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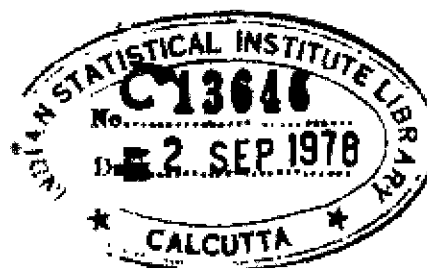

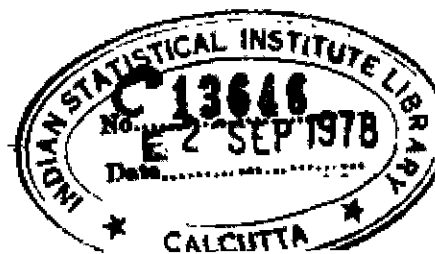
Section 1 : Introduction, Concepts & Definitions

Introduction

1.0 In the twenty seventh round of the National Sample Survey (NSS) a country-wide comprehensive survey on the nature and extent of employment and unemployment was conducted. It is known that since 1962-63 the NSS discontinued having in its annual programme, the survey on employment and unemployment in rural areas^{1/}. The labour force survey in urban areas, however, continued till twentythird round (1968-69). The conceptual frame-work of the preceding series of employment-unemployment surveys in rural and urban areas was based on the Standard ON LABOUR FORCE SURVEYS prescribed by the Central Statistical Organisation (C.S.O.).

1.1 Since 1960 the users of the data on NSS employment surveys started questioning their reliability. There were "considerable divergence of opinion regarding appropriate definitions of yardsticks for measuring unemployment and under employment". Doubts were raised in regard to the applicability of the CSO Standard in the surveys to be conducted in countries like India. These doubts and queries became the cause of concern in view

of the fact that the estimates of the employment and under-employment worked out on the basis of the Census, the NSS and the Employment Exchange data were widely differing from one another and the NSS estimates, compared to other estimates, were consistently lower. The necessity, therefore, was keenly felt for suitable re-orientation of the concepts and approach of the enquiry that would lead to the recognition and proper reflection in the survey of the "extremely heterogeneous" character of "the labour supply available to the Indian Economy" which the Standard Concepts (C. S. O.) could not adequately satisfy.

1.2 The Planning Commission set up in August 1968 an Expert Committee on Unemployment Estimates with Prof. M.L.Dantwalla as its Chairman and asked the Committee to go into all the relevant issues involved in the measurement of Unemployment and Under-employment and to recommend, for adoption in surveys, an alternative conceptual frame-work and a changed procedure of enquiry. The Expert Committee submitted its Report in March 1970

1.3 The NSSO Governing Council in its meeting held on 16-17 April 1971 decided to conduct a household survey on employment and unemployment as the principal subject of enquiry in the twenty seventh round of NSS keeping in view the main recommendations of the Expert Committee. A technical working Group set up by the NSSO Governing Council framed an appropriate schedule for the enquiry and also worked out the procedure of data collection which were finally approved by the Governing Council in its meeting held in November 1971. The draft Schedule was put to a pre-survey trial by the survey staff of Field Operations Division (FOD), NSSO before it was made ready for the actual survey.

1.4 All the states (except Nagaland and West Bengal) and some Union Territories participated in the NSS 27th round programme on at least equal matching basis to get more reliable estimates for their respective states. Some states, for this particular survey, took more than equal matching sample to improve their estimates. Survey extended over the whole of rural and urban areas of Indian Union excepting Ladakh district of Jammu & Kashmir state; rural areas of Pal and Samri tehsils of district surguja and Priyapur, Dantewara, Konta and Narayanpur tehsils of district Chanda and Melghat tehsil of district Amravati of Maharashtra; rural areas of Nagaland; disturbed villages of Tripura, rural areas of the Union Territories of Arunachal Pradesh; Andaman and Nicobar Islands, Mizoram, Laccadive, Minicoy and Amindivi Islands and Dadra & Nagar Haveli.

1.5 The sample design of the survey was stratified two stage with villages and urban blocks being the first stage units respectively in rural and urban sectors. In both the sectors, the households were the second stage units^{2/}. In the Central sample altogether 9088 villages and 4832 urban blocks were selected as the first stage units. The design was made self-weighting at the sub-stratum and region level for rural areas and sub-stratum and state level for urban areas^{3/}. On an average 12 households per sample village/block were selected in each of which the schedule of enquiry was canvassed.

1.6 The survey work was started in October 1972 and continued upto September 1973^{4/}. The survey period was divided into 4 sub-rounds (which together covers one full year i.e. four agricultural seasons, obviously both peak and lean period having been included) each being of three months duration. The sample units were so staggered over 4 sub-rounds that valid estimates could be built up for each of ^{the} sub-rounds separately. Presentation of sub-roundwise estimates for different characteristics of population has, therefore, been possible.

1.7 The NSSO Governing Council set up a Working Group to draw and finalise the tabulation plan of this survey. The approved (by the NSSO Governing Council) tabulation plan provided cross tabulation of different characteristics of population, so that the tabulated data could be made amenable to an "in-depth" study of the anatomy of employment and unemployment for the country as a whole at regional and state levels. The Working Group also decided to tabulate the survey material not only by states but also by 66 different geographical regions.

1.8 Quite a massive information from about 8 lakhs individual members belonging to about 1.7 lakhs of sample households of the country (in the Central sample) have been collected. In view of the shortage of mechanical tabulation resources, the tabulation of these huge survey materials (by states and by regions) was taken up by the 25 newly set up Manual Tabulation Centres located at the different FOD Block Offices under the administrative control of FOD, NSSO. The Pre-tabulation processing of the central sample data was

started at these Manual Tabulation Centres from August 197 . To expedite the completion of tabulation work, the Manual Tabulation Centres were subsequently asked to complete tabulation upto an intermediate stage and the work relating to the final stage of tabulation was entrusted to the Data Processing Division of NSSO. Till now, only a part of the tabulation is complete. Considering the urgency and necessity of quick presentation of Survey results and also in view of such interest evinced by different users for the results of this survey some estimated broad results (in percentages) for some states only are being presented in this Brouchure. As the volume of total tabulation work is quite substantial, higher priorities have been assigned to the preparation of some tables while the other tables got lesser priorities in tabulation. The publication of the full survey results will, therefore, be made in phases.

Conceptual frame-work of Data Collection

1.9 The CSO Standard, which was considered as the guide line for the earlier NSS employment and unemployment surveys, prescribed classification of population into categories such as Employed, Unemployed and Not in labour force on the basis of the recorded data on activity (or inactivity) of the household members during the varying (or moving) reference weeks.

1.10 The expert Committee specially recommended to abandon this procedure of classification, as the Committee argued that "the percentage of unemployed reported in a given NSS round is an average of the varying weekly situations recorded for different periods during the year over which the investigation is spread. There is no reason to believe that those classified as unemployed

during the specific reference week preceding the date of survey of a household or households would necessarily be without work throughout the year. The fact that the sample is spread over the entire year does not remove this limitation; it means an aggregation of the weekly situations in regard to the unemployment status of individuals rather than the continuing unemployment of the same set of individuals"^{6/}. As an alternative approach, they recommended that on the basis of the recorded data on varying weekly situations of individuals some measure of level or rate of unemployment/under-employment during different periods of time or seasons in a year might be built up and that to in further disaggregated form.

1.11 Classification of population on the basis of current status : In the survey an attempt has been made, as the accompanying data will show, to interpret, in the line of the recommendation of the Expert Committee, the data on the classification of individual members of the households during the varying reference weeks by current status as (a) Working person-weeks, (b) seeking person-weeks; (c) not seeking but available person-weeks and (d) not available person-weeks. In the earlier NSS employment surveys, the working person-weeks were interpreted as number of working (or gainfully employed) persons; the seeking and not seeking but available person-weeks were interpreted as number of persons seeking and available (or unemployed) and not available person-weeks were interpreted as number of persons not available for work (or persons out of labour force). The Expert Committee "felt that the method of working out 'equivalent full time unemployment' from partial period of unemployment was arbitrary". Of course, on the basis of some valid assumptions, one may deflate the data on person-weeks under

different status as described above into number of persons employed, unemployed or number out of labour force. But one should perhaps desist from straightway equating the data on person-weeks under each of the activity categories mentioned above as data on number of persons under each of such activity status category.

1.12 Weekly day to day labour time disposition : Data on labour time disposition of persons reported as working or seeking and also persons not seeking but available for gainful work during the reference week have been collected in this Survey. In the earlier NSS employment-unemployment surveys, similar data on day-to-day labour time disposition of only those individual members who were classified as working (or employed) during the reference week were collected. The purpose of collection of such data was to get a quantitative measure of the extent of under-employment (and not unemployment, as the individuals already reported themselves as employed during the reference week). In this survey the data on day-to-day labour time disposition were collected for both individuals recorded as working and also for those seeking or available for work. Thus the base population for data on day-to-day labour time disposition were those reported as belonging to labour force (persons working seeking and not seeking but available taken together) during the reference week. Secondly, in the present survey (as also in the earlier NSS employment survey) data on current status of every individual of the base population collected for each day of the week or in other words, day instead of one week was the unit of classification and measurement. All these information on the day-to-day labour time disposition of persons reported as belonging to labour force will give : 1) the rate or level of the net employment content of the

population in labour force during the week, 2) the unemployment content of the same population during the week and also 3) the rate of withdrawal from the economic activity of labour force population during the reference week.

1.13 As for the estimation of the rates described above, the unit of measurement is day, the respective rates have been measured in terms of person-days and not in terms of persons (as was done in tabulation and presentation of data of earlier NSS employment-unemployment surveys). The data on day-to-day labour time disposition of persons who belonged to labour force during the varying reference weeks will have three different components : (a) person-days working during the week, (b) person-days seeking, (c) person-days available during the week and (d) person-days not available for gainful work (out of labour force) during the reference week.

1.14 As intensity of work on a particular day might be different for different individuals, a further probing enquiry was made in this survey in regard to the work content of each activity status that one was having on each day of the reference week and accordingly data on intensity of work, in qualitative terms, were collected. In the earlier NSS Surveys, similar data on intensity expressed in terms of hours in a day were collected. But in view of criticism that intensity in terms of hours carry very little meaning when they are used as a yardstick for measuring the work content in rural agriculture, the usefulness of their use in Urban areas notwithstanding, a qualitative measure, such as, full and half - 'full' for a full day work and 'half' for a half day work - was used for the measurement of intensity of work in a day. The criterion to decide what was 'full' and what was 'half' was rested on the judgement of the informant who would be reporting on the

intensity of days work. Of course, restriction was imposed that persons working for less than 1 hour of work in a day should not be treated as working with 'half' intensity on that day. It was also implied, in the adoption of the above procedure, that one person might have 'half' intensity in two different kind of statuses on a single day but can not have three different statuses with 'half' intensity on the same day.

1.15 Classification of population on the basis of enduring status (usual status) : Besides collection of data for the purpose of measuring the rate or level of employment, unemployment and underemployment in the country, the data on enduring status of the population i.e. the status which prevailed over a long period in the past and which is also likely to continue in future, have been collected in this survey for each individual member of the households. For an economically backward country having her mainstay in traditional agriculture with preponderance of household as economic unit, a bench-mark data on the employment-unemployment pattern can only be built-up on the basis of classification of individual by their enduring statuses. The terminology used in this survey for this enduring status is Usual Status. This was not a new terminology that was used in this survey. Indian Census had been using this concept till the 1951 Census. Subsequently of course, in the Census a sort of mixed current-cum-usual status concept has been in use. NSS also, along with current status concept (or labour force concept), adopted the usual status concept for the classification of population in the first country-wide survey on employment and unemployment in the NSS, Ninth Round (1955). The data that will be thrown up from the current survey on the basis of classification of individuals by usual Status will give the estimates of

number of persons employed, unemployed and not in the labour force with reference to a long period in the past, say, one year. The estimates of unemployed obtained on the basis of Usual Status Classification will perhaps indicate the number of persons who are chronically unemployed for a long period.

1.16 Probing Questions : With a view to having a realistic analysis and study of the data on the distribution of population by usual status, a kind of background information highlighting different aspects of the usual work-pattern of persons categorised under one usual status or the other, different sets of probing questions were formulated, each set being relevant for a particular set of individuals classified under a particular usual status category. The data on usual status, read and analysed concurrently with the tabulated answers of the probing questions will bring into clearer relief the exact employment-unemployment profile of the population. As an illustration some of the probing questions asked to individuals who were assigned a particular usual status code are given below :

1. Whether full-time or part-time wage paid/salaried employee ?
 2. Whether in temporary or permanent employment ?
 3. Whether also seeking work and if seeking, whether seeking within or outside village/town ?
 1. Whether seeking or available for wage/salaried employment ?
 2. Whether seeking employment in agriculture or in non-agricultural activity ?
 3. If seeking, how long seeking and what efforts have been making in search of work ?
 4. Whether willing to accept employment outside village/town or within village/town ?
 1. Whether seeking work for the first time ? How long seeking ? What efforts have been making in search of work ?
 2. Whether farm or non-farm employment sought ? Whether sought employment within/outside village/town ?

1.17 The answers to the probing questions were sought in such a manner that those were either in categorical affirmative or negative. It would obviously be seen that the distribution of population by usual status would present only the broad contours of their work pattern. But this distribution when analysed with the respective answers of persons belonging to different



usual status categories will unfold the real content of their work-pattern profile. Thus, instead of making a lop-sided inference on the basis of partial information on activity pattern averaged out from varying weekly situations obtaining for different individual members of households, the inferences drawn after collation of three different kinds of information - (1) weekly labour time disposition of population in labour force, (2) distribution of population by usual status and (3) the answers to the relevant probing questions put to persons having a particular usual status will be meaningful and will perhaps reflect the reality of the employment - unemployment situation in the country.

1. 3 Definition of some important terms adopted in the Survey : The definition of terms used in the survey are as follows :

- (a) Household : The Household was defined as consisted of individuals normally living together under the same roof and taking meal in the same kitchen.
- (b) Industry : The sector of economic activity in which a person works is the Industry of the person.
- (c) Occupation : The nature or type of work performed by a person is termed as the Occupation of the person.
- (d) Normal member : The Normal members constituted of those who usually resided in the same household and used to take food in the same kitchen. They included temporary stay-aways and excluded temporary visitors.
- (e) Current Status* : The Current Status has been defined as the activity status of an individual during a particular point period of time. For this survey the current status will refer to the current activity status of persons during the week preceding the date of survey. For assigning the appropriate

Current Status code to a particular person who was having concurrently two different statuses during the reference week the status which occupied relatively more labour time than the other will be his Current Status for recording entries in the Schedule.

- (f) Usual Status* : The Usual Status has been defined as the enduring activity status of a person i.e. the activity status which prevailed for a long period in the past and which was also likely to continue in future. But in the case of person whose last enduring status ceased in the recent past and he or she assumed a new status which was also likely to continue in future, the status which the person assumed lately was considered to be his Usual Status.
- (g) Current Working : A person found to be engaged in his own farm/enterprise/profession etc. or were in employment in other's farm/enterprise/profession etc. or were in casual employment in agricultural/non-agricultural activities or was working as helper in household farm/non-farm enterprise during the reference week was termed Currently Working (or currently in gainful employment). Included in the above category were those persons who temporarily abstained from work on any day of the reference week or during the whole period of the week due to sickness or other reasons without having been disengaged or left from the work or employment.
- (h) Usually Working : A person found to be usually (i.e. over a long period) engaged in his own farm/enterprise/profession etc. or were usually in employment in other's farm/enterprise/profession etc. or was usually on casual employment in agricultural/non-agricultural activities or had been working in household farm/non-farm enterprise as helper was termed Usually Working (or Usually in gainful employment).

The description of Current and Usual Status and the corresponding codes adopted for this survey is given in Appendix II.

- (i) Currently seeking employment : A person who was having no work and made some tangible effort in search of employment on any day of the reference week or during the whole reference week was termed as Currently seeking employment (or currently unemployed).
- (j) Currently not seeking but available for employment : A person who was having no work and though did not actively sought work or employment but was available for employment at the prevail rate of remuneration was termed not-seeking but available for employment (or Currently Unemployed).
- (k) Usually seeking employment : A person who was having no work or employment for a long period and had been making some efforts search of employment for fairly long time was termed usually seeking employment (or usually unemployed).
- (l) Usually not seeking but available for employment : A person who was having no work or employment for a long period and though not been actively seeking work or employment but had been available for employment at the prevailing rate of remuneration was termed usually not seeking but available for employment (or usually unemployed).
- (m) Currently not available for work : A person who was having no work or employment and at the same time was not either seeking or available for work or employment for various reasons on any day of the reference week or for the whole period of the week was termed as currently not available for work (or currently out of labour force).
- (n) Usually not available for work : A person who was having no work or employment and at the same time had not been either seeking or available for work or employment for various reasons during the long period in the past was termed as usually not available for work (or usually out of labour force).

Section 2 : Explanatory Note on Tables

2.0 General : Out of a total of 45 tables (9 tables on household characteristics and 36 tables on employment-unemployment characteristics of individual household members) of the approved tabulation plan, only 13 tables (1 on household characteristics and 12 on employment-unemployment characteristics of individual household members) are being presented in this Brochure. The percentage estimates presented in these tables are State estimates only, separately, for another 3 States of Indian Union (In the first three issues of this Brochure, vide No. 255/1, 255/2 & 255/3, estimates for 22 States have already been presented). Estimates for the different regions within a State/Union Territory and those for All-India are still at the tabulation stage.

2.1 The numbering of the tables presented in the Brochure is different from that in the approved tabulation plan. The correspondence of the table number on this Brochure with the respective number of the approved tabulation plan is given below :

2.2 The approved tabulation plan prescribed preparation of multidimensional estimates. But for quick presentation of at least some results of the survey only marginal totals (exposing some features and suppressing others), have been presented for the present.

2.3 Separate sub-roundwise estimates for sub-rounds 1 & 2 have been presented in tables 1,2,3 & 4 and estimates taking sub-rounds 1 & 2 together have been shown in the remaining 9 tables. All the tables, excepting table numbers 8 & 9 are presented separately for rural and urban areas. Table numbers 8 & 9 contain estimates only for urban and rural areas respectively.

2.4 In all the tables excepting table number 2 (on household characteristics), the population of ages 5 + (years) have only been covered. As no data relating to different employment-unemployment characteristics have been recorded for the population of ages 0-4 (years), they have been excluded for compiling the aforesaid tables. The proportion of population in the age bracket 0-4 (years) for different States are given below :

2.5 Table number 0 : (1) Percentage distribution of households by per-centage monthly household expenditure group is given in the left hand portion of the table (cols. 2-9). (2) The ratio of economically active persons in different expenditure group to total persons in each of such group is shown in the right hand portion of the table (cols. 10-17).

2.6 Table number 1 : In the survey, information was collected from different individual members of the households pertaining to their activities (inactivities) during the varying (moving) reference weeks. All such person-weeks have been distributed by different activity categories (after suitably grouping the detailed activity categories used in the survey) and shown in this table.

The general-cum-technical education group codes under col.1 have been explained in item A of Appendix II. The general-cum-technical education group codes have been arranged in ascending order and those code combinations not appearing in the table should be taken as codes not reported in the survey.

2.7 Table number 2 : The detailed day-to-day labour time disposition, of persons already categorised as either working or not working but seeking or available for work during the varying (moving) reference weeks, were collected in the survey i.e., each one of these persons was further categorised for each day of reference weeks as either (a) working or (b) not working but seeking work or (c) neither working nor seeking but available for work or (d) not available for work. In this table the total available labour-force-days (which is shown as 100) i.e., the seven days of the week multiplied by the total of the number of persons categorised as working and those categorised as not working but seeking or available, have been shown (taking day as the unit of measurement) as distributed by the (a) number of person-days working, (b) number of person-days seeking, (c) number of person-days not seeking but available and (d) number of person-days not available for work during the reference week.

2.8 Table number 3 : This table is just an extension of the table number 2. The basic information, which is furnished in this table is whether a particular activity status assigned to a person (belonging to labour force during the reference week) on a day lingered for the 'full' day or for 'half' of the day and to what proportion the 'full' labour force weeks are distributed between different broad activity categories days (shown as 100) and half labour force days (shown also as 100) of the [(a) working, (b) not working but seeking, (c) neither working nor seeking but available and (d) neither working nor available for work]^{1/}.

2.9 Table number 4 : The average weekly earnings (not average wage rate) of wage and salary earners from all occupations pursued by them during the varying reference weeks have been presented in this table separately for persons having different educational qualification.

2.10 Table number 5 : In this table is shown the distribution of population by broad usual activity status category (after suitably grouping the detailed usual status categories used in the survey) i.e., the activity category which prevailed in the past and which is likely to continue also in future, (usually working; usually not working but seeking or available; usually not working and not available).

2.11 Table number 6 : This table has two sections, the left hand section (cols.2-7) relates to persons having usual activity status code 11 (working in own farm) and the right hand section (cols. 8-13) relates to persons having usual activity status code 12 (working in household non-farm enterprise/profession). In this table is shown the proportion of persons having a

particular usual activity status code (11 or 12) working throughout the year and the proportion (of the same base population) also work, in addition to his/her usual attachment to a particular activity status code (11 or 12), in household non-farm enterprise/profession or in own farm.

2.12 Table number 7 : The extent of idleness of persons having the usual activity category code 11 or 12 has been shown in this table. The table has two sections, the left hand section (col.3) showing the proportion of those, having idle time in their own farm/household non-farm enterprise or profession, usually working or seeking work or available for work for wages in other's farm/enterprise and the right hand section (cols. 4 to 10) showing the proportion of them worked or sought work or was available for work for various number of days-group.

2.13 Table number 8 : In this table is shown (in cols. 2, 3 & 4) the proportion of persons having usual activity category code 13/14 (i.e., working as wage and salary earners in farm/non-farm enterprise or profession) working full time as paid employee - the residual proportion (not shown in the table) being those working part time as paid employee. Also shown in this table is the proportion of those 'not trying to change present employment', 'seeking or available for wage/salaried employment' and 'not seeking or available for wage/salaried employment'. The estimates in this table will show the extent of under-employment (both visible and disguised) among wage and salary earners.

2.14 Table number 9 : The estimates shown in cols. 2, 3 and 4 of this table are the proportion of wage and salary earners in rural areas (having usual activity category codes 13/14) 'not trying to change present employment' the residual proportion being those 'trying to change the present employment' (not shown in the table). APPENDIX I

National Sample Survey

A Note on Sample Design and Estimation Procedure

1. Sample Design and Sample Size

1.1 Sample Design : The general sample design is stratified with two-stage selection within each stratum. The first-stage units are villages in rural areas and blocks in urban areas; the second-stage units are households in both rural and urban areas. The sample design has been self-weighting for all the household enquiries at the region and sub-stratum level in rural areas and at the state and sub-stratum level in urban areas. The sample villages and blocks have been selected in the form of usually two independent and interpenetrating sub-samples.

1.2 Sample Size (Central Sample) : The all-India sample size for households enquiries is 9088 villages and 4832 blocks. The rural price enquiry will be conducted in another sample of 419 villages which are the same villages as taken up for this enquiry in earlier rounds. The average sample size in a sample village/block is 12 households for schedule 10.

2. Work Programme

Sub-round : The survey period of 12 months is divided into 4 sub-rounds of 3 months each. One-fourth of sample villages and blocks will be surveyed in each sub-round. Each sample village and block will be visited *once only* - according to the sub-round arrangement described below :

3. Rural Sample Design

3.1 Sampling Frame : The sample consists of the first 24 villages as per 1971 population census.

3.2 Stratification : The country has been divided into 66 agricultural regions by grouping, within each state or union territory, districts having similar population density and crop pattern. Then within each region, strata have been formed by grouping tehsils which are (i) contiguous, (ii) having similar crop pattern, population density and altitude, and (iii) having good transport and communication facilities amongst them. The total rural population is about the same for each stratum within a region. The number of strata formed within state/union territory is given by the number of sample villages allocated to it divided by 24 except in Uttar Pradesh where each district is a stratum. The total number of rural strata is 392.

3.3 Allocation (Central Sample) : The all-India sample size of 9088 villages has been allocated to the states on a joint consideration of their rural population, area under cereal crops and available investigator strength. This has been modified to (i) ensure a minimum of 360 villages in a state excepting some smaller states and the union territories, (ii) take account of state-wise variation in work-load and number of investigators, and (iii) make the sample size a multiple of 24 in order to facilitate selection of 2 sub-samples of 12 villages in each stratum except in some areas, see para 4.4. Generally the participating states are surveying the same number of sample villages as in the central sample. However, the states of Uttar Pradesh, Gujarat, Rajasthan, Delhi and Goa-Daman-Diu are having enlarged samples.

3.4 Selection of Villages : Two independent sub-samples of 24 villages each are selected circular systematically with equal probability in each stratum after arranging the tehsils of the stratum in a serpentine order. In each sub-sample, the villages with odd order of selection form the 'Central sample' and the rest form the 'State sample'.

Thus generally, each sub-sample of a rural stratum contains 12 sample villages, but a sub-sample has only 8 villages in Delhi, 3 villages in central sample of Goa-Daman-Diu. And in Uttar Pradesh, the sub-sample size varies from 12 to 24 stratum to stratum and also between central and state samples. The central and state samples have been independently drawn in U.P. and Goa-Daman-Diu.

3.5 Investigation Zone : If a stratum is very large and/or if transportation among different parts of a stratum is extremely difficult, then it has been divided into two or more investigation zones which are manageable in area and transport. Two such zones are selected independently with probability proportional to their size.

3.6 Unit of Survey : As mentioned earlier, the 1971 census villages are first-stage units of selection. They are also the units of survey in this round.

3.7 Hamlet-group Selection : To control the work-load at the listing stage in case of large villages, the method of hamlet-group (hg) selection is adopted. The investigator divides the village into two or more areal sub-divisions (called hamlet-groups) of nearly equal population content and selects one of them at random for survey. When the number of hamlet groups is specified as 1 (one), then the whole village is surveyed.

3.8 Selection of Households : For schedules 1.0 and 10, all households in a sample village/hamlet-group are divided into three sub-strata on the basis of their means of livelihood as follows : (1) self-employed in non-agriculture, (2) rural labour, and (3) others. On an average, 12 sample households are selected in a sample village (2, 5 and 5 households, on the average, from sub-strata 1, 2 and 3 respectively); both the schedules 1.0 and 10 are canvassed in the same set of sample households. Sampling of households is done linear systematically and independently from each sub-stratum using the interval and random start specified for the purpose so as to make the design self-weighting at the region level for each sub-stratum.

4. Urban Sample Design

4.1 Sampling Frame : The list of NSS areal Urban Frame Survey (UFS) blocks supplemented by the list of 1971 census blocks (1961 census blocks in Tamil Nadu and West Bengal) have been used as the sampling frames, the latter for those towns only where UFS has not yet been done.

4.2 Stratification : In each state/union territory, towns with 1971 census population less than 50,000 form stratum 1, and the remaining towns and cities form stratum 2 except the four big cities viz., Bombay, Calcutta, Delhi and Madras. Each one of them forms stratum 3 of its respective state. The total number of urban strata in all-India is 50.

4.3 Allocation (Central Sample) : The all-India sample size of 4832 blocks has been allocated to the States in proportion to their 1961 census urban population. The allocations have been modified (i) to ensure a minimum of 144 sample blocks in a state excepting some smaller states and union territories, (ii) to take account of state-wise variation of work-load and number of investigators, and (iii) to make the allocations multiples of 8 in order to facilitate having 2 sub-samples and 4 sub-rounds. Sample size for a state is allocated to the strata in it in proportion to their total urban population; final stratum allocations also are made multiples of 8.

Generally, the participating States are having the same sample size as

4.4 Arrangement of Blocks : Before sampling of blocks, the towns are arranged by stratum and region within each state. The blocks in a town are arranged by geographical contiguity.

4.5 Selection of Blocks : In each stratum blocks have been selected circularly systematically with probability proportional to size (pps), the size of a block being taken as its population rounded off to the next multiple of 1000. Generally, the blocks have been selected in the form of two independent and interpenetrating sub-samples of equal size; within each sub-sample the 'central sample' and the 'state sample' are formed as for sample villages.

Some of the 'state samples' are having more than two sub-samples due to increased sample size. In Uttar Pradesh and Goa-Daman-Diu, sampling of blocks for central and state samples has been done independently.

4.6 Sub-block Selection : This is similar to the procedure of hamlet-group selection in villages. In a large sample block, the investigator forms the specified number of sub-blocks of nearly same population, selects one of them at random and conducts the survey in the selected sub-block only.

4.7 Selection of Households : All households of a sample block/sub-block are divided into two sub-strata : (1) self-employed and (2) not self-employed. Further, the households of sub-stratum 1 are arranged in two classes viz., (a) self-employed in manufacture, and (b) self-employed in other activities. Then from each sub-stratum households are sampled linearly systematically using the interval and random start specified in the sample list. The average sample size for a block will be 12 households-6 from each sub-stratum. Schedules 1.0 and 10 are canvassed in the same set of sample households. The design is self-weighting at the state and sub-stratum level.

6. Maintenance of the Self-weighting Nature of the Design

6.1 In order to retain the self-weighting nature of the design for schedules 1.0 and 10, the cases of casualty villages, blocks and households and the cases of revision of intervals for household sampling will be taken care of by adjusting the multipliers in the following manner

Rural Area

6.2 The adjustment of multipliers for the rural area will be done separately for each region, sub-sample, sub-stratum and schedule. At first the following four quantities will be calculated for each region, sub-sample, sub-stratum and schedule:

- n = number of villages selected in a region and sub-sample.
- m = number of villages surveyed including un-inhabited villages and zero cases in a region and sub-sample.
- P = expected total number of schedules in a sub-stratum of all the surveyed villages of a region and sub-sample. P will be calculated as the sum of the products of c for sample village and the number of households finally selected for the concerned schedule type (say schedule 10) in tth sub-stratum of that village, the summation being taken over all the surveyed villages. The factor c_t for a village is equal to D'I'/I where D' is the number of hamlet-groups actually formed in that village, I is the specific sampling interval for schedule 10 for tth sub-stratum of that village and I' is the interval actually used.
- Q = total number of filled-in schedules available for tabulation for the concerned region, sub-sample and sub-stratum.

6.3 Then the constant multiplier M (at the region and sub-stratum level) will be adjusted as M' where

6.4 The procedure of adjusting the urban multipliers would be the same as described above with the two changes mentioned below.

- 1) The adjustment will be done separately for each state, sub-sample, sub-stratum and schedule. Hence the word 'region' wherever it occurs in paras 6.2 and 6.3 would be replaced by the word 'state'
- 2) The factor C_t for a sample block will be equal to $D'I'/D.I$ where I is the specified number of sub-blocks and I' is the specified sampling interval for t^{th} sub-stratum for that sample block, and D' and I' are the corresponding actually used figures.

6.5 Sub-round-wise Estimates : Estimates of aggregates based on sample villages/blocks surveyed during a sub-round may be obtained by using the adjusted multiplier as per formula (5) where m will be the number of villages/blocks surveyed during that sub-round, in the concerned sub-sample, region (for villages) or state (for blocks).
