PART - I OVERALL PERFORMANCE ANALYSIS

Twenty Point Programme-2006

Progress Report – (April 2021 - December 2021)

- 1. This progress report of Twenty Point Programme-2006 consists of two parts: *Part-I* contains an analysis of the overall performance, whereas *Part-II* deals with item-wise performance.
- 2. The report is compiled on the basis of data received from the Central Nodal Ministries and State Governments/UT Administrations. Presently, 14 parameters are taken for quarterly performance analysis. The data are received either through web enabled software of this Ministry or through fax/e-mail/post.
- 3. The analysis for the period *April 2021 March 2022* shows that the performance under *six items/parameters* has been '**Very Good**' (90% or above the targets). These items/parameters are:
 - (i) Pumps sets energized
 - (ii) Number of SHGs promoted (new and revived) during the financial year NRLM
 - (iii) ICDS Blocks Operational (Cum.)
 - (iv) Anganwadis Functional (Cum.)
 - (v) Electricity supplied
 - (vi) Food Security: National Food Security Act (Tide Over)-NFSA
- 4. There are *two* items/parameters in the category of 'Good' (80% or above but less than 90%).
 - (i) Food Security: Targeted Public Distribution System (TPDS)
 - (ii) Food Security: National Food Security Act (Normal)-NFSA
- 5. The performance of *six items/parameters* has been 'Poor' (below 80% of target). These items/parameters are:
 - (i) Number of SHGs provided Community Investment Fund (CIF) during the financial year NRLM
 - (ii) Seedlings planted (Public and Forest Lands)
 - (iii) Rural Housing PMAY(G)
 - (iv) Area Covered under Plantation (Public and Forest Lands)
 - (v) Road constructed- PMGSY
 - (vi) Number of SHGs provided Revolving Fund (RF) during the financial year NRLM
- 6. Rest of the quarterly monitored items are being monitored without any targets.
