1. INTRODUCTION

1.1. Data on household consumer expenditure are being collected in each round of the National Sample Survey (NSS) beginning from the first round which started in October 1950. These data are generally being processed roundwise and published in the form of "NSS Tables with Notes" series. The present set of tables has been prepared from the data collected during the fourteenth round of the survey. The tabulation plan and item coverage were decided in accordance with the recommendations of the NSS Programme Committee which met in February 1960. It may be noted that as compared to the reports of the earlier rounds, the scope of information of the present report has been enlarged to a considerable extent. This was mainly because of the requirements of some of the principal users of the consumer expenditure data such as the National Income Division (CSO), the Ministry of Food and Agriculture, etc. The additional information furnished in the report relates to the statewise distribution of vegetarian and non-vegetarian population, consumption of individual items (rice, wheat, etc.) of the cereal group in terms of quantity and value, cash and barter purchases and consumption out of homegrown stock for a large number of items.

1.2. The field work of the fourteenth round started in July 1958 and continued up to June 1959, covering a period of one complete year. The reference period for collection of data on consumer expenditure was 30 days preceding the date of survey. The estimates presented in the report, therefore, broadly relate to the period, June 1958 to June 1959.

*The present report is the combined form of the draft reports numbering **D. 99** and **D. 107**. **D. 99**, which relates to urban sector, was submitted to the Government of India in July, 1962 and **D. 107**, relating to rural sector, was submitted in October, 1962.

National Sample Survey

1.3. The geographical coverage of the survey was the entire Indian Union excluding the Andaman and Nicobar Islands, the islands of Amindivi, Laccadive and Minicoy, the North East Frontier Agency and the rural areas of Ladakh district in Jammu and Kashmir. Information was collected by interviewing the members (usually the head of a household) of the sample households. Altogether 7589 sample households selected from 2573 sample villages in rural areas and 2218 sample households from 2220¹ sample blocks (including 397 sample households selected from 397 sample blocks in the four big cities of Bombay, Calcutta, Delhi and Madras) in the urban areas were surveyed in the present round. The estimates in all tables are given by a pair of independent and interpenetrating sub-samples and also by the combined sample. The usual technique of interpenetrating net-work of samples (IPNS) has been employed both at the collection and tabulation stages.

1.4. The responsibility for field work rested with the Directorate of the National Sample Survey in all states and union territories covered under the survey except in West Bengal and Bombay City, where the collection of data was done by the field staff of the Indian Statistical Institute. Processing and tabulation of data were done in the Indian Statistical Institute.

1.5. A broad outline of sampling design and method of estimation is given in Appendix I. Appendix II contains two summary tables, namely (i) pattern of consumer expenditure by items and by rounds for all India and (ii) distribution of per capita total consumer expenditure by states. Both these are supplied for the rural and urban sectors separately. Facsimile of schedules of enquiry is given in Appendix III.

2. CONCEPTS AND DEFINITIONS

2.1. The concepts and definitions as followed in the consumer expenditure enquiry continue to remain the same as in earlier rounds. Some of the basic concepts and definitions are explained below.

2.2. *Household* : [A household is a group of persons usually living together and taking principal meals from a common kitchen. A boarding house, a hotel or a hostel is treated as a cluster of households, where each individual boarder (with his dependents or guests) forms a separate household. Households maintained and fed directly by Government such as those in prisons, police quarters, cantonments, hospitals, asylums and relief camps are, however, excluded from the scope of the survey.]

2.3. *Household member* : [Any person who takes principal meals with the household for at least 16 days preceding the date of enquiry is considered to be a member of the household. Such a person may be the head of the household, or a relation or a protege of the head, or an employee or a guest of the household.]

2.4. Household size : [The number of members (as defined in page 2) in a household gives the household size.]

2.5. Consumer expenditure : [Consumer expenditure comprises all expenditures incurred by the household exclusively on domestic account including consumption out of homegrown produce or transfer receipts like gift, loan, etc. The expenditure on household enterprises is excluded from consumer expenditure. Consumption out of homegrown produce is evaluated at ex-farm rates¹. Consumption out of gifts and charities as well as of articles acquired through barter exchanges is evaluated at prevailing retail rates. While consumption out of transfer receipts is included, transfer payments of all kinds (loans, gifts, charities, monetary as well as in kind, like grain loan etc.) are excluded. Expenditures on purchase and construction of residential houses are considered to be expenses on capital account and hence are excluded from the consumer expenditure schedule; but the expenses towards maintenance of residential building are included in the consumer expenditure of the household. For collection of data from sample households, monetary value of food articles consumed during the reference period² is taken to represent consumer expenditure on food articles during the period. For non-food articles, in general, monetary value of articles acquired during the reference period represents consumer expenditure on the articles during the period.]

2.6. Purchases : [Purchases include cash and barter purchases by the household during the reference period. Cash purchase includes credit purchase as well. Barter purchases are exchanges by goods and/or services and are imputed at the rate of average local retail prices prevailing during the period of reference. Only such purchases by the household as are utilised (or likely to be utilised) for non-productive domestic consumption are taken into account.]

2.7. Vegetarian and non-vegetarian members : [Classification of members into vegetarian or non-vegetarian category was done on the basis of the usual consumption habit. Thus if a member usually (not necessarily regularly) took meat, fish, eggs, etc., he or she was considered as a non-vegetarian. Information was collected under the following breakdowns :

- (i) non-vegetarian, i.e. taking meat, fish, egg, etc.
- (ii) vegetarian taking eggs but not meat or fish,
- (iii) vegetarian not taking either meat or fish or eggs
 - (a) on the grounds of religious or social prohibitions
 - (b) on medical grounds
 - (c) from just habit or tradition
 - (d) for other reasons.]

3. EXPLANATORY NOTES ON TABLES

3.1. Three sets of tables are included in the report. One set represents tables for the entire rural areas and other set for the entire urban areas. The third set represents tables for the four big cities of Bombay, Calcutta, Delhi and Madras. The urban areas include these four cities as well. The estimates in each table are given by sub-samples (indicated by S_1 and S_2) and by the combined sample (indicated by comb.). For convenience of reference, the table numbers have been coded. The left hand most digits stand for the sector to which the tables belong, i.e. 1 for rural, 2 for urban and 3 for cities (four big cities only). The digits following the first point from left stand for the nature of information. The digits following the second point, refer to regions for which estimates are supplied. These region codes are defined as follows :

3.2. The description of rural tables presented in this report are as follows :

3.3. Table 1.1.0 shows the allotted and surveyed number of sample villages and sample households in rural areas by states, and all India.

3.4. Tables 1.2.0 to 1.5.0 give (i) the distribution of sample households, (ii) the percentage distribution of estimated number of households, (iii) the percentage distribution of estimated number of persons and (iv) average number of persons per household in rural areas. The estimates in these tables are given by states and all India and by monthly per capita expenditure levels.

The monthly per capita expenditure levels have been grouped in 12 classes as follows :

The groups 0—8, 8—11, etc. stand for 0—less than 8, 8—less than 11 and so on. Estimates for all classes pooled together are also presented.

Consumer Expenditure

3.5. Table 1.6.0 gives the consumer expenditure in rupees per person for a period of 30 days by items of consumption and by monthly per capita expenditure levels in rural areas. Estimates are given for 15 broad groups of items such as (1) cereals and cereal substitutes,* (2) milk and milk products, (3) edible oil, (4) meat, egg and fish, (5) sugar, (6) salt, (7) other food items, (8) food total, (9) clothing, (10) fuel and light, (11) rent, (12) taxes, (13) miscellaneous, (14) non-food total and (15) total consumer expenditure.

These groups are defined here in terms of their constituents.

- (1) Cereals and cereal substitutes : [rice, wheat, jowar, bajra, maize, barley, small millets, ragi, Bengal gram and their products and cereal substitutes such as tapioca, pea etc.]
- (2) Milk and milk products : [liquid milk (cow, buffalo, goat and others), milk (condensed, powder, etc.), ghee (cow and buffalo), butter, dahi, ghol, lassi, and other milk products]
- (3) Edible oil : [mustard oil, cocoanut oil, gingelly oil, groundnut oil, vanaspati and oil seeds used as food.]
- (4) Meat, egg and fish : [meat (goat-meat, mutton, beef, pork, buffalo meat and other meat), egg, poultry, fish (fresh and dried), bird and others.]
- (5) Sugar : [sugar (factory), gur (cane and others), sugar candy and others.]
- (6) Salt : [sea salt, rock salt and other salts.]
- (7) Other food : [pulses and products, vegetables, fruits and nuts, spices, beverages and refreshments; pickles, jams and jellies.]
- (8) Food total : this is obtained by aggregating the groups 1 to 7.
- (9) Clothing : [all items of clothing—cotton (mill made, handloom and khaddar), silk and woollen including items of bedding and upholstery.]
- (10) Fuel and light : [coke, coal, firewood, electricity, gas, dungcake, charcoal, kerosene, candle, matches and other fuel and lighting oil.]
- (11) Rents : [rents on residential house, residential land and other consumer goods. No imputation of rent for residential houses owned by the sample household was made.]
- (12) Taxes : [consumer taxes like road cess, chowkidari taxes, municipal rates, consumer license fees and other local rates. Income tax or taxes relating to household enterprise are excluded.]
- (13) Miscellaneous : [pan etc., tobacco and products, drugs and intoxicants, amusements and sports, education, medicine, toilets, sundry goods, services, conveyances, ceremonials, furniture, musical instruments, ornaments, domestic utensils, footwear and other durable and semi-durable goods and their repairing expenses including the maintenance of residential houses.]

*The old terminology "foodgrains" as used in earlier reports on consumer expenditure has been replaced by "cereals and cereal substitutes" in the present report.

(14) *Non-food total* : this is obtained by aggregating groups 9 to 13.

(15) *Total consumer expenditure* : this is obtained by aggregating the groups 8 and 14.

3.6. Table 1.7.0 conveys the same information as given by Table 1.6.0 but in terms of percentage to total consumer expenditure. Both the tables 1.6.0 and 1.7.0 give estimates for all India (rural).

3.7. Tables 1.8.0 and 1.9.0 respectively give the value and quantity of consumption per person for a period of 30 days by monthly per capita expenditure levels in rural areas. The tables are supplied for all India. The items included are : rice, wheat, jowar, bajra, maize, barley, small millets, ragi, gram (Bengal), total cereals, cereal substitutes, total cereals and cereal substitutes and pulses and products.

3.8. Table 1.10.0 gives the value of cash purchase, purchase by goods and services and total purchase per person for a period of 30 days in rural areas. The table is given for all India. The items included are : rice, wheat, other cereals¹, total cereals, total cereals and cereal substitutes, milk (liquid), ghee, butter, total milk and milk products, total vegetables, mango, total fruits and nuts, goat meat, mutton, beef, pork, buffalo meat, other meat, egg, poultry, fish (fresh), fish (dried), bird, total meat, egg and fish, sugar, gur (cane), food items other than cereals and milk and their products (i.e. all items under block 12), pan (leaf), pan (finished)), supari, opium, ganja, toddy, firewood, dungcake, charcoal, services: teacher, doctor, nurse, midwife, lawyer; telephone, priest, preceptor, domestic servant, domestic cook, driver, coachman, sweeper, barber, cobbler, tailor, washerman, carpenter, blacksmith, goldsmith, silversmith, bricklayer, masons, other house builders, unskilled labour, other services, total services, rent for residential house, total rent and total second-hand purchase.

3.9. Tables 1.11.0 to 1.11.16 give value of consumption out of homegrown stock, value of total consumption per person for a period of 30 days and proportion of consumption out of homegrown stock to total consumption in rural areas. Items included in each of these tables are: rice, wheat, other cereals¹; total cereals, total cereals and cereal substitutes, pulses, total vegetables, total fruits and nuts, total meat, egg and fish and food items other than cereals and milk and their products (i.e. all items under block 12). Tables have been provided for each state, all Union Territories pooled, all India and all cities pooled.

3.10. Table 1.12.0. gives statewise indices of value of consumption per person in rural areas (with all India as base, 100). This table gives a comparative picture of value of consumption per person for the states relative to that for all India. The indices are given for four principal groups of items, namely cereals and cereal substitutes, food total, non-food total and total consumer expenditure.

3.11. Table 1.13.0 gives the percentage distribution of estimated vegetarian and non-vegetarian population to estimated total population in rural areas. Table 1.14.0 gives the number of eggs consumed per person for a period of 30 days in rural areas. Estimates in both the tables are given by states, all Union Territories (pooled) and all India. Information contained in these two tables was requisitioned by the Ministry of Food and Agriculture.

3.12. The description of urban tables is exactly similar to that of the rural tables as given in paras 3.3. to 3.11. References to the urban tables are obtained by changing the sector code 1 into 2. Similar tables as mentioned in paras 3.3 to 3.9 are also supplied for the four big cities (Bombay, Calcutta, Delhi and Madras). No tables corresponding to paras 3.10 and 3.11 are supplied for the cities.

3.13. It may be noted that estimates in some of the tables are based on a very small number of sample households. In such cases, it is advisable that the estimates should be used with sufficient caution.

3.14. Figures in the tables are given in two decimal places. Where the estimate is nil it is indicated by dash (—) but where the estimate is too small to be represented in two decimal places, it is indicated by 0.00.

4. SUMMARY OF RESULTS

4.1. Some of the broad findings of the consumer expenditure survey during the period, July 1958 to June 1959, are being summarised in this chapter. The figures quoted here refer to the combined sample estimates.

4.2. The average number of persons per rural household (according to the concepts and definitions adopted in para 2.2 to 2.4) is 5.18 for the country as a whole. It is lowest (4.61) for the state of Madras and highest (5.83) for Punjab. For the urban sector, the average household size is 4.33 for all India, the highest size (5.69) being reported by Kerala and the lowest (3.31) by West Bengal. For the city sector¹, the average household size is slightly lower (3.91), the highest size (4.46) being reported by Madras and the lowest (3.30) by Calcutta.

4.3. The consumer expenditure on all items, that is, the total consumer expenditure per person per 30 days in India is Rs. 20.13 for the rural sector, Rs. 28.06 for the urban sector and Rs. 39.91 for the cities. Thus the level of per capita consumer expenditure is lowest in the countryside and highest in cities. There is, however, not much difference in the per capita consumer expenditure for these three regions when viewed separately for each monthly per capita expenditure level. The wide variation in the overall per capita consumer expenditure for rural, urban and

city sectors is, however, due to the difference in the pattern of percentage distribution of population into various expenditure levels for these regions. Table 4 series show that the rural population is concentrated more heavily towards the lower expenditure levels while the population of the urban sector, in particular, that of the cities, towards the higher expenditure levels.

4.4. Variation also exists in the level of per capita consumer expenditure among the states. In the rural sector, the lowest per capita expenditure (Rs. 14.35) is reported by Orissa and the highest (Rs. 33.96) by Punjab. In the urban sector, the lowest per capita expenditure (Rs. 21.39) is reported by Kerala and the highest (Rs. 38.57) by Assam. The per capita consumer expenditure for the Union Territories is Rs. 22.76 for the rural sector and Rs. 48.33 for the urban sector. The significantly high level of per capita expenditure for the urban sector of the Union Territories is due to inclusion of the city of Delhi within its jurisdiction¹.

4.5. Considering the estimates of consumer expenditure per person per 30 days by broad groups² of consumer items presented in Table 7 series, it appears that the pattern of consumer expenditure also differs in rural, urban and city sectors of India. The per capita expenditures for a period of 30 days on all food items are Rs. 13.93, Rs. 16.91 and Rs. 21.91 for the rural, urban and city sectors respectively and their percentages to total consumer expenditure are 69.26, 60.25 and 54.91 respectively. Thus a major part of consumer expenditure in India is spent on food. The per capita expenditures on cereals and cereal substitutes are Rs. 8.51, Rs. 6.85 and Rs. 6.34 for the rural, urban and city sectors respectively. In other words, this particular item accounts for 61.09%, 40.51% and 28.94% of expenditure on all food items and 42.31%, 24.40% and 15.87% of total consumer expenditure for the three sectors taken in order. Thus in the rural sector people subsist mainly on cereals and cereal substitutes. The same item is also the principal item of food for the urban and city sectors. Milk and milk products come as the next item of importance in the family budget in India. The per capita expenditures on milk and milk products are Rs. 1.43, Rs. 2.59 and Rs. 3.60 for the rural, urban and city sectors respectively. The corresponding percentages to total consumer expenditure are 7.12%, 9.23% and 9.02% respectively. The per capita expenditure for a period of 30 days for the rural, urban and city sectors, taken in order, are respectively Re. 0.50, Re. 0.96 and Rs. 1.48 for edible oil, Re. 0.47, Re. 0.94 and Rs. 2.01 for meat, egg and fish, Re. 0.61, Re. 0.85 and Re. 0.99 for sugar, and Rs. 2.36, Rs. 4.68 and Rs. 7.44 for the group representing the other food items. It is observed that the rates of consumption of these items are much higher for the urban sector than the corresponding rates for the rural sector. The per capita value of consumption of salt is of the order of Re. 0.04 for the urban sector while for the rural sector and cities, the rate of consumption is slightly higher (Rs. 0.05 per person per 30 days).

4.6. The expenditure per person per 30 days on the non-food items for the rural, urban and city sectors are Rs. 6.20, Rs. 11.15 and Rs. 18.00 respectively and their percentage to total consumer expenditure are 30.74, 39.75 and 45.09 respectively, thus bringing out a sharp inequality in the level of living for the three regions under consideration. The per capita expenditures on items like 'clothing', 'fuel and light' and 'miscellaneous goods and services' are respectively Rs. 1.67, Rs. 1.17 and Rs. 3.31 for the rural sector, Rs. 1.79, Rs. 1.75 and Rs. 6.40 for the urban sector and Rs. 1.91, Rs. 2.07 and Rs. 10.59 for the cities, showing that the rates of expenditure for these items are sufficiently high for the cities. Consumer rent shows a very wide difference in its rate of expenditure for these three regions. The per capita expenditures on this item are Rs. 0.03, Rs. 1.10 and Rs. 3.32 for the rural, urban and city sectors respectively. While the rate of payment towards consumer taxes remains the same (Re. 0.11 per person per 30 days) for the urban and city sectors, it is negligible (Re. 0.02 per person per 30 days) for the rural sector.

4.7. An important characteristic in the consumer habit of the rural, urban and city population in India is revealed by the rate of physical consumption of cereals and cereal substitutes in these sectors. The per capita consumption of this item for a period of 30 days is of the order of 19.50 sr. for the rural sector, 13.75 sr. for the urban sector and 10.97 sr. for the cities. This regional characteristic is also noticed at each monthly per capita expenditure level. The per capita estimates of quantity of consumption of cereals and cereal substitutes by monthly per capita expenditure levels presented in Table 9 series show that the rate of consumption rises steadily with the rise in the level of expenditure. For the rural sector, the rise is continuous, starting from 10.83 sr. per person per 30 days for the lowest expenditure level and rising to 33.19 sr. per person per 30 days for the highest expenditure level. For the urban and city sectors, a slower rate of rise of per capita consumption is noticed. Starting from 9.19 sr. per person per 30 days for the lowest expenditure level, the urban rate of consumption for different expenditure levels at first rises and then subsequently fluctuates within a range of 13 to 15 seers approximately. The rate of consumption for the cities similarly starts from 8.76 sr. per person per 30 days for the lowest expenditure level, continues to rise with the rise in the expenditure level and subsequently fluctuates within a range of 10 to 12 seers approximately. The estimates of value of consumption of cereals and cereal substitutes presented in Table 8 series also exhibit similar trend.

4.8. The principal items of cereals consumed in India are rice and wheat. The per capita quantities of consumption of rice for a period of 30 days for the rural, urban and city sectors are 8.24 sr., 5.95 sr. and 6.41 sr. respectively and those of wheat for the same period are 2.55 sr., 4.10 sr. and 4.16 sr. respectively. Jowar is the next important item of cereals consumed in both rural and urban areas. The per capita quantities of consumption of jowar for a period of 30 days are 2.75 sr. and 1.79 sr. respectively for the rural and urban sectors. Bajra is another important item of cereals consumed in rural sector, in particular. The per capita consumption

of bajra for a period of 30 days is of the order of 1.37 sr. for the rural sector. The other items of cereals consumed mostly in the rural areas are maize, barley, ragi, gram (Bengal) and small millets. The per capita consumption of any of these items for a period of 30 days is below one seer for the rural sector. The order of per capita consumption of any of these items is still lower (i.e., below 0.50 sr.) for the urban sector. Cereal substitutes like tapioca, pea, etc., are primarily consumed in the rural sector, the rate of consumption being of the order of 0.94 sr. per person per 30 days. It is worthwhile to note that the cities consume mostly rice and wheat, which account for 96.35% of the total consumption of cereals and cereal substitutes in the cities.

4.9. The per capita values of cash purchase of all food items for a period of 30 days for the rural, urban and city sectors are Rs. 6.43, Rs. 15.33 and Rs. 21.29 respectively and the corresponding values of consumption are Rs. 13.93, Rs. 16.91 and Rs. 21.91 respectively. This shows that while the consumption of food items is almost completely monetized in the urban and city sectors, it is partly monetized and partly non-monetized in the rural sector. The non-monetized part mainly consists of consumption out of home-grown stock. The proportion of consumption out of home-grown stock to total consumption for the rural sector is of the order of 52% for cereals, 50% for pulses, 28% for vegetables, 36% for fruits and nuts and 17% for meat, egg and fish. The corresponding proportions for the urban sector range between 2 and 8 per cent and for the city sector, they hardly exceed 2 per cent. Consumption out of barter purchases comprises only a small proportion of total non-monetized consumption in the rural sector. In the case of cereals, the principal item of barter in the rural sector, the order of barter purchase is Re. 0.65 per person per 30 days as against the rate of consumption of Rs. 4.36 per person per 30 days of homegrown cereals for the same sector. An exception, however, arises in the case of consumer services such as those rendered by barbers, washermen, carpenters, blacksmiths, etc. in the rural sector. The non-monetized part of such services consumed comes from barter purchase only. The value of such services purchased in kind in the rural sector is Re. 0.17 per person per 30 days and comprises 25% of cash purchase of consumer services for the rural sector. The proportion of barter purchase to cash purchase of consumer services is below 4 per cent for the urban sector and below one per cent for the cities. The estimates of per capita value of barter purchase of food items other than cereals for a period of 30 days show that the rate for the city sector (Re. 0.24) is higher than the corresponding rates for the urban sector (Re. 0.18) and rural sector (Re. 0.17). This may appear confusing at first sight. A scrutiny of the filled-in schedules, however, reveals that in a majority of cases, the data collected relate to the value of food items like cooked meals, refreshments and beverages received from the non-household establishments like hotels, restaurants etc., in exchange of services rendered by their employees.

4.10. Table 13 series reveal that in India there are twice as many non-vegetarian persons as there are vegetarian persons. The percentage of non-vegetarian persons to total population is of the order of 70.23% for the rural sector and

66.99% for the urban sector. The percentage varies widely from state to state. The range of variation for the rural sector is from 33.99% (Rajasthan) to 95.72% (Assam) and that for the urban sector is from 37.77% (Rajasthan) to 100% (Orissa) States in which the non-vegetarian population is predominantly high are Andhra Pradesh, Assam, Jammu and Kashmir, Kerala, Madras, Orissa and West Bengal. The percentage of non-vegetarian persons to total persons exceed 80% in these States.

4.11. Table 14 series show that the number of eggs consumed per person per 30 days is 0.21 for the rural sector and 0.57 for the urban sector in India. In the rural sector, the state of Jammu and Kashmir is the largest consumer (0.70 per person per 30 days) of eggs, where as in the urban sector, West Bengal reports the highest consumption (1.34 per person per 30 days).

APPENDIX I

SAMPLING DESIGN AND METHOD OF ESTIMATION¹

1. *General* : A broad outline of the sampling design and estimation procedure as followed in the rural and urban sectors during the fourteenth round is given below.

A. *Sampling Design for the rural sector* :

2. *General* : A stratified two-stage sampling design was adopted in which the first-stage units were the villages and the second-stage units were the households from which information was collected.

3. *Work programme* : The survey period in the rural sector was divided into six sub-rounds of two months each. In each stratum, two investigators were posted and the same two investigators worked throughout the survey period each surveying an independent sub-sample of 6 villages. The same 6 villages were surveyed in each sub-round by each investigator except in the first sub-round in which 3 of them were surveyed. Thus in each sub-round, two independent and interpenetrating network of sub-samples of villages were surveyed by two different parties of investigators.

4. *Stratification* : In each state, strata were formed by grouping together contiguous tehsils, more or less homogeneous with respect to population density, altitude above sea level and cultivation of food crops, in such a way that the population of each stratum was approximately the same. The number of strata in a state was made one-twelfth of the total allocation of sample villages for the state. This was done so because the number of sample villages selected for survey was 12 per stratum. The total number of strata so formed was 218 in the rural sector.

5. *Allocation* : A total of 2616 villages were sampled in the rural sector during the fourteenth round. These sample villages were allocated to the different states on a joint consideration of their population, geographical area, crop acreage and the number of persons engaged in household enterprise on the basis of the 1951 census. Special weight was given to the state of Jammu and Kashmir in the final allocation to ensure better estimates for that state. The allocations were finally rounded off to multiples of 12. Table 1.1.0 gives the allocation of sample villages by states. It may be noted that for the purpose of stratification and allocation, the union territories of Manipur and Tripura were merged with the state of Assam and those of Delhi and Himachal Pradesh with the Punjab.

6. *Selection* : Within a stratum, the tehsils were first listed arranging them in a serpentine order (without breaking their geographical contiguity). Six villages were selected systematically with a random start, constituting one sub-sample for the stratum. Another six villages were selected in a similar manner with another

random start, constituting the other sub-sample of the stratum. In case a stratum had a large area, it was divided into smaller regions (known as 'investigation zones') so that the area to be covered by an investigator was limited. From each such stratum, two investigation zones were selected with probability proportional to the number of villages in them and with replacement. Two sets of six sample villages, constituting the two sub-samples, were then selected from these two investigation zones in the manner described above. In case a sample village was too large for investigation purposes, a hamlet or a group of hamlets within the sample village was selected with equal probability and the survey in that village was restricted to the hamlet or group of hamlets thus selected.

6.1. The six sample villages in a stratum, allotted to an investigator, were numbered from 1 to 6 according to their order of selection and were visited in that order in each sub-round. In the first sub-round, the listing of all the six villages was completed and one household was selected at random from each of the sample villages, 1, 3 and 5. In the second and each subsequent sub-round, 3 households were selected systematically with a random start from amongst the households belonging to all the six sample villages taken together. The data on household consumer expenditure were then collected from these selected households.

7. *Estimation procedure* : The estimates presented in the report are, in general, estimates of ratios like the consumer expenditure per person on different items of consumption or the percentages to total consumer expenditure by items of consumption. These estimates of ratios were obtained by division of the estimates of totals of two characteristics. The procedure of estimation of total of a characteristic is explained below :

Let,

- V_i = total number of villages in the i -th stratum.
- v_i = number of sample villages of one sub-sample surveyed in the first sub-round from the i -th stratum. In the second or each subsequent sub-round, this number is 6.
- w_{ij} = number of hamlet groups formed in the j -th sample village in the i -th stratum.
[$w_{ij}=1$, if there are no hamlet groups]
- H_{ij} = total number of households listed in the j -th sample village (or in the hamlet group selected from it) in the i -th stratum.
- h_{ij} = number of sample households surveyed in the j -th sample village in the i -th stratum in the first sub-round.
- h_i = number of sample households selected from all the sample villages of one sub-sample from the i -th stratum and surveyed in each of the sub-rounds—second to sixth.
- y_{ijk} = total value of a characteristic reported from the k -th sample household in the j -th sample village from the i -th stratum.

then, the unbiased estimates of total value of the characteristic for a given region (state/all India) built up from G strata within it, for one sub-sample, are

The sub-sample estimate for the entire round is obtained by taking simple arithmetic average of the sub-sample estimates for all the sub-rounds. The combined sample estimate is obtained by taking the simple arithmetic average of the sub-sample estimates.

B. *Sampling Design for the urban sector :*

8. *General :* A stratified two-stage sampling design was adopted in which the first-stage units were the 1951 census enumeration blocks and the second-stage units were the households from which information was collected.

9. *Work Programme :* The survey period in the urban sector was divided into two sub-rounds of six months each. The sample of blocks selected for survey in this round had been drawn in the form of 4 independent and interpenetrating sub-samples. The sub-samples 1 and 2 were surveyed during the first sub-round and sub-samples 3 and 4 in the second sub-round. The four sub-samples were surveyed by two different parties of investigators. Party 1 surveyed sub-samples 1 and 3 and party 2 sub-samples 2 and 4¹.

10. *Stratification :* Each city with a population of 3,00,000 and above and each capital town of the former Part A and Part B states (prior to States Reorganisation in 1956), excepting Shillong, the capital of Assam, formed an independent stratum as also the towns within each Natural Division. In the city of Calcutta, 8 sub-strata were formed, each stratum consisting of several adjoining Wards (1951 census), and in Jammu and Kashmir, the town of Jammu was considered as a separate stratum. In all there were 94 strata in the urban sector of Indian Union.

11. *Allocation :* Out of the 2228 blocks sampled throughout the Indian Union for the fourteenth round, 216 were from Jammu and Kashmir and 12 from Chandigarh in the Punjab. The rest of the blocks were mainly allocated to the different strata in proportion to their respective non-agricultural population (1951

census). Preferential weights were given to the cities and towns, which were treated as separate strata, while allocating the sample blocks. This was achieved first by allocating four-fifths of these blocks to all the strata in proportion to their non-agricultural population and then one-fifth only to cities and towns treated as separate strata in a similar way. In all cases, the stratum allocations were ultimately rounded off to multiples of 4 in view of the requirement of 4 independent sub-samples¹. Tables (2.1.0) and (3.1.0) give the allocations of sample blocks by reorganised states and by four big cities respectively.

12. *Selection*: The towns and cities (excepting those treated as separate strata) within each Natural Division were first arranged according to their means of livelihood classes. Within each of these livelihood classes, they were further arranged according to their geographical nearness as far as possible. Next, the blocks within each town or city were also arranged according to their geographical nearness. With this arrangement of towns and blocks, 4 circular systematic samples of blocks were drawn with independent random starts with a view to obtaining 4 interpenetrating and independent sub-samples. Finally, *one household* was selected at random from each sample block for collection of data on consumer expenditure. If a selected block was found to be very large, it was divided into a number of artificial blocks, each consisting of about 100 to 200 households. One of these artificial blocks was then selected with equal probability and a household was selected at random from it for survey.

13. *Estimation Procedure*: The estimates presented for the urban sector are similar to those of rural sector. The estimates of 'total' of a characteristic for the urban sector are, however, obtained as follows.

Let,

- B_i = total number of blocks in the i -th stratum;
 b_i = the number of sample blocks in one sub-sample from the i -th stratum;
 w_{ij} = the number of artificial blocks formed in the j -th sample block from the i -th stratum;
