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CHAPTER ONE

INTRODUCTION

- no Objective.—In the twenty-fourth round of the National Sample Survey (NSS), main emphasis was laid on the enquiry on household trade. The survey was intended to throw up estimates of earnings of the household trading sector, not registered under the Sales Tax Act, at the national and state levels. The survey had the coverage both in the rural and urban areas and the sample size was fairly large.
- tics of the survey has already been prepared which is now under printing. The present report besides giving some two-way distributions of trade households provides the estimates of employment in household trade, physical fixed assets used in the household trading sector, average gross earning in household trade derived by using the trade margin figures of different commodities as reported by the respondents and other related features of trading activity both for the rural and urban sectors at the all-India level (Appendix II). However, the findings of the survey in respect of the use of physical assets in the household trading enterprise, their addition and depletion over a period of one year, proportion of such assets owned and taken on hire by the trade households and the gross earning of the trade households classified by commodity groups have been given for each state separately for the rural and urban sectors (Appendix III).
- 1.2 Geographical coverage.—The survey was extended over the whole of the rural and urban sectors of Indian Union except North-East Frontier Agency, Ladak district of Jammu & Kashmir Mizo Hills (Lushai) district in Assam, Pal and Samari tehsils of districts Surguja and Bijapur, Dantewara and Kanta tehsils of district Bastar of Madhya Pradesh, rural areas in Nagaland, Mao, Ukhrel and Tamenglong sub-divisions of the Union Territory of Manipur; Longai & Kanchanpur in Dharmanagar sub-division of the Union-Territory of Tripura, the Union Territories of Adaman & Nicobar Islands and Laccadive, Minicoy & Amindivi Islands.
- in four independent and interpenetrating samples, each of which could provide valid estimates of any characteristic. The results presented in the Appendices of this report are, however, based on the the total sample. In the rural sector, in general all the trade households listed in the sample village were surveyed while in the urban sector, households were selected from the sample blocks following a self-weighting² design at the state level ensuring a good proportion of the trade households to come in the sample.
- terprises operated by the household sector. The non-household trading activities like those undertaken by joint stock companies, co-operative societies and other similar bodies were excluded from the scope of the survey. In the household sector, households having trading enterprises registered under the Sales, Tax Act were excluded. However, trading enterprises dealing in commodities exempted from the Sales Tax Act were considered for the survey even if the annual turnover exceeded the financial limit for the registration under the Sales Tax Act. In so far as the type of

trading activities were concerned, the present survey covered both the wholesale and retail trade as well as activities like auctioneering, commission agency, brokerage, hiring out of durable goods. But brokerage or agency activities in stock exchange, insurance, real estate, state lotteries etc., and hiring out of conveyances did not come under the purview of this enquiry. Money lending activities were also excluded.

- by way of sale normally involving no transformation of the goods during such transaction. However, when goods were purchased and some nominal processing work was done before selling without making any transformation of the goods purchased then such activities were also considered under trading. Common examples of those types are the households of the hawkers who sell fruits after peeling off the skins and cutting the fruits into pieces, those households who sell soaked grams and green peas mixed with onions, pepper and salt, etc. Households having distributive trading activities in respect of the products manufactured by them were also taken into account under trading if such households kept separate accounts of the manufacturing and trading activities. In case of inclusion of such households under trading, account relating to the trading part only was considered for the survey.
- 1.6 Frame for the trade households.— A household was considered to be a trade household if at least one of its member was self-employed in trade (as per the coverage and definition of trade given in paragraphs 1.4 and 1.5) for at least one day during the reference period. Self-employed in trade were those who were either employers or own-account workers in trade having trade as principal or subsidiary occupation. Obviously households having only employees engaged in trade, were not taken into account. The households which reported trading activity (as defined earlier) during any day out of the 30 days preceding the date of listing formed sub-stratum 1 and those which reported the activity during any day out of the 365 days, other than last 30 days preceding the date of listing constituted sub-stratum 2 of the frame. This report is based on the households belonging to sub-stratum 1 only.
- 1.7 Treatment of joint and multiple enterprises.—For trading enterprises managed by two or more households particulars of different items of trading activity were collected for the entire joint enterprise and not for the sample household only. In such cases the percentage share in the profit of the sample household was used to derive the households' share for estimating different items of enquiry. In cases where households had more than one trading establishments, for the purpose of recording the data, such households were considered to have only one trading enterprise provided the households had sole proprietory right over all the establishments. But whenever two or more joint trading establishments or one proprietory (sole) and one or more joint establishments were managed by a household, schedules were filled in separately for each establishment of the household.
- 1.8 Survey period.—The survey started in July 1969 and continued upto June 1970. The survey period of one year was split up into six sub-rounds of two months each.
- 1.9 Participation of States.—Along with the work of the Central sample of the NSS, all the State Governments except West Bengal and Nagaland participated in the work of the NSS on a full-matching basis. The Union Territories of Manipur and Tripura also participated in the NSS work on a a full-matching basis.
- of the National Sample Survey, Government of India, in all the States and Union Territories, except in West Bengal and Bombay City where the survey work was carried out by the Indian Statistical Institute. The Indian Statistical Institute was responsible for the planning and designing of the survey.
- 1.11 Fusimile of Schedules of enquiry, etc.—The list showing the details of the commodity groups and the facsimile of the schedules of enquiry are given in Appendices IV and V respectively.

CHAPTER TWO

SUMMARY OF FINDINGS

- 2.0 Some important findings of the survey in respect of various characteristics of the trade households for the rural and urban sectors of India are presented in this chapter. The discussion is restricted only to the findings of the survey at the all-India level which will give an overall picture of the activities undertaken by the household trading sector. The results discussed here are based on the total sample.
- 2.1 Trade as a perennial activity.—The survey reveals that there were 26.47 lakh trade households in the rural sector and 14.03 lakhs in the urban sector of India. Households engaged in trade were found to pursue the activity throughout the last year (i.e., 365 days prior to the date of survey) as 93 percent in the rual areas and little over 96 percent in the urban areas had trading as perennial activity. Trading activities pursued only during certain months in the last year (i.e. seasonal activity) were reported by 6 and 3 percent of trade households in rural and urban areas respectively while sporadic activities in trade at different times with no marked continuity, during the last year (i.e. casual activity) were pursued by about 1 percent households in both rural and urban areas.
- 2.2 Fixed capital assets in use in trade.—In the rural areas 94 percent of the trade households were reported to use at least one of the fixed assets like land, building, tools & appliances, furniture & fittings, transport and other equipments. The same index for the urban areas was 90. Thus the percentage of households not using a single physical asset in their trading activity in the urban areas was higher than that of the rural areas. This might be due to the fact that in urban areas considerable number of hawker households engaged in trade did not require any fixed asset for pursuing their activity. The value of fixed assets used in trade household was estimated at Rs. 697 for the rural sector and Rs. 1,646 for the urban sector. Both in the rural and urban sectors about 85 per dent of the total value of physical assets in use in trade was accounted for by land and buildings.
- 2.3 Employment in household trade .—The average number of persons including both the household members and hired workers engaged in trade per week in the trading households was 1.30 for the rural sector and 1.43 for the urban sector. In so far as the average number of mandays worked in trade per week is concerned, rural sector reported 8 mandays while urban sector engaged a little less than 11 mandays. The proportion of mandays put in by hired workers to the total mandays was negligibly small in rural sector (2.4 percent) while the same index for the urban sector was 6.4 percent.
- 2.4 Gross earning in trade by using trade margin figures.—The information on the gross trade margin of different commodities dealt in by the trade households were collected from the respondents by direct interrogation without going into the details of the accounts relating to the actual value of sales and purchase of merchandise of the trading enterprise. Gross trade margin for a commodity was defined as the value of gross earning expressed as a percentage of the purchase value the commodity. Generally when a trader purchases some commodity he immediately fixes up its selling price as per the prevailing market rate. The difference between the selling price so fixed by the trader and the purchase price gave the gross earning from the particular commodity and gross trade margin was ascertained accordingly. Using the trade margin figures of individual commodities, the weighted trade margins for the important ten commodity groups classified by three categories of trade were derived by using the value of purchase as well as the value of sale as the weights. Using these two sets of values of weighted trade margins, two sets of figures for the gross earning of the households classified by ten commodity groups and by three categories of trade (i.e., wholesale, retail and others) were calculated (vide Table 8, Appendix II),

Tij (1) and Tij(2) are weighted trade margins for ith commodity group and ith category of trade by using two different weight; Pij is the estimated value of purchase by trade households belonging to ith commodity group and ith category of trade and Gij (1) and Gij (2) are gross carnings of households belonging to ith commodity groups and jth category of trade by using Tij (1) and Tij (2) respectively.

2.5 For the classification of hoseholds into different commodity groups particularly when a household pursued trading in commodities belonging to different commodity groups, the criterion of maximum value of sale was adopted. According to the procedures of calculating the gross earning of the trade households enunciated above, the value of gross earning per trade household in rural areas turned out to be Rs. 46 per month by one procedure which differed only slightly when the weighting was done by the value of sales (Rs. 48 per month). In the urban sector the average gross earning derived by both the procedures came out to be the same (Rs. 129 per month). It may be noted that the average gross earning in trade obtained by deducting total value of purchase from total value of sales showed a higher value particularly in the urban sector (vide NSS Draft Report No. 249) than the figure obtained by the direct method (i.e., using trade margins).

APPENDIX I

SAMPLING DESIGN AND ESTIMATION PROCEDURE

- I. General—A stratified two-stage sampling design was adopted for the rural and urban sectors. While villages and blocks formed the first-stage sampling units for the rural and urban sectors respectively, households constituted the second-stage units for both the sectors.
 - A. Sampling Design and Estimation Procedure for Rural Sector
- 2. Stratification.—The country was divided into 64 agricultural regions by grouping within each state or union territory, districts having similar population density and crop pattern. Strata were formed within each region by grouping contiguous tehsils having similar population densities and altitudes above sea level and having good transport and communication facilities amongst them such that the sum of the size measures of the villages was the same for each stratum within a state/union territory. The size of a village was the ratio of its population to the average population of a village in the population class 0-499 of the state rounded off to a suitable integer. The number of strata to be formed within a state/union territory was obtained by dividing the number of villages allocated to the state/union territory by 24 which was the number of sample villages selected from each rural stratum. The total number of strata was 350.
- 3. Allocation.—The allocation of the total sample size of 8,400 villages to each state/union territory was based on a joint consideration of its rural population, area under cereal crops and available investigator strength. This allocation was further modified to ensure a minimum sample size of 360 villages in each state (except Punjab and Haryana where the number of sample villages were only 192 and 144 respectively) and about 200 sample villages in the union territories of Manipur and Tripura and to make them multiples of 24 to have 4 sub samples of 6 villages each in each stratum. Twentyfour villages were planned to be surveyed from each of the remaining union territories except Himachal Pradesh where a larger sample (72 in number) was envisaged for the survey.
- 4. Selection of villages.—The 1961 census list of villages constituted the sampling frame for selection of villages. The villages in each state were categorised into four classes depending on the number of household manufacturing enterprises in them. Class I consisted of villages reporting at least X₁ enterprises where X₁ indicated the integral part of X/n, X being the total number of enterprises and n the number of sample villages in the state. The villages having no enterprise at all were grouped under class 4 and the rest of the villages were then arranged according to the decreasing order of the numer of enterprises in them. From the list of villages so ranked, class 2 was constituted by those villages from the top of the list which accounted for about half the number of enterprises belonging to all the villages in the list. The remaining villages formed class 3. Within each stratum the villages were first arranged into the above-mentioned four classes and then within each class tehsils were arranged in a serpentine order considering geographical contiguity, the arrangement of tehsils being reversed in adjacent classes. Four independent sub-samples of 12 villages each were selected circular systematically with probability proportional to size, size being related to population as mentioned earlier. In each sub-sample the villages with odd order of selection formed the Central Sample and the rest constituted the State Sample. The unit of selection was thus the 1961 census village, but the revenue village corresponding to the selected census village, was taken to be the unit of survey. If a stratum was too large and/or if good transport facilities were not available between some segments of it, then the stratum was divided into a convenient numer of Investigation zones so that the area of each zone was of manageable size and more or less good transport facilities become available within each such zone. Two such zones were selected independently with probability proportional to their total size. Sub-samples 1 and 3 were selected from one zone and sub-samples 2 and 4 from the other.
- 5. Selection of hamlet groups.—In case of some big sample villages the number of hamlet groups to be formed was specified before hand. In such villages the investigators were asked to form the specified number of hamlet groups of approximately equal population content. In each village, one of the hamlet groups was selected with equal probability for the survey.

- 6. Selection of households.—In the sample village/hamlet group, all the households engaged in non-registered (as per Sales Tax Act) distributive trade were enumerated. For the purpose of listing, a household was considered to be a 'trade household' if any member(s) of it was self-employed in trade either in principal or in subsidiary capacity. Households which were engaged in trade at any time during the last 30 days prior to the date of listing formed sub-stratum 1 and those engaged in trade during any dáy out of the 365 days, other than the last 30 days, preceding the date of listing constituted sub-stratum 2 of the frame. In general all the trade households belonging to substratum 1 were surveyed. But in cases where the number of hoseholds of sub-stratum 1 exceeded 10, a linear systematic sample with a specified interval was taken for the survey. From sub-stratum 2 only one household was selected with equal probability.
- 7. Estimation procedure.—The estimate of state total for any characteristic from a sub-sample belonging to sub-stratum 1 was derived as

- B. Sampling Design and Estimation Procedure for Urban Sector.
- 8. Stratification.—In each state/union territory, towns with population less than 50,000 formed stratum 1 and the remaining towns and cities were categories under stratum 2 except the 4 big cities, viz., Bombay, Calcutta, Delhi and Madras. Each of the big cities formed stratum 3 of the respective states. The total number of strata was 44.
- 9. Allocation.—The totals sample size of 4632 blocks (Central Sample) was allocated to the states in proportion to their 1961 census urban population. The allocation was modified to ensure a minimum of 144 sample blocks in each state with the exception of Punjab, Haryana and Nagaland having only 96, 72 and 24 sample blocks, respectively) and rounded of to multiples of 24. As far as the union territories were concerned, Goa, Daman & Diu, Himachal Pradesh and Pondicherry were given a quota of 24 blocks each while 48 sample blocks were planned to be surveyed in Manipur and Tripura. Delhi and Chandigarh had a larger share in the allocation having 120 blocks ear marked for the survey. In allocating the total sample size to different state/union territories, available investigator strength and also the work load of the survey in rural areas were kept in view.

10. Arrangement of towns.—Before drawing the sample of blocks, the towns were arranged by stratum, region and the number of manufacturing establishments in the towns. The blocks within a town were then arranged according to their geographical contiguity.

vith probability proportional to size, the size of each block being taken as its population rounded off to the next multiple of 1,000. The blocks were selected in the form of 4 independent and interpenetrating sub-samples. Each sub-sample had one-fuurth of the sample size allocated to that stratum.

12. Selection of sub-blocs.—For very big blocks sub-division was allowed to reduce the work load. The investigators were asked to divide the block into the specified number of sub-block having more or less equal population content. One sub-block was selected with equal probability for the survey.

13. Selection of households.—In each sample block/sub-block, the households engaged in non-registered trade were categorised into 2 sub-strata as done in case of rural households. Further the hoseholds of sub-stratum 1 were arranged in two classes, viz., (i) those having trade as principal activity and (ii) those having trade as subsidiary activity. Then a sample of households was selected linear systematically with specified interval and random start from sub-stratum 1. From substratum 2 only one household was selected with equal probability.

14. Estimation procedure.—The estimate of state total for a characteristic from a sub-sample belonging to sub-stratum 1 was derived as:

15. All India estimates and combined estimates of sub-samples.—The all-India aggregate estimate was derived by summing the state estimates. Combine estimate of all the 4 sub-samples (comprising the total sample) were obtained by taking the arithmetic mean of the respective sub-sample estimates. The estimate of ratio was derived by dividing the aggregate estimate of the characteristic pertaining to the numerator by the corresponding aggregate estimate of the denominator.
