A STUDY ON ANIMALS IN MILK AND THEIR YIELD RATE IN INDIA

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1. INTRODUCTION

Although India has enormous bovine population of the order of about 250 million, the milk yield per animal is found to be one of the lowest in the world. The average daily milk yield per animal in milk in India is about 1.5 litres for cows and 3 litres for buffaloes as against 8-9 litres obtained in some countries such as Denmark, New Zealand, UK & USA. The low production of milk in India is attributed to the extremely low production potential of animals caused by the lack of adequate nutrition and health coverage. An investigation into the production potential of animals and its linkage with the availability of fodder and medical and other facilities will evidently be interesting and useful in planning for increased milk production and dairy development.

1.2 The data on livestock numbers, production and consumption of livestock products and other ancillary information on livestock were collected by National Sample Survey (NSS) in their 30th Round (July 1975 to June 1976). The ancillary information related to (a) availability of area under fodder and pasture and (b) the distance at which facilities are available for artificial insemination,

treatment for illness etc. The regional as well as State level estimates for the Central Sample have been brought out by NSS (2,3,4).

1.3 Making use of these data, an attempt has been made in this paper to throw some light on three important factors, viz. (i) the percentage of animals in milk to milch animals, (ii) the daily milk yield per animal in milk for cows and buffaloes in rural and urban areas separately and (iii) the daily milk yield per household in rural areas. The association between the milk yield and the availability of fodder, pastures and various facilities have also been examined. In addition, NSS regions have been ranked on the basis of per household milk yield in order to identify regions needing special development efforts. Effort has also been made to see whether the selection of areas under operation Flood II project has been done from the high yielding areas.

2. PERCENTAGE OF ANIMALS IN MILK TO MILCH ANIMALS

2.1 SEASONAL VARIATIONS

The percentages for cows and buffaloes over different seasons both for rural and urban sectors at All India level are presented in Table 1.

It would be seen that the percentages in rural sector for cows and buffaloes were 49 and 59 respectively. The corresponding figures for the urban sector were 59 and 67. The percentages in urban sector were therefore 8 to 10 points higher than those obtaining in the rural sector. This is explainable in urban areas not only better facilities are available for maintenance of livestock more efficiently than in rural areas, but also selective re-

tention for productive animals is adopted by send-away animals to villages when they are not in milk.

There was hardly any seasonal variation in the percentages for the cows. The percentage for buffaloes in both rural and urban sectors seemed to be higher during the period October to March than the percentages during the remaining period of April to September of the year.

2.2 DISTRIBUTION OF NSS REGIONS BY RANGES OF PERCENTAGES

The distribution of NSS regions was also examined

over various ranges of percentages for cows and buffaloes in rural and urban sectors. The distribution is given in Table 2.

It can be seen that in case of cows in the rural sector most of the regions (54 out of 64) between 40 and 60 percentage of animals in milk to milch animals whereas most of the regions (54 out of 65) in urban areas and percentages between 50 and 70 animals milk to milch animals. Similarly, for the buffaloes in the rural sector in most of the regions (50 out of 64) the percentages were between 50 to 70 whereas in most of the regions (48 out of 62) in urban sector they exceeds 60 and even 70 in case of 16 regions.

3. MILK YIELD PER ANIMAL IN MILK (YIELD RATE)

3.1 SEASONAL VARIATION

With a view to examining whether the problem of supply demand imbalances is exacerbated by seasonal imbalances, the estimates of average daily yield of milk per animal in milk of cows and buffaloes in rural and urban sectors for different seasons are presented in Table 3.

There was small variation in yield rate over different reason for both cows and buffaloes in rural as well as urban sector. The estimates clearly point out that the yield rate in urban area was considerably higher than that in rural area. In the case of cows, the urban yield rate was 90 percent more than that of rural yield rate but in the case

of buffaloes, the increase was only about 38 per cent.

3.2 DISTRIBUTION OF NSS REGIONS BY RANGES OF YIELD RATE

The distribution of NSS regions corresponding to the yield rate of cows and buffaloes was also worked out and is given in Table 4.

In about 79 per cent of the regions in urban areas, buffaloes yielded milk more than 2.5 liters per day whereas only about 34 per cent of the regions in rural sector were in this category. In case of cows, about fifty per cent of the regions in rural areas had yields less than one litre of milk per day while for urban sector the yield rate was more than 1.5 litres per day in about 60 per cent of the regions.

4. VARIATION IN PERCENTAGES OF ANIMAL IN MILK TO MILCH ANIMALS AND YIELD RATE

Coefficient of variations (CV) of the percentages of animals in milk to milch animals over regions were worked out. It was found that CV was 17% for both rural cows and buffaloes whereas for cows and buffaloes in urban sector the CV was 15 and 21 per cent respectively. This small variation was observed in the percentages over regions both for cows and buffaloes in rural and urban areas.

Coefficient of variation of milk yield per day per animal in milk over regions were 59 and 51 per cent for rural and urban cows respectively whereas they were 46 and 44 per cent for rural and urban buffaloes respectively. Thus the variation in yield rates is not small, indicating large disparity in the yield rates over regions.

5. RANKING OF REGIONS

We have so far discussed the estimates of percentage of animals in milk to milch animals and yield rate. Let the estimates of the former be denoted by r_i and that of the latter by p_i for the i -th regions. Further, let n_i be the average number of milch animals per household for the i -th region. Then, an estimate of milk production per household for the i -th region will be given by $m_i = n_i p_i r_i$

With this formula; m previous and indicator of the availability of the milk per household in the i -th region as against the yield rate of milk per animal in milk in the i -th region denoted by p which is an indicator of the yield without any regard for the human population.

The NSS regions have been ranked according to the increasing magnitude of m and are given in column 2 of Table 5 alongwith corresponding values of m in column 3 and of p in column 4.

To know whether the yield rate per region (p_i) is adequate to represent availability also (m_i), correlation coefficient between m_i and p_i was obtained. The coefficient of correlation was 0.8 which is not as high as expected. This shows there are several regions where yield per animal may be high but the availability per household may be inadequate. This leads to the conclusion that our efforts should be directed to increase m rather than p alone.

6. VARIATION IN HOUSEHOLD SIZE AND AVERAGE NUMBER OF MILCH ANIMALS AND YIELD RATE

It would have been desirable to rank the regions according to per capita availability of milk. Since the population at regional level is not available, it was decided to obtain the availability of milk per household. This may serve as an index for per capita availability provided the household size remains constant. The household sizes for the 30th round (1975-76) have not been tabulated. A tabulation of household size available from the 26th round (1971-72) were therefore examined assuming that the four year time changes in household size would be negligible. This is given in Table 6. Alongwith this, the average number of milch animals per household and specieswise yield per animal in milk are also given.

It would be seen therefrom that not much variation in observation in size of households over States.

Hence the ranking based on per household availability will not be materially different from that based on per capita availability. Average number of house per household was observed to be much more than that of buffaloes. In most of the States but in A.P., Gujarat, Haryana, Punjab, U.P. and Delhi. The position is reverse. The variation over States of the no. of house per household was also much more than that of buffaloes. the CV for the former being 46% and for the latter 22%. However the average yield of milk per buffaloes was much more than that of cow for all the States except Meghalaya and Tripura. The CV of the average yield over States for buffaloes (46%) was also larger than that of cows (39%).

7. CLASSIFICATION OF REGIONS ACCORDING TO LEVEL OF YIELD RATES.

NSS regions have been classified according to the following criteria for average daily milk yield per rural household and per animal in milk.

These categories have been determined considering mainly the average milk yield per rural household and per animal in milk for each region vis-a-vis the overall yield. The classification of regions according to these categories is given in Table 7.

8. ANCILLARY VILLAGE LEVEL INFORMATION.

In the 30th round of NSS, some ancillary infor-

mation at village level which could have some bearing on livestock production was also collected for rural regions. The factors responsible for improvement in feeding and breeding etc. such as areas under fodder and pastures and availability of artificial insemination centres, stockmen centres and veterinary hospitals dispensaries were also taken into account and their estimates are presented in Columns 5-10 of Table 5.

Average area per village, percentage of villages having different facilities within 10 kms and percentage of villages under ICDP, for the group of regions falling under low, medium and high categories of average daily milk yield per animal in milk are given in Table 8.

It would be seen that the average area per villages under fodder is only 0.53 acre for the villages lying in low category of milk yield per animal in milk whereas it is 49.34 for regions falling under high category of milk yield. For medium category it is 8.00. It appears that areas under fodder has direct impact on the yield of milk. Further, average area per village under pasture and also percentage of villages having different facilities within 10 kms are more or less same for the three categories of regions. As regards, percentage of villages under ICDP, it is seen that the percentage is almost the same under low and medium categories or regions but it is small under the high category of regions. It seems in the selection of villages under ICDP, less weightage was given to regions having high milk yield.

9. SOME ASPECTS OF AREA CHOICE OF OPERATION FLOOD II PROJECT.

In 1970 the Government of India took special initiative to launch a Dairy Development Project with commodity assistance in the shape of gift skim powder milk and butter oil from the World Food

Programme. It was envisaged that the funds would be generated from the sale of the gift commodities for further expansion in the milk processing facilities of the public sector dairies. Based on the result achieved through the implementation of this programme, an Operation Flood II (OF II) project was started in 1978 with the intention of raising per capita milk consumption. The project is managed by the Indian Dairy Corporation (IDC). In all 25 States/Union Territories have signed agreement with IDC till June, 1983. The field programme has, however, started in only 18 States/Union Territory⁽¹⁾.

A review of the choice of areas under OF II was made by Surinder Singh⁽²⁾ in January 1981 and it was observed that the choice of districts made by the OF authorities was such that there was a systematic bias towards the more developed districts and that the programme was likely to generate further inter-regional inequalities in the sense that the prosperous regions first to launch OF II would have an edge over others in the years to come. These findings were based on the districts selected in 15 states till then.

Since then the programme has been extended to more States and even in the earlier selected States, more districts have been taken up. The position is given in Table 9.

It would be seen that even now in hilly regions of Assam, J&K and UP, no district has been selected under OF II. However, out of regions where the availability of milk is low and the yield rate is also low (total 12 regions), these are two regions, viz., Maharashtra-Coastal and Orissa-Northern where the percentage of districts selected is only 33 which is low. In Bihar-Southern and Orissa-Southern regions where also the availability of milk and the yield rate is low, as district has been selected. In regions like Kerala-Northern, Tamil Nadu-Coastal Southern and Goa, Daman & Diu where the availability of milk per household is low but the yield rate per animals is not low, only nil, 14.3 and 33.3 percentage of districts respectively have been selected under OF II. Since the implementation of the programme requires much financial assistance to the weaker sections of rural population for the purchase of milch cattle and other complementary inputs, it was necessary to extend this programme to districts where also the yield per animal is not small.

10. REVIEW AND DISCUSSION

In rural areas, the percentage of animals in milk to milch animals for cows is about 50 and that for buffaloes, is about 60. This also means that cows and buffaloes remain dry roughly in about 50 and 40 per cent respectively of the time during their milch age. This is a long period. The CV of these percentages is only 17% which shows that practically in all the regions the period is of the same order. There is an imperative need for research and investigation to reduce dry period of milch animals.

The picture as regards yield rates (daily milk yield per animal in milk) in India is different. The average daily milk yield per rural animal in milk is 1.05 and 2.61 litres for cows and buffaloes respectively but their coefficients of variation are 59 and 46 per cent respectively over regions. We find that there are regions in Gujarat, Haryana, Rajasthan, West Bengal and Delhi where milk yield for rural cows and buffaloes is as high as about 4 and 6.5 litres respectively in certain seasons which is not far below from that of developed countries, whereas there exist regions in States like Assam, Andhra Pradesh, Maharashtra, Orissa

and Tripura where yield rate in certain seasons is as low as 0.07 and 0.30 litres for cows and buffaloes respectively. This shows that we have to create the potentials like improved breed, fodder, medical and other facilities available in high yielding areas, as well as in areas also where the yield is low.

A comparison of the milk production per household and milk yield per animal will show that in regions like Kerala-Northern, Manipur-Hills and plains, Tamil Nadu-Coastal Southern, West Bengal-Central Plains and Goa, Daman & Diu, although the yield rate is not low, yet the availability of milk per household is small. The obvious cure for this type of situation would be to increase the population of animals also in these regions by providing incentives like subsidies, credit facilities etc. to the people there.

In regions like Andhra Pradesh-Inland Northern, Bihar-Southern, Madhya Pradesh-Eastern, Maharashtra-Coastal and Eastern, Meghalaya, Orissa-Coastal, Southern and Northern, Tamil Nadu-Coastal Northern, Tripura and West Bengal-Western Plains where the milk yield and the per household availability both are low, the immediate necessity would be to divert some milk from the high availability areas at subsidised rates, if necessary, in the interest of social justice.

There are also regions like Andhra Pradesh-Inland and Southern, Assam Plains, Karnataka-Inland Eastern, Madhya Pradesh-Inland Eastern and Western and Maharashtra-Inland Eastern where the yield rate per animal is low but the per household availability is not low. In these regions, comparatively the number of animal is, therefore, more with reference to the number of households. Obviously, in these regions, even the small increase in the yield rate per animal would increase in the availability sufficiently.

The large association (0.8) between the area under fodder and yield rate shows that the yield rate is greatly influenced by the area under fodder. We have, therefore, to popularise the increased cultivation of fodder in the interest of increasing the milk production, per animal.

The very low association (0.05) between the yield rate and the area under pasture shows the yield rate is not affected by the availability of pastures. It seems pastures are not in good shape and may include tracts of barren land, which are not instrumental in increasing the yield.

A review of the percentage of villages under Intensive Cattle Development Programme (ICDP) shows that a good number of villages are covered under ICDP, the percentage of coverage at all-India level being 51. Also in 15 out of 64 regions in the country, 90% and more villages have been covered under ICDP. It is also seen that in low yielding regions, the coverage of the project is somewhat adequate, but in high yielding regions, it is small.

The operational flood II may cover these areas also adequately where the availability of milk per household is low, in the interest of removing regional disparities.

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A NOTE ON SOME CHARACTERISTICS OF HOUSEHOLD POULTRY ENTERPRISES: NSS 30TH ROUND (JULY 1975—JUNE 1976)

1. INTRODUCTION

1.0 With a view to fill up the gaps in the animal husbandry statistics the Governing Council of National Sample Survey Organisation (NSSO) decided to devote the entire 30th round (July 1975—June 1976) of NSS to an enquiry on various aspects of livestock and livestock enterprises. Alongwith various characteristics relating to number, products and enterprises, information on the consumption of livestock products was also collected in this survey. A draft report no. 288/1 had already been brought out on the estimates of the household dairy enterprises which constitute the main livestock enterprises in the household sector. Also a note dealing with some key characters of household dairy enterprises was published in Sarvekshana, Vol. III, No. 4, April 1980. In this report estimates on various aspects of household poultry enterprises have been presented.

Scope, coverage, sample size and field work

1.1 The main survey on livestock number and products was carried out in 18,856 villages and 20,440 urban blocks spread over the whole of India. While investigation in Central Sample which consisted of 8,512 villages and 9,744 blocks was carried out by the Field Operations Division of NSSO, the remaining sample villages and urban blocks were surveyed on a matching basis by the field staff of the different state statistical agencies.

1.2 For the purpose of this survey, a household was considered to have a poultry enterprise if on the date of listing, it possessed 20 or more poultry birds (fowls, ducks and other poultry birds taken together). However, those poultry enterprises which were registered under section 2m (i) or 2m(ii) of the Factory Act of India, 1948 were not covered in this survey. All the households reporting poultry enterprises (as per the definition given above) in the sample village/block were surveyed.

1.3 In the Central sample, out of the total sample villages and blocks surveyed, only 1,376 sample villages and 772 sample blocks have reported

ted household poultry enterprises at all-India level. The number of poultry households enumerated in the sample villages and blocks are 2,794 and 1,082 respectively.

1.4 With the definition adopted for poultry enterprise households, the aggregate estimates are of limited utility. Hence, important economic coefficients in the form of rates and percentages are presented in this report.

Explanatory note on tables presented

1.5 A set of nine tables giving various characteristics of household poultry enterprises at the state and all India levels has been presented separately for rural and urban sectors. All India and state estimates are based on the data of the Central sample only.

1.6 The following system has been adopted for numbering the tables :—

The left hand most number refers to the serial number of the table and the digits 1 and 2 following first point from the left stand for the sector code i.e. rural and urban respectively. The individual state and union territory are first arranged in alphabetical order of their respective names and the respective tables are presented with the table heading 'contents' of the corresponding table number.

1.7 Table 1 provides the number of sample villages/blocks reporting poultry enterprises and number of poultry households investigated. Tables 2 and 3 give the proportion of poultry enterprise households to all households and also the proportion of households having poultry as principal occupation to all poultry enterprise households. The average number of hired workers per working day in the poultry enterprises has also been presented in Table 3. Table 4 provides the percentage of hired and household labour days in poultry enterprises and so the average value of service charges and other expenses per month per enterprise household. Table 5 shows the average value of the assets (owned or hired) per enterprise household.

amount of outstanding loan per reporting household. While Table 6 gives the number and value of poultry birds possessed per enterprise household by size of poultry holding separately for fowl and duck, the number and value of eggs produced and sold per week per enterprise household separately for hen and duck classified by poultry holding class are presented in Table 7. Table 8 gives the quantity and value of consumption of poultry feed per month per enterprise household by size class of holding. Finally, Table 9 provides average value of consumption of poultry feed per month per poultry enterprise household by items of poultry feed.

2. IMPORTANT FINDINGS OF THE SURVEY

Here some important characteristics of the household poultry enterprises such as the size of the enterprise, production and sale of eggs, utilisation of labour, assets and indebtedness position and expenditure on poultry feed incurred by the enterprise households have been dealt with. The discussion is generally restricted to the all-India estimates, separately for rural and urban sectors. However the extent of variations exhibited by different states on the above mentioned aspects have also been touched upon.

2.1 The enterprise households : The potentiality of the poultry farming for augmenting the income and employment of the rural households particularly the small and marginal farmers have been recognised by the National Commission on Agriculture. However, the survey results indicate that the poultry farming has not been taken up as a business proposition by most of the households and, therefore, it has made little impact on the entrepreneurial activities either in the rural or the urban sector in India. The households, in general, run the poultry farming at a nominal scale of operation as most of them possess less than 20 poultry birds.

2.2 In the rural sector of India, of the total number of households estimated as 8,46,35,900, only 0.31 per cent is found to possess 20 or more poultry birds and hence only a small percentage of households is engaged in the poultry enterprise according to the definition of poultry enterprise adopted for the survey. Also, most of these enterprise households run the enterprise in their subsidiary capacity as poultry farming is reported to be the principal occupation for only 5.63 per cent of the poultry enterprise households (Ref. Table 3.1). The

percentage of the enterprise households to all households by land possessed class as given in Table (S1) reveals that the said percentage are more in the higher classes than the lower ones indicating that the poultry farming has made last in-road among the small and marginal farmers.

2.3 The overall position in respect of poultry enterprise in the urban sector is less satisfactory than that in the rural sector. At the all-India level, the percentage of poultry enterprise households to all households is observed to be 0.01. However, compared to rural sector, proportionately more enterprise households in this sector have poultry farming as their principal occupation. It is revealed from Table 3.2 that the percentage of households having poultry enterprise as principal occupation to all poultry enterprise households is 11.53 in the urban sector. Table (S2) showing the percentage of poultry enterprise households to all households classified by household monthly per capita expenditure groups indicated an increasing trend of the said percentage over the expenditure groups upto the class Rs. 40—59 and thereafter the same remains more or less stationary.

2.4 It is revealed from Tables 2.1 and 2.2 that the percentage of poultry enterprise households to all households comparatively high in Meghalaya (2.67), Manipur (1.62), Assam (1.25), Maharashtra (0.79) and West Bengal (0.60) in the rural sector and in Jammu & Kashmir (0.78), Manipur (0.57), Meghalaya (0.45), Kerala (0.43) and Orissa (0.22) in urban sector. However, it appears that the enterprise households of Haryana and to some extent those of Punjab have been operating this enterprise in more business like fashion than those of the other states. In Haryana, as high as 39.93 and 50.00 per cent of the poultry enterprise households operate this enterprise as their principal occupation respectively in rural and urban sectors. The said percentage for the two sectors of Punjab are 14.04 and 30.18 respectively.

2.5 *Hired and Household workers* : In the prevailing situation, it may not be unlikely to expect that the poultry enterprise will provide little employment opportunity either to the household members or to the hired workers. The average number of workers per working day in an enterprise has been found as 1.35 and 1.48 in the rural and urban sectors respectively. The enterprises are, obviously, run mostly by household labour. The percentage of hired labour days to total labour days is 6.03 in the rural sector at the all-India level. In comparison, the

enterprise households in the urban sector use more hired labour and the said percentage is found to be 9.57 in urban India. (Ref. Table 4.1 and 4.

2.6 *Size of the enterprise* : It is seen from Table 6.1 that¹ in the rural sector at all-India level an enterprise household, on an average, possesses about 48 poultry birds. The percentage distribution of the number of poultry enterprise households over size class of poultry holdings shows that 67 percent of the enterprise households possess birds between 20—29 and another 16 per cent between 30—39. Among the states the average number of poultry birds possessed by the enterprise households is found to be 255, 190 and 120 respectively in Punjab, Haryana and Gujarat which are quite high in comparison to those of the other states. In Punjab and Haryana, as high as 42 and 36 per cent enterprise households fall in the highest class of poultry holding i.e. "100 & above". In the case of Gujarat although only about 13 percent of the enterprise household is in the class of 100 & above, the average number of poultry birds per enterprise household in the highest class of poultry holding is found to be 716 against 564 and 459 in Punjab and Haryana respectively.

2.7 Compared to rural sector, the average number of poultry birds per enterprise household is fairly high in the urban sector. At the all-India level, the said average is observed to be about 94. Further, 51 per cent of the poultry enterprise households possess birds between 20—29 and another 14 percent between 30—39. Among the states Haryana has made a very good progress in poultry farming as the average number of birds possessed per enterprise household is as high as 1801. Although Punjab follows Haryana in this respect, an enterprise household, on an average, possesses only 367 birds. It is seen from Table 6.2 that in Haryana, unexpectedly high percentage of enterprise households (76%) has been reported against poultry holding class of 100 & above. It may be mentioned here that in the urban sector of Haryana, only 6 sample blocks out of 144 have reported any poultry enterprise. Moreover, although an urban block contains on an average 150 households, only 8 households in all the sample blocks taken together have reported poultry enterprises (Ref. Table 1.2) some of which are found to be very big possessing, on an average 1801 poultry birds.

1. the value of per bird in a poultry holding generally increases as the size of holding increases,

2.8 Production and sale of eggs : From Tables 7.1 and 7.2 it is observed that the average number of eggs produced per week in an enterprise in the urban sector is much higher than that in the rural sector for every size brackets of poultry holding whereas the position is just the opposite in case of duck eggs. The rural enterprise households at the all-India level produce, on an average, 53 hen eggs and 5 duck eggs per week, while the corresponding figures in the urban sector are 199 and 2. It is thus apparent that so far as the total production of eggs are concerned, the contribution from duck is negligible except Kerala, Andhra Pradesh and Assam in respect of production and sale of duck eggs vis a vis hen eggs.

2.9 Almost similar pattern is observed in the case of eggs sold by the enterprise households. As revealed from table 7.1 and 7.2 that the average number of eggs sold per week by an enterprise household is 46 and 5 respectively for hens and ducks at all-India level in the rural sector. The corresponding average in the urban sector are 181 and 2. At all-India level, the percentage of hen eggs sold to hen eggs produced by the enterprise households is 87 in rural sector and 91 in the urban sector. However, if all households are considered the percentage of eggs sold to eggs produced comes down to 38 for rural sector and 57 for urban sector as estimated from the data of Schedule 19.1, 30th round.² So far as the states are concerned the households in the rural sector of Haryana, Gujarat, Punjab, Tamil-Nadu and Himachal Pradesh run their enterprises more or less on a commercial scale as the percentage of hen eggs sold to hen eggs produced is very high, the respective figures being 116, 97, 96, 93 and 90. In the urban sector, quite a number of states have the said percentage above 90. The highest is reported by Orissa (101), followed by Haryana (100), Karnataka (99) and Rajasthan (97). Since the data collected for sale in the reference week is not restricted to the production of eggs of the same week, the percentage of hen eggs sold to hen eggs produced may exceed 100 in some extreme cases as found in the case of rural & urban sectors of Haryana and in the urban sector of Orissa.

2.10 The estimates presented in Table (S3) show that at the all-India level, out of the total hen eggs sold by the enterprise households, about 88 percent in the rural sector and 93 per cent in the urban sec-

tor are supplied by the households possessing 100 and above poultry birds. Interestingly, in the rural sector, a little over 5 per cent of the total hen eggs sold are supplied by the households belonging to the lowest class of the poultry holding whereas, only about 7 per cent is sold by the remaining households possessing 30—99 poultry birds. The percentage of hen eggs sold to hen eggs produced is found to have an increasing trend over the poultry holding classes in the urban sector. However, the same trend is not noticeable in the rural sector for the first four holding classes.

2.11 Assets and outstanding loan : The survey results do not reveal marked inter sectoral variation in respect of the percentage of enterprise households reporting assets used for the enterprise at the all-India level. However, the average value of assets per enterprise households is observed to be about 4 times higher in the urban sector than

2.12 On the liability side, the estimates presented in Table (S4) indicate that the percentage of households reporting loan taken for the entrepreneurial purpose which remained outstanding on the date of survey is as low as 2 in rural sector and 6 in urban sector at the all-India level. However, the amount of outstanding loan per reporting household is quite substantial in both rural (Rs. 4978) and urban (Rs. 6,880) areas as seen from table 4.1 and 4.2 respectively. Among the states, number of enterprise households reported to be indebted in the rural sector is relatively more in Punjab, Haryana and Tamil Nadu, the percentage of enterprise households reporting outstanding loan being 19, 14 and 10 respectively. In the urban sector, about 22, 18, 17, 17 and 16 per cent of the enterprise households have been observed to be indebted in Jammu & Kashmir, Tamil Nadu, Rajasthan, Karnataka and Himachal Pradesh respectively. In regard to the average amount of outstanding loan per reporting

household, West Bengal is on the top of the list (Rs. 10,100) followed by Haryana (Rs. 9,717) and Punjab (Rs. 5,986) in the rural sector. In the urban sector this average is maximum in Madhya Pradesh (Rs. 15,000) followed by Karnataka (Rs. 12,954) and Himachal Pradesh (Rs. 11,650).

2.13 *Expenditure for household poultry enterprise :* The all India estimates of average value of consumption of poultry feed per month per enterprise household for different poultry holding groups are presented in Table (S5) ;

2.14 As expected, the average value in each poultry holding group is more in the urban sector than that of the rural sector and in both the sectors it increases with the increase in the size of the poultry holding.

2.15 The estimates of average quantity and value of consumption for different items of feed per month per enterprise household are given in Table (S6)

2.16 The estimates of Table (S6) reveal that the quantity consumed for each item of feed is much more in the urban sector than that of the rural sector. The total quantity consumed comes from two sources, viz., home-grown stock and purchase. Between rural and urban sectors, while for each item of feed, the quantity consumed out of home-grown stock is more in the rural sector, the quantity purchased is much higher in the urban sector.

2.17 In this context it may be noted that the item "other feed" shown in the table includes fodder, green grass, straw, oil cake, crushed pulse, bran, husk, oil seeds, gur, salt, other feeds and other chemicals excluding medicine. Contrary to expectation, the average value of consumption against "other feed" is found to be quite high. Since many of the poultry enterprise households are likely to possess some dairy animals and other live-stocks it is not unlikely that part of the expenditure made against the purchase of feed for those livestock have been wrongly reported against the poultry enterprise.

3. SAMPLE DESIGN AND ESTIMATION PROCEDURE

3.1 SAMPLE DESIGN : The general sample design in the NSS Thirtieth round was stratified with two stage selection, the first stage units are village blocks and the second stage units the households.

3.2 SAMPLE SIZE (CENTRAL SAMPLE) : In the central sample, there were 8512 villages and 9744 blocks.

3.3 WORK PROGRAMME : The survey period of 12 months (from July 1975 to June 1976) has been divided into 4 sub-rounds of 3 months each. Number of sample villages and blocks were equal for each of the four sub-rounds in each of the strata.

3.4 RURAL SAMPLE DESIGN

3.4.1 *Sampling Frame* : The frame used for selection in the rural sector was the list of villages as per 1971 population census.

3.4.2 *Stratification* : The whole of India had been divided into a number of basic strata so that the basic strata did not cut across district boundaries. Districts with more than 1.5 million 1971 census rural population had been divided into 2 or more basic strata by grouping contiguous tehsils, (or sub-divisions in Bihar, Orissa and West Bengal), homogeneous, as far as possible with respect to density of rural population and crop pattern, so that population of each basic stratum was less than 1.5 million. Each district with less than 1.5 million 1971 census rural population formed one basic stratum by itself except in Gujarat where some district with less than 1.5 million rural population had been divided into two basic strata on consideration of concentration of the tribal population and dry areas of the state. Basic strata so formed had been treated as basic strata both for rural and urban areas. Out of 374 districts, 366 districts were within survey coverage of the NSS. The number of basic strata formed were 520 in rural sector.

3.4.3 *Allocation* : The all-India sample of villages had been allocated to the different states and union territories considering their investigator strength and rural population. Within each state and union territory, the allocated number of villages had been distributed over the constituent basic stratum in proportion to their rural population. These allocations had been made multiple of 4.

3.4.4 *Selection of villages* : The 1971 census list of villages had been used as the sampling frame for selection of villages. Sample villages within each basic stratum had been selected with probability proportional to 1971 census population and with replacement, in the form of two independent sub-samples.

In rural sector, the first stage sampling unit and also the unit of survey was the census village. In a few cases the sampled census villages differed with the corresponding revenue villages. Nevertheless, if the sampled census village was clearly identifiable, it was surveyed. Otherwise, if the sampled census village contained two or more revenue villages wholly or partly, all these revenue villages taken together

were taken as the unit of survey. On the other hand, if the sampled census village was wholly contained within a bigger revenue village which contained wholly or partly other census villages also, the bigger revenue village was surveyed.

In case of sample villages with large population content, the survey was conducted in one of the sub-divisions (selected at random) formed in a village called hamlet groups of nearly equal population contents.

3.4.5 Selection of sample households : Households possessing 20 or more poultry birds, on the date of survey (fowls, ducks and other poultry birds taken together) excluding those which are registered under section 2m (i), or 2m (ii) of Factory Act of India, 1948, had been selected.

3.5 URBAN SAMPLE DESIGN

3.5.1 Sampling Frame : Urban frame survey (UFS) blocks in cities and towns where UFS was done and 1971 census blocks where UFS had not been done, were used for final selection of blocks.

3.5.2 Stratification : Basic strata as described in rural sample design had been treated as basic strata for urban sector also. In the urban sector, however, some of the basic strata with very low urban population content had been merged together to form urban strata with sizeable urban population. In all such cases, however, the separate entity of the district had been retained in general, except in case of districts with very low urban population where such districts had been merged with neighbouring districts in the same region for urban strata formation. Out of 374 districts in India, 56 districts were within the survey coverage of the ISS. Total number of basic strata formed in the 56 districts was 380 in urban sector.

3.5.3 Allocation : The all-India sample of blocks had been allocated to the different states and union territories considering their investigator strengths and urban population contents. Within each state and union territory, the allocated number of blocks were distributed over the constituents urban strata in proportion to their urban population. These locations were made multiple of 4.

3.5.4 Selection of blocks : Within each urban stratum the allocated number of blocks have been selected with probability proportional to size (pps) where size is a measure of population and with replacement in the form of two independent samples.

3.5.5 Selection of sample households : The criterion as described in rural sample design under para 3.4.5 had been followed for urban sector too.

3.6 ESTIMATION PROCEDURE

Notations :

- Y : the estimate of the state total for the characteristic y based on the whole sample and for the whole round.
- s : subscript for the s th stratum of a state.
- i : subscript for the i th sample village/block/surveyed part (hamlet group or sub-block) of village or block.
- j : subscript for the j th household.

- z : block size (used for selection).
- p : village population (used for selection).
- P : total rural population.
- Z : total urban size.
- m : number of surveyed villages/blocks including uninhabited and zero-cases.

The last summation is over all schedules 20, filled up for a sample village.

Here also, the last summation will be over all the schedules 20, filled up for a sample block.

The estimates of ratios are obtained by first obtaining the estimates of the numerator and denominator of a given ratio and then by division at the final stage.

A NOTE ON THE SECOND QUINQUENNIAL SURVEY ON CONSUMER EXPENDITURE : NSS 32ND ROUND (JULY 1977—JUNE 1978)

1. INTRODUCTION

1·0 Data on household consumer expenditure were being collected in every round of the National Sample Survey (NSS), beginning from the first round which started in October, 1950 through the 28th round (1973-74). After the 26th round of the survey, the Governing Council of NSSO decided that the survey on consumer expenditure and on Employment & Unemployment be undertaken together once in every five years beginning from the 27th round. Thus, the first quinquennial survey on consumer expenditure was conducted in the 27th round (Sept. 1972-Oct. 1973). To meet some specific ad-hoc requirements, a survey on consumer expenditure was also conducted in the 28th round, outside this quinquennial programme. The present report has been prepared from the data collected during the 32nd round, that is, the second quinquennial survey on consumer expenditure, carried out during the period July 1977 to June 1978.*

1·1 In this report, some of the basic results of the survey have been presented. Incidentally, it may be mentioned that in this round the Rural Labour Enquiry (RLE) was integrated with the consumer expenditure survey as per decision of the Governing Council. The present report, however, does not contain separate estimates relating to rural labour households.

1·2 The field work of the thirty second round started in July 1977 and continued upto June 1978, covering a period of one complete year. The reference period for collection of data on consumer expenditure was 30 days preceding the date of survey. The estimates presented in the report, therefore, broadly relate to the period June 1977 to June 1978.

1·3 The geographical coverage of the survey was the entire Indian Union excluding Sikkim, Ladakh district of Jammu & Kashmir, rural areas of Pal and Samri tehsils of district Surguja and Bijapur, Dantawara, Konta and Narayanpur tehsils of district Bastar of Madhya Pradesh, Rajane, Siron-

cha and Gadh-Chiroli tehsils of district Chandrapur and Melghat of district Amravati of Maharashtra, rural areas of Chandigarh, Mizoram and Nagaland, Andaman and Nicobar Islands; Lakshadweep, Dadra and Nagar Haveli. The survey in North Eastern Region covered Arunachal Pradesh, two hill districts (Mikir hills and Cachar hills) of Assam, Manipur, Meghalaya, Mizoram, Tripura and urban areas of Nagaland. Information was collected by interviewing the members (usually the head of the household) of the sample households. Altogether 99766 sample households selected from 8216 sample villages in rural areas and 58162 sample households from 4871 sample blocks (including 6363 sample households selected from 534 sample blocks in the 4 big cities of Bombay, Calcutta, Delhi and Madras) in the urban areas were surveyed in this round. The present report relates to central sample only.

1·4 In this round all the states and union territories (included in the geographical coverage except Chandigarh participated in the survey on at least equal matching basis.

2· CONCEPTS AND DEFINITIONS

2·1 The concepts and definition followed in the consumer expenditure enquiry continue to remain broadly the same as in earlier rounds. Some of these concepts and definitions are explained below:

2·2 *Household* : A household is a group of persons normally living together and taking food from a common kitchen. A boarding house, a hotel or a hostel is treated as a cluster of households, where each individual boarder (with his dependents or guests) forms a separate household. Households maintained and fed directly by government, such as those in prisons, police quarter, cantonments, hospitals, asylums, relief camps are however, excluded from the scope of the survey.

2·3 *Household member* : Any person who is a normal resident of the sample household considered to be a member of the household. Household members are grouped into three categories viz., adult male, adult female and child. One who has already attained the age of 15 (in completed years) is considered as an adult.

*The results of the NSS 27th and 28th rounds of survey on Consumer Expenditure were published in *Sarvekshana vol. II No. 3* and in *Vol. I No. 1* respectively.

2.4 Household size : The total number of members (as defined above) in a household is considered to be the size of the household.

2.5 Household consumer expenditure : Consumer expenditure comprises all expenditure incurred by the household, exclusively on domestic account, including consumption out of home-grown produce or transfer receipts like gift, loan etc. The expenditure on household enterprise is excluded from consumer expenditure. While consumption out of transfer receipts is included, transfer payments of all kinds (loans, gifts, charities, monetary as well as in kind, like grain loan etc.) are excluded. Expenditures on purchase and construction of residential houses are considered to be expenses on capital account and hence are excluded from the consumer expenditure; but the expenditure towards maintenance of residential building is included in the consumer expenditure of the household. Monetary value of food articles consumed during the reference period is taken to represent consumer expenditure on food articles. For semi-durable and durable goods, the actual expenditure incurred towards purchase of these articles acquired

during the reference period is considered as the consumer expenditure of the articles. For items of clothing & footwear there is slight departure from earlier rounds. Monetary value of articles (other than meant for gift etc.) acquired during the reference period (even though not used) is taken as the consumer expenditure on the articles concerned.

2.6 Consumer unit : The consumer unit number for a person of a sex-age group is an index number representing his/her requirement of energy in relation to that for the reference man. A man belonging to the age group 20-39 is considered as the reference man and his energy requirement is one consumer unit.

2.7 Reference period : The reference period for collection of data on all items of consumer expenditure is last 30 days (ending on the day preceding the date of enquiry). In addition for items of clothing & footwear, durable goods and some items of miscellaneous goods & services, data have been collected for a reference period of last 365 days also. In the present report the data relating to the reference period of 30 days have been presented.

3. EXPLANATORY NOTES ON TABLES

3.1 The report contains three distinct types of tables for each state and union territory of India as also for all-India. Separate sets of tables are presented for the respective rural and urban areas. The contents of the tables are described below.

3.2 *Table 1 series* give the distribution of (i) no. of sample households, (ii) percentage of estimated no. of households, persons, consumer unit (iii) average household size (adult male, adult female and children) and (iv) total consumer units per household by monthly per-capita expenditure classes.

3.3 *Table 2 series* give quantity and value of consumption of cereals per person for period of 30 days by monthly per capita expenditure classes.

3.4 *Table 3 series* give value of consumption of broad groups of items per person for a period of 30 days by monthly per-capita expenditure classes. Estimates are given for 21 broad groups of items. The groups are (1) cereals; (2) gram; (3) cereal substitute; (4) pulse and products; (5) milk and products; (6) edible oil; (7) meat egg and fish; (8) vegetables; (9) fruits and nuts; (10) sugar; (11) salt; (12) spices; (13) beverages and refreshments; (14) pan, tobacco & intoxicants; (15) fuel and light; (16) clothing; (17) foot-wear; (18) miscellaneous goods and services (including rents and taxes); and (19) durable goods. Apart from this, estimates on (20) rents and (21) taxes have been shown separately also. The results are presented also for (i) food-total; (ii) non-food total and (iii) total consumer expenditure.

3.5. Monthly per capita expenditure classes : Estimates have been given by monthly per-capita expenditure classes in rupees, arranged in ascending order of magnitude. The expenditure levels are grouped into the following 16 classes (15 classes for the rural areas) :—

4. A BROAD OUTLINE OF THE SAMPLING DESIGN AND ESTIMATION PROCEDURE

4.1. Broad design : The sample design is a stratified two stage one : the first-stage units are villages in the rural sector and blocks in the urban sector and the second stage units are households in both the sectors.

4.2. Formation of strata : For the purpose of stratifications, the country was first divided into 73 agro-economic regions by grouping contiguous districts of similar agricultural profile—the number of regions in a state/union territory varying from one to five. "Basic strata" were formed within regions based on districts as follows. Each district with less than 1·5 million 1971 census rural population forms one basic stratum by itself except in Gujarat and Arunachal Pradesh where some districts with less than 1·5 million population have been divided into two or more basic strata. A district with more than 1·5 million 1971 census rural population has been divided into a number of basic strata, depending on its rural population by grouping contiguous tehsils, homogeneous as far as possible with respect to rural population density and crop pattern. Basic strata so formed have been treated as the strata for sampling for both rural and urban sectors. In the urban sector, however, some of the basic strata having very small urban population have been merged together to form the ultimate urban strata. Total number of rural and urban strata are 516 and 386 respectively.

4.3 Allocation : The all India sample of 8820 villages and 4940 urban blocks were allocated to the states/union territories considering the field strength and rural and urban populations of each. Within each state and union territory these have been further allocated to the rural and urban strata in proportion to their 1971 census rural and urban population respectively. The final allocations of strata have been so adjusted as to make them a multiple of 4 at the stratum level and a

multiple of 8 at the region level.

4.4 Sampling of villages : In each rural basic stratum the allocated number of villages have been selected with probability proportional to population and with replacement. The frame used was the 1971 census list of villages. This procedure however, was not followed for the north-eastern region.

4.5 Sampling of villages—N E region : In the North-Eastern region clusters of villages formed around some 'nucleus' villages were selected for survey. These nucleus villages were selected systematically with equal probability. A cluster consisted of 4 villages, in general, but did not exceed 6 in any case. In Manipur (plains) stratum, clusters were not formed. All the allocated villages were selected in one step systematically with equal probability.

4.6 Sampling of urban blocks : In each urban stratum, the allocated number of sample blocks were selected with probability proportional to size (a measure of population) and with replacement. The same procedure was followed for the North-Eastern region also. The frame used was Urban Frame Survey (UFS) blocks in cities and towns where UFS had been done and 1971 census blocks elsewhere.

4.7 Sampling of households (rural) : All the households of a sample village were arranged into the following means of livelihood classes—(1) self-employed in non-agriculture, (2) rural labour and (3) others. A sample of 12 households was selected circular systematically from the arranged frame. In the North-Eastern region, if a cluster consisted of L villages then 24/L households were selected in the above manner from each village of that cluster.

4.8 Sampling of households (urban) : In a sample block, the sampling frame was prepared by arranging the households into 4 classes on the basis of their nature of employment (self-employed, not self-employed) and their per-capita expenditure level (less or greater than the pre-assigned per-capita expenditure for the state). As in the case of villages, 12 households were selected circular systematically from this frame.

4.9 Survey period and sub-rounds : The survey was started in July 1977 and completed in June 1978. The entire survey period of one year was divided into 4 sub-rounds each of three months' duration, coinciding approximately with the 4

agricultural seasons. The sub-round periods are :

- Sub-round 1 : July to September, 1977;
- Sub-round 2 : October to December, 1977;
- Sub-round 3 : January to March 1978;
- Sub-round 4 : April to June, 1978.

The sample villages & blocks were distributed over the 4-sub-rounds in equal numbers so as to provide equally valid estimates for each of the sub-round separately.

4.10 Estimation Procedure : The estimate of the aggregate of any characteristic y for a state/union territory was obtained as follows :

where $M_r = \frac{P_r}{p_r}$ where P_r is the projected rural/urban population of rth region* and p_r is the number of sample persons in the rural/urban area of that region (i.e. p_r is the sum of the households sizes of all the surveyed households).

R = number of regions in the state

h_r = number of surveyed households in r-th region

y_{ri} = value of y for the i-th household of r-th region.

Although the sampling design was not strictly self-weighting the procedure used for estimation assumed that the multipliers were uniform for each region/sector.

4.11 Estimate of Ratios : Estimate of a ratio of two characteristics is given by the ratio of the estimates of their aggregates.

5. SUMMARY OF FINDINGS

5.1 In this section some important findings are presented to give a broad comparative picture of the composition and consumption pattern of the households.

5.2 Distribution of households by monthly per capita expenditure (MPCE) class : The percentage distribution of households and the household size by monthly per-capita expenditure class over NSS rounds (27th, 28th & 32nd) are presented

in Table 1. The distribution of households quite perceptably changed in passing from 27th round to 28th round to 32nd round. In the first two expenditure groups, there was a sharp fall from 27th to 28th round and again another from 28th to 32nd round. From the third expenditure group i.e. from 34—100, the trend was reversed which continued ever afterwards. This indicates that households belonging to lower per-capita expenditure classes at the earlier round were spending more money towards consumption at later round and thereby moved up to the higher expenditure class. This might be primarily due to increase in general price level and cost of living. Thus in the rural areas the percentage of households spending less than

Rs. 100 per person per month, decreased from 95% in 27th round to 92% in 28th round and declined further to 85% in the 32nd round. It is worthwhile to note that in any round the capacity to spend more than Rs. 100 per person greatly diminished resulting in very steep decline in the percentage of households from per-capita class 35—100 to 100—150. What has been observed for rural areas also holds good for the urban areas, the only difference being that in urban areas, percentage of households in higher expenditure class was more. Thus percentage of households with per-capita expenditure of Rs. 100 or more, were 21, 26 and 40 in urban areas and only 5, 8 and 15 in the rural areas, over the three survey rounds.

5.3 Average size of household by MPCE class : The table also shows the average number of persons per household over the rounds. The all-India rural and urban average household sizes in 32nd round were 5.22 and 4.88 respectively. And there was not much difference in these figures over the rounds. In general the rural household size was larger than the urban and also with the rise in per-capita expenditure the household size declined. In general, while the 'average' rural household was larger in size compared to its urban counterpart, the usual tendency of the size to gradually fall with increasing per-capita expenditure is observed in all the three rounds considered.

5.4 Pattern of consumer expenditure : In Table 2 is given the consumer expenditure on some broad groups of items and their percentages to total expenditure in Table 3 at all-India level for the three rounds 22, 27 and 32. These three annual surveys were carried out during July '67—June '68, October '72—September '73 and July '77—June '78 respectively. It is found that the expenditures of all the items have increased over the rounds (except for gram and cereal substitute in rural areas) beginning from the 22nd round for both the rural and urban areas, as may be expected due to the price rise in general. Thus the consumer expenditure on total-food has risen from about Rs. 26 in 22nd round to

Rs. 32 in 27th round to Rs. 44 in 32nd round in rural areas. The corresponding rise in urban areas has been from about Rs. 30 in 22nd round to Rs. 41 in 27th round to Rs. 58 in 32nd round. In terms of percentage, there has been a substantial fall in the proportion of expenditure on food over the 5-year range from 77 percent in 22nd round to 73 percent in 27th round and to 64 percent in 32nd round. The corresponding figures for urban areas are 67 percent, 64 percent and 60 percent. In the food group, the items attracting more expenditures are milk products, pulses, vegetables and edible oil in both the rural and urban areas. It may be noted, however, that while, in general, there is a fall in percentage expenditure on the items of food, for vegetables, fruits and nuts and meat, fish and egg,

there is rise in the percentage expenditure over rounds. Contrary to what has been found for food items in general, the expenditure on non-food items has increased over the said rounds both in absolute terms and in terms of percentages. The main items of expenditure in non-food group are miscellaneous goods and services, clothing, durable goods and fuel and light.

The percentage of expenditure on durable goods is observed to be considerably high in the NSS 32nd round. The expenditure on durable goods is also found to be quite high in the rural areas of Maharashtra, Madhya Pradesh, Rajasthan, Manipur and some other States. Further scrutiny of these results would be necessary to assess the quality of the results.

5.5 *Consumption of cereals* : The per-capita quantity of consumption of major cereals is shown in Table 4 for the three latest rounds of NSS surveys on consumer expenditure—27th, 28th and 32nd.

Excepting for a slight improvement in per-capita quantity of consumption of cereals in the 32nd round, the overall pattern of consumption over the five year period seems to be fairly stable.

प्रस्तावना

1.0 पशुगति सांखिकों के अन्तरालों को भरने के उद्देश्य से, राष्ट्रीय प्रतिदर्श सर्वेक्षण संगठन की शासी परिवद ने पशुधन तथा पशुधन उद्यमों के विभिन्न पहचानों पर पूछताछ करने के लिए रा० प्र० सर्वे० का सम्पूर्ण 30वां दौर (जुलाई 1975 जून 1976) लगाने का नियंत्रण किया है। संचया, उत्पादों और उद्यमों से सम्बन्धित विभिन्न विशेषताओं के साथ-साथ पशुधन उत्पादों की खरपते से सम्बन्धित सूचना भी इस सर्वेक्षण में एकत्रित की गयी थी। घरेलू डेरी उद्यम, जिसमें घरेलू खेत के पशुधन उद्यम भी शामिल हैं, से सम्बन्धित अनुमानों पर एक प्रारूप रिपोर्ट संख्या 288/1 पहुँचे ही प्रकाशित की जा चुकी थी। घरेलू डेरी उद्यमों की कुछेक प्रमुख विशेषताओं से सम्बन्धित एक टिप्पणी भी संख्या 3, वा० ३ संख्या 4, अप्रैल 1980 में प्रकाशित की गयी। इस रिपोर्ट में बहुत हुक्कुट उद्यमों के विभिन्न पहचानों पर अनुमान प्रस्तुत किए गए हैं।

कार्यक्रम, व्याप्ति, प्रतिदर्श आकार तथा श्रेणीय कार्य

1.1 पशुधन मुद्रा तथा उत्पादों पर संख्य सर्वेक्षण सम्पूर्ण भारत में केने 18,856 गांवों और 20,440 शहरी खण्डों में किया गया था। यद्यपि, केंद्रीय प्रतिदर्श, जिसमें 8512 गांव तथा 9744 खण्ड शामिल थे, की जांच रा० प्र० सर्वे० सं० के लेवे० संकार्य प्रभाग द्वारा की गयी, शेष प्रतिदर्श गांवों और शहरी खण्डों का सर्वेक्षण तुल्यता के आधार पर विभिन्न राज्य सांखिकीय प्रभिकरणों के लेवीय कर्मचारियों द्वारा किया गया था।

1.2 इस सर्वेक्षण के उद्देश्य के लिए, उस परिवार को, कुक्कुट उद्यम के रूप में समझा गया था यदि सूचीबद्ध करने की तारीख को जिसके पास 20 अवधि उससे अधिक कुक्कुट पक्षी (मुर्गी, बत्तबों तथा अन्य कुक्कुट पक्षियों को एक साथ लेने) थे। यद्यपि, उन कुक्कुट उद्यमों को जिन्हें भारतीय कारबाह का विनियम, 1948 की धारा 23(1) अथवा 25(II) के अन्तर्दृष्टि पंक्तोंहत किया गया था, को इस सर्वेक्षण में शामिल नहीं किया गया था। प्रतिदर्श गांव/वा० ३ में हुक्कुट उद्यमों (आरदों गयी परिमात्रा के अनुसार) के लिए आवेदन देने वाले सभी परिवारों का सर्वेक्षण किया गया।

1.3 केंद्रीय प्रतिदर्श में, सर्वेक्षित कुल प्रतिदर्श, गांवों और खण्डों में से केनल 1376 प्रतिदर्श गांवों और 772 प्रतिदर्श खण्डों ने अखिल भारतीय स्तर पर घरेलू कुक्कुट उद्यमों के लिए आवेदन दिए हैं। प्रतिदर्श गांवों और खण्डों में परिवर्गित कुक्कुट उद्यम परिवारों की संख्या क्रमशः 2794 तथा 1085 थी।

1.4 हुक्कुट उद्यम परिवारों के लिए अपनायी गयी परिमापा से, "सकल गांवों" को उपरोक्त गांवों समित हो जाती है। अतः महत्वपूर्ण आर्थिक गुणांक, दरों तथा प्रतिदर्श अनुपातों के रूप में इस रिपोर्ट में प्रस्तुत किए गए हैं।

प्रस्तुत की गयी सारणियों पर व्याख्यात्मक टिप्पणी

1.5 राज्य तथा समस्त भारत स्तर पर घरेलू कुक्कुट उद्यमों की विभिन्न विशेषताएं दर्शाने वाली नौ तालिकाओं का एक सेट ग्रामीण तथा शहरी खेतों के लिए अवगत-प्रज्ञय प्रस्तुत किया गया है। समस्त भारत तथा राज्य अनुमान केनल केंद्रीय प्रतिदर्श के आंकड़ों पर आधारित हैं।

1.6 तालिकाओं की संख्या गिनते के लिए निम्नलिखित पद्धति अपनायी गई है, सबसे बांधी तरफ की तालिका की क्रम संख्या को दर्शाती है।

तथा वर्षे से प्रथम बिन्दु के पश्चात् अंक 1 और 2 खेत को अर्थात् उद्यम: ग्रामीण तथा शहरी को दर्शाते हैं। अलग-अलग राज्यों तथा संघ शास्त्र खेतों को उनके अलग-अलग नामों के क्रम से वर्णक्रम के अनुसार व्यवरित किया जाता है और अलग-अलग सारणिया संगत सारणी संख्या "जारी" के सारणी शीर्षक के साथ प्रस्तुत की गई है।

1.7 सारणी (1) जांच किए गए कुक्कुट उद्यमों और कुक्कुट दृष्टि परिवारों की संख्या के लिए आवेदन देने वाले प्रतिदर्श गांवों/खण्डों की संख्या प्रदान करती है। सारणी 2 और 3 सभी परिवारों के सन्दर्भ में कुक्कुट उद्यम परिवारों का अनुपात दर्शाती है तथा सभी कुक्कुट उद्यम परिवारों के हृष्टमें प्रमुख व्यवसाय के रूप में कुक्कुट रखने वाले परिवारों का अनुपात भी दर्शाता है। कुक्कुट उद्यम में प्रति कार्य दिवस पर भाड़े पर लगाए गए कार्मिकों की औसतन संख्या भी सारणी 3 में दर्शायी गयी है। सारणी—4 कुक्कुट उद्यमों में भाड़े पर लिए गए तथा परिवारिक अम दिवस की प्रतिशत अनुपात तथा प्रतिमास प्रति उद्यम परिवार में सेवा प्रभारों का औसत मूल्य तथा अन्य स्वर्च दर्शाती है। सारणी 5 प्रति उद्यम परिवार की परिसम्पत्तियों का अंतर्गत मूल्य (स्वामित्व अथवा भाड़े पर) तथा आवेदन देने वाले प्रति परिवार बकाया ज्ञान भी दर्शाती है। यद्यपि सारणी 6 मुर्गा तथा मुर्गी और बत्तबों के लिए अलग कुक्कुट पालन खेत के आकार के अनुसार प्रति उद्यम परिवार के स्वामित्व में कुक्कुट पक्षियों की संख्या तथा मूल्य दर्शाती है, सारणी 7 में कुक्कुट पालन खेत की श्रेणी के अनुसार वर्गीकृत मुर्गी तथा बत्तबों के लिए इलग प्रति उद्यम परिवार प्रति सप्ताह उत्पादित और बेचे गए अप्टों की संख्या और मूल्य दर्शाएं गए हैं। सारणी 8 कुक्कुट पालन खेत के आकार की श्रेणी के अनुसार प्रतिमास प्रति उद्यम मुर्गी दाने की ब्यपत की ब्याता तथा मूल्य दर्शाती है। अन्त में, सारणी 9 मुर्गी दाने की मदों के अनुसार प्रतिमास प्रति कुक्कुट उद्यम मुर्गी दाने की ब्यपत का औसतन मूल्य प्रदान कर सकती है।

2. सर्वेक्षण के महत्वपूर्ण निष्कर्ष

यह खण्ड घरेलू कुक्कुट उद्यमों की कुछेक महत्वपूर्ण विशेषताओं से सम्बन्धित है जैसे कि उद्यम का आकार, अप्टों का उत्पादन तथा दिक्षी, अम वा उपयोग, परिसम्पत्तियां तथा अनुग्रहस्तता की स्थिति तथा उद्यम परिवारों द्वारा मुर्गी दाने की ब्यपत की ब्याता तथा मूल्य दर्शाती है। अत्यधिक भारतीय अनुमानों तक सीमित है। तथापि उपर्युक्त पहलुओं पर विभिन्न राज्यों द्वारा प्रदर्शित भिन्नताओं की सीमा पर भी विचार किया गया है।

2.1 उद्यम परिवार: ग्रामीण परिवारों, विशेष कर लघू तथा मध्यम किसानों की आय तथा रोजगार को बढ़ाने के लिए कुक्कुट पालन। सभी व्यापक को राष्ट्रीय कृषि आयोग द्वारा मान्यता दी गयी है। तथापि, सर्वेक्षण के परिणाम सकेत देते हैं कि कुक्कुट पालन अधिकांश परिवारों द्वारा व्यय साध्य के रूप से शुरू नहीं किया गया था। अतः खर्च साधारण तौर पर ग्रामीण तथा शहरी खेतों के लिए अखिल भारतीय अनुमानों तक सीमित है। तथापि उपर्युक्त पहलुओं पर विभिन्न राज्यों द्वारा प्रदर्शित भिन्नताओं की सीमा पर भी विचार किया गया है।

2.2 भारत के ग्रामीण खेत में, 48,35,900 अनुमानित परिवारों की कुल संख्या में से केवल 0.31 प्रतिशत के पास 20 [अथवा इससे अधिक कुक्कुट पक्षी है। अतः सर्वेक्षण के लिए अपनायी गयी कुक्कुट उद्यम की

परिवारों के अनुसार कुकुट उद्यम में कुछ प्रतिशत परिवार ही कुकुट उद्यमों में लगे हुए हैं। इसके अतिरिक्त, इनमें से अधिकांश उद्यम परिवार इन उद्यमों को सहकारी रूप से चलाते हैं इसलिए मुर्गी पालन को कुकुट उद्यम परिवारों में से केवल 5.63 प्रतिशत के सम्बन्ध में ही प्रमुख व्यवसाय के रूप में सूचित किया गया है (संदर्भ: सारणी 3.1) 1 भूस्वामित्व वाले वर्गों के सभी परिवारों के सन्दर्भ में उद्यम परिवारों का प्रतिशत अनुपात जैसा कि सारणी (एस-1) में दिया गया है कि उपर्युक्त प्रतिशत अनुपात निम्न वर्ग के परिवारों की तुलना में उच्च परिवारों में अधिक है जो यह संकेत देता है कि मुर्गी पालन ने छोटे तथा मध्यम किसानों पर बहुत कम प्रभाव डाला है।

2.3 शहरी क्षेत्रों में मुर्गी पालन उद्यमों के सम्बन्ध में कुल स्थिति, प्रामीण क्षेत्र की स्थिति की अपेक्षा कम सन्तोषजनक है। समस्त भारत स्तर पर, सम्पूर्ण परिवारों के सम्बन्ध में मुर्गी पालन उद्यम परिवारों का प्रतिशत अनुपात 0.10 है। तथापि, प्रामीण क्षेत्र की तुलना में इस क्षेत्र में अनुपालिक अनुपात 0.10 है। सारणी 3.2 से पता चलता है कि शहरी क्षेत्र में सभी कुकुट उद्यम हैं। सारणी 3.2 से पता चलता है कि शहरी क्षेत्र में सभी कुकुट उद्यम को प्रमुख व्यवसाय के रूप में अपनाने परिवारों की तुलना में कुकुट उद्यम परिवारों को प्रमुख व्यवसाय के रूप में अपनाने परिवारों का प्रतिशत अनुपात 11.53 है। परिवारिक मासिक प्रतिशत वाले परिवारों का प्रतिशत अनुपात 11.53 है। परिवारिक मासिक प्रतिशत वाले वर्गों में उपर्युक्त प्रतिशत अनुपात की बढ़ती हुई प्रवृत्ति दर्शाती है तथा इसके पश्चात् यह लगभग समान रही।

2.4 सारणी 2.1 तथा 2.2 से पता चलता है कि सभी परिवारों की तुलना में प्रामीण क्षेत्र में कुकुट उद्यम परिवारों का प्रतिशत अनुपात मेघालय (2.67), मणिपुर (1.62), असम (1.25), महाराष्ट्र (0.79) और पश्चिम बंगाल 0.60 और यह शहरी क्षेत्रों में जम्मू तथा कश्मीर 0-78, मणिपुर (0.57), मेघालय (0.45), केरल (0.43) और उड़ीसा (0.22) की तुलना में अधिक है। तथापि, यह प्रतीत होता है कि हरियाणा के उद्यम परिवार तथा कुछ हद तक पंजाब के उद्यम परिवार अन्य राज्यों के परिवारों के मुकाबले में इस उद्यम को अधिक व्यापारिक दर देखा रखते हैं। हरियाणा में, प्रामीण तथा शहरी क्षेत्रों में कुकुट उद्यम परिवारों में से क्रमशः 39.93 और 50.00 प्रतिशत परिवार इस उद्यम को अपने प्रमुख व्यवसाय के रूप में चला रहे हैं। पंजाब के दो क्षेत्रों के लिए उपर्युक्त प्रतिशत अनुपात क्रमशः 14.04 और 30.18 है।

2.5 किराये के तथा परिवारिक कामगार : विद्यमान परिस्थिति में, यह प्राशा करना असंभव नहीं होगा कि कुकुट उद्यम, परिवारिक सदस्यों अद्यता भाइ के कामगारों को कम रोजगार प्रदान करेगा। प्रामीण तथा शहरी क्षेत्रों में एक उद्यम में प्रति कार्यदिवस पर कामगारों की ओसतन संख्या क्रमशः 1.35 तथा 1.48 पर्याप्त नहीं है। स्पष्टतया, ये उद्यम मुख्यतः परिवारिक अधिकों द्वारा चलाए जाते हैं। आंकड़े सारणी 1.2, कालम 5, अन्तिम वंशित में दिए गए आंकड़ों से भिन्न हैं क्योंकि चण्डीगढ़ के प्रतिदर्श खण्डों में किसी कुकुट उद्यम की स्थिति नहीं दी गयी थी जहां चण्डीगढ़ के लिए परिवारों की अनुमानित संख्या 641 है। भाइ पर दिलाए गए अधिक दिवसों का प्रतिशत अनुपात कुल अधिक दिवसों के मुकाबले में समस्त भारत स्तर पर प्रामीण क्षेत्रों में 6.03 है। इसकी तुलना में, शहरी क्षेत्र में उद्यम परिवार भाइ पर लिए गए अधिक अधिकों का ध्येय करते हैं तथा उक्त प्रतिशत अनुपात शहरी भारत में 9.57 पाया गया है। (संदर्भ सारणी 4.1 और 4.2) 1

2.6 उद्यम का आकार : सारणी 6.1 से देखा गया है कि सामान्यतः कुकुट उद्यम क्षेत्र का आकार बड़ा जाने पर कुकुट उद्यम में प्रत्येक एकी का मूल्य बड़ा जाता है। समस्त भारत स्तर पर ग्रामीण क्षेत्र में, एक उद्यम परिवार के पास ओसतन लगभग 48 कुकुट पक्षी होते हैं। कुकुट उद्यमों के आकार वर्ग में नकुकुट उद्यम परिवारों की संख्या का प्रतिशत वितरण यह दर्शाता है कि उद्यम परिवारों में से 67 प्रतिशत के पास 20 से 29 पक्षी तथा अन्य 16 प्रतिशत के पास 30 से 39 के बीच पक्षी हैं। राज्यों में, पंजाब, हरियाणा तथा गुजरात; उद्यम परिवारों द्वारा प्राप्त कुकुट पक्षियों की ओसत

संबंधी क्रमशः 255, 190 तथा 120 में जो अन्य राज्यों की तुलना में बहुत अधिक है। पंजाब और हरियाणा में कुकुट उद्यम परिवारों के उच्चतम वर्ग उद्यम परिवार का प्रतिशत अधिक से अधिक 42 और 36 प्रतिशत ठहरता है अर्थात् "10 और 10 से अधिक"। गजरात के मामले में, यद्यपि केवल लगभग 13 प्रतिशत उद्यम परिवार 100 और इससे अधिक की श्रेणी में हैं फिर भी पंजाब तथा हरियाणा में क्रमशः 564 और 459 के मुकाबले में कुकुट उद्यम की उच्चतम श्रेणी में प्रति उद्यम परिवार में कुकुट पक्षियों की औसतन संख्या 716 पाई गयी है।

2.7 ग्रामीण क्षेत्र की तुलना में, प्रति उद्यम कुकुट पक्षियों की औसत संख्या शहरी क्षेत्रों में बहुत कुछ अधिक है। समस्त भारत स्तर पर, उपर्युक्त औसत लगभग 94 देखा गया है। इसके अतिरिक्त, कुकुट उद्यम परिवारों के लगभग 51 प्रतिशत के पास 20-29 पक्षी हैं तथा अन्य 14 प्रतिशत के पास 30-39 के बीच। राज्यों में, हरियाणा ने मुर्गी-पालल में बहुत ज्यादा प्रगति की है क्योंकि प्रत्येक उद्यम के पास उपलब्ध पक्षियों की औसत संख्या 1801 है। यद्यपि, पंजाब इस सम्बन्ध में हरियाणा से धीमे है, जहां औसतन एक उद्यम परिवार में केवल 367 पक्षी हैं। सारणी 6.2 में देखा जाता है कि हरियाणा में 100 और इससे अधिक के कुकुट उद्यम परिवार वर्ग के मुकाबले उद्यम परिवारों की अप्रत्याशित रूप से उच्च प्रतिशतका (76) सूचित की है। यहां यह भी उल्लेखनीय है कि हरियाणा के शहरी क्षेत्र में 144 में से केवल 6 प्रतिदर्श खण्डों किसी कुकुट उद्यम की रिपोर्ट दी है। इसके अतिरिक्त, यद्यपि किसी शहरी खण्ड में औसतन 150 परिवार हैं, जिसमें से इकट्ठे किए गए सभी 6 प्रतिदर्श खण्डों में से केवल 8 परिवारों ने कुकुट उद्यमों के लिए आवेदन दिया है। सन्दर्भ सारणी 1.2) उनमें से कुछेक के पास बहुत अधिक अर्थात् औसतन 1801 कुकुट पक्षी हैं।

2.8 अंडों का उत्पादन तथा विक्री:—सारणी 7.1 तथा सारणी 7.2 में देखा गया है कि शहरी क्षेत्र में किसी उद्यम में प्रति सप्ताह तैयार किए गए अंडों की औसतन संख्या ग्रामीण क्षेत्र के कुकुट उद्यम क्षेत्र के प्रत्येक आकार कोण्डों की अपेक्षा बहुत अधिक है जबकि बत्तख के अंडों के मामले में यह स्थिति विकल्पित है। समस्त भारत स्तर पर ग्रामीण उद्यम परिवार, औसतन प्रति सप्ताह 53 मुर्गी के अंडों और 5 बत्तख के अंडे तैयार करता है, जबकि शहरी क्षेत्र में संगत आंकड़े 199 और 2 हैं। इस प्रकार यह स्पष्ट है कि जहां तक अंडों के कुल उत्पादन का सम्बन्ध है, बत्तख का योगदान केरल, आंध्र प्रदेश और असम को छोड़कर नगद्य है तथा मुर्गी के अंडों के साथ-साथ बत्तख के अंडों के निर्माण और विक्री के सम्बन्ध में भी।

2.16 सारणी (एस 6) के अनुमान स्पष्ट करते हैं कि शहरी क्षेत्र में कुकुट खाद्य की प्रत्येक मद के लिए उपयुक्त मात्रा ग्रामीण क्षेत्र की मात्रा की अपेक्षा बहुत अधिक है। उपयुक्त कुल मात्रा दो गांवों से आती है अर्थात् घर में तैयार किए गए स्टाक और खरीदे गए। ग्रामीण तथा शहरी क्षेत्रों के बीच, यद्यपि भोजन की प्रत्येक मद के लिए, घर में तैयार किए गए स्टाक की उपयुक्त मात्रा ग्रामीण क्षेत्र में अधिक है, खरीदे गए खाद्य की मात्रा शहरी क्षेत्र में बहुत अधिक है।

2.17 इस सन्दर्भ में वह नोट किया जाए कि सारणी की मद "अन्य खाद्यों व चारा, हरी धास, धास-फूस, खली, रोटी हुई दाल, भूसी, छिलका, तिलहन, मुँड़, नमक, अन्य खाद्य पदार्थ, दवाईयों सहित अन्य रसायन शामिल है। आशा के विपरीत, "अन्य खाद्यों के विपरीत खपत का औसतन मूल्य बहुत अधिक पाया गया है। चूंकि कई कुकुट उद्यम परिवारों में कुछ डेरी पशु तथा अन्य पशुधन प्राप्त करलेने की सम्भावना है, अतः यह संभाव्य नहीं है कि इन पशुओं के लिए चारा खरीदने पर किए गए खर्च को गलती से कुकुट उद्यम पर खर्च किए जाने की रिपोर्ट में शामिल किया गया हो।

प्रतिदर्श अभिकल्प एवं आकलन पद्धति

3.1 प्रतिदर्श अभिकल्प : राष्ट्रीय प्रतिदर्श सर्वेक्षण के तेरहवें दौर में सामान्य प्रतिदर्श अभिकल्प द्वि चरणीय चयन के साथ स्वीकृत किया गया था, प्रथम चरण एक गांव/खण्ड है और दूसरा चरण एक परिवार है।

3.2 प्रतिदर्श आकार (केन्द्रीय प्रतिदर्श) : केन्द्रीय प्रतिदर्श में 8512 गांव और 9744 खण्ड थे।

3.3 कार्य विषयक योजना : 12 महीने (जुलाई 1975 से जून 1976 तक) की सर्वेक्षण अवधि को प्रति तीन महीने के हिसाब से चार उप-दौरों में विभाजित किया गया है। प्रतिदर्श गांवों और खण्डों की संख्या प्रत्येक स्तर के चार उपदौरों के प्रत्येक दौर में बराबर थी।

ग्रामीण प्रतिदर्श अभिकल्प

3.4.1 प्रतिचयन ढांचा :—1971 की जनगणना के अनुसार ग्रामीण क्षेत्र में चयन के लिए प्रयोग किया गया ढांचा गांवों की सूची थी।

3.4.2 स्तरीकरण : समस्त भारत को अनेक आधार भूत संस्तरों में विभाजित किया गया था ताकि आधारभूत संस्तर किले की सीमाओं का उलंघन न करें। वर्ष 1971 में हुई जनगणना के अनुसार 15 लाख से अधिक ग्रामीण जनसंख्या वाले जिलों को (अथवा बिहार, उड़ीसा एवं पश्चिम बंगाल उपप्रभाग) निकटवर्ती जिलों को जहां तक संभव था ग्रामीण जनसंख्या की संबन्धता एवं फसल प्रतिदर्श के लिए समान रूप से समूहीकृत करते हुए दो अथवा उससे अधिक के आधारभूत संस्तरों में विभाजित किया गया था ताकि प्रत्येक आधारभूत संस्तरण की जनसंख्या 15 लाख से कम हो। 1971 की जनगणना के अनुसार प्रत्येक जिले में 15 लाख से कम ग्रामीण जनसंख्या, गुजरात के अतिरिक्त जहां 15 लाख से कम ग्रामीण जनसंख्या वाले कुछ जिलों को राज्य की आदिवासी जनसंख्या एवं सूखा अस्त क्षेत्रों के संकेतण के विचार-विमर्श पर आधारभूत संस्तरों में विभाजित किया गया था, अपने माप में एक आधारभूत संस्तर का निर्माण करती थी। इस प्रकार से निर्मित संस्तरों के ग्रामीण व शहरी दोनों ही क्षेत्रों में आधारभूत संस्तर के केन्द्र में माना गया था। 374 जिलों में से 366 जिले राष्ट्रीय प्रतिदर्श सर्वेक्षण की सर्वेक्षण व्याप्ति के अन्दर थे। बानाए गए आधार भूत संस्तरों की संख्या ग्रामीण क्षेत्र में 520 थी।

3.4.3 आवंटन :—विभिन्न राज्यों एवं संघ शासित क्षेत्रों को गांवों के अखिल भारतीय प्रतिदर्श के आधार पर उनके अवेषकों की संख्या एवं ग्रामीण जनसंख्या को ध्यान में रखते हुए आवंटित किया गया है। प्रत्येक राज्य एवं संघ शासित क्षेत्र के अन्तर्गत खण्डों की आवंटित संख्या को उनकी शहरी जनसंख्या के अनुपात में संघटक आधार भूत संस्तरण में वितरित किया गया था। इन आवंटकों को चार का गुणक बनाया गया था।

3.4.4 गांवों का चयन :—गांवों का चयन करने के लिए प्रतिचयन ढांचे के रूप में वर्ष 1971 की जनगणना पर आधारित गांवों की सूची को प्रयोग में लाया गया था। प्रत्येक आधारभूत संस्तरण में प्रतिदर्श गांवों को दो स्वतंत्र उप-प्रतिदर्शों के रूप में वर्ष 1971 में हुई जनगणना के समानपाती सम्भावित द्वारा तथा प्रतिस्थापन द्वारा चना गया।

ग्रामीण क्षेत्र में प्रथम चरण प्रतिचयन एक और सर्वेक्षण एक भी जनगणना गांव ही था। कुछ मामलों में प्रतिदर्शित जनगणना गांव संगत राजस्व गांवों से भिन्न थे। इसके बावजूद भी यदि प्रतिदर्शित जनगणना गांव का स्पष्ट रूप से पता लगा तो उसका सर्वेक्षण किया गया। अन्यथा यदि प्रतिदर्शित जनगणना गांव में पूर्ण रूप से अथवा आंशिक रूप से अथवा अधिक राजस्व गांव हुए तो इन सभी राजस्व गांवों को मिलाकर सर्वेक्षण एक के रूप में माना गया था। दूसरी तरफ, यदि प्रतिदर्शित जनगणना गांव पूर्ण रूप से उस बड़े राजस्व गांव शामिल किया जाता, जिसमें अब राजस्व गांव पूर्ण रूप से अथवा आंशिक रूप से शामिल थे तो वडे राजस्व गांव का सर्वेक्षण किया गया।

अधिक जनसंख्या वाले प्रतिदर्श गांवों के मामले में किसी गांव में गठित उप-प्रभागों में से एक (जिसको याटूचिक्कि आधार पर चुना गया था) का सर्वेक्षण किया गया जिसको लगभग बराबर जनसंख्या वाले खण्डों समूह कहा गया।

3.4.5 प्रतिदर्श परिवारों का चयन :—भारतीय कारखाना अधिनियम की धारा 2क (1) अथवा 2क(II) के अधीन पंजीकृत परिवारों को छोड़कर उन परिवारों को चुना गया था। सर्वेक्षण की तारीख को जिनके पास 20 अथवा उससे अधिक कुकुट पक्षी (मुर्गी बतख और अन्य कुकुट पक्षियों को मिलाकर) थे।

शहरी प्रतिदर्श अभिकल्प

3.5.1 प्रतिचयन ढांचा : जिन नगरों और कस्बों में शहरी ढांचा सर्वेक्षण किया गया था तथा 1971 के जिनमें जनगणना खण्डों में जहरी ढांचा सर्वेक्षण नहीं किया गया था, खण्डों के अन्तिम चयन के लिए प्रयुक्त किया गया था।

3.5.2 स्तरीकरण : ग्रामीण प्रतिदर्श अभिकल्प में यथा वर्णित आधारभूत संस्तर को शहरी क्षेत्र के लिए भी आधारभूत संस्तर माना गया था। फिर भी शहरी क्षेत्र में पर्याप्त शहरी जनसंख्या वाले शहरी संस्तर का गठन करने के लिए बहुत कम जनसंख्या वाले कुछ आधारभूत संस्तरों को एक साथ मिलाना पड़ा। फिर भी ऐसे सभी मामलों से सामान्य रूप से जिले के पृष्ठक अस्तित्व को कायम रखा गया किन्तु बहुत कम शहरी जनसंख्या वाले जिलों के मामले को छोड़कर ऐसे जिलों को शहरी संस्तर के गठन के लिए उसी क्षेत्र के पड़ीसी जिलों से मिला दिया गया था। भारत में 374 जिलों में से 366 जिले राष्ट्रीय प्रतिदर्श सर्वेक्षण की सर्वेक्षण व्याप्ति के अन्तर्गत थे। 366 जिलों में निर्मित आधारभूत संस्तरों की कुल संख्या शहरी क्षेत्र में 380 थी।

3.5.3 आवंटन :—विभिन्न राज्यों एवं शासित क्षेत्रों को खण्डों के अखिल भारतीय प्रतिदर्श का उनके अवेषकों की संख्या एवं शहरी जनसंख्या को ध्यान में रखते हुए आवंटन किया गया था। प्रत्येक राज्य एवं संघ शासित क्षेत्र के अन्तर्गत खण्डों की आवंटित संख्या को उनकी शहरी जनसंख्या के अनुपात में, संघटक शहरी संस्तरों में विभाजित किया गया था। इन आवंटनों को 4 का गुणक बनाया गया।

3.5.4 खण्डों का चयन : प्रत्येक शहरी संस्तरण में आवंटित खण्डों की संख्या का, जहां जनसंख्या का मानदण्ड आकार था वहां आकार के लिए सम्भाव्यता अनुपातीय तथा दो स्वतंत्र उप-प्रतिदर्शों के रूप में प्रतिस्थापन द्वारा चयन किया गया है।

3.5.5 प्रतिदर्श परिवारों का चयन : पैरा 8 के अन्तर्गत ग्रामीण प्रतिदर्श अभिकल्प में वाणित मानदण्ड को शहरी क्षेत्र के लिए भी अपनाया गया था।

प्रस्तावना

संकल्पनाएं और परिभाषाएं

2.2 परिवार : परिवार, सामान्यतः व्यक्तियों का एक ऐसा समूह है जो एक साथ रहता है तथा एक ही रसोई घर से भोजन करता है। छात्रावास, होटल, अथवा होस्टल को परिवारों का एक समूह माना गया है जहां प्रत्येक आवासी व्यक्ति (अपने अधितों तथा अतिथियों के साथ) एक पृथक् परिवार बनाता है। किन्तु सरकार द्वारा सीधे तीर पर सम्पोषित और भोजन उपलब्ध कराए जाने वाले परिवार जैसे जेलों, पुलिस क्वार्टर्स, छावनियों, अस्पतालों, शरणगृहों, राहत शिविरों को सर्वेक्षण के व्याप्ति में शामिल नहीं किया गया है।

2.4 परिवार का आकार : परिवार में सदस्यों की कुल संख्या को परिवार का आकार समझा गया है ।

2.5 परिवार उपभोक्ता व्यय : उपभोक्ता व्यय में घरेलू उत्पाद में से उपभोग अथवा उपहार, ऋण आदि जैसी हस्तान्तरण प्राप्तियों सहित केवल घरेलू मामलों पर परिवार द्वारा किए गए सभी खर्च शामिल हैं। परिवार उद्यम सम्बन्धी खर्च को उपभोक्ता व्यय में शामिल नहीं किया गया है। जब कि हस्तान्तरण प्राप्तियों में से उपभोग को शामिल किया गया है किन्तु सभी प्रकार के हस्तान्तरण भुगतान (ऋण, उपहार, दान—हप्ते पैदे और वस्तु जैसे अनाज वर्णन आदि) को शामिल नहीं किया गया है। आवासीय मकानों की खरीद और निर्माण पर व्यय पूँजीगत खाते पर व्यय समझा गया है और इसलिए उपभोक्ता व्यय में शामिल नहीं किया गया है किन्तु आवासीय भवन के खरखात के खर्च को परिवार के उपभोक्ता व्यय में शामिल किया गया है। संदर्भ में गत अवधि के दौरान उपभोग की गयी खाद्य वस्तुओं के मौद्रिक मूल्य को खाद्य वस्तुओं पर उपभोक्ता व्यय को प्रस्तुत करने वाला माना गया है। अब स्थायी और स्थायी सामान के लिए संदर्भगत अवधि के दौरान प्राप्त की गयी इन वस्तुओं की खरीद पर किए गए वास्तविक व्यय को वस्तुओं का उपभोक्ता खर्च माना गया है। कपड़े और जूतों के संबंध में पहले के दौरों से कुछ भिन्नता है। संदर्भगत अवधि के दौरान प्राप्त वस्तुओं (उपहार आदि को छोड़कर) के मौलिक मूल्य को संबंधित वस्तुओं पर उपभोक्ता व्यय माना गया है।

2.6 उपभोक्ता एक : लिंग-आयु समूह के किसी व्यक्ति के लिए उपभोक्ता एक संख्या संर्दर्भगत आदमी के संबंध में ऊर्जा की आवश्यकता उस पुरुष/स्त्री का प्रतिनिधित्व करने वाला सूचकांक है। आयु समूह 20-39 के किसी आदमी को संर्दर्भगत आदमों माना गया है और उसको ऊर्जा आवश्यकता एक उपभोक्ता एक है।

2.7 संदर्भ अवधि :—उपभोक्ता व्यय की सभी मर्दों संबंधी आंकड़े एकत्र करने के लिए संदर्भ अवधि अन्तिम 30 दिन (जांच की तारीख से पूर्व दिन को समाप्त) है। इसके अतिरिक्त कपड़े, और जूते, टिकाऊ सामान तथा विविध सामान और सेवाओं की कुछ मर्दों के लिए आंकड़े अन्तिम 365 दिनों की संदर्भ अवधि के लिए भी एकत्र किए गए हैं। प्रस्तुत रिपोर्ट में 30 दिन की संदर्भ अवधि के संबंध में आंकड़े प्रस्तुत किए गए हैं।

3.1 रिपोर्ट में भारत के प्रत्येक राज्य और संघ शासित तथा समस्त भारत के लिए सारणियों की तीन पृष्ठक कोटियाँ शामिल की गयी हैं। संबंधित ग्रामीण और शहरी क्षेत्रों के लिए सारणियों के पृष्ठक सैट प्रस्तुत किए गए हैं। सारणियों की विषय-वस्तु का नीचे वर्णन किया गया है।

3.2 सारणी की शुरुआत (i) प्रतिदर्श परिवारों की संख्या, (ii) परिवारों व्यक्तियों, उपभोक्ता एककों की अनुमानित संख्या का प्रतिशत अनुपात (iii) औसत परिवार आकार (व्यस्त पुरुष, वयस्क स्त्री और बच्चे) तथा (iv) मासिक प्रति व्यक्ति व्यय श्रेणियों के अनुसार प्रति परिवार उपभोक्ता एकक के विवरण दर्शाती है।

3.3 सारणी की शुरुआत मासिक प्रति व्यक्ति व्यय श्रेणियों द्वारा 30 दिन की अवधि के लिए प्रति व्यक्ति अनाजों के उपभोग की मात्रा दर्शाती है।

3.4 सारणी 3 की शुरुआत मासिक प्रति-व्यक्ति व्यय वर्गों द्वारा 30 दिन की अवधि के लिए मर्दों के स्थूल समूहों में प्रति व्यक्ति उपभोग के मूल्य को दर्शाती है। मर्दों के 21 वृहत् समूहों के लिए अनुमान दिए गए हैं समूह इस प्रकार है (1) अनाज, (2) चना, (3) अनाज के प्रतिस्थापन, (4) दालें और उनके उत्पाद, (5) दूध और उसके उत्पाद, (6) खाने वाले तेल, (7) मांस, अण्डा, मछली, (8) सब्जियाँ, (9) कल और मेवे, (10) चीनी, (11) नमक, (12) मसाले, (13) मादक पेय और जलपान, (14) पान, तम्बाकू और नशीले पदार्थ, (15) ईंधन और बिजली (16) कपड़े, (17) जूते, (18) विविध वस्तुएँ और सेवाएँ (किराये एवं करों सहित), (19) टिकाऊ सामान इसके अतिरिक्त (20) किराए संबंधी अनुमान और (21) करों की भी अलग-अलग दर्शाया गया है। (i) कुल खाद्य, (ii) कुल और खाद्य और (iii) कुल उपभोक्ता व्यय के लिए भी परिणाम प्रस्तुत किए गए हैं।

3.5 मासिक प्रति व्यक्ति व्यय वर्ग : मासिक प्रति व्यक्ति व्यय (रुपए में) वर्गों के अनुसार दर्शाया गया है। व्यय स्तरों को निम्नलिखित 16 वर्गों (ग्रामीण क्षेत्रों के लिए 15 वर्ग) में समृद्धीकृत किया गया है :—

4. प्रतिचयन अभिकल्प और आकलन पद्धति की स्थूल रूपरेखा

4.1 स्थूल अभिकल्प : प्रतिचयन अभिकल्प को दो चरणों में स्तरीकृत किया गया है : प्रथम चरण एक ग्रामीण क्षेत्र में गांव और शहरी क्षेत्र में खण्ड है तथा द्वितीय चरण एकक दोनों क्षेत्रों में परिवार है।

4.2 संस्तर का निर्माण :—स्तरीकरण के प्रयोजन के लिए समान कृषि रूपरेखा वाले निकटस्थ जिलों को समूहीकृत करके देश को पहले 73 कृषि-आधिक क्षेत्रों में विभाजित किया गया—किसी राज्य/संघ के शासित क्षेत्र में क्षेत्रों की संख्या एक से पांच के बीच घटती-बढ़ती रही। निम्नलिखित के अनुसार जिलों पर आधारित क्षेत्रों के अन्तर्गत 'आधारभूत संस्तरों' का निर्माण किया गया। गुजरात और अरुणाचल में जहाँ 15 लाख से कम जनसंख्या वाले कुछ जिलों को एक अथवा अधिक आधारभूत संस्तरों में बांटा गया है, के अतिरिक्त 1971 की जनगणना के अनुसार 15 लाख से कम ग्रामीण जनसंख्या वाला प्रत्येक जिला अपने आप में एक आधारभूत संस्तर का निर्माण करता है। 1971 की जनगणना के अनुसार 15 लाख से अधिक ग्रामीण जनसंख्या वाले जिले को अनेक आधारभूत संस्तरों में विभाजित किया गया है जो कि जिले की ग्रामीण जनसंख्या पर निर्भर करता है और यह विभाजन जहाँ तक सम्भव था ग्रामीण जनसंख्या की संघनता और फसल पद्धति की ध्यान में रखते हुए निकटस्थ और समरूप तहसीलों को समूहबद्ध करके किया गया है। इस प्रकार निर्मित आधारभूत संस्तरों को ग्रामीण और शहरी दोनों क्षेत्रों के प्रतिचयन के लिए संस्तर भाना गया है। किन्तु शहरी क्षेत्र में बहुत कम जनसंख्या वाले कुछ आधारभूत संस्तरों को मूलभूत शहरी संस्तर बनाने के लिए एक साथ मिला दिया गया है। ग्रामीण और शहरी संस्तरों की कुल संख्या त्रिमण: 516 तथा 386 है।

4.3 आवंटन : 8820 गांवों और 4940 शहरी खण्डों के अखिल भारतीय प्रतिदर्श प्रत्येक राज्य एवं संघ शासित क्षेत्र की क्षेत्र क्षमता तथा ग्रामीण और शहरी जनसंख्या को ध्यान में रखते हुए आवंटित किए गए थे। प्रत्येक राज्य और संघ शासित क्षेत्र के अन्तर्गत इन्हें 1971 की जनगणना के अनुसार क्रमशः ग्रामीण एवं शहरी जनसंख्या के अनुपात में ग्रामीण और शहरी संस्तरों में पुनः आवंटित किया गया है। संस्तरों के अन्तिम आवंटन को इस प्रकार समायोजित किया गया है ताकि उन्हें संस्तर के स्तर पर 4 का गुणक तथा क्षेत्र स्तर 8 का गुणक बनाया जा सके।

4.4 गांवों का प्रतिचयन : प्रत्येक ग्रामीण आधारभूत संस्तर में, गांवों की आवंटित संख्या, जनसंख्या और प्रतिस्थापन सहित उसकी सम्भाव्यता अनुपात के अनुसार चुनी गई है। प्रयोग किया गया ढांचा 1971 की

जनगणना के अनुसार बनायी गई गांवों की सूची है। किन्तु उत्तर-पूर्वी क्षेत्र के लिए इस प्रक्रिया को नहीं अपनाया गया है।

4.5 गांवों का प्रतिचयन :—उत्तर पूर्वी क्षेत्र में कुछ केन्द्रक गांवों के चारों तरफ बनाए गांवों के समूह को सर्वेक्षण के लिए चुना गया था। इन केन्द्रक गांवों को समान संभाव्यता के आधार पर क्रमबद्ध रूप से चुना गया था। सामान्य रूप से 4 गांवों का एक समूह होता है किन्तु किसी भी दशा में 6 गांवों से अधिक नहीं होता है। मणिपुर (मैदानी) संस्तरण में समूह नहीं बनाए गए थे। सभी आवंटित गांवों को समान संभाव्यता के आधार पर क्रमबद्ध रूप से एक बार में ही चुना गया था।

4.6 शहरी खण्डों का प्रतिचयन : प्रत्येक शहरी संस्तरण में प्रतिदर्श खण्डों की निर्धारित संख्या, आकार (जनसंख्या का माप) और प्रतिस्थापन सहित उसकी संभाव्यता अनुपात के अनुसार चुना गया था। उत्तर-पूर्वी क्षेत्र के लिए भी उसी प्रक्रिया को अपनाया गया था। प्रयोग किया गया ढांचा शहरों और कस्बों में जहाँ शहरी ढांचा सर्वेक्षण किया गया था, शहरी ढांचा सर्वेक्षण खण्ड था और अन्यत 1971 की जनगणना खण्ड था।

4.7 परिवारों (ग्रामीण) का प्रतिचयन : प्रतिदर्श गांव के सभी परिवारों को आजीविका के साधनों के निम्नलिखित वर्गों में विभाजित किया गया है—(1) गैर-कृषि में स्व-नियोजित, (2) ग्रामीण अधिक और (3) अन्य। विभाजित ढांचे से 12 परिवारों के एक प्रतिदर्श को वर्तुल क्रमबद्ध रूप से चुना गया था। उत्तर-पूर्वी क्षेत्र में यदि किसी समूह में गांव हो तो 2-4 परिवारों को उस समूह के प्रत्येक गांव में से उपर्युक्त रीति से चुना गया था।

4.8 परिवारों (शहरी) का प्रतिचयन : एक प्रतिदर्श में, परिवारों को उनके रोजगार (स्व-नियोजित, जो स्व॑ नियोजित नहीं है) के स्वरूप तथा उनके प्रतिव्यक्ति व्यय के स्तर (राज्य के लिए पूर्व निर्धारित प्रतिव्यक्ति व्यय की अपेक्षा कम अथवा अधिक) के प्रकार के आधार पर चार वर्गों में क्रमबद्ध करते हुए प्रतिचयन ढांचा तैयार किया गया था। इसी प्रकार गांवों के मामले में इस ढांचे से 12 परिवार वर्तुल क्रमबद्ध रूप में चुने गए।

4.9 सर्वेक्षण अवधि एवं उप-दौर : सर्वेक्षण जुलाई 1977 में आरम्भ हुआ तथा जून 1978 में समाप्त हुआ। एक वर्ष की समूर्ण सर्वेक्षण अवधि को समवाय रूप से लगभग कृषि की चार छतुओं में से प्रत्येक के लिए तीन-तीन महीने की अवधि निर्धारित करते हुए चार उप-दौरों में विभाजित किया गया था। चारों उप-दौरों की अवधियां निम्नलिखित हैं :—

उप-दौर 1 : जुलाई से सितम्बर 1977

उप-दौर 2 : अक्टूबर से दिसम्बर 1977

उप-दौर 3 : जनवरी से मार्च 1978

उप-दौर 4 : अप्रैल से जून 1978

प्रतिदर्श गांवों एवं खण्डों को चार उप-दौरों में बरावर-बराबर संख्या में विभाजित किया गया था ताकि प्रत्येक उप-दौर के लिए अलग-अलग समान रूप से वैध अनुमान तैयार किए जा सके।

4.10 प्राक्कलन पद्धति : राज्य/संघ शासित क्षेत्र के लिए किसी भी विशेषता के समानांतर के अनुमान निम्नानुसार प्राप्त किए गए :

5. निष्कर्षों का सारांश

5.1 इस खण्ड में परिवारों की संरचना एवं उपयोग का एक बहुत उल्लंघनक रूप देने के लिए कुछ महत्वपूर्ण निष्कर्ष प्रस्तुत किए गए हैं।

5.2 मासिक प्रति व्यक्ति व्यय वर्ग द्वारा परिवारों का विभाजन : रा० प्र० सर्वे० के दौरों (27वाँ, 28वाँ एवं 32वाँ) के दौरान मासिक प्रति

सारणी (1) ग्रामीण शहरी क्षेत्रों में मासिक प्रति व्यक्ति व्यय वर्गों के बहुत समूहों द्वारा परिवार के प्रतिशत अनुपात की औसत संख्या।

15-34 एवं 34-100 तक के समूह 32 वें दौर के लिए लागू नहीं होते हैं।

इस दौर के लिए निकटतम संगत समूह 15-35 एवं 35-100 है।

व्यक्ति व्यय वर्ग द्वारा परिवारों के विभाजन एवं परिवार के आकार का प्रतिशत अनुपात सारणी (1) में दिया गया है। 27वें दौर से 28वें दौर में तथा उससे 32 वें दौर से गुजरने में परिवारों के विभाजन में बिल्कुल स्पष्टतः परिवर्तन दृष्टिगोचर हुआ है। प्रथम वर्ग व्यय समूहों में 27वें से 28वें दौर में भारी घिराव आई थी और एक बार फिर 28वें से 32वें दौर में ऐसा ही हुआ था। तीसरे व्यय समूह अर्थात् 34-100 से प्रवृत्ति उलट गयी थी जो कि बाद तक भी जारी रही। यह दर्शाता है कि पिछले दौर में निम्न प्रति व्यक्ति व्यय वर्ग से संबंधित परिवार बाद के दौरों में उपयोग के मामले में अधिक पैसा खर्च करते थे। एवं उसके द्वारा वे उच्चतर व्यय वर्ग में पहुंचते थे। ऐसा सामान्य मूल्य स्तर एवं जीवन निवाह लागत में होने वाली वृद्धि के कारण हो सकता था। इसी प्रकार ग्रामीण क्षेत्र में प्रति माह 100 रुपए प्रति व्यक्ति से कम खर्च करने वाले परिवारों का प्रतिशत अनुपात 27 वें दौर में 95 प्रतिशत से घट कर 28वें दौर में 92 प्रतिशत रह गया तथा 32वें दौर में और घटकर 85 प्रतिशत हो गया था इस बात को ध्यान में रखना लाभप्रद होगा कि किसी भी दौर में प्रति व्यक्ति 100 रुपए से अधिक व्यय करने की असमता प्रति व्यक्ति वर्ग 35-100 से 100-150 से परिवारों की प्रतिशत अनुपात में होने वाले अत्यधिक है। इस के परिणामस्वरूप अव्यन्त कभी आई थी। जो भी देखा गया है उससे यह स्पष्ट है कि शहरी क्षेत्रों की तरह ग्रामीण क्षेत्रों के प्रतिशत अनुपात की वित्ती काफी अच्छी रही केवल यही अन्तर पाया गया कि शहरी क्षेत्रों में अधिक व्यय करने वाले वर्ग में परिवारों की प्रतिशत अनुपात अधिक थी। इसी प्रकार सर्वेक्षण के तीन से भी अधिक दौरों में प्रति व्यक्ति 100 रुपए अव्यवा उससे अधिक व्यय करने वाले परिवारों का प्रतिशत अनुपात क्षेत्रों में 21, 26 और 40 वा तथा ग्रामीण क्षेत्रों में केवल 5.8 और 15 था।

5.3 मासिक प्रति व्यक्ति व्यय वर्ग हारा परिवार का औसत आकार: सारणी में दौरों के दौरान प्रति परिवार में व्यक्तियों की औसत संख्या भी दर्शायी गयी है। 32वें दौर में अधिल भारतीय ग्रामीण एवं शहरी औसत परिवार के आकार क्रमशः 5.22 एवं 4.88 थे। तथा दौरों के दौरान इन आकारों में बहुत अधिक अन्तर नहीं था। सामान्यतः ग्रामीण परिवार का आकार शहरी परिवार से बड़ा था और प्रति व्यक्ति व्यय करने वाले परिवार में बृद्धि होने का आकार घटा है। सामान्यतः जबकि "ओसत" ग्रामीण परिवार, अपने शहरी प्रतिरूप की तुलना में, आकार में बड़ा था प्रति व्यक्ति व्यय किए जाने वाले व्यय में घेरे-घेरे होने वाली बृद्धि के लिए आकार की सामान्य प्रवृत्ति सभी तीनों दौरों में पाई गई है।

5.4 उपभोक्ता व्यय का प्रतिदर्श: सारणी (2) में मदों के कुछ बहुत समूहों पर होने वाला उपभोक्ता व्यय प्रस्तुत किया गया है तथा कुल व्यय के लिए उनका प्रतिशत अनुपात तीनों दौरों 22, 27 एवं 32 के लिए अधिल भारतीय स्तर पर सारणी (3) में दिए गए हैं। ये तीनों वाष्पक सर्वेक्षण क्रमशः जुलाई, 67—जून, 68, अक्टूबर, 72—सितम्बर, 73 एवं जुलाई, 77 जून, 78 के दौरान जारी रखे गए। जैसी कि आशा की जाती है सामान्यतः मूल्य बृद्धि के कारण यह पाया गया कि सभी मदों पर होने वाले खर्चों 22वें दौर से आरम्भ होने वाले दौरों (ग्रामीण क्षेत्रों में चुने एवं अनाज के प्रतिस्थापक अनाज को छोड़कर) के दौरान बृद्धि हुई है। जो कि ग्रामीण एवं शहरी क्षेत्रों के लिए थी। इस प्रकार शहरी क्षेत्रों में कुल खाद्य पर उपभोक्ता व्यय 22वें दौर में लगभग 26 रुपए 27वें दौर में 32 रुपए तथा 32वें

दौर में बढ़कर 44 रुपए हो गई है। शहरी क्षेत्रों में बृद्धि 22वें दौर में से 30 रुपए से बढ़कर 27वें दौर में 41 रुपए और 32 वें दौर में बढ़कर 58 रुपए हो गई। प्रतिशत अनुपात के विषय में खाद्य पर होने वाले व्यय के अनुपात में 5 वर्ष के अवधि त्रिमी भारी गिरावट हुई है जो कि 22वें दौर में 77 प्रतिशत से घटकर 27वें दौर में 73 प्रतिशत तथा 32वें दौर में उससे भी घटकर 64 प्रतिशत रह गई। शहरी क्षेत्रों के लिए अनुकूल आंकड़े 67 प्रतिशत, 64 प्रतिशत तथा 60 प्रतिशत हैं। ग्रामीण एवं शहरी दोनों क्षेत्रों में खाद्य समूह में और अधिक व्यय करने वाली मदे ये हैं—दूध एवं दुध उत्पाद, दालें, सब्जियाँ एवं खाद्य तेल तथापि, इस बात का ध्यान दिया जाए कि जबकि जहां सामान्यतः खाद्य मदों पर संदिग्यां फलों एवं सूखे मेवे तथा मांस, मछली व अण्डे के प्रतिशतता व्यय में बृद्धि हुई है। सामान्यतः खाद्य मदों के लिए जो पाया गया उसके विपरीत सम्पूर्ण मदों एवं प्रतिशत अनुपातों की शर्तों दोनों उक्त में दौरों के दौरान अखाद्य मदों पर होने वाले व्यय में बृद्धि हुई है। उक्त में दौरों के दौरान अखाद्य मदों पर होने वाले व्यय में बृद्धि हुई है। विविध वस्तुयों एवं सेवायें, परिधान, टिकाऊ वस्तुएँ एवं ईंधन व विजली।

टिकाऊ वस्तुओं पर होने वाले व्यय का प्रतिशत अनुपात रां ३० सर्वे के 32वें दौर में बहुत अधिक पाया गया है। महाराष्ट्र, मध्य प्रदेश, राजस्थान, मणिपुर एवं कुछ अन्य राज्यों के ग्रामीण क्षेत्रों में टिकाऊ वस्तुओं पर होने वाला व्यय भी काफी अधिक पाया गया। परिणामों के प्रकार निर्धारित करने के लिए इन परिणामों की पुनः संवीक्षा करना आवश्यक था।
