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FIRST REPORT ON LAND HOLDINGS, RURAL SECTOR FOREWORD

GENERAL ARRANGEMENTS

- 0.1. In the Eighth Round of the National Sample Survey (NSS) information was collected, as in previous rounds, on household consumption and production. In addition, an extensive survey was made of land holdings by including a large number of questions broadly on the lines of the agricultural survey recommended by the Food and Agricultural Organization (FAO). The concepts, definitions and standards were settled at a Conference of Central and State Statisticians held in Calcutta in March 1954 on the basis of detailed discussions which had been arranged in advance between the NSS, the Ministry of Food and Agriculture, the Planning Commission and the Central Statistical Organization. Dr. F. Yates, F.R.S., of Rothamsted Experimental Station, United Kingdom, who was in India at that time, participated in the preliminary stages of the discussions held in the Indian Statistical Institute and we should place on record our appreciation of the help received from him. The Indian Statistical Institute was in charge of the design of the survey, the processing of the data and the preparation of the report. The names of some of the responsible workers of the Institute are given in Appendix III.
- 0.2. The sample consisted of three main portions, one covering 1424 villages for which the information was collected by the permanent whole-time field staff of the NSS under the direct control of the Ministry of Finance. Information for two other portions, each covering about 1500 villages, was collected by a field staff under the control of the respective State Government. Each of these three portions was arranged in the form of four independent interpenetrating net-work of samples. There were thus 12 independent sub-samples each of which would give valid estimates of items under enquiry.
- 0.3. The present report gives some information on 'household holdings' on the basis of two sub-samples comprising 704 villages of the Central Sample covering 1424 villages. The 'household ownership holding' covers all lands (agricultural and non-agricultural) owned by the usual members of the household as constituting a socio-economic unit (and excluding domestic servants, relations residing temporarily, paying guests etc.). Similarly, the 'household operational holding' is defined as the land owned by the usual members of the household less land leased out plus land leased in. It includes not only agricultural but all kinds of non-agricultural land such as house-sites, brick-fields, pastures, barren land, cultivable waste etc., and must be clearly distinguished from operational holdings for agricultural purposes,

- 0.4. Information on 'household ownership holdings' and 'household operational holdings' is of immediate interest in connexion with land policy. It would take some considerable time to tabulate the data for the total sample of 4,456 villages. It has been decided, therefore, to publish the present results based on only about one-sixth of the total material. Tabulation of the primary data on the basis of agricultural holdings and in many other ways would be gradually completed according to programme on the basis of all the 12 sub-samples covering 4,456 villages¹. Results given here are subject to adjustments after the whole of the material has been tabulated and analysed.
- 0.5. In the Tables it will be noticed that a large number of households have been recorded in the 'zero' class because these households either do not own any land or own less than half cent (one cent equals to one-hundredth of an acre) of land. The average size of holdings would, of course, depend on whether the households in the 'zero' class are included in the calculation. If the 'zero' class is included, the average would represent the average for all households. If the 'zero' class is excluded, the average would give the average for households having more land than half cent. Both averages are meaningful but serve different purposes; both averages have been given in this report.

SOME INTERESTING RESULTS

- 0.6. I shall briefly note a few interesting results. According to the present survey there were about 6.5 crores² (65 or 66 millions) of households residing in the rural area of India at the time of the enquiry. The estimated area owned by rural households was about 31 crores (310 millions) of acres which formed about 38 per cent of the geographical area and 61 per cent of the topographically usable area of India. What remained belonged to Government, urban households, and non-household bodies.
- 0.7. A little over one-fifth, that is, about one and a half crore (14 or 15 millions) of households did not own any land. About one quarter of all rural households had a small parcel of land less than one acre in area. A little less than half of the rural households had thus either no land or owned less than one acre; their share was only a little more than one per cent of the land owned by rural households. About three-fourths of all the households either had no land or less than 5 acres; and their share was about one-sixth of the area. At the upper end, about one-eighth of the households had more than 10 acres with a total share of about two-thirds of the whole area; and about one per cent of the households owned more than 40 acres accounting for one-fifth of the area.

Foreword

- 0.8. The distribution was extremely concentrated with a small minority owning most of the land. The size of ownership holdings is, however, small. The estimated average for all households was about 4.7 acres; if those who had no land are excluded, the average would rise to about 6 acres. Out of 6.5 or 6.6 crores of households something of the order of about one lakh of households had more than 100 acres; but the number owning more than 250 acres would probably be a few thousand only.
- 0.9. Most of the land was held under proprietary rights with only about 2 per cent of tenure holders and 14 per cent of occupancy tenants. The total area leased out was about 14 per cent of the area owned. The distribution of household operational holdings (land owned plus land leased in minus land leased out) was somewhat more uniform especially at the lower end.
- 0.10. Separate estimates are given for the six Census zones. There was considerable variation between the six zones but the broad pattern was similar showing mostly small holdings with an extremely uneven distribution.
- 0.11.1. The figures given in the present report would enable some preliminary calculations being made about the general effect of fixing ceilings and floors on land holdings at specified points.
- 0.11.2. For example, Table (1.0) which furnishes all-India estimates of distribution of ownership holdings can be used for studying the general implications of fixing ceilings and floors taking India as a whole. If it is decided that every household (both agricultural and non-agricultural) should have some land and that the minimum is fixed at 2.0 acres, that is, every rural household must have at least 2.0 acres, a simple calculation will show that the total area of land required for those who do not own any land or have less than 2.0 acres, would be about 60 million acres. If the ceiling is fixed at 20 acres, and all households holding more than 20 acres are required to hand over the area held by them in excess of 20 acres, then the amount of land which becomes available for distribution in this way would be about 63 million acres. There would thus be available an excess of 3 million acres for distribution. It is possible to adjust for this by actually distributing 95% of the land from households which own 20 acres or more. Using all-India figures (with an overall average size of holding of 4.7 acres) it is thus seen, as a first approximation, that a floor of 2.0 acres would be consistent with a ceiling of 20 acres.
- 0.11.3. It is likely, of course, that in a scheme of land redistribution the decision would be to give land only to those whose main occupation is agriculture. In this case the non-agricultural households would have to be taken out of the calculation; and this would result in the possibility of the ceiling or the floor being raised to some extent.
- 0.12. But the distribution of land, its quality and the average size of ownership holdings differ from zone to zone and it would not be realistic to think in terms

of uniform ceilings and floors on land holdings in different zones¹. However, calculations even on the basis of zonal figures would be of an abstract nature. In actual practice the details would have to be worked out for small homogeneous regions or even groups of villages. But the zonal or the all-India figures can supply a rough idea of the possibilities and limitations of land distribution in India under given assumptions about floors and ceilings (or graduated cuts) of land holdings. I have drawn attention to one way of using the results. The report contains much material which would be of interest from many points of view and would be useful for many purposes.

RELIABILITY OF THE RESULTS

- 0.13. The information has been collected, as usual in NSS surveys, by the interview method which is known to be subject to errors of ascertainment arising from a failure on the part of the investigator to convey to the person supplying the information (that is, the interviewee) the correct meaning of the question; or from a failure on the part of the interviewee to give the correct answer due to lapse of memory; or from the personal bias of the investigator or of the interviewee; or from negligence or wilful distortion of facts by the interviewee. Other methods would also be subject to similar or other types of errors. No method is free from error. The decision to use the interview method to collect information on land holdings was made after careful consideration of alternative methods which were not considered suitable or practicable under Indian conditions.
- 0.14. Information on the distribution of land owned by size on a country-wide scale has been obtained for the first time. Similar data are not available from other sources for direct comparison. It is, however, possible to secure some information on reliability from the two interpenetrating sub-samples each of which furnishes an independent and valid estimate. The two independent sets of results (based respectively on the two sub-samples) are shown separately in Appendix I to the Report. For any class range or for any item, the difference between the two sets of estimates would supply some idea of the reliability of the results. It may be usually assumed that the probability is half that the 'true' value lies between the two estimates given by the two sub-samples.
- 0.15. A glance at the Tables given in Appendix I would show that the difference or discrepancy between the two sets of estimates (based on the two subsamples) varies from item to item or from one class-range to another depending partly

The position would be different for different zones. For example, in North India (where the average size of ownership holdings is about 3.5 acres), if the floor is maintained at 2.5 acres the ceiling must be brought down to 6.5 acres (or a suitable graduated cut would have to be made). If, however, the floor is reduced to 2 acres then it would be possible to get enough land by imposing a ceiling somewhere round 9 acres. In East India the position is still worse as the average size of ownership holding is a little less than 3 acres. To maintain a floor of 2.5 acres, it would be necessary to bring down the ceiling to below 5 acres. However, if the floor is reduced to 1.5 acres then the ceiling can be maintained a little above 7.5 acres. There is more room for manoeuvre in Central India where the average size of ownership holding is over 8 acres. It is possible to maintain a floor of 2.5 acres and have a ceiling of 30 acres or to raise the floor to about 3.5 acres by reducing the ceiling to about 25 acres; or it would be possible to increase the floor to 4.5 acres by reducing the ceiling to 20 acres.

on the size of the sample and partly on the nature of the item. Also, if the difference or the discrepancy is expressed as a percentage of, say, the combined or pooled estimate then the percentage difference would vary widely. This is inevitable. Even when the actual difference is the same, the percentage difference may be high if the denominator is small.

- 0.16. The actual or percentage discrepancy or error has not much meaning by itself, that is, without reference to the purpose for which the results would be used. The real point is to enquire whether the results given by the two sub-samples are sufficiently in agreement (that is, whether the difference between the two sets of results is sufficiently small) to enable policy or administrative decisions being made with some confidence. If so, the results may be accepted as sufficiently accurate for the purpose in view.
- 0.17. It should be observed that the difference between the results for the two sub-samples gives a measure of the over-all margin of uncertainty which consists of both errors of sampling and errors arising from all non-sampling differences between the two sub-samples. The sub-sample difference is, therefore, more comprehensive than the sampling error alone and is, therefore, a better guide to the reliability of the results. In India we have very little prior knowledge about the reliability of information on land holdings or agriculture. The present report marks a definite advance as it is making available for the first time a comprehensive measure of the margin of uncertainty of the results for a number of items.
- 0.18. It is, of course, true that systematic biases, which affect both subsamples equally, would not enter into the difference or discrepancy between the two sub-sample results. We do not know whether any systematic biases affect equally all sub-samples; but, if any biases exist which are common to both sub-samples then such biases can be detected only through external checks, that is, by comparison of the results with information on the same item collected by an entirely different and independent method. In NSS General Report No. 1, in Chapter Seven, paragraph 29, I discussed the criteria for the assessment of results and emphasized the importance of external checks. No statistical results (secured through the NSS or through other agencies) can be accepted as final on their face value. This is why I observed in the first Report on NSS:

"The validity of the NSS results, thus, will have to be assessed by piecing together of a large mass of evidence based partly on internal consistency, partly on external checks, and ultimately on the accuracy and social usefulness of the estimates and forecasts. All that can be said at present is that the results are definitely encouraging and provocative of thought."

0.19. It would be of great value, for example, if experienced statisticians would make a critical comparison, in selected areas, of the results obtained by the interview method with results obtained by other methods.

CHAPTER ONE

INTRODUCTION

- 1.1. In the eighth round of the National Sample Survey (NSS) the subject coverage was extended to a detailed enquiry on land holdings, over and above the usual enquiries relating to household consumer expenditure, productive enterprises of households, direct observation of land utilisation and prices. Emphasis was laid on collection of data concerning ownership and operational holdings. This enlargement of subject coverage was made mainly for meeting the requirements of the Ministry of Agriculture so that the commitments made by the Government of India to the Food and Agricultural Organisation (FAO) for the participation in the World Agricultural Census might be fulfilled. The enlargement particularly in respect of ownership holding was to meet the additional requirements of the Planning Commission. The other topics taken up for enquiry for the first time, at the instance of the Central and State Governments were (1) trend of self-management of agricultural holdings, (2) household indebtedness and (3) farming practices.
- 1.2. One very important development in this round of survey was the participation for the first time of the various State Governments in the work of the National Sample Survey. The plan of the survey was discussed in broad outline in a conference of Central and State Statisticians held in the Indian Statistical Institute, Calcutta in March 1954.
- 1.3. In view of the importance of the subject of land holdings to the States, it was necessary to increase the sample size so that more dependable estimates for

States could be obtained. The participation of the States in the survey made it possible to enlarge the sample size without increasing the strength of the investigating personnel of the NSS Field Directorate of the Central Government. The participation of the States in field work was however, confined, to the sample survey of land holdings, trend of self-management, household indebtedness and farming practices in the rural sector only.

- 1.4. The survey covered the whole of India excluding the Andaman and Nicober islands and Sikkim. The urban areas were covered by the Central sample only. The State of Jammu and Kashmir was included in the survey for the first time since the inception of the NSS. The Ladakh District of Jammu and Kashmir could not, however, be surveyed as it was not possible to contact the sample villages.
- 1.5. Field work pertaining to the survey started in August 1954 and was completed in February 1955. Field work of the Central sample was carried out by NSS personnel who had experience of similar work in the previous rounds. Field work of the State sample was entrusted to personnel recruited from the Revenue and Agriculture Departments of the respective States. The State authorities completed the arduous task of organising the work within a short period almost from a scratch. The supervising officers who were in charge of field survey were provided with detailed instructions on the field work, and they remained for a suitable period in the Indian Statistical Institute to receive necessary clarifications and explanations of these instructions. These officers in their turn took the responsibility of training and guidance of the field inspectors and investigators on their return to their respective centres. The State authorities made special efforts for training up and supervising their field staff who, unlike their Central counterpart, were quite new to the NSS field techniques.
- 1.6. The survey was conducted by the method of interview. For a large part of India where village records were available, the information collected by enquiry was compared with the data contained in those records. In case of any discrepancy between the two sets of information, reconciliation was made by enquiring into the reasons for discrepancy and on the basis of a considered report which would be obtained by referring the questions back to the informant by a revisit.
- 1.7. The Central (as well as State) field workers were divided into two independent parties who took up different sub-samples for their investigation. The present Report deals with only two of the Central sub-samples covered by two different parties.
- 1.8. Some important tables on land holdings in rural sector have been prepared. Summary tables are given in the body of the text and detailed tables will be found in Appendix I. These tables are based on the reconciled figures. The information relates to the major crop season in the agricultural year, July 1953 to June 1954. A major crop season for a locality was defined as that season in which the largest area was brought under cultivation.

CHAPTER TWO

SAMPLING DESIGN AND SURVEY COVERAGE

2.1. Sampling design for rural sector—After a good deal of discussion on various practical and theoretical aspects of the survey it was finally decided to take 4216 sample villages in rural India excluding Jammu and Kashmir (which received special treatment). These were divided into several sub-samples of which about one-third constituted the Central sample, and the rest constituted the State sample. The number of sample villages in the Central sample were allocated to the different States (excluding Jammu and Kashmir) on a joint consideration of their relative agricultural population (excluding agricultural labour) and the area under cereal crops in 1952-53. This number was then rounded off to the nearest multiple of 4 with a view to forming 4 sub-samples in the Central sample. The size of the State sample was made an exact multiple (generally twice) of the size of the Central sample in each State, subject to the restriction that the total number of sample villages in a major State should be nearly 100 or more. The object of this restriction was to obtain reasonably dependable estimates for each major State. In Jammu and Kashmir, however, for special reasons, 80 villages were selected for Central sample and 160 for State sample. In Assam, at the request of the State government, the size of the State sample was enhanced by an additional multiple of the Central sample. Table (2.1) shows the allocation of sample villages to different States separately for Central sample and State sample.

2.2. The Central sample for any State was further distributed to the natural divisions (Census, 1951) within the State, in proportion to their respective agricultural population (excluding agricultural labour). The natural divisions were stratified ultimately into sets of tehsils which were more or less homogeneous with respect to the net cropped area per head of agricultural population (excluding agricultural labour). Limits for the measure of homogeneity were set by more or less equal volume of agricultural population (excluding agricultural labour) in each stratum. Tehsils for which figures for net cropped area were not available received separate treatment. They were grouped into separate strata on the basis of geographical area per head of agricultural population. Four sample villages were chosen as first-stage sample from an ultimate stratum with probability proportional to population and with replacement. The additional villages constituting the State sample were drawn from the same strata, the total number being a uniformly exact multiple of the Central sample for all the strata in each State.

2.3. In the second stage of sampling, a number of households were chosen from each sample village after suitable stratification into three types according to sizes of household ownership holding, operational holding and principal means of livelihood of the household. These three categories were, (1) households owning or operating large holdings, i.e., holdings larger than a specified size (irrespective of the livelihood classes to which they belonged), (2) households owning and operating small holdings, namely, those below the specified size and belonging to the three agricultural classes, namely, cultivating owners of land, non-owning cultivators or non-cultivating

owners of land, (3) households owning and operating small holdings (including holdings of size zero, i.e., no holdings) and belonging to other livelihood classes (including agricultural labour). A sample of households was selected by the process of systematic sampling with a random start, separately from each of the three household types. The size of the sample for each type was so determined as to ensure adequate representation of each type. The sampling fraction in each household type was maintained at a level that would give in all an average of 20/24 sample households per village and at the same time make the sample self-weighting, separately for each household type.

- 2.4. Estimates of various characteristics were required separately for different size-levels of holdings (ownership as well as operational). The larger holdings (though of great importance) were, comparatively speaking, very few in number. The system of stratification allowed a higher sampling fraction for the larger holdings compared to the smaller ones. This helped to provide more precise estimates for the largesized holdings than those which would have been obtainable if a uniform sampling fraction were adopted irrespective of the size of the holding. Of course, the method adopted entailed a reduction in the sample size for the smaller holdings, but even then the reduced sample size was expected to be sufficiently large to give fairly precise estimates. One of the reasons for stratification of the smaller holdings to type (2) which were expected to be mainly agricultural holdings and to type (3) which were expected on the other hand to be comprised mainly of non-agricultural holdings, with a somewhat higher sampling fraction for type (2) was to give the survey a leaning towards agricultural holdings rather than to non-agricultural holdings. In connection with what has been said in this paragraph it is of interest to compare the (estimated) distribution of household ownership holdings [Appendix I, Table (1.0), col. (6)] with the distribution of sample households in various size classes [Appendix I, Table (0.1), col. (22)]. Thus, for example, there were 345 different sample households in the size-class 25.00-29.99 acres whereas if the total of 12,480 sample households were distributed to the various size-classes in proportion to the (estimated) number in the various classes as in the population, then this class would have only 134 sample households. For the size-class 1.50-2.49 acres on the other hand, the actual sample size of 857 is smaller than what would otherwise have been obtained, namely, 1070; but the actual sample size of 857 may still be considered to be sufficiently large. A similar comparison may also be made in respect of operational holdings [Appendix I, Table (0.2), col. (22) and Table (7.0), col. (6)].
- 2.5. The stratification and selection of villages at the first stage were done by the Technical Wing of the NSS at the Indian Statistical Institute. The work of listing and classifying the households in the selected villages into three types, and selection of sample households from each type were, however, left to the investigators.
- 2.6. Number of villages and households surveyed—Altogether 704 villages and 12480 households were covered in the two sub-samples considered in this Report. As many as 353 villages in sub-sample 1 and 351 villages in sub-sample 2 were surveyed against an expected number of 356 in each sub-sample. Thus, there were 3 casual-

ties in sub-sample 1 and 5 in sub-sample 2. Ladakh district of Jammu and Kashmir State accounted for 2 casualties in each of the sub-samples; the remaining casualties were, one from Assam in sub-sample 1, and two from Assam and one from Bihar in sub-sample 2.

2.7. The following table gives for each State and population zone the number of sample villages and sample households surveyed.

CHAPTER THREE

CONCEPTS AND DEFINITIONS

- 3.1. The definitions and concepts of household, ownership holding and operational holding as used in this survey are explained in this chapter. What is exactly meant by the Rural Sector with which this Report deals is also explained at the end of this chapter.
- 3.2. Household—According to the basic concept of household adopted with special reference to consumer expenditure enquiry of the NSS, in the earlier rounds, a household means a group of persons taking principal meals from a common kitchen for at least 16 days (any 16 days) in the 30 days preceding the date of enquiry and usually living together.
- 3.3. Nursing homes, hospitals, relief camps, and Government institutions like military messing units, jails etc., were excluded from the scope of this survey. The individual boarders living in a boarding house for at least sixteen days in the thirty days preceding the date of enquiry were taken as separate households. Domestic servants and other employees taking meals in the household even though they did not sleep in the household premises, were considered to belong to the household from whose kitchen they obtained their meals. An employee taking one of his principal meals at the employer's household and the other at his normal place of residence was, however, characterised as a member of the household where he normally resided. A paying guest, as distinguished from an ordinary tenant of a room in the house, was reckoned as a member of the household.
- 3.4. The data on land holdings, however, were not recorded for each and every member of the household as defined above. This was done for such members of the household who could also be regarded as usual members of the household¹ and all lands owned by the casual (i.e., not usual) members of household, fulfilling the requirement of the basic definition (para. 3.2), were left out of account. Persons, even if they did not belong to the household according to the basic definition of household described above, were on the other hand taken into account, if they could be regarded as usual members of the household. The question of determining whether a person was a usual or casual member of the household was left to the judgment of the household except in certain cases for which some probing by the investigator was necessary. There might be circumstances when a household would regard a person as a usual member owing to proximity of relationship even though that person left the household long ago and formed a separate household where he could, with better reasons, be considered as a usual member. To avoid duplications he should not be included in the former household despite that household's acceptance of the

person as a usual member. On the other hand, for some reasons or other, in rather rare cases, a household might decline to recognise a person (considered as its member according to para. 3.2) as a usual member even though that person was found to belong to no other household, at least during the period of the survey. In such cases, despite the household's contrary attitude, (to avoid total omission of representation of such persons in the sample) the person was treated as a usual member of the sample household and a record of land held by him was made. So far as domestic servants, other employees and paying guests were concerned they were not (ordinarily) considered as usual members of the household for recording information on ownership and operational holdings.

- 3.5. Ownership holdings—Ownership of land consists in the right of permanent heritable possession—with or without the right to transfer such title. The right of permanent heritable possession is tantamount to what is generally known as occupancy right. In enumerating ownership holdings, account was taken of all lands in India held with such right by all categories of holders like landlords, tenure holders, peasant proprietors, occupancy ryots or tenants. (It should be noted that a landlord or tenure holder may not be an owner of the whole estate, for which he is empowered to collect revenue. His ownership right extends over that part only of the estate which he holds with occupancy right.) When a person owned a parcel of land jointly with some other person the proportionate share only had been considered for recording the area owned by him.
- 3.6. Ownership should also be distinguished from actual physical possession of land. A piece of land may happen to be under the possession of a person or persons who have no ownership right on that plot and hold it on lease from the holder of its occupancy right. In such cases land continues to be owned by the holder of occupancy rights.
- 3.7. The present report gives the features of household ownership holding which comprised of the sum total of holdings of individual persons for whom data have been recorded in connection with the household.
- 3.8. It may also be specially noted that, unless otherwise stated, a land-less household (owning no land) is considered to correspond to a household owner-ship holding of size zero. Thus, generally speaking, the total number of household ownership holdings is exactly equal to the total number of households. It may also be noted that an ownership holding may be purely non-agricultural.
- 3.9. Operational holdings—An operational holding is defined as all land that is directed or managed by one or more persons, alone or with the assistance of others, without regard to title, size, or location. It may consist of one or more parcels of land, even if widely separated, provided that they form a part of the same technical and economic unit. Thus, the principal criterion lies in the distinct nature of the technical and economic unit, i.e., the operational unit. An operational holding would, therefore, mean all parcels of land falling within the scope of a distinct unit of technical and economic management for cultivation or other purposes. This

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includes land owned and self-operated and land leased in by the participating house-hold. Non-agricultural lands such as house-site, brick-fields, cultivable waste, pastures, barren land etc., have also been enumerated under operational holdings. It is important, therefore, to bear in mind that an operational holding may consist, for example, of just a house-site. This, obviously, is distinct from an agricultural operational holding, as it covers purely non-agricultural holdings also.

- 3.10. An operational unit is joint when it is directed or managed by persons belonging to separate households. All lands brought under the operation of that joint unit would be enumerated as joint operational holding.
- 3.11. Information on operational holdings has thus been recorded separately for each operational unit which was directed or managed by a sample household alone or jointly with other households.
- 3.12. The present report gives the features of household operational holdings. The total area of a household operational holding is the sum of the areas of all holdings directed or managed solely by the household, together with a part of the area of joint holdings—determined on the assumption of equal share among all participating households.
- 3.13. The term 'lease' in this report means transfer of 'possession' to the lessee in return for cash or crop rent, loans and advances, professional services and the like to be rendered by the lessee. The term 'operation' does not necessarily mean actual agricultural or non-agricultural use, as it includes land possessed but not at all 'used' in the popular sense.
- 3.14. Rural sector—The tabulations relate to the rural sector only. In this connection it is important to bear in mind that, throughout this Report, by rural sector is meant the aggregate of ownership (or operational) holdings owned (or operated) by households resident in the rural areas of the country.
- 3.15. It will thus be seen that the aggregate of holdings *located* in the rural tracts is not quite identical with the aggregate considered in this Report. Whereas the difference between the two may be quite small in the case of operational holdings, it may not be so for ownership holdings because substantial areas in the rural tracts may be owned by households resident in the urban areas or even in areas outside India.

CHAPTER FOUR

AREA OWNED

4.1. Total area owned and area under different ownership rights—Table (4.1) shows the percentage distribution of total land owned under different ownership rights in the whole of rural India and in rural areas of each population zone. The various ownership rights were classified into six types, namely, (1) proprietor with right to transfer title, (2) proprietor without right to transfer title, (3) tenure holders with right to transfer title, (4) tenure holders without right to transfer title, (5) occupancy right holders without right to transfer title.

4.2. Nearly 310 million acres of land were estimated to be owned by rural households in the country. Thus about 38 per cent of the total area and 61 per cent of the topographically usable area were owned by households in rural India. The remaining part of the country was, of course, owned by Government and other non-household bodies, as well as by urban households. Some land was also perhaps owned by persons now resident in Pakistan.

- 4.3. We find that in the whole of rural India, 84 per cent of total land owned were held under proprietary rights—71 per cent as proprietors with right to transfer title and 13 per cent as proprietors without right to transfer title. As large as 97 to 99 per cent of land were owned under proprietary rights in all the population zones, except in East India and North-West India where the percentages were much lower, namely 43 and 66 respectively. Only as small as 2 per cent of land were held as tenure holders in the whole of rural India. The land under ownership right of tenure holders was 6 and 4 per cent in North-West India and East India respectively and half per cent or less in other zones. As large as 52 per cent of land owned by households in East India and 27 per cent in North-West India but only 2 per cent or less in other zones were owned by permanent heritable occupancy tenants who pay revenue to Government through middlemen. The percentage of land owned by occupancy tenants in the whole of rural India was 14. Proper information regarding right of ownership could not be ascertained for a small proportion (less than 1 per cent) of area. Percentages of area owned under different ownership rights by sizelevel of household ownership holding for each sub-sample are given in Tables (6.0) to (6.6) of Appendix I.
- 4.4. Average area owned by a household—Table (4.2) shows the average area owned by a rural household in India and in each of the population zones. Households owning land below the average size (including those with no land) are shown as a percentage of the total rural households. Also, the area owned by such households is shown as a percentage of the total area under rural ownership. Figures in brackets show the average size of area owned by a household owning land and the percentages of households to total land-owning households (i.e., excluding landless¹ households) below this average size and their share of land owned. [See Table (4.2), p. 12.]
- 4.5. The agreement between the two sub-sample estimates is fairly good. Considering the combined estimate, the average size of household ownership holding (that is, the average area owned by a household) was largest in Central India, being 8.20 acres. West India and North-West India stood next in order with an average size of 7.18 and 7.17 acres respectively. In the other zones, the average size was less than 4 acres and the all-India average was 4.72 acres. 74 per cent of households had ownership holdings of less than average size in South India and in North-West India, and 68 per cent in North India. For the other population zones the proportion varied between these two figures, the all-India average being 73 per cent. The percentage of area under the ownership of holdings of less than average size was as low as 13 in South India and reached a maximum of 19 in North India. The average of all-India was 16 per cent.
- 4.6. In the previous paragraph the average area owned by a rural household has been obtained. In obtaining this average, naturally landless (owning no land) households have also been included. But when attention is focussed not on households but on holdings it is equally natural to restrict to holdings which really

exist. Thus, landless households have no real holdings and are, as such, to be excluded from this point of view. Thus the average size of household ownership holding for the whole of rural India was 6.05 acres and those for North, East, South, West, Central and North-West India were respectively 3.83, 3.85, 4.75, 10.44, 10.57 and 9.28 acres. (In obtaining these figures households owning less than 0.005 acre were treated as landless.) It is also worthwhile to obtain the average size of household ownership holding excluding the households who own less than 0.05 acre of land as such holdings of small size are generally of very little use in agricultural operations. The average area owned by a household owning 0.05 acre or more of land in the whole of rural India was 6.91 acres. The average size of household ownership holding was largest in Central India (12.37 acres), followed by West India (11.23 acres) and North-West India (10.87 acres). The average area owned by a household owning 0.05 acre or more was comparatively small in South India (5.61 acres) and North India (4.57 acres) and smallest in East India (4.16 acres).

- 4.7. Distribution of households by size of ownership holding—Table (4.3) shows the cumulative percentage distributions of households and of total area owned by size of ownership holding in the whole of rural India and in each population zone. It will be seen that 22 to 31 per cent of households in different zones, except in North India were landless¹, i.e., did not own any land whereas in North India only 8 per cent of households did not own any land. The overall percentage of households not owning any land in rural India was 22. [See Table (4.3), p. 14.]
- 4.8. 47 per cent of households in rural India owned (no land or) less than 1 acre of land and their share of total land was only 1 per cent. 74 per cent of households owned (no land or) less than 5 acres of land and had only 17 per cent of the total area under their ownership. Another 13 per cent of households owning between 5 and 10 acres of land had 19 per cent of total land under their ownership. The remaining 13 per cent of households had ownership holdings of size bigger than 10 acres and among themselves they accounted for 64 per cent of total land owned. 5 per cent of households, each of whose ownership holding size was more than 20 acres of land, owned altogether 41 per cent of total land. Furthermore, the share of $2\frac{1}{2}$ per cent of households each owning over 30 acres of land amounted to 28 per cent of total land, or one-fortieth of households was owning much more than a quarter of the total area.
- 4.9. This indicates that the great majority of households with smaller ownership holdings owned only a small percentage of total area whereas a minority with larger ownership holdings owned by far the major portions of the total area. Zone-wise figures show a similar pattern of concentration. This concentration is shown graphically for each zone along with all-India based upon all households (Graph 1) and upon those owning 0.10 acre or more of land (Graph 2) in Appendix I.
 - 4.10. Cumulative percentage distributions of households and of area owned

by size of household ownership holdings for sub-samples 1 and 2 are given for all households and for those owning 0.10 acre or more of land in Tables (3.0) to (3.6) and (4.0) to (4.6) respectively in Appendix I. The agreement between the two sub-samples was fairly good.

- 4.11. Table (4.4) shows the decile points of the distribution of household ownership holdings and the cumulative percentage of area owned. The decile points are the size of ownership holdings below which 10, 20, 30 etc. per cent of households lie. From col. (14) of this table it will be observed that 50 per cent of households in the whole of rural India owned below 1.28 acres of land; only 20 per cent owned 6.69 acres or more. In the different population zones of India the median size (the size above and below which 50 per cent of the households lay) varied from 0.63 to 2.86 acres. It was highest in Central India, followed in order by West India, North-West India, North India, East India and South India. The upper 20 per cent of the households had ownership holdings of size exceeding 4.73 acres in South India, 4.75 acres in East India, 5.44 acres in North India, 10.40 acres in North-West India, 11.35 acres in West India and 12.96 acres in Central India.
- 4.12. From col. (15) of Table (4.4), it is observed that the share of total land owned by the lower 50 per cent of rural households in India was only 2 per cent and lay between 1 to 6 per cent in different zones. On the other hand, 40 per cent of households lying above the 6th decile owned 94 per cent of total land; 30 per cent of households above the 7th decile owned 87 per cent of total land; 20 per cent of households above the 8th decile owned 76 per cent of total land and finally 10 per cent of households above the 9th decile owned 57 per cent of total land. One feature common to all population zones was that in each zone the uppermost 10 per cent of rural households owned 48 per cent or more of the total estimated area. This, in essence, means that half or even more than half of the total land was owned by only one-tenth of households.

CHAPTER FIVE

'AREA OWNED AND SELF-OPERATED' AND 'AREA LEASED OUT'

- 5.1. All areas owned by a household were not necessarily in his possession. We shall, therefore, in this chapter consider how much of the land owned was kept by the household and how much was leased out to others.
- 5.2. Percentage of households leasing out land and percentage of area owned by them—Table (5.1) shows the percentage of households and of area owned by leasing out and non-leasing out households.

5.3. From sub-table 1 it is apparent that among all households in rural India there were $63\frac{1}{2}$ per cent who did not lease out any land, $12\frac{1}{2}$ per cent leased out partly their own land and 2 per cent leased out fully their own land. The remaining 22 per cent of households were landless.

- 5.4. From sub-tables 2 and 3 it is seen that among land-owning households in the whole of India 81 per cent of households owning 69 per cent of the total area under rural household ownership did not lease out any land. Another 16 per cent of households owning 29 per cent of the total area leased out only a part of their own land. 3 per cent of households owning only 2 per cent of the total area leased out their entire ownership. Similar feature was noticed in each of the six zones.
- 5.5. Percentage of households not leasing out land owned by them by size of household ownership holding—Table (5.2) shows the percentage of households who do not lease out any land owned by them. It is observed that among land-owning households in the whole of India, the percentage of households not leasing out any land varies from 91 when the size of household ownership holding is less than one acre to 56 when the size of holding is more than 50 acres. Similar trend is noticed in each of the six zones.
- 5.6. Average area leased out by leasing out households—Table (5.3) shows the average area owned by a household and the average area leased out per leasing out household.

- 5.7. The average size of ownership holding among those who lease out their land fully is less than that among those who did not lease out any land. On the other hand, those leasing out only a part of their own land had ownership holding of roughly double the size compared to those who retained their own land fully. However, in the whole of rural India they leased out to others nearly 41 per cent of their own land.
- 5.8. Percentage of owned area leased out and area leased out per leasing out household by size-level of ownership holding—The relevant information is given in Table (5.4). It will be observed that for rural India except possibly for the largest size-group, 50 acres and more, the percentage of owned area leased out does not change appreciably from one size-group to another, being slightly more than one-eighth of

the owned areas. Broadly the same feature held for each of the zones. Percentage of owned area leased out ranged successively from 9 in North India, to 11 in East India, 13 in North-West India, 14 in Central India, 15 in West India and 19 in South India; the all-India figure was 14. It is true that a little more than one-seventh of the owned land was leased out, but when one restricts oneself to only those households who lease out some land one finds that as much as one-third to one-half of the owned area was leased out and this remained broadly the same as one moved from one household ownership holding size-level to another.

5.9. Area owned and area leased out by size-level of area owned and self-operated—That portion of the household ownership holding which is under the possession or management (operation) of the owner household is called the area owned and self-operated by the household. Table (5.5) gives the necessary information. Further details will be found in Appendix I, Tables (5.0) to (5.6). These tables, giving the distribution of the households by size-level of area owned and self-operated were wanted by the Planning Commission. Leaving out the landless households including those who own less than 0.005 acre and for whom the question of leasing out any land does not arise, it is found that in the whole of India roughly one in every three households operated less than one acre of owned land. Moreover, these households who operate

not even one acre of own land are really those who account for as much as half the total area leased out by all rural households in India. There were even households who practically did not manage any of their own land even though on the average each of them owned as much as 4.21 acres of land. Although these households form only about one-fortieth of the total number of households having some land, yet they accounted for as much as one-seventh of the total leased out area.

5.10. The picture for each of the population zones follows broadly the one for all-India. Nearly one in four households owning some land in West India, nearly one in three in North, Central and North-West India and slightly less than one in two in East and South India operated less than one acre of land. In Central India as much as 61 per cent of total leased out area were accounted for by these households. The corresponding percentage for other zones was slightly less than 50 except in North-West India where it was appreciably smaller, namely, 38. The average area owned by households owning some land and practically managing no portion of it was highest in West India, namely, 8.68 acres. This average was also quite large in North-West and Central India, namely, 6.71 and 5.95 acres respectively. In the three remaining population zones the average area owned by such households ranged from 2.92 acres in North India to only 1.29 acres in East India, that for South India being 2.55 acres.

5.11. Extent of area owned and self-operated by partly leasing out and non-leasing out households and that leased out by partly leasing out and fully leasing out households—Table (5.6) shows the percentage of area owned and self-operated by

partly leasing out households and non-leasing out households and also the percentage of area leased out by partly leasing out households and fully leasing out households. All these percentages were calculated on the basis of the total area owned by rural households.

5.12. In the whole of rural India, out of 86 per cent of owned and self-operated land, 69 per cent of area were operated by non-leasing out households and the rest by partly leasing out households. Therefore, roughly one-fifth of the total area owned and self-operated was operated by partly leasing out households. About 12 per cent of owned area were leased out by households leasing out their own land partly in the whole of rural India and only 2 per cent by households who were leasing out whole of their owned land. Thus, about one-seventh of the total leased out area was owned by fully leasing out households. It is worthwhile to notice that out of 29 per cent of area owned by partly leasing out households, in the whole of rural India, about 17 per cent of the owned land were self-operated and the remaining 12 per cent were leased out by them. Similar feature was observed in all the population zones.

CHAPTER SIX

AREA OPERATED

- 6.1. We have seen in the previous chapter in what manner part of the area owned is leased out to others. The area leased out by one is, of course, leased in by others, and we naturally pass on from a consideration of area owned by a household to the area under the possession of a household, that is, to household operational holding.
- 6.2. Total area operated and total area owned—Table (6.1) shows the total area owned by all rural households as well as the total area under the possession of all such households. The area operated was always found to be in excess of the area owned in each of the population zones. Several possibilities need considera-

tion, namely, owners of land operated by rural households residing in urban areas or in Pakistan, the effect of non-household ownership etc. It has not been possible to take up these points for consideration in this Report. The agreement between the two sub-sample estimates of excess area operated was not sufficiently close in all population zones. This only indicated that these estimates might not be sufficiently accurate.

6.3. Area owned and area leased in expressed as percentage to total operated area—Table (6.2) shows the percentage distribution of total area under possession of rural households into two components, namely, land owned and land leased in for the whole of India and for each population zone.

on lease. The percentage of area leased in for management was only 13 in North India and between 20 and 27 in East India, South India, West India and Central India. These zonal estimates (particularly the one for North-West India) are to be used with some caution as they may not, in all cases, be sufficiently accurate which is seen from the sub-sample comparisons.

- 6.5. From a comparison of Table (6.2) with Table (6.1) it would appear that only a part of the area leased in by the rural households came from the rural households themselves. On the assumption that practically all areas owned by rural households were also operated by them, half (12 per cent of operated area) of the total area leased in (24 per cent of operated area) comes from outsiders, that is, from those who do not belong to the category of rural households of India.
- 6.6. Extent of joint operation—Table (6.3) below shows the percentage of households operating some land jointly with other households. It is, of course, possible for some of these households to have in addition some land operated individually. Households have, therefore, been divided into three categories, namely, those operating (1) purely individually, (2) purely jointly and (3) both individually and jointly (mixed).

6.7. From this table it will be evident that a very large majority of households was operating purely individually. 90 per cent of households in rural India were operating individually and in some population zones the percentage of households operating individually was even more than 90. In the whole of India 10 per cent of the households possessed land jointly with others; 6 per cent were operating purely jointly and the remaining 4 per cent were operating both jointly and individually.

N.B. Figures in the brackets give the number and the percentage of households by omitting the households operating less than 0.005 acre.

6.8. Table (6.4) shows the percentage of total operated area under individual and joint possession of households.

- 6.9. It will be observed that only 8 per cent of the total area were under joint management. For East, South and West India this percentage for joint management was about 6 whereas for the remaining zones it was about 10.
- 6.10. Distribution of households by size of household operational holding—It is of interest to study the size distribution of household operational holding defined earlier. It will be remembered that only a proportionate share of the joint operational holding has been added to the area operated by the households individually, on the assumption of equal share to each participating household, to arrive at the area of the household operational holding. Although there is a certain element of artificiality in this method of allocation, yet in view of the fact as shown in the previous section that large percentage (90) of households operated individually and since they accounted for a very large percentage (92) of the total area, it is not likely to give an unrealistic picture. It may be incidentally noted that area operated means area under physical possession irrespective of utilisation; in fact, some household operational holdings may be just house-sites.
- 6.11. Table (6.5) shows the average size of household operational holding in rural India and in each of the population zones. The percentage of households operating below the average size and the percentages of area operated by them to the total area operated are also shown. In obtaining the average size of household operational holding, households operating land less than 0.005 acre have also been included. But holdings of such a small size have little or no importance in agricultural operations. Excluding these households operating land less than 0.005 acre, the average size of household operational holding has been obtained for the whole of rural India and for each of the population zones and these figures have been shown in brackets in Table (6.5). The percentages of households below this average size to the total number of households operating 0.005 acre of land or more and their share of total operated area have also been indicated in brackets.

- 6.12. The agreement between the two sub-samples is fairly good. Considering the combined estimate, it is seen that the average size of household operational holding was 5.34 acres in the whole of rural India, and it lay between 8 and 10 acres in West India, Central India and North-West India and between $3\frac{1}{2}$ and $3\frac{3}{4}$ acres in North India, East India, and South India. More than 65 per cent of households in each of the population zones had household operational holdings below the average size and their total share of the entire operated area ranged from 14 to 21 per cent.
- 6.13. A preliminary examination of the data shows that purely non-agricultural holdings are mostly of size less than half an acre; (there are, however, some agricultural holdings of this small size). It may, therefore, be of some interest to determine the average size of holding when holdings of size less than half an acre are not taken into consideration. The all-India average then becomes 8.08 acres. Those corresponding to North, East, South, West, Central and North-West India are respectively 5.12, 5.21, 6.19, 12.42, 13.73 and 13.17 acres.
- 6.14. Table (6.6) shows the cumulative percentage distribution of households and of area operated by size-level of household operational holding. It is seen that 40 per cent of households operated (i.e., possessed) less than 1 acre and had 1 per cent of the total land in their possession. Households possessing 0.00 acre are, of course, included in this 40 per cent. Again, 71 per cent of households operated below 5 acres of land and their share of total land amounted to 17 per cent. On the other hand, 14½ per cent of households operated above 10 acres of land and they had 64 per cent of the total land in their possession, $5\frac{1}{2}$ per cent of households operating above 20 acres of land possessed 40 per cent of the total land. Further, only 4 per cent of households operating more than 25 acres of land had 33 per cent of the total land in their possession. Thus, one-twentyfifth of households possessed nearly one-third of the total land. A similar feature of concentration is seen in each zone. The concentration curve for each population zone along with all-India based upon all the households are shown in Graph 3 in Appendix I. Similar concentration curves based upon the households operating 0.10 acre or more of land are shown in Graph 4 in Appendix I.
- 6.15. Detailed tables showing cumulative percentage distribution of households and of area operated by size of household operational holdings for sub-samples 1 and 2 are given for all households in Tables (9.0) to (9.6) and for households operating 0.10 acre or more of land in Tables (10.0) to (10.6) in Appendix I.
- 6.16. Similar data relating to land operated (possessed) by the households were collected in the earlier rounds of the NSS. Therefore, it may be worthwhile here to examine the agreement of distribution of households by size of household operational holding obtained from the data of the present survey with the distribution of households by size of holding published in NSS. Report No. 2—Tables with notes on the second round (April–June 1951). Although by definition the term 'land possessed' is the same in both the rounds, there is a slight difference in the procedure of allocating the share of jointly possessed land. The 'holding under occupa-

tion' as defined in the second round, consists of land of all types (including homestead plots) under occupation of household. So, in other words it means 'net area of land owned plus land leased in minus land leased out'. In enumerating the land owned (or leased in) jointly with other households, the sample household's share had been taken into account. The household operational holding as already stated in para 3.12 includes all land (including leased in land) operated by the household singly and a share of all land operated jointly with other households based on the assumption that all the participating households under that joint holding operate the same proportion of land. Since the percentages of joint operational holding and the corresponding area operated are rather small, the size of holding under occupation of household will be more or less the same as that of household operational holding. Table (6.7) gives the percentage distribution of households and of cropped area (from second round data) and total operated area (from data of eighth round) by size-level of household operational holding.

- 6.17. The percentage distribution of households by size of operational holding follows the same pattern in both the rounds. It is also interesting to note that the percentage distribution of cropped area obtained from the 2nd round is more or less similar to the distribution of total area operated as obtained from the data of the present survey. Similar distributions are available for 'cultivators' holdings in the Report of Agricultural Labour Enquiry (Rural man-power and occupational structure). But as the present Report deals with total land holdings (both agricultural and non-agricultural), no direct comparison is possible¹.
- 6.18. Table (6.8) shows the decile points of the distribution of household operational holding. From col. (14) and (15) of this table it is found that 50 per cent of rural households in India possessed below 1.97 acres of land and the share of total land in their possession was only 4 per cent. The median size of household operational holding was between 0.95 to 4.05 acres in different population zones. The share of households with holding less than the median size was 2 per cent in South India, 3 per cent in Central India, about 4 per cent in West India, 6 per cent in North-West India, $6\frac{1}{2}$ per cent in East India and $8\frac{1}{2}$ per cent in North India. It is also observed that the median size was always substantially less than the average. The share of 40 per cent of households with operational holding sizes between the 5th and 9th decile amounted to 42 per cent of total land. This percentage varied from 42 to 48 in different zones. The upper 10 per cent of households in the whole of rural India possessed as much as 54 per cent of total operated land. This percentage was between 43 and 56 in different zones.

¹ Some comparison is possible if it is restricted to holdings in the higher size groups, as then the household operational holding is likely to be an agricultural holding and may roughly be considered to be the same as the 'cultivators' holding. Thus if one restricts to holdings of size, say, greater than 0.1 acre then the proportions of holdings in different size classes are more or less in agreement between the two enquiries. The average size of holding for the whole of rural India as obtained from the data of Agricultural Labour Enquiry was 7.5 acres, the figures for North India, East India, South India, West India, Central India and North-West India being respectively 5.3, 4.5, 4.5, 12.3, 12.2 and 12.6 acres. (Ref.: page 22, Statement of Rural Man-Power and Occupational Structure). The average size of household operational holding for those households operating 0.1 acre or more for the whole of rural India obtained from the present survey was 7.3 acres, the figures for North India, East India, South India, West India, Central India and North-West India being 4.7, 4.5, 5.5, 12.0, 12.9 and 12.6 acres respectively.

CHAPTER SEVEN

HOUSEHOLD SIZE

7.1. The average household size against size of land owned is shown in Table (7.1) for each zone separately. Figures by sub-samples will be found in Appendix I, Table (11). This household size is according to the definition given in paras 3.2 and 3.3 and does not include 'usual' but absentee members of the household.

- 7.2. It is seen that the household size increases with increasing size of ownership ranging from about 4 persons per household not owning any land to more than double that size for households owning 75 acres or more. The overall size for the whole of India is 4.9 persons per household.
- 7.3. The average household size against size of household operational holding is given in Table (7.2) for each population zone. Figures by sub-samples will be found in Appendix I, Table (12).


GRAPH-1, CONCENTRATION CURVE FOR HOUSEHOLD OWNERSHIP HOLDINGS




GRAPH-3, CONCENTRATION CURVE FOR HOUSEHOLD OPERATIONAL HOLDINGS




