# THE NATIONAL SAMPLE SURVEY

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## TABLES WITH NOTES ON CONSUMER EXPENDITURE

*The report entitled "Tables with Notes on Consumer Expenditure: Eleventh and Twelfth Rounds, August 1956—August 1957" was prepared by the Indian Statistical Institute, Calcutta. The views contained in the report are not necessarily those of the Government of India.\**

### INTRODUCTION

1.1. The consumer expenditure schedule is being canvassed regularly from the very inception of the National Sample Survey in 1950. The tables presented in this report have been prepared from the data collected during the eleventh round covering the period August 1956 to February 1957 and twelfth round covering the period March 1957 to August 1957. Reports on consumer expenditure based on these two rounds have already been brought out as separate volumes (Report no. 77: Tables with notes on consumer expenditure, 11th round and Report no. 78: Tables with notes on consumer expenditure, 12th round). Since each of these two rounds covers only a part of a year, the estimates in these two reports are subject to seasonal variations. It was therefore thought desirable to combine these two rounds together and obtain estimates relating to one full year (August 1956 to August 1957) which will naturally be free from seasonality. Since the reference period for the collection of data on consumer expenditure was 30 days preceding the date of enquiry, estimates presented in the report broadly refer to the period, July 1956 to August 1957.

1.2. The survey covered the entire rural and urban areas of the Indian Union excluding Andaman and Nicobar islands and part B tribal areas of Assam. The information was collected from 14503 sample households selected from 3676 sample villages in the rural areas and from 5698 sample households selected from 1166 sample blocks in the urban areas (including 1186 sample households from 252 sample blocks in the four big cities of Bombay, Calcutta, Delhi and Madras). All information was collected by interviewing members (usually the head of the household) of the sample households.

1.4. An account of the sampling design and the method of estimation appears in Appendix I. The estimates presented in this report have been obtained by calculating the simple average of the eleventh and twelfth round estimates. The procedure was adopted because even if the appropriately weighted method was used the estimates would not differ appreciably. This will be clear from the table provided in Appendix II, which gives a dimensional idea of the weighted and unweighted averages. A facsimile of the schedule of enquiry is given in Appendix III.

#### CONCEPTS AND DEFINITIONS

2.1. The concepts and definitions remained the same as in the earlier rounds. Some basic concepts and definitions adopted in the survey are explained below.

2.2. *Household*: A household is a group of persons usually living together and taking principal meals from a common kitchen. A boarding house, a hostel or a hotel is treated to be consisting of a number of households, where each individual boarder (with his dependants or guests) forms a separate household. Households maintained and fed directly by government such as those in prisons, police quarters, cantonments, hospitals, asylums and relief camps are, however, excluded from the scope of the survey.

2.3. *Household member*: Any person who takes principal meals with the household for at least 16 days (not necessarily continuous) within a period of 30 days preceding the date of enquiry is considered to be a member of the household. Such a person may be the head of the household, or a relation or protege of the head, or an employee or a guest of the household.

2.4. *Household size*: The number of members (as defined above) in a household gives the household size.

2.5. *Consumer expenditure*: Consumer expenditure comprises all expenditures incurred by the household exclusively on domestic account including consumption out of home-grown produce or transfer receipts like gift, loan, etc. The expenditure on household enterprises is excluded from consumer expenditure. Consumption out of home-grown produce is evaluated at ex-farm rates.<sup>1</sup> Consumption out of gifts and charities as well as of articles acquired through barter exchanges is evaluated at prevailing retail rates. While consumption out of transfer receipts is included, transfer payments of all kinds (loans, gifts, charities, monetary as well as in kind, like grain loan, etc.) are excluded. Expenditures on purchase and construction of residential houses are considered to be expenses on capital account and hence are excluded from the consumer expenditure schedule; but the expenses towards the maintenance of residential building are included in the consumer expenditure of the household. For collection of data from sample households, monetary value of food articles consumed during the reference period (30 days preceding the date of

enquiry) is taken to represent consumer expenditure on food articles during the period. For non-food articles, in general, monetary value of articles acquired during the reference period represents consumer expenditure on the articles during the period.

#### EXPLANATORY NOTES ON TABLES

3.1. The tables, according to the nature of the information they supply, are grouped in the following way :

- (i) tables showing the distribution of sample households,
- (ii) tables showing the percentage distribution of estimated number of households and persons,
- (iii) tables showing the average number of persons per household,
- (iv) tables showing the consumer expenditure in rupees per person for a period of 30 days by items of consumption and by monthly per capita expenditure classes,
- (v) tables showing the expenditure as percentage to total consumer expenditure by items of consumption and by regions.

3.2. The items of consumption have been merged into 15 major groups. The 15 major groups are : (1) foodgrains, (2) milk and milk products, (3) edible oil, (4) meat, egg and fish, (5) sugar, (6) salt, (7) other food, (8) food total, (9) clothing, (10) fuel and light, (11) rent, (12) taxes, (13) miscellaneous, (14) non-food total and (15) total consumer expenditure.

3.3. The groups of items of consumption, as presented in the table, are defined here in terms of their constituents :

- (a) *Foodgrains* : rice, wheat, jowar, bajra, maize, barley, small-millets, ragi, Bengal gram and their products and cereal substitutes such as tapioca, pea, etc.
- (b) *Milk and milk products* : liquid milk (cow, buffalo, goat and others), milk (condensed, powder, etc.), ghee (cow and buffalo), butter, dahi, ghol, lassi and other milk products.
- (c) *Edible oil* : mustard oil, cocconut oil, gingelly oil, groundnut oil, vanaspati and oilseeds used as food.
- (d) *Meat, egg and fish* : meat (goat meat, mutton, beef, pork, buffalo meat and other meat), egg, poultry, fish (fresh and dried), bird and others.
- (e) *Sugar* : sugar (factory), gur (cane and others), sugar candy and others.
- (f) *Salt* : sea salt, rock salt and other salts.

- (g) *Other food* : pulses and products, vegetables, fruits and nuts, spices, beverages, refreshments, pickles, jams and jellies and cooked meals.
- (h) *Clothing* : all items of clothing—cotton (millmade, handloom and khaddar), silk and woollen, including items of bedding and upholstery.
- (i) *Fuel and light* : coke, coal, firewood, electricity, gas, dungcake, charcoal, kerosene, candle, matches and other fuel and lighting oil, lubricating oil, motor spirit and others.
- (j) *Rents and taxes* : rents on residential house, residential land and other consumer goods, consumer taxes like road-cess, chowkidari taxes, municipal rates, consumer licence fees and other local rates. Income tax or taxes relating to household enterprise are excluded.
- (k) *Miscellaneous* : pan, etc. tobacco and products, drugs and intoxicants, amusement and sports, education, medicine, toilets, sundry goods, services, conveyance, ceremonials, furniture, musical instruments, ornaments, domestic utensils, footwear and other durable and semi-durable goods and their repairing expenses including the maintenance of residential houses.

3.4. Separate tables have been supplied for each of the population zones, and all India for both the rural and urban sectors; and for each of the four big cities of Bombay, Calcutta, Delhi and Madras and all these cities pooled.

The six zones as existing prior to reorganisation, for which the tables are presented, are as follows :

1. North India	Uttar Pradesh
2. East India	Bihar, Orissa, West Bengal, Assam, Manipur Tripura.
3. South India	Andhra, Madras, Mysore, Travancore-Cochin, Coorg.
4. West India	Bombay, Saurashtra, Kutch
5. Central India	Madhya Pradesh, Madhya Bharat, Hyderabad, Bhopal, Vindhya Pradesh.
6. North-West India	Rajasthan, PEPSU, Ajmer, Delhi, Punjab, Bilaspur, Himachal Pradesh, Jammu and Kashmir.

3.5. The estimates in all the tables of the report have been given by sub-samples (indicated by s.1, s.2 and comb.) and by monthly per capita expenditure

classes in rupees, arranged in ascending order of magnitude. The expenditure levels were, like previous rounds, grouped into 12 classes as follows :

The groups 0-8, 8-11, etc. stand for 0-less than 8, 8-less than 11 and so on. Estimates for all classes pooled together are also presented.

3.6. The following system has been adopted in numbering the tables. The left-hand-most digits stand for the sector to which the tables belong, i.e. 1 for rural, 2 for urban and 3 for cities (four big cities only). The digits following the first point stand for the nature of information.

## APPENDIX I

### A. SCOPE AND DESIGN OF THE SURVEY

#### *Sampling design—rural sector*

1.1. The whole of India with the exception of the islands—Andaman, Nicobar, Amindivi and Laccadive—was covered in the eleventh and twelfth rounds of the National Sample Survey.

1.2. The entire rural area of the country was divided into 72 strata; and sampling was done in two stages. Stratification was carried out by dividing the rural areas, in the first instance, into 39 primary strata, designated as NSS-ALE zones. These zones were so formed as not to cut across the boundaries either of the pre-reorganised states or of the 75 zones into which the rural areas were divided for purposes of stratification during the First Agricultural Labour Enquiry. In forming these zones it was also ensured that the proportion of agricultural labourers and their dependants in each zone was not less than one per cent of the total rural population of the zones according to the 1951 census data. These 39 zones were further sub-divided into 12 ultimate strata, which were more or less homogeneous with respect to the proportion of agricultural labourers and their dependants to the total rural population. The ultimate strata were generally groups of districts. The rural population in each stratum was approximately of the same size with a few exceptions.

1.3. In the first stage of sampling, a number of villages was selected from each stratum with probability proportional to the population of the village and with replacement, the number of villages sampled from a stratum being made proportional to the rural population of the stratum subject to the restriction that the number of sample villages in each stratum would be a multiple of 48. This method of selection and allocation made it possible for the whole survey to be divided into 12 independent sub-rounds of equal size, each being representative of the entire rural area. These sub-rounds were arranged to be covered consecutively—each within a period of one month; and were, thus, utilized for ensuring uniform distribution of samples over time. It was also possible to have four independent sets of sample villages in each stratum for each monthly sub-round, the four sets containing an equal number of sample villages. This enabled the survey to be conducted in 4 independent and interpenetrating sub-samples of the same size.<sup>1</sup> Two sets of estimates are presented in this report each set being formed by merging two sub-samples together. Thus sample 1 is formed by merging the sub-samples 1 and 2 and sample 2, by merging the sub-samples 3 and 4. A combined sample estimate is also presented in the report by merging all the 4 sub-samples together. The total number of villages sampled was 3696.

<sup>1</sup>In the eleventh and twelfth rounds, unlike in other recent NSS rounds, the different interpenetrating sub-samples were not allocated to separate investigating teams for investigation. The interpenetrating sub-samples used in this round were independent with regard to selection but not with regard to investigators.

1.4. In the second stage of sampling, from each sample village, 4 sample households consisting, on the average, of 2 agricultural labour households and 2 households other than agricultural labour, were selected systematically with a random start from two different frames, one from agricultural labour households and another from households other than agricultural labour. Data on household expenditure were collected from these households.

### *Sampling design—urban sector*

1.5. The urban sector was divided into 94 strata. Towns with a population of 3 lacs and above and capitals of part A and part B states (with the exception of Shillong, the capital of Assam, the population of which was comparatively low) were each formed a separate stratum. Excluding these, the rest of the urban areas, in each natural division, also formed independent strata. In the state of Jammu and Kashmir, the city of Srinagar and the town of Jammu were treated as separate strata. For greater Calcutta, 8 strata were formed within the city area (excluding Tollygunge). Each of the strata consisted of several adjoining wards. Among the rest of greater Calcutta area, some towns and cities or groups of towns were treated as separate strata.

1.6. A total of 1168 blocks were allocated to the various strata. The allocation was done in two stages. In the first stage, approximately four-fifths of the total number of sample blocks were allocated to all the strata in proportion to their non-agricultural population. In the second stage, however, the remaining one-fifth of the blocks was allocated, more or less on the same basis, only to the cities treated as individual strata. This preferential allocation to the cities was made in addition to their original allocation. The stratum allocations were finally rounded off to multiples of 2 to provide for two independent sub-samples of equal size from each stratum.

1.7. In each stratum, the sample units were drawn in two stages. In the first stage, the sample blocks (constructed on the basis of 1951 population census enumeration blocks) were selected systematically with a random start in the form of 2 independent sub-samples excepting in Bombay city where the sample had been drawn in the form of 4 independent sub-samples. As in the rural sector, two sets of estimates together with a combined set are presented in this report.

1.8. In the second stage of sampling, 5 households were selected from these different frames consisting of (i) agricultural labour households, (ii) households other than agricultural labour with household size 1-4 and (iii) households other than agricultural labour with household size 5 and above. From the first frame, that is, from agricultural labour households, 1 household was selected and from each of the other two frames 2 households were selected. The households in each frame were selected systematically with random start.

1.9. A statement showing the number of villages and blocks allocated to different states and zones is given below.

1.10. For some reason or other 60 sample villages (constituting 1.62 per cent of the total number of sample villages) could not be surveyed. Out of these 60 sample villages, 40 were substituted by other sample villages. A substitute was chosen at random from amongst the surveyed sample villages belonging to the same stratum as the one for which substitution was made. For the remaining 20 sample villages, no substitution could be made, as representative sample villages for the purpose of substitution were not available. In the case of urban sector 17 sample blocks (constituting 1.45 per cent of the total number of sample blocks) could not be surveyed. Out of these 17 sample blocks 15 were substituted by other sample blocks following the principles adopted for rural sector.

## B. METHOD OF ESTIMATION

1.11. The estimates presented in the report are, in general, estimates of ratios like per person expenditure on different items of consumption or expenditure on different items of consumption expressed as a percentage of total expenditure. These estimates were obtained from the corresponding estimates for the eleventh and twelfth rounds already published in Tables with Notes on Consumer Expenditure—NSS series nos. 77 (eleventh round) and 78 (twelfth round). A simple average of the estimates for the eleventh and twelfth rounds has been tried out here to obtain the estimate for the combined rounds. This has been done independently for each sub-sample and for the combined sample. As a result of the procedure so adopted, the combined sample estimate has, in a few cases, gone outside the limits of the corresponding sub-sample estimates.

1.12. The method of estimation of 'totals' from which the estimates of ratios are derived, in case of either of the two rounds is described below.

(i) For a particular region and for one sub-sample, the estimate of the total for any item has been built up separately for the three different household classes (i.e. agricultural labour households, households other than agricultural labour with household size 1-4 and households other than agricultural labour with household size 5 and above; each having a separate sampling frame). These estimates are then added up to obtain the sub-sample estimate of 'total' for that item.

(ii) The sub-sample estimate of 'total' for an item in any region for a certain household classes A is given by
