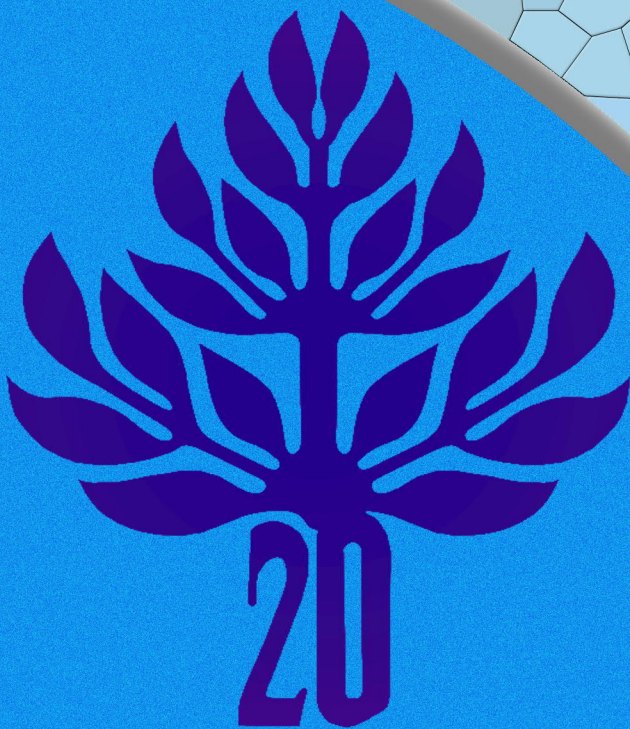

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Introduction

1.1 Twenty Point Programme - 2006

1.1.1 Alleviation of poverty and improving the quality of life of the people, especially of those who are below the poverty line, has been the prime objective of planned development in the country. Over the years, the meaning of economic development has shifted from growth in per capita income to the expansion of opportunities. The government, through various programmes/schemes, is helping its citizens to expand their capabilities. In order to achieve these objectives, package of programmes comprising schemes relating to Poverty Alleviation, Employment Generation, Education, Health, etc., called the Twenty Point Programme (TPP), has been in operation since 1975. In view of the changing scenario of the country over the years, the programme has been restructured thrice - in 1982, 1986 and 2006. The present programme now called Twenty Point Programme-2006 (TPP-2006) is in operation since April 2007.

1.1.2 TPP-2006 has various points/items for the benefit of both the rural and urban people, taking care of all the requirements of the deprived and adversely affected population. TPP-2006 has 20 Points covering 65 items. These 65 items coincide with various programmes and schemes of the government which are administered by the Central Nodal Ministries/Departments and by and large are implemented through the State Governments/UT Administrations. The Ministry of Statistics & Programme Implementation has been given the responsibility of monitoring all the 65 items, of which some are reported on quarterly basis, and the others on annual basis. The details of 20 Points covering 65 items, the parameters under these 65 items, names of the nodal agencies and the frequency of reporting are available in *Annexure-1*.

1.2 Monitoring Mechanism

1.2.1 In order to effectively monitor the Twenty Point Programme, this Ministry has developed a Management Information System (MIS). The Management Information System (MIS) consists of a Quarterly Progress Report (QPR) and an Annual Report. The Quarterly Progress Report (QPR) covers monitoring of achievements in respect of the 9 crucial items (containing 14 parameters) against pre-set physical targets, whereas the Annual Report presents an analytical review of the performance of all the 65 items under the programme. The sources of information for the Annual Report are the Central Nodal Ministries and the State/UT Governments.

1.2.2 All the States and the Union Territories of the country have a monitoring/evaluation unit under a nodal Department, which has been entrusted with the responsibility of monitoring all schemes/items covered under the Twenty Point Programme. The units have functionaries at block and district levels, to monitor and collect information for the different schemes of the Twenty Point Programme.

1.2.3 Besides the monitoring done at the state level, individual scheme/ programme covered under TPP-2006 are also monitored by the Central Nodal Ministries concerned. The charter of this Ministry is to monitor the TPP-2006 as a whole in a holistic manner with a view to enhance its effectiveness.

4.2.2 Development of Agricultural Marketing infrastructure, grading and standardization:

The Agmark certification scheme is implemented by 11 Regional Offices, 27 Sub Offices, 11 Regional Agmark Laboratories and a Central Agmark Laboratory through QC division at Head Office Faridabad.

In order to fulfil the Hon'ble Prime Minister's Digital India dream, the application/approval processes related to Agmark certification was envisaged to be made online and user friendly from an offline mode. The software requirement specification (SRS) was prepared to bring physical processes to online mode with several modules.

While developing the online software, the application forms were appropriately reoriented to make online filing process simple, fast, transparent, 24x7 and paperless with a facility to upload scanned /PDF documents. There is a provision of online receipt of fees and e-signing at relevant stages in the new online application.

4.3 Irrigation Facilities (including Minor and Micro Irrigation) for Agriculture

4.3.1 Micro Irrigation for Agriculture - Progress of Micro Irrigation: comes under PMKSY - Per Drop More Crop component.

From 2015-16 to 2020-21, Central Assistance of Rs. 14548 crore has been released to States for implementation of PMKSY- PDMC. Further, Rs. 749.18 crore has been released during 2021-22 up to 12.11.2021.

During 2015 to 2021, an area of 57.31 lakh ha has been covered in the country under Micro Irrigation under PMKSY- PDMC and an area of 2.07 lakh ha has been covered during 2021-22 till December 2021.

4.3.2 Pradhan Mantri Krishi Sinchayee Yojana - Accelerated Irrigation Benefits Programme - Coverage of Minor Irrigation:

Implementatlon of PMKSY AIBP (including CADWM) during 2021-26:
PMKSY-AIBP including CAD&WM has been approved for implementation with an outlay of Rs. 23,918 crore (central assistance) during 2021-26 for completion of 60 ongoing AIBP and 85 ongoing CAD&WM projects, along with financial assistance of new major and medium irrigation projects. Funding of National Proj- ects, including Renuka and Lakhwar Projects, is also approved.
Financial progress requirement is dropped for inclusion of a project under AIBP and only physical progress of 50% to be considered.
Advanced stage (50% physical progress) criteria is relaxed for projects having command area of 50% or more in Drought Prone Area Programme (DPAP), tribal, Desert Development Programme (DDP), flood prone, Tribal area, Flood prone area, left wing extremism affected area, Koraput, Balangir and Kalahandi (KBK) region of Odisha, Vidarbha & Marathwada regions of Maharashtra and Bundelkhand region of Madhya Pradesh & Uttar Pradesh, as also for Extension Renovation Modernisation (ERM) projects and also for States with net irrigation below national average.
Reimbursement is allowed for due central assistance in subsequent years also.
Project completion permitted with physical progress of 90% or more.
HAR KHET KO PANI: SURFACE MINOR IRRIGATION (SMI) SCHEMES AND rePaIr renovatIon & reStoratIon (RRR) OF WATER BODIES: Under the SMI scheme, since 12 th plan onwards, 6,213 schemes are ongoing with an estimated cost of Rs. 13,473 crore. Under the RRR of Water Bodies scheme, since 12 th Plan onwards, 2,228 schemes are ongoing with an estimated cost of Rs. 1,910 crore. In the approval by Government of India for continuation of the scheme during 2021-22 to 2025- 26, 4.5 lakh hectare of minor irrigation using surface water is targeted through SMI and RRR of water bodies. Cost norm of development of irrigated land under SMI has been revised from Rs. 2.5 lakh to Rs. 4 lakh per hectare. Inclusion criteria for RRR of water bodies has been revised in terms of size from minimum 5 hectare to 2 hectare (1 hectare for north eastern and Himalayan States) for rural areas, and from 2-10 hectare in urban areas to 1 hectare (0.5 hectare for north eastern and Himalayan States). Funding pattern for RRR of water bodies component has also been enhanced from 25% to 60% for non-special category regions. The outlay for SMI & RRR of water bodies scheme for implementation during 2021-26 is Rs. 4,580 crore, out of which Rs. 710 crore is targeted for the current financial year.

5.4 Welfare of Women Labour:

In tune with the Government of India's stress on empowering the women workers, special efforts were made by Dattopant Thengadi National Board for Workers Education & Development (erstwhile Central Board of Workers Education) to have more participation of Women Workers in Board's various training programmes. During the year 2021-22 (upto October, 2021) 2,79,573 women participated in Board's various training Programmes. Of these 2,79,573 total women workers, 109729 were from SC category and 36443 from ST Category.

The Dattopant Thengadi National Board for Workers Education & Development (formerly CBWE) also conducts 2-days special training programmes for women workers in which only women participants of various categories in unorganized sector are enrolled. Till October, 2021, 242 such special programmes for women workers were conducted in which 18038 numbers of workers participated. The women are made aware about their rights and duties, and provisions under various Labour Legislations in respect of women and child, and various other welfare provisions of the Central and State Government related to women for upliftment of women and children i.e. on health, hygiene and total care etc.

9.1.3 Malaria:

9.1.3.1 India has made considerable progress in reducing its malaria burden.

In 2020 total 186532 cases (119088 Pf cases) and 93 deaths were reported.

In 2021*(P) a total of 64520 cases of malaria and 35 deaths have been reported till July 2021 as compared to 89776 cases and 49 deaths reported during the same period in 2020 amounting to 28.13% decline in malaria cases and 31.13% decrease in falciparum malaria.

There has been significant reduction in malaria cases from 1169261 in 2015 to 186532 in 2020 and deaths have decreased from 384 in 2015 to 93 in 2020.

The number of high endemic districts having API e" 1 has decreased considerably to 32 in 2020 as compared to 154 in 2015.

9.3.2 Routine immunisation comprising of DPT, Polio, BCG and Measles- Children Immunised: Universal Immunization Programme (UIP)

Universal Immunization Programme (UIP) in India is one of the largest public health programmes in the world. It targets around 2.9 crore pregnant women and 2.67 crore newborn annually. More than 1.2 crore immunization sessions are conducted annually.
It is one of the most cost-effective public health interventions and largely responsible for reduction of vaccine preventable Under-5 mortality rate.
Under UIP, the Government of India is providing vaccination free of cost against twelve vaccine preventable diseases, of which: i) Ten are provided across the country against Diphtheria, Pertussis, Tetanus, Polio, Measles, Rubella, severe form of Childhood Tuberculosis, Rotavirus diarrhea, Hepatitis-B and Meningitis & Pneumonia caused by H. Influenza Type-B ii) Two are provided in selected States or endemic districts against, Pneumococcal Pneumonia and Japanese Encephalitis (JE); of which Pneumococcal Conjugate Vaccine is in the process of expansion while JE vaccine is provided only in endemic districts
A child needs seven contacts till the age of five years to complete immunization under UIP.
There are three main systems to measure full immunization coverage: 1. Online web-based Health Management Information System (HMIS) portal wherein administrative coverage is reported through health facilities across the country. As per HMIS data for FY 2019-20, the full immunization coverage of the country stands at 92.8%.
2. Periodic surveys like NFHS, DLHS, Rapid Survey on Children (RSOC), Integrated Child Health and Immunization Survey (INCHIS) etc. As per the latest available survey (NFHS-4) the full immunization coverage in the country stands at 62%.
3. Concurrent monitoring of the UIP is conducted through session as well as community monitoring.

9.3.3 Pulse Polio Immunisation Programme - Children Immunised: On 24th February, 2012, WHO removed India from the list of countries with active endemic wild polio virus transmission after reporting of the last case of poliovirus in the country in January, 2011. Subsequently, on 27th March, 2014, India along with 10 other countries of South-East Asia Region was declared Polio-free by the Regional Certification Commission (RCC) of WHO.

14.1 Sports for all in Rural and Urban Areas:

Panchayat Yuva Krida Aur Khel Abhiyan (PYKKA) scheme was introduced as a nation-wide rural sports programme in the year 2008-09. **Rajiv Gandhi Khel Abhiyan Scheme (RGKA)**, a Centrally Sponsored Scheme, was introduced in 2014-15, expanding the erstwhile “Panchayat Yuva Krida Aur Khel Abhiyan (PYKKA)”. 16.2 Prevention of Pollution of Rivers and Water Bodies:

National River Conservation Plan for 34 rivers - Sewerage plants set up: Sewage Treatment Capacity of 187 mld was targeted to be created under NRCP during the year 2018-19 (September, 2018) against which, 48.00 mld has been created so far during the year.

Presently, NRCP (excluding Ganga and its tributaries) covers polluted stretches of 34 rivers in 77 towns spread over 16 States at a sanctioned cost of Rs.5,870.55 crore.

An amount of Rs.2,510.63 crore has been released to various State Governments for implementation of various pollution abatement schemes and a treatment capacity of 2,522.03 million litres per day (mld) has been created so far under NRCP (excluding Ganga and its tributaries).

16.3 Solid and liquid Waste Management in Rural Areas and Urban Areas:

The Tamil Nadu Model of Solid Waste Management and the Telangana Model of Liquid Waste Management were studied by Senior Officials of 10 States. After this study, a Write-shop was organized and facilitated by DAY- NRLM to develop suitable proposals to initiate SLWM in rural areas in India. Accordingly, six States have developed their proposal, viz., Bihar, Chhattisgarh, Gujarat, Madhya Pradesh, Uttar Pradesh and West Bengal and received EC approval. These projects were rolled-out from January 2017. (Source: Annual Report 2018-19 of Ministry of Rural Development)

As on 31.12.2019, 81,073 wards (out of the total 84, 475 wards, i.e. 965) are covered by 100% door-to-door collection. 60% of the total waste generated is currently being processed, and 74% wards are practicing source segregation. (Source: Annual Report 2019-20 of Ministry of Housing and Urban Affairs)

Under Swachh Bharat Mission, Currently, there are 1531 functional waste to compost plants (centralized) with capacity to process 106636 tonnes waste per day, and another 566 plants are under construction, with approx. input capacity of 62,823 tonnes per day. Additionally, there are 4 functional RDF plants with input capacity of 1621 tonnes per day, 37 bio gas plants with input capacity of 1861 tonnes per day. 26 waste to energy plants are under construction with input capacity of over 22541 tonnes per day. There are currently 6 functional C&D plants 1 plant in Ahmedabad, 1 2 in Delhi EDMC and NDMC), 1 in Rajkot, 1 in Indore and 1 in Dhillwan (Punjab) (Source: Annual Report 2019-20 of Ministry of Housing and Urban Affairs)

19.1 Bio-diesel Production:

During the period April to March, 2020, 10.55 crore litres of biodiesel has been procured by OMCs for blending with biodiesel.

In order to encourage production of biodiesel from Used Cooking Oil (UCO), Oil Marketing Companies have floated Expression of Interest for supply of biodiesel produced from UCO at 300 locations across the country. The ex-factory UCO based biodiesel price has been fixed for three years. The price for the first year has been fixed at Rs 51/litre, for the second year at Rs 52.7/litre and for the third year at Rs 54.5/litre. GST and transportation shall be payable in addition to this price.

OMCs have received offers for setting up 65 Biodiesel Plants with a production capacity of approx. 1300 MT/day (48 Crore litre/annum).

19.2 Villages Electrified under Deendayal Gram Jyoti Yojana (erstwhile Rajiv Gandhi Grameen Vidyutikaran Yojana (RGGVY)): Ministry of Power has informed that all inhabited census villages have been electrified as on 28th April, 2018.
