 Besides the monitoring done at the state level, individual scheme/ programme covered under TPP-2006 are also monitored by the Central Nodal Ministries concerned. The charter of this Ministry is to monitor the TPP-2006 as a whole in a holistic manner with a view to enhance its effectiveness.

4.2 Marketing and Infrastructural Support to Farmers: There is a need to enhance private sector investment in development of post-harvest marketing infrastructure for which various schemes are also implemented.

4.2.1 Agricultural Marketing Infrastructure (AMI): (Note: The erstwhile two schemes viz. (i) Grameen Bhandaran Yojana (GBY) implemented since 01.04.2001, and (ii) Scheme for Strengthening/Development of Agricultural Marketing Infrastructure, Grading & Standardization (AMIGS) implemented since 20.10.2004 have been subsumed into one scheme known as Agricultural Marketing Infrastructure (AMI) w.e.f. 01.04.2014.)

Progress of the Scheme (Since inception of scheme up to 30.06.2020):

A total number of 39,416 storage infrastructure projects (godowns), with storage capacity of 66.54 million MT were sanctioned under the scheme and subsidy of Rs.3050 crore has been released.
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18,608 other marketing infrastructure projects have also been sanctioned and subsidy of Rs.1,843 crore has been released so far.

4.2.1 Development of Agricultural Marketing infrastructure, grading and standardization:

The Agmark certification scheme is implemented by 11 Regional Offices, 27 Sub Offices, 11 Regional Agmark Laboratories and a Central Agmark Laboratory through QC division at Head Office Faridabad.
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In order to fulfil the Hon'ble Prime Minister's Digital India dream, the application/approval processes related to Agmark certification was envisaged to be made online and user friendly from an offline mode. The software requirement specification (SRS) was prepared to bring physical processes to online mode with several modules.
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While developing the online software, the application forms were appropriately reoriented to make online filing process simple, fast, transparent, 24x7 and paperless with a facility to upload scanned /PDF documents. There is a provision of online receipt of fees and e-signing at relevant stages in the new online application.

4.3 Irrigation Facilities (including Minor and Micro Irrigation) for Agriculture

4.3.1 Micro Irrigation for Agriculture - Progress of Micro Irrigation: comes under PMKSY - Per Drop More Crop component.

From 2015-16, Central Assistance of Rs. 13,332.23 crore has been released to States for implementation of PMKSY- PDMC which includes Rs. 1,346.38 crore released during 2020-21 up to 30.12.2020.

From 2015-16, Micro Irrigation area of 50.11 lakh ha has been covered in the country under PMKSY- PDMC which includes 2.22 lakh ha during 2020-21 till December 2020.

During the year 2019-20, 11.72 lakh ha was brought under Micro Irrigation which is the highest coverage in a calendar year so far.

4.3.2 Pradhan Mantri Krishi Sinchayee Yojana - Accelerated Irrigation Benefits Programme - Coverage of Minor Irrigation:

Since its inception, 297 Irrigation / Multi Purpose Projects have been included for funding under AIBP. Out of this 143 projects have been completed and 5 projects were foreclosed. An irrigation potential of 24.39 Lakh ha. has been created through these completed projects.
The cumulative Central Loan Assistance /Grant provided to States under AIBP to all of above project till 31.3.2015 was Rs. 52,868.01 crore. Twenty five States got benefited from the programme. During 2015-16, Central Assistance of Rs. 2327.82 crore was released for projects under AIBP.
In July, 2016, the proposal to complete 99 prioritized projects under AIBP, including their Command Area Development and Water Management (CADWM) works, by December, 2019 was approved by the Government. Total requirement of funds for completion of identified 99 projects is estimated at Rs. 77,595 crore (Rs. 48,546 crore for project works and Rs. 29,049 crore for CADWM works) with Central Assistance (CA) of Rs. 31,342 crore. Out of 99 prioritized projects, AIBP works of 31 Priority projects were completed/almost completed by June, 2018.
Ultimate Irrigation Potential of these projects is 76.03 Lakh ha. out of which 41.39 Lakh ha. had been created upto 31.03.2016 and the balance potential of 34.64 Lakh ha. is envisioned to be created through the completion of these projects.
Under the Surface Minor Irrigation (SMI) Schemes, since 12th plan onwards, 5,838 schemes are ongoing with an estimated cost of Rs. 13,222 crore. CA of Rs. 6,531 crore has been released to states upto March, 2019. Further, 2,821 schemes have been reported to be completed upto March, 2019.
Target irrigation potential creation of these schemes is 10.412 L Ha and out of this, 6.547 L Ha is reported to be created till March, 2019. In the current financial year, Rs. 694.71 crore has been released to SMI schemes till 11.03.2020.

9.1.3 Malaria:

9.1.3.1 India has made considerable progress in reducing its malaria burden.

India achieved a reduction of 79% in malaria morbidity and 90% in malaria mortality between 2000 and 2018.

Thereby India achieved Goal 6 of the Millennium Development Goals (50-75% decrease in case incidence between 2000 and 2018).

The country has achieved a reduction of 83% in malaria morbidity and 92% in malaria mortality between 2000 and 2019.

Comparison of data showed decline in incidence of malaria in 2015 and 2019, with a decline of nearly 71% in malaria cases and 80% in malaria deaths. In 2020 (upto September), there was 45.19% decline in malaria cases, 22.42% decline in falciparum malaria and 9.30% increase in malaria deaths as compared to the corresponding period in 2019.

Twenty Five States reported 'Zero' malaria deaths in 2019 and in 2020 (till September).

9.3.2 Routine immunisation comprising of DPT, Polio, BCG and Measles- Children Immunised: Universal Immunization Programme (UIP)

Universal Immunization Programme (UIP) in India is one of the largest public health programmes in the world. It targets around 2.9 crore pregnant women and 2.67 crore newborn annually. More than 1.2 crore immunization sessions are conducted annually.
It is one of the most cost-effective public health interventions and largely responsible for reduction of vaccine preventable Under-5 mortality rate.
Under UIP, the Government of India is providing vaccination free of cost against twelve vaccine preventable diseases, of which: i) Ten are provided across the country against Diphtheria, Pertussis, Tetanus, Polio, Measles, Rubella, severe form of Childhood Tuberculosis, Rotavirus diarrhea, Hepatitis-B and Meningitis & Pneumonia caused by H. Influenza Type-B ii) Two are provided in selected States or endemic districts against, Pneumococcal Pneumonia and Japanese Encephalitis (JE); of which Pneumococcal Conjugate Vaccine is in the process of expansion while JE vaccine is provided only in endemic districts
A child needs seven contacts till the age of five years to complete immunization under UIP.
There are three main systems to measure full immunization coverage: 1. Online web-based Health Management Information System (HMIS) portal wherein administrative coverage is reported through health facilities across the country. As per HMIS data for FY 2019-20, the full immunization coverage of the country stands at 92.8%.
2. Periodic surveys like NFHS, DLHS, Rapid Survey on Children (RSOC), Integrated Child Health and Immunization Survey (INCHIS) etc. As per the latest available survey (NFHS-4) the full immunization coverage in the country stands at 62%.
3. Concurrent monitoring of the UIP is conducted through session as well as community monitoring.

9.3.3 Pulse Polio Immunisation Programme - Children Immunised: On 24th February, 2012, WHO removed India from the list of countries with active endemic wild polio virus transmission after reporting of the last case of poliovirus in the country in January, 2011. Subsequently, on 27th March, 2014, India along with 10 other countries of South-East Asia Region was declared Polio-free by the Regional Certification Commission (RCC) of WHO.

14.1 Sports for all in Rural and Urban Areas:

Panchayat Yuva Krida Aur Khel Abhiyan (PYKKA) scheme was introduced as a nation-wide rural sports programme in the year 2008-09. **Rajiv Gandhi Khel Abhiyan Scheme (RGKA)**, a Centrally Sponsored Scheme, was introduced in 2014-15, expanding the erstwhile “Panchayat Yuva Krida Aur Khel Abhiyan (PYKKA)”. A new umbrella Scheme “**Khelo India**” was launched during the financial year 2016-17 after merger of existing scheme **Rajiv Gandhi Khel Abhiyan (RGKA)**, **Urban Sports Infrastructure Scheme (USIS)** and **National Sports Talent Search System Programme (NSTSSP)**.

14.2 National Youth Corps (NYC): National Youth Corps (NYC) Scheme was launched in country during the year 2010-11, encompassing the erstwhile ‘*Rashtriya Sadbhavana Yojana*’, which is merged into a new ‘umbrella’ Scheme called “Rashtriya Yuva Sashaktikaran Karyakram RYSK)”. Key points are:

As per the provision of the scheme, a total of 13,253 volunteers in 706 districts are being deployed during 2019-20.
There is a selection committee under Chairpersonship of DM/DC of the district for selecting volunteers. Volunteers in the age group of 18-29 years are being deployed for maximum period of 2 years duration only.
Each volunteer is being paid Rs. 5000/- as monthly honorarium with effect from October 2016 earlier each volunteer was being paid the monthly honorarium of Rs. 2500/- only.
During the year 2018-19, a total of 13,206 volunteers were deployed across the country.

14.3 National Service Scheme (NSS):

National Service Scheme (NSS) is one of the flagship programmes of Ministry of Youth Affairs & Sports aimed at developing character and personality of student youth in schools and colleges. NSS was launched in the Birth Centenary Year of Mahatma Gandhi in 1969 in 37 Universities with about 40,000 students with primary focus on the development of personality of students through community service. The motto of the NSS is “Not me but You”.
Enrolment of NSS Volunteers: As on 31.12.2019, NSS has about 39.26 lakh volunteers enrolled in 530 Universities and +2 Councils/Directorates, 17,676 Colleges/ Technical Institutions and 12,087 Senior Secondary Schools. Since inception, over 7 crore students have benefited from NSS.
Adoption of Villages/ Slums: During 2019-20, NSS units have adopted 26,172 villages/ slums for their activities.

16.2 Prevention of Pollution of Rivers and Water Bodies:

National River Conservation Plan for 34 rivers - Sewerage plants set up: Sewage Treatment Capacity of 187 mld was targeted to be created under NRCP during the year 2018-19 (September, 2018) against which, 48.00 mld has been created so far during the year.

Presently, NRCP (excluding Ganga and its tributaries) covers polluted stretches of 34 rivers in 77 towns spread over 16 States at a sanctioned cost of Rs.5,870.55 crore.

An amount of Rs.2,510.63 crore has been released to various State Governments for implementation of various pollution abatement schemes and a treatment capacity of 2,522.03 million litres per day (mld) has been created so far under NRCP (excluding Ganga and its tributaries).

16.3 Solid and liquid Waste Management in Rural Areas and Urban Areas:

The Tamil Nadu Model of Solid Waste Management and the Telangana Model of Liquid Waste Management were studied by Senior Officials of 10 States. After this study, a Write-shop was organized and facilitated by DAY- NRLM to develop suitable proposals to initiate SLWM in rural areas in India. Accordingly, six States have developed their proposal, viz., Bihar, Chhattisgarh, Gujarat, Madhya Pradesh, Uttar Pradesh and West Bengal and received EC approval. These projects were rolled-out from January 2017. (Source: Annual Report 2018-19 of Ministry of Rural Development)

As on 31.12.2019, 81,073 wards (out of the total 84, 475 wards, i.e. 965) are covered by 100% door-to-door collection. 60% of the total waste generated is currently being processed, and 74% wards are practicing source segregation. (Source: Annual Report 2019-20 of Ministry of Housing and Urban Affairs)

Under Swachh Bharat Mission, Currently, there are 1531 functional waste to compost plants (centralized) with capacity to process 106636 tonnes waste per day, and another 566 plants are under construction, with approx. input capacity of 62,823 tonnes per day. Additionally, there are 4 functional RDF plants with input capacity of 1621 tonnes per day, 37 bio gas plants with input capacity of 1861 tonnes per day. 26 waste to energy plants are under construction with input capacity of over 22541 tonnes per day. ग्रामीण ऊर्जा (ENERGIZATION OF RURAL AREA)

19.1 Bio-diesel Production:

During the period April to March, 2020, 10.55 crore litres of biodiesel has been procured by OMCs for blending with biodiesel.

In order to encourage production of biodiesel from Used Cooking Oil (UCO), Oil Marketing Companies have floated Expression of Interest for supply of biodiesel produced from UCO at 300 locations across the country. The ex-factory UCO based biodiesel price has been fixed for three years. The price for the first year has been fixed at Rs 51/litre, for the second year at Rs 52.7/litre and for the third year at Rs 54.5/litre. GST and transportation shall be payable in addition to this price.

OMCs have received offers for setting up 65 Biodiesel Plants with a production capacity of approx. 1300 MT/day (48 Crore litre/annum).

19.2 Villages Electrified under Deendayal Gram Jyoti Yojana (erstwhile Rajiv Gandhi Grameen Vidyutikaran Yojana (RGGVY)): Ministry of Power has informed that all inhabited census villages have been electrified on 28th April, 2018.

19.6 Supply of Kerosene and LPG:

19.6.1 Kerosene: Key features - Allocation of Kerosene in States, and Stock of Kerosene lifted and distributed:

The allocation for the year 2019-20 was further reduced by 29% in comparison to the allocation of 2018-19. The allocation for 2020-21 has been further reduced by 26% in comparison to the allocation for 2019-20.

Over and above the above reduction in the PDS Kerosene allocations, till date, 13 State Governments/UTs (Karnataka, Haryana, Telangana, Nagaland, Chandigarh, Gujarat, Andhra Pradesh, Bihar, Goa, Puducherry, Rajasthan, Maharashtra and Uttar Pradesh) have availed 'Cash incentive for voluntary cut in kerosene allocation' scheme.

As on date, 9 State Governments/UTs have already cut down their PDS Kerosene allocation to nil.
