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Introduction

1.1 Twenty Point Programme - 2006

1.1.1 Alleviation of poverty and improving the quality of life of the people, especially of those who are below the poverty line, has been the prime objective of planned development in the country. Over the years, the meaning of economic development has shifted from growth in per capita income to the expansion of opportunities. The government, through various programmes/schemes, is helping its citizens to expand their capabilities. In order to achieve these objectives, package of programmes comprising schemes relating to Poverty Alleviation, Employment Generation, Education, Health, etc., called the Twenty Point Programme (TPP), has been in operation since 1975. In view of the changing scenario of the country over the years, the programme has been restructured thrice - in 1982, 1986 and 2006. The present programme now called Twenty Point Programme-2006 (TPP-2006) is in operation since April 2007.

1.1.2 TPP-2006 has various points/items for the benefit of both the rural and urban people, taking cadre of all the requirements of the deprived and adversely affected population. TPP-2006 has 20 Points covering 65 items. These 65 items coincide with various programmes and schemes of the government which are administered by the Central Nodal Ministries/Departments and by and large are implemented through the State Governments/UT Administrations. The Ministry of Statistics & Programme Implementation has been given the responsibility of monitoring all the 65 items, of which some are reported on quarterly basis, and the others on annual basis. The details of 20 Points covering 65 items, the parameters under these 65 items, names of the nodal agencies and the frequency of reporting are available in *Annexure-1*.

1.2 Monitoring Mechanism

1.2.1 In order to effectively monitor the Twenty Point Programme, this Ministry has developed a Management Information System (MIS). The Management Information System (MIS) consists of a Quarterly Progress Report (QPR) and an Annual Report. The Quarterly Progress Report (QPR) covers monitoring of achievements in respect of the 9 crucial items (containing 14 parameters) against pre-set physical targets, whereas the Annual Report presents an analytical review of the performance of all the 65 items under the programme. The sources of information for the Annual Report are the Central Nodal Ministries and the State/UT Governments.

1.2.2 All the States and the Union Territories of the country have a monitoring/evaluation unit under a nodal Department, which has been entrusted with the responsibility of monitoring all schemes/items covered under the Twenty Point Programme. The units have functionaries at block and district levels, to monitor and collect information for the different schemes of the Twenty Point Programme.

1.2.3 Besides the monitoring done at the state level, individual scheme/ programme covered under TPP-2006 are also monitored by the Central Nodal Ministries concerned. The charter of this Ministry is to monitor the TPP-2006 as a whole in a holistic manner with a view to enhance its effectiveness.

4.2 Marketing and Infrastructural Support to Farmers: There is a need to enhance private sector investment in development of post-harvest marketing infrastructure for which various schemes are also implemented.

4.2.1 Agricultural Marketing Infrastructure (AMI): (Note: The erstwhile two schemes viz. (i) Grameen Bhandaran Yojana (GBY) implemented since 01.04.2001, and (ii) Scheme for Strengthening/Development of Agricultural Marketing Infrastructure, Grading & Standardization (AMIGS) implemented since 20.10.2004 have been subsumed into one scheme known as Agricultural Marketing Infrastructure (AMI) w.e.f. 01.04.2014.)

The details of storage capacity created and women beneficiary under AMI sub-scheme of ISAM (including erstwhile Grameen Bhandaran Yojana (GBY) and Agricultural Marketing Infrastructure Grading & Standardization (AMIGS) since inception till September, 2022 is shown below:

4.2.2 Development of Agricultural Marketing infrastructure, grading and standardization:

Implementation & Monitoring: The Agmark certification scheme is implemented by 11 Regional Offices, 27 Sub Offices, 11 Regional Agmark Laboratories and a Central Agmark Laboratory(CAL) out of which 10 RALs and apex Lab i.e. CAL have been accredited with the National Accreditation Board for testing and Calibration Laboratories (NABL) following International Standard ISO 17025. RALs Chennai, Kanpur, Kochi and Mumbai have been strengthened with Gas Chromatography equipment each.

Agmark online certification: In order to fulfil Hon'ble Prime Minister's Digital India dream, the application/approval processes related to Agmark certification was envisaged to make online and user friendly from offline mode. The software requirement specification (SRS) was prepared to bring physical processes to online mode with several modules. While developing the online software, the application forms were appropriately reoriented to make online filing process simple, fast, transparent, 24x7 and paperless with a facility to upload scanned /PDF documents. There is a provision of online receipt of fees and e-signing at relevant stages in new online application. On 26.09.2018, the then Hon'ble Union Minister of Agriculture and Farmers Welfare Shri Radha Mohan Singh has launched the online software on agmark online. dmi.gov.in web portal for Agmark Certification.

The software sends SMS/ emails to the applicants/officers/users at relevant stages. Through the Agmark online system, certificate of authorisation (domestic), permission of printing press, permission of laboratories (domestic) and services related to laboratory information management system are provided online.

4.3 Irrigation Facilities (including Minor and Micro Irrigation) for Agriculture

4.3.1 Micro Irrigation for Agriculture - Progress of Micro Irrigation (comes under PMKSY - Per Drop More Crop component):

From 2015-16 to 2021-22, Central Assistance of Rs. 16344.07 crore was released to States for implementation of PDMC. Further, Rs.906.35 crore was released during 2022-23 up to 15.11.2022.

During 2015-16 to 2021-22, an area of 67.46 lakh ha has been covered in the country under Micro Irrigation under PDMC and an area of 4.21 lakh ha has been covered during 2022-23 till October 2022.

4.3.2 Pradhan Mantri Krishi Sinchayee Yojana - Accelerated Irrigation Benefits Programme - Coverage of Minor Irrigation:

Implementation of PMKSY AIBP (including CADWM) during 2021-26:
PMKSY-AIBP including CAD&WM has been approved for implementation with an outlay of Rs. 23,918 crore (central assistance) during 2021-26 for completion of 60 ongoing AIBP and 85 ongoing CAD&WM projects, along with financial assistance of new major and medium irrigation projects. Funding of National Projects, including Renuka and Lakhwar Projects, is also approved.
Financial progress requirement is dropped for inclusion of a project under AIBP and only physical progress of 50% to be considered.
Advanced stage (50% physical progress) criteria is relaxed for projects having command area of 50% or more in Drought Prone Area Programme (DPAP), tribal, Desert Development Programme (DDP), flood prone, Tribal area, Flood prone area, left wing extremism affected area, Koraput, Balangir and Kalahandi (KBK) region of Odisha, Vidarbha & Marathwada regions of Maharashtra and Bundelkhand region of Madhya Pradesh & Uttar Pradesh, as also for Extension Renovation Modernisation (ERM) projects and also for States with net irrigation below national average.
Reimbursement is allowed for due central assistance in subsequent years also.
Project completion permitted with physical progress of 90% or more.
Central Assistance of Rs. 18,332.09 crore (AIBP: Rs. 15,451.18 crore; CADWM: Rs. 2,880.91 crore) has been provided for these projects from 2016-17 to 2022- 23 (upto 31.12.2022), out of which Rs. 167.77 crore (AIBP: Rs. 142.49 crore; CADWM: Rs. 25.28 crore) has been provided during the year 2022-23 (upto 31.12.2022).
HAR KHET KO PANI: SURFACE MINOR IRRIGATION (SMI) SCHEMES AND REPAIR RENOVATION & RESTORATION (RRR) OF WATER BODIES:
Under the SMI scheme, since 12th plan onwards, 6,213 schemes are ongoing with an estimated cost of Rs. 13,473 crore. Under the RRR of Water Bodies scheme, since 12th Plan onwards, 2,333 schemes are ongoing with an estimated cost of Rs. 1,981 crore. In the approval by Government of India for continuation of the scheme during 2021-22 to 2025- 26, 4.5 lakh hectare of minor irrigation using surface water is targeted through SMI and RRR of water bodies. Cost norm of development of irrigated land under SMI has been revised from Rs. 2.5 lakh to Rs. 4 lakh per hectare. Inclusion criteria for RRR of water bodies has been revised in terms of size from minimum 5 hectare to 2 hectare (1 hectare for north eastern and Himalayan States) for rural areas, and from 2-10 hectare in urban areas to 1 hectare (0.5 hectare for north eastern and Himalayan States). Funding pattern for RRR of water bodies component has also been enhanced from 25% to 60% for non-special category regions. The outlay for SMI & RRR of water bodies scheme for implementation during 2021-26 is Rs. 4,580 crore.
HAR KHET KO PAANI- GROUND WATER SCHEME (PMKSY-HKKP-GW)
PMKSY- Har Khet Ko Pani-Ground Water scheme envisages to provide irrigation facility for small and marginal farmers in areas having sufficient potential for future development of ground water.
During F.Y. 2022-23, an amount of Rs. 34.85 crore has been released (upto 31.12.2022) to the projects in the States of Gujarat and Uttar Pradesh towards Central Assistance and 2,547 wells have been constructed creating additional command area of 19,500 ha benefitting 9,707 small & marginal farmers.

5.4 Welfare of Women Labour:

In tune with the Government of India's stress on empowering the women workers, special efforts were made by Dattopant Thengadi National Board for Workers Education & Development (erstwhile Central Board of Workers Education) to have more participation of Women Workers in Board's various training programmes. During the year 2021-22 (upto December, 2022) 1,91,628 women participated in Board's various training Programmes. 9.1.3 Malaria:

9.1.3.1 India has made considerable progress in reducing its malaria burden.

Epidemiological Situation
In 2021 total 161753 cases (101566 Pfcases) and 90 deaths were reported.
In 2022 (till Sep) a total of 1,26,305 cases of malaria with 72,993 Plasmodium falciparum cases and 46 deaths have been reported as compared to 1,07,316 cases with 67,281 Plasmodium falciparum cases and 78 deaths, amounting to 17.69% and 8.49% increase in malaria cases and Plasmodium falciparum cases and 41.03% decrease in malaria deaths reported during the same period in 2021.
There has been significant reduction in malaria cases from 11,69,261 in 2015 to 1,61,753 in 2021 and deaths have decreased from 384 in 2015 to 90 in 2021.

Road Map for Malaria Elimination
Government of India envisages eliminating malaria by 2030 in a phased manner.
Launch of National Framework for Malaria Elimination (NFME) 2016-2030 in February, 2016 by Hon'ble Health Minister.
Dissemination of NFME 2016- 2030 to all States and UTs with instructions to initiate key actions.
Launch of Operational Manual for Malaria Elimination - April, 2016: The National Strategic Plan (NSP) 2017-2022 for Malaria Elimination was launched in July 2017 by Hon'ble Health Minister.
Award to the Districts/States for achieving 'Zero indigenous case status' and maintaining it for 3 consecutive years on attaining sub-national malaria elimination, instituted for Year 1 and Year 3.
Achievements in 2021
India has made considerable progress towards malaria elimination. India has achieved a reduction of 92.03% in malaria morbidity and 90.34% in malaria mortality as compared to 2020.
India has achieved 86.16% reduction in malaria cases and 76.56% reduction in malaria deaths as compared to 2015.
National API was 0.12 per 1000 population and 34 States/UTs have achieved API less than one except 2 States Mizoram (6.51) and Tripura (2.58).
Total 125 districts in the country have reported 'zero malaria cases' and only 24 districts have API 1 and above.
Among 182 tribal districts, there has been 88.03% reduction in malaria morbidity and 77.42% reduction in malaria mortality as compared to 2015.
Malaria has been made notifiable in 33 States/UTs (Andhra Pradesh, Arunachal Pradesh, Assam, Chhattisgarh, Goa, Gujarat, Haryana, Himachal Pradesh, Jammu & Kashmir, Jharkhand, Karnataka, Kerala, Madhya Pradesh, Manipur, Mizoram, Nagaland, Odisha, Punjab, Rajasthan, Sikkim, Tamil Nadu, Telangana, Tripura, Uttar Pradesh, Uttarakhand, West Bengal, Puducherry, Chandigarh, Daman & Diu, D&N Haveli, Lakshadweep, Delhi, and Maharashtra).
Till October 2022, 28 States have constituted State Task force for Malaria Elimination.
Malaria microscopy, the gold standard for malaria elimination has also been strengthened by National Refresher trainings and certification of a core group of Laboratory Technicians from different States. There are 11 L-1 and 18 L-2 WHO certified Laboratory technician for strengthening microscopic activity and laboratory capacity building.
Malaria Programme Review (MPR) was carried out in Nine states in India, namely Punjab, Assam, Odisha, Gujarat, Karnataka, Haryana, Chhattisgarh, Tripura, and Maharashtra from 18th April - 24th April 2022 for formulation of National Strategic Plan (2023-2027).

9.3.2 Routine immunisation comprising of DPT, Polio, BCG and Measles- Children Immunised: Universal Immunization Programme (UIP)

Universal Immunization Programme (UIP) in India is one of the largest public health programmes in the world. It targets around 3.04 crore pregnant women and 2.67 crore newborn annually. More than 1.2 crore immunization sessions are conducted annually.
It is one of the most cost-effective public health interventions and largely responsible for reduction of vaccine preventable Under-5 mortality rate.
Under UIP, the Government of India is providing vaccination free of cost against twelve vaccine preventable diseases, of which: a) Eleven vaccines are provided across the country against Diphtheria, Pertussis, Tetanus, Polio, Measles, Rubella, severe form of Childhood Tuberculosis, Rota virus diarrhoea, Hepatitis B, Meningitis & Pneumonia caused by Hemophilus Influenza Type B and Pneumococcal pneumonia. b) Only Japanese Encephalitis (JE) vaccine is provided sub nationally in endemic districts. c) A child needs seven contacts with the health facility, until the age of five years to complete immunization under UIP.
A child is said to be fully immunized if he/she receives all due vaccines as per national immunization Schedule within 1st year of the age of the child.
There are three main systems to measure full immunization coverage: 1. Online web-based Health Management Information System (HMIS) portal where in administrative coverage is being reported through health facilities across the country. As per HMIS data for FY 2020-21, the full immunization coverage (FIC) of the country was 88.05%. For FY 2021-22 as per HMIS data, the FIC was 89% and till 31st October 2022, the full immunization coverage is 93%.
2. Periodic surveys like NFHS, DLHS, Rapid Survey on Children (RSOC), Integrated Child Health and Immunization Survey (INCHIS) etc. As per the latest available survey (NFHS-4) the full immunization coverage in the country stands at 76.4%.
3. Concurrent monitoring of the UIP is conducted through session as well as community monitoring.

9.3.3 Pulse Polio Immunisation Programme - Children Immunised: On 24th February, 2012, WHO removed India from the list of countries with active endemic wild polio virus transmission after reporting of the last case of poliovirus in the country in January, 2011. Subsequently, on 27th March, 2014, India along with 10 other countries of South-East Asia Region was declared Polio-free by the Regional Certification Commission (RCC) of WHO.

14.1 Sports for all in Rural and Urban Areas:

Panchayat Yuva Krida Aur Khel Abhiyan (PYKKA) scheme was introduced as a nation-wide rural sports programme in the year 2008-09. **Rajiv Gandhi Khel Abhiyan Scheme (RGKA)**, a Centrally Sponsored Scheme, was introduced in 2014-15, expanding the erstwhile “Panchayat Yuva Krida Aur Khel Abhiyan (PYKKA)”. A new umbrella Scheme “**Khelo India**” was launched during the financial year 2016-17 after merger of existing scheme **Rajiv Gandhi Khel Abhiyan (RGKA)**, **Urban Sports Infrastructure Scheme (USIS)** and **National Sports Talent Search System Programme (NSTSSP)**.

The Khelo India University Games 2021(22) is planned to be held in Jain University, Bangalore, Karnataka.

16.2 Prevention of Pollution of Rivers and Water Bodies:

Presently, NRCP (excluding Ganga and its tributaries) has covered polluted stretches of 36 rivers in 80 towns spread over 16 States at a sanctioned cost of Rs. 6,248.16 crore. An amount of Rs. 2,900 crore has been released to various State Governments for implementation of various pollution abatement schemes and a treatment capacity of 2,745 million litres per day (mld) has been created so far under the NRCP resulting in reduction in pollution load being discharged into various rivers.

The Central Government has, vide Notification No. 1763 dated 14th June, 2019, further amending in the Government of India (Allocation of Business) Rules, 1961, transferred NRCD including NRCP from Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change (MoEF&CC) to the DoWR, RD & GR under the newly constituted Ministry of Jal Shakti for implementation of works in respect of pollution abatement of rivers other than Ganga and its tributaries under the NRCP.

16.3 Solid and liquid Waste Management in Rural Areas and Urban Areas:

The Tamil Nadu Model of Solid Waste Management and the Telangana Model of Liquid Waste Management were studied by Senior Officials of 10 States. After this study, a Write-shop was organized and facilitated by DAY- NRLM to develop suitable proposals to initiate SLWM in rural areas in India. Accordingly, six States have developed their proposal, viz., Bihar, Chhattisgarh, Gujarat, Madhya Pradesh, Uttar Pradesh and West Bengal and received EC approval. These projects were rolled-out from January 2017. *(Source: Annual Report 2018-19 of Ministry of Rural Development)*

As on 31.12.2019, 81,073 wards (out of the total 84, 475 wards, i.e. 965) are covered by 100% door-to-door collection. 60% of the total waste generated is currently being processed, and 74% wards are practicing source segregation. *(Source: Annual Report 2019-20 of Ministry of Housing and Urban Affairs)*

Under Swachh Bharat Mission, Currently, there are 1531 functional waste to compost plants (centralized) with capacity to process 106636 tonnes waste per day, and another 566 plants are under construction, with approx. input capacity of 62,823 tonnes per day. Additionally, there are 4 functional RDF plants with input capacity of 1621 tonnes per day, 37 bio gas plants with input capacity of 1861 tonnes per day. 26 waste to energy plants are under construction with input capacity of over 22541 tonnes per day. There are currently 6 functional C&D plants 1 plant in Ahmedabad, 1 2 in Delhi EDMC and NDMC), 1 in Rajkot, 1 in Indore and 1 in Dhillwan (Punjab) *(Source: Annual Report 2019-20 of Ministry of Housing and Urban Affairs)*

19.1 Bio-diesel Production:

Government has notified Guidelines for sale of biodiesel for blending with High Speed Diesel for transportation purposes on 30.4.2019. Through this Notification Government has granted permission exclusively for sale of biodiesel (B-100) only and not for any mixture thereof of whatever percentage.
The Biodiesel procurement by OMCs increased from 1.1 crore litres during 2015-16 to 10.56 crore litres during 2019-20.
Presently, bio-diesel is being produced in the country primarily from imported palm stearin oil. In order to phase-out palm stearin, and as a measure towards import substitution, it has been decided to promote domestically available used cooking oil (UCO) as the feedstock.
UCO has been identified as a potential raw material for biodiesel production in National Policy on Biofuels-2018. UCO can be collected from Bulk Consumers such as hotels, restaurants, canteens, etc. for conversion.
Oil Marketing Companies (OMCs) are periodically floating Expression of Interest (EoI) for procurement of Biodiesel produced from UCO.
