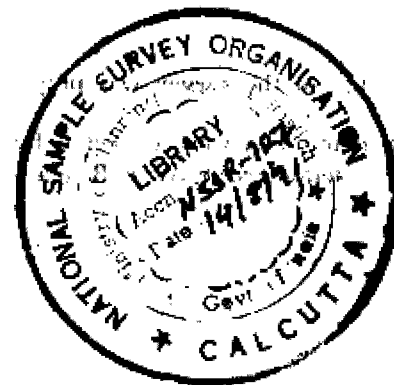

CHAPTER ONE

INTRODUCTION AND CONCEPTS AND DEFINITIONS

Introduction :

1.1 The Urban Labour Force Survey was introduced in the National Sample Survey (NSS) sixteenth round. Prior to that round, more detailed questionnaires were used for both the rural and the urban employment and unemployment enquiries. In view of the consideration that the economic activities in urban areas is likely to be more organised, a simplified set of questions is being used for the urban areas since the NSS sixteenth round.

1.2 This report contains the result derived from the data collected in the NSS 17th round, conducted during the period of eleven months commencing from the month of September, 1961 and terminating at the end of the month of July, 1962.

1.3 Results on employment and unemployment of earlier NSS rounds have been presented in several NSS reports, most of which have already been printed and for others, draft reports have been submitted. A list of NSS reports already published is annexed.

1.4 The total survey period of eleven months was divided into two halves, each of a duration of nearly six months. All the households surveyed during the first half were revisited in the latter half of the survey period. Thus for each sample household, for any characteristic, there were two observations taken during the period at an interval of about six months. Hence, visit-wise estimate would reflect variations in these characteristics obtaining in the two halves of a year.

1.5 *Participation by states :* Since the eighth round of the NSS, the State Statistical Bureaus have been participating in the work of the NSS by conducting the same enquiries on an additional similar sample in their respective states. In the NSS 17th round all the states excepting Mysore and West Bengal participated and of the Union Territories only Tripura participated. This report, however, presents the results based on the Central Sample only.

1.6 *Geographical coverage :* The survey covered the urban sector of India excluding Andaman and Nicobar Islands, Laccadive, Minicoy and Amindivi Islands, Ladakh district of Jammu and Kashmir, the disturbed areas of Manipur and the North East Frontier Agency.

Concepts and definitions :

1.7 *Household :* The normally resident member concept of household was used in this survey. Persons who normally passed nights under the same roof and normally took food from the same kitchen were considered as members of the household. Guests were thus excluded and temporary absentees were included.

1.8 *Employed, at work :* The category consisted of persons who worked on at least one day during the seven days preceding the date of enquiry for salary, wages, remuneration or profit in a gainful occupation or as an unpaid worker in the household enterprise. An unpaid family enterprise worker was one who worked in the enterprise run by another member of his or her own household without being paid in cash or kind.

1.9 *Employment status :* This specified the capacity in which the person worked in his gainful occupation. The gainfully employed population were sub-divided into the following four employment status categories :

- (i) *an employee* was one who worked for a public or private organisation, an individual or a group of persons and received remuneration in wages or salary or pay in kind ;
- (ii) *an employer* was a person who hired one or more employees to assist him in operating his (or her) enterprise ;
- (iii) *an own-account worker* was one who had been running his (or her) own enterprise without employing any one on salary or wages. There might be unpaid family enterprise workers or other own account workers working in the same enterprise ;
- (iv) *an unpaid family enterprise worker* was one who worked in the enterprise run by another member of his (or her) household without being paid in cash or kind.

1.10 *Employed, not at work :* This category comprised of persons who had a job or enterprise from which they were temporarily absent during the reference week because of reasons such as illness, injury or other physical disability, bad weather, strike or lock-out, paid lay-off, paid vacation for rest or recreation, or for any other causes, including social and religious necessitating absence from work.

jobs only who worked for less than 48 hours during the seven days preceding the day of enquiry. In collecting this item of information the following points were taken into consideration :

- (i) for those days on which the person was employed but not at work (i.e., was with job or enterprise but did not work for reasons such as illness, injury, bad weather, strike or lockout, leave etc.) no extra hour was to be recorded ;
- (ii) for those days on which the person was without any job or enterprise and was available for work, the number of additional hours available was taken as 8 hours on each such day ;
- (iii) no additional hour was recorded for those days on which the person worked for 8 hours or more. For a person who worked for less than 8 hours on a day, if the sum of the number of hours at work and the number of additional hours reported to be available on that day exceeded 8, the number of additional hours considered available on that day was taken as 8 minus number of hours worked on that day. No additional hours was, of course, considered available for those who were not legally permitted to take up extra work.

1.12 *Unemployed* : Persons who were not "employed" during the reference week, either "at work" or "not at work", and were looking for full-time work were considered as unemployed, provided they were above the age of 14 and below the age of 60. The undermentioned persons, for example, were to be considered as unemployed :

- (a) those who were on the live register of employment exchange at the end of the week ;
- (b) those who had put in written application for salaried jobs during the two months preceding the date of enquiry and were awaiting the results of the applications ;
- (c) those who had contacted or tried to contact prospective employers at least once during the reference week for employment ;
- (d) those who could not contact (or try to contact) prospective employers during the reference week because of ill-health, disability, bad weather or other similar reasons but for which they would have contacted prospective employers for employment, provided they had contacted or tried to contact prospective employers for employment within the preceding two months ;
- (e) those who did not make any tangible efforts to secure employment during the week under an expectation of recall to jobs which they had temporarily left, or under a belief that no alternative opportunities existed in the locality or for other similar reasons that could not be helped ;
- and (f) those who (without any job or enterprise) were wanting to start their own business (or enterprise) but could not do so owing to lack of necessary facilities.

1.13 *New entrants* : Unemployed persons, who were looking for work for the first time were treated as "new entrants".

1.14 *Labour force* : The employed and the unemployed together constituted the labour force. The rest are persons not in labour force.

1.15 *Earnings* : Data on earnings derived from the principal occupation for the reference period of seven days preceding the day of enquiry was recorded for each gainfully employed person excepting for the unpaid family enterprise workers. For an employee the salary or wages received or receivable for this period was noted. The imputed value of kind payment was also included. This imputation was done at the ruling wholesale prices of the locality.

For a person operating an enterprise, the average weekly net earnings from the enterprise was to be recorded. The average was computed from the net earnings (as estimated by the person concerned) of the last one year. For an agricultural enterprise the net earnings of the last agricultural year were to be used as the basis for calculating the average. Net earnings was defined as follows :

net earnings : gross receipt of the enterprise minus current expenses of the enterprise.

Capital expenditure of any kind was not to be taken into consideration while calculating the net earnings. Current expenses would, however, include the expenses for the repair and maintenance of the buildings, machineries, tools and other capital equipments of the enterprise.

SUMMARY OF FINDINGS

2.1 *Sex age composition of total population* : Of the total population 53.10 per cent are males and 46.90 per cent are females. Thus the population sex ratio is 113 males per 100 females for all-India urban. Nearly 41 per cent of the population belong to the age group 0—14 years.

2.2 *Literacy and educational standard* : Nearly 43 per cent of males in urban India are illiterate. The proportion are as high as 65 per cent for females and 53 per cent for the total population. With age advancing the proportion of illiterates rises and the proportions for graduates and secondary level exhibit a falling trend.

2.3 *Labour force status* : Amongst males, 49.70 per cent are gainfully employed, 1.50 per cent are unemployed; and for females only 10.62 per cent are employed and 0.96 per cent unemployed. These proportions are based on the information obtained from the first visit. No appreciable change in the proportions is found in the table for the second visit.

2.4 *Labour force participation* : The population distribution by labour force status, exhibited the highest proportion of gainfully employed males for West Bengal (54.79 per cent). On the other side of it, Manipur returned the lowest proportion (43.20 per cent) of gainfully employed males. This low rate of male labour force participation in Manipur was more than compensated by the significantly high percentage (43.45 per cent) of gainfully employed females. In other states female participation rates were comparatively much lower: Assam (2.34 per cent) and Jammu Kashmir (2.94 per cent) reported the lowest and Madhya Pradesh (15.75 per cent) the highest. In Table (1) the percentage of population employed and the percentage of population in labour force have been shown for each state classified by sex.

Gainfully Employed Population

2.5 *Employment status* : Considering the results derived from the two visits combined, the major portion, 53.53 per cent, of the gainfully employed persons are employees, 4.06 per cent are employers, 31.87 own account workers and 8.64 per cent were unpaid family enterprise workers. For the remaining 1.90 per cent the status could not be determined.

2.6 *Industry* : According to the distribution of the gainfully employed persons by industry, the highest largest proportion is claimed by manufacturing (29.06 per cent). The industries services (22.10 per cent), agriculture (16.61 per cent) and trade and commerce (15.63 per cent) follow that in order of magnitude.

2.7 *Occupation* : Amongst the gainfully employed persons 33.13 per cent are craftsmen and production process workers; 16.25 are farmers, fishermen, hunters, loggers and other related workers; 14.69 per cent are sales workers and 9.74 per cent are in service and sports under recreation work.

2.8 *Industry and occupation* : From the percentage distribution of employed population by industry and occupation the major findings are :

- (a) craftsmen and production process workers are the principal components in at least three industries: 82.47 per cent of those in manufacturing, 84.23 per cent of construction industry and 57.32 per cent of electricity, gas, water and sanitary services.
- (b) the industry division services claims 86.21 per cent of the professional, technique and related workers; 36.75 per cent of administrative, executive and managerial workers, 59.17 per cent of clerical and related workers and 86.16 per cent of the service, sports and recreation workers.

2.9 *Industry of employees and self-employed* : Table (2) shows the percentage distribution of employees and self-employed persons (comprised of employers and own account workers) by industry division. Wide divergences between the two distributions were present in the industries (a) agriculture, (b) trade and commerce and (c) services. Whereas the proportions of employees in these industries were 10.24, 8.13 and 32.45 per cent respectively, the corresponding proportions of self-employed persons were 16.77, 27.34 and 11.88 per cent, taken in order. The industry group manufacturing claimed the highest proportion of the employees as well as the self-employed. For both the employment status categories the proportion engaged in manufacturing industries was of the order of 30 per cent.

2.10 *Occupation of employees and self-employed* : The percentage distribution of employees and self-employed persons by occupation has been shown in Table (3). It is observed that the distribution of employees over occupations was more uniform compared to the corresponding distribution for the self-employed population. The self-employed persons were largely concentrated within three occupation groups. The proportion of employees engaged in crafts and production process work was 36.89 per cent. High proportion of employees were also engaged in clerical and related work (15.76 per cent), services (13.86 per cent) and agriculture (10.47 per cent). Occupation divisions craft and production process work, sales work and agriculture covered 31.41, 29.20 and 16.19 per cent respectively of the self employed persons. Thus about three out of every four self-employed persons were engaged in either of the three occupation divisions.

2.11 *Industry and Employment status* : Employees are found in high proportions in (i) electricity, gas, water, sanitary services (79.08 percent), (ii) services (77.01 percent) and (iii) transport storage and communication (70.01 percent). Whereas trade and commerce with 27.34 percent and agriculture with 34.97 percent as employees fall on the other end of the scale. The proportion working as unpaid family worker is highest (20.29 percent) for the industry division agriculture. In trade and commerce 54.51 percent work as own account workers and 10.83 as unpaid family workers.

2.12 *Hours worked and hours available for extra work* : About seven percent of the gainfully employed population reported as available for extra work. The proportion reporting available for extra work was less than one percent for the employed population who worked for more than 42 hours a week. More than nine percent of the employed population worked less than 28 hours a week, 14.39 percent of them worked 29 hours to 42 hours a week, 54.37 percent worked between 43 hours and 56 hours and 18.49 percent reported to have worked for 57 hours or more in a week. Table (4) shows the percentage distribution of employed population by number of hours worked in a week.

2.13 The average weekly earnings of employees was rupees 21.69 and that for self-employed person was rupees 25.59. The proportion of non-response cases with respect to income was 2.06 percent and 7.26 percent for employees and self-employed persons respectively. About 19 percent of the population self-employed in agriculture could not report their income for the reference week. Both employees and self-employed persons reported the lowest income for the agricultural occupation. By industry also, the lowest income was recorded for the agriculture division. For the industry as well as the occupation division "agriculture", the average weekly earnings for self-employed persons were almost double the weekly earnings for employees. The highest weekly earnings of rupees 74.95 was reported by the employees engaged in administrative, executive and managerial work.

2.14 *Registration* : Only 0.95 per cent of the employed population were reported to have registered their names at employment exchange for better employment.

Unemployed Population

2.15 *Present activity of unemployed population* : Amongst the unemployed persons in the age group 20—24 years the proportion of students is 8.87 per cent. Proportions of students in lower and higher age groups are much less. It appears that a considerable number of persons in age group 20—24 years continue studies because of non-availability of job.

2.16 *Unemployment registration* : It seems that the eagerness for registering names at employment exchange are more marked amongst educated persons. About 49 per cent of under graduates having Technical education registered their names at employment exchange. More than 57 per cent of the graduates were reported to be registered. But only 4.04 per cent of the illiterate persons were registered.

2.17 *Duration of unemployment* : The results derived from the information collected during the first half of the survey period (first visit) shows that about 22 per cent of the unemployed persons are seeking work for less than two months and 75.74 of them for a period of one year or less. That is, roughly one out of every four unemployed persons remain unemployed for more than a year.

Population Outside Labour Force

2.18 Student population constitute the major portion of the population outside labour force belonging to the age groups 10—14 and 15—19 years. The proportion of students rapidly falls in the next two 5 years age groups and is almost zero in ages 30 and above.

APPENDIX I
SAMPLING DESIGN AND PROCEDURE OF ESTIMATION

I.1 *Sampling Design* : The sampling design was a stratified two stage one. In sector 1 strata, the urban blocks were the first stage units and the households, the second stage units. In sector 2 strata, the design was a stratified three stage one where the towns were the first stage units and the urban blocks and the households, the second and third stage units respectively.

I.2 *Stratification* : Within each state the whole of urban area was divided into two strata—stratum 1 consisting of towns and cities with 1951 population 50,000 or more and stratum two consisting of the rest of the urban areas within the state. For Maharashtra Bombay city itself constituted one stratum and two other strata were formed with the rest of the urban areas in the usual manner. In all there were 35 strata.

I.3 *Allocation* : The allocation of the sample blocks for the sectors 1 and 2 was made approximately in the ratio 2 : 1, and within each state the allocation was made to its urban population in that sector. To form 3 sets of samples over 6 sub-rounds, the final allocations to the states were rounded off to multiples of 18.

I.4 *Selection procedure* : In sector 2, towns were selected with probability proportional to the number of blocks in a town. After the selection of a town one block was selected at random from the list of 1961 census blocks or the list of NSS Urban Frame Survey blocks for the sample town.

I.5 *Large blocks* : If a sample block was very large the investigator was permitted to divide the block into a number of compact and identifiable sub-blocks, of approximately equal population content and select one sub-block at random and restrict investigation in the selected sub-block only. This procedure was adopted to guard against the possibility of an investigator's work load becoming unmanageably heavy.

I.6 *Second stage stratification* : At the time of listing, some items of information were collected for each household for the second stage stratification. For the urban Labour Force Survey the total number of households in a sample block was grouped into 4 second-stage strata. Households with at least one person unemployed constituted stratum 1. Among the others, households with at least one person self-employed in professions and services constituted stratum 2. Out of the remaining households, those having at least one person self-employed in any other enterprise formed stratum 3 and rest of the households constituted stratum 4. Circular systematic samples of sizes 6, 4, 2 and 4 were drawn from the second-stage strata 1, 2, 3 and 4 respectively. Each selected household was surveyed twice during the survey period at an interval of approximately 6 months. At the time of the second visit any new household formed within the block was listed and two households were selected from this fresh list and were surveyed.

APPENDIX II

INDEPENDENT SUB-SAMPLE ESTIMATES

II.1 Independent sub-sample-wise estimates for a few selected items of information, considered to be representative, are given in this appendix, so as to provide some idea about the margin of error associated with the estimates.

II.2 The total sample for this survey was divided into three independent and interpenetrating sub-samples—surveyed by three different parties of investigators. Results presented here show side by side the sub-sample-wise estimates and the combined estimates.

II.3 The theoretical aspects of this technique of splitting the total sample into a number of independent sub-samples have already been discussed in earlier publications of NSS, particularly in NSS Report No. 5—Some Aspects of the Sample Design. Here it would be sufficient to mention that these sub-sample estimates can be used to set confidence intervals for the estimates.

II.4 If there are a number of sub-samples (say n) the probability that the true value of the characteristic lies between the largest and the smallest of these sub-sample estimates is $\left(1 - \frac{1}{2^{n-1}}\right)$, as that the absolute value of the difference between the three sub-sample estimates immediately provides a 75 percent confidence interval.
