CHAPTER ONE

INTRODUCTION

- 1.1 The present report is the revised version of NSS Draft Report No. 229 (Tables with Notes on Non-household Small Manufacture, 23rd Round). The Draft Report No. 229 was based on central sample data only while the revised report incorporates results from both central and state material. Information presented in the report shows the estimates under breakdown by central and state sample and also the pooled one.
- 1.2 Regular collection of detailed information on the manufacturing enterprises which are registered under the Factories Act is being done through Annual Survey of Industries (ASI). In the twentythird round of National Sample Survey (NSS) after a gap of several years a comprehensive survey of the non-registered sector of the manufacturing enterprise in the country was undertaken to provide data on essential characteristics of this sector to add it up with data collected for the registered sector under the ASI.
- 1.3 Non-registered sector of manufacturing enterprise or the small scale manufacturing industries were classified as (i) household and (ii) non-household, and two separate schedules of enquiry viz., schedule 2.2 and schedule 2.21 were canvassed respectively for household and non-household manufacturing enterprises. Household enterprises were those which were owned and operated by households on a proprietory or partnership basis, while non-household enterprises were those among the non-registered (i.e. not registered under the Factories Act) which were institutionally owned and run i.c., owned and run by non-household corporate bodies e.g., co-operative societies, government and other types of societies. The present report relates only to data collected from the non-household establishments of the non-registered sector of manufacturing enterprise.
- 1.4 The survey in the twentythird round covered a whole year (July 1968—June 1969) and was divided into six sub-rounds of two months each in both rural and urban areas.
- 1.5 The geographical coverage of the twentythird round was the whole of the rural and urban sectors of the Indian Union excepting: North-East Frontier Agency, Ladak district of Jammu and Kashmir State, Mizo Hills (Lushai) district in Assam State, Pal and Samari Tehsils of district Surgiya and Bijapur, Dantewara and Konta Tehsils of district Bastar of Madhya Pradesh, Mao, Ukhrol and Tamenlong sub-divisions of the Union Territory of Manipur, the Union Territories of Andaman and Nicobar Islands and Laccadive, Minicoy and Amindivi Islands.
- 1.6 A stratified two-stage sampling procedure was adopted both in rural and urban sectors. The villages in the rural sector and the blocks in the urban sector were the first stage sampling units and the manufacturing establishments, the second stage sampling units.
- 1.7 The 1961 primary census abstract giving a list of all villages and the list of villages reporting household industry establishments was used as the sampling frame for selection of villages.

- 1.8 The villages in each state were divided into four classes depending on the number of household manufacturing establishments in them. Four independent sub-samples of 12 villages were selected circular systematically with probability proportional to size. In addition to this general sample, there was a special sample.
- 1.9 In some of the large sample villages a specified number of hamlet groups of approximately equal population content was formed. The hamlet groups having highest concentration of manufacturing establishments was always selected for survey.
- 1.10 The sampling frame for this enquiry was a list of non-household manufacturing establishments located at village and hamlet group level. In cases where the number of non-household establishments was less than 6 at village level and less than 3 at hamlet group level, all the establishments were surveyed and in other cases linear systematic sampling of establishments were made.
- 1.11 In each State/Union Territory, towns with population less than 50,000 formed stratum 1 and the remaining towns and cities formed stratum 2, except the 4 big cities, Bombay, Calcutta, Delhi and Madras. Each one of these formed stratum 3 of the respective state. The total number of strata were 44.
- 1.12 The total sample size had been allocated to the States in proportion to their 1961 census urban population. Allocation had been so made as to ensure a minimum of 144 sample blocks in each State except for Tripura, Manipur, Haryana, Punjab, Delhi, Himachal Pradesh, Goa, Daman & Diu and Pondicherry.
- 1.13 Before sampling of blocks, towns were arranged Sy (i) stratum, (ii) region within each stratum and (iii) number of manufacturing establishments within each region.
- 1.14 Each Block was assigned a size which was a measure of its population. Then from each stratum the allocated number of blocks were selected circular systematically with probability proportional to size in the form of 4 independent sub-samples. In addition to those general samples there were special samples of blocks which contained a large number of manufacturing establishments.
- 1.15 A specified number of sub-blocks were formed for a selected large block in order to reduce the work load. One sub-block was selected at random for survey.
- 1.16 In cases where the number of non-household establishments was 5 or less, all the establishments were surveyed and in other cases establishments were selected systematically with interval and random start as specified.
- 1.17 In this survey all the State Government except that of West Bengal and Nagaland all the Union Territories excepting Himachal Pradesh, Goa, Pondicherry and Chandigarh participated in the work of NSS on a full matching basis, to get more precise estimates. The State Statistical Bureaus were in charge of field work, processing and tabulation of State Sample data. The aggregates and the multiplying factors of the states sample data of schedule of this round were furnished by the State Statistical Bureaus. The central, state and pooled results are presented in this report.
- 1.18 As a general samples for centre and state combined 16104 villages and 8616 blocks and for special samples 764 villages and 1408 blocks were selected for this enquiry. From general samples 270 villages and 113 blocks reported to have one or more non-households establishments and from special samples 165 villages and 35 blocks were having non-household establishments. In all 659 establishments from rural areas and 205 establishments from urban areas were selected for data collection.
- possible for the collection of primary data in all the States and the Union Territories except in West Bengal and Bombay City, where the field work was carried out by the Indian Statistical Institute. The work relating to processing and tabulation of data was done by the department of the National Sample Survey in the Indian Statistical Institute subsequently merged with the National Sample Survey Organisation, Department of Statistics, Ministry of Planning, Government of India.

CHAPTER TWO

SOME RESULTS

- 2.1 Extent of non-household non-registered manufacturing sector in rural and urban areas: The prevalence of manufacturing activity carried on through non-registered non-household establishments have been the subject of enquiry in a few earlier rounds of NSS. In the 19th round a pilot study on non-household enterprises belonging to manufacture as well as trade and transport was carried out in nine State blocks (NSS report no. 149). Further in the listing schedules (schs. 0.1 and 0.2) of the nineteenth round, NSS, information was collected regarding the number and type of non-household non-registered enterprise units from both rural and urban areas. Both the Pilot Study results and those obtained from the listing schedules (NSS Draft report no. 194), have shown that actually such enterprises, whether these are manufacture, trade or transport, are very few in number so that the per village and per block number of non-household establishments of all types for all India were estimated to be as low as 0.09 for rural and 0.19 for urban. If the estimates were restricted to non-household manufacture only, these averages would have been still smaller.
- 2.2 The above experience only got further corroborated by the survey of non-household non-registered manufacture in the 23rd round through the schedule 2.21. From the Central and state sample combined the number of total sample enterprises that could be achieved at the all-India level was only 864 for rural and urban combined, with a sample size of 16868 villages and 10024 blocks. The distribution of sample establishments and the effective sample villages and blocks for central and state is given below.

- 2.3 In view of the small number of samples for this schedule, it was decided to present only a few salient estimates all-India and all-industry level with only a breakdown for textile industry. It may be noted that for the urban areas the sample size even at all-India all-industry level was quite poor. The following paragraphs deal with the results.
- 2.4 From table (3) below it is noted that on an average the number of workers per establishment for all industries came to about 15 in rural areas and 27 in urban areas whereas in textile industry these were 25 and 50 respectively. The hired labour charge per worker was almost the same in both rural and urban areas which came about Rs. 90. But in textile industry the charge was Rs. 82/- in rural areas and Rs. 72 in unban areas.

^{2.5.} Table (4) below gives the details of the value of capital used per establishment and the value of yearly rent paid per establishment. It is observed that the value of total capital (fixed and working) per establishment in all industries is of the order of Rs. 45,000 in rural areas and Rs. 64,000 in urban areas. However, the very large difference which is noticed between the central and state sample estimates for value of capital as well for most other selected items that are presented in this note may be due to the heterogeneous composition of the sample units, the size of effective samples & the Nature of the records of the establishments.
