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FOREWORD

The National Sample Survey (NSS) started in 1950, was reorganised in 1970 by bringing the Field, Technical and Data Processing wings under one organisation named the National Sample Survey Organisation (NSSO). The 25th round of NSS (July 1970 - June 1971) was the first round of survey to be carried out under the new set-up. The Governing Council of the NSSO which was responsible for deciding the programme of enquiry took into consideration the great urgency and relevance of a study on the economic conditions of the weaker sections of the rural population, and resolved to devote the 25th round of NSS mainly for this purpose. For the purpose of the survey, the weaker sections were defined to be the lowest 10 per cent of the cultivating households, and the households having no cultivated holding whatsoever except that households from both these strata which might have derived their major income, more or less on a regular basis, from sources like self-employment in trading, manufacture, mechanised transport, professions and also from salaried employment or from rent were excluded. Thus the rural households selected for investigation were (i) the small cultivator households whose main stay was farming a small holding and wage labour, and (ii) non-cultivating wage earner households having no other means of livelihood.

A comprehensive enquiry on the earning and consumption expenditure of the households and their indebtedness and assets was carried out. Besides, information on the activity pattern of the individual members of the households was collected. In addition, as a special feature of this enquiry, a number of questions were asked to ascertain how the small cultivator households would appraise the difficulties and improvement possibilities of their farm businesses and also the extent and nature of response of these small cultivator and wage earner households to employment opportunities outside the village of residence.

Results of the survey are being brought out in four series covering the different aspects, namely:—

- (a) Time disposition and wage rate.
- (b) Annual household earnings, indebtedness, cultivated holding and other assets.
- (c) Consumer Expenditure.
- (d) Problems and prospects.

Of these, the report under (a) are issued by sub-round (there are 4 sub-rounds each of 3 months duration) which makes available data on activity pattern and wage rate for different periods of the year. Reports on other aspects are presented for all sub-rounds combined. A separate all sub-round combined report on time disposition and wage rate is also under preparation. One important feature of the publication of the results of these series is that all essential tabulations are presented at regional level in addition to the all India and state level estimates, which it is hoped would enhance the utility of the data to a great extent.

The present report, the draft of which was brought out in December 1972, relates to results regarding activity pattern, wage rate and attitude towards employment opportunities outside the village for the first sub-round of the survey i.e., for the three months from July to September, 1970.

The sample design and schedules of enquiry were prepared by the Survey Design and Research Division (SDRD) of the NSSO. Field work of the survey was done by the Field Operations Division (FOD) in all states excepting West Bengal and Bombay city where the survey work was the charge of the field staff of the Indian Statistical Institute (subsequently merged with the FOD, NSSO). Processing of the Data was done by the Data Processing Division (DPD) of the NSSO.

Drafting of the report was the responsibility of Shri Sitansu Bhattacharyya, OSD., Shri S. Sengupta, Deputy Director and Shri S. K. Sinha, Statistician of the SDR Division. S/Shri M. Bhattacharyya, N. R. Dhar and P. C. Kundu, Assistant Directors and N. K. Dasgupta and M. L. Joshi, Statisticians of the DPD of NSSO were in technical charge of the Manual Tabulation of the Data. CHAPTER ONE

INTRODUCTION

1.1 The subject coverage and sample design of the twentyfifth round of the survey was finalised by the National Sample Survey Organisation Governing Council (NSSO-GC). The technical work relating to details of the sample design, sample selection, design of schedules, writing of instructions and training of field staff had been done by the Indian Statistical Institute (ISI). The field work of the survey was done by the Directorate of National Sample Survey, subsequently renamed as Field Operation Division (FOD), in all the states, excepting in West Bengal and Bombay City where the survey work was done by the ISI Field staff (subsequently merged with FOD).

1.2 According to the decision of the Governing Council of the NSSO, the main plank in the socio-economic programme of the 25th round of National Sample Survey was the enquiry into economic conditions of the weaker sections of the rural population in the country. The weaker sections for the purpose of this enquiry were to comprise two strata of population viz. the 'small cultivator households' and the 'rural non-cultivating wage earner households'. 'Small cultivator households' were defined as the lowest ten percent of the households having some cultivated land during the reference period July 1969—June 1970; and 'non-cultivating wage earner households' were defined as households having no cultivated land whatsoever during the same reference period. Further, any of the households from either of these strata which might have derived its major income during the reference period, more or less on a regular basis, from sources like self-employment in trading, manufacture, mechanised transport, professions and also from salaried employment or from rent, was to be excluded. The rural households thus sifted and classified were to constitute two more or less homogenous groups viz., (1) the small cultivator households whose mainstay was farming a small holding size of which is not the same nor is it fixed throughout the country), and (2) non-cultivating wage earner households whose mainstay was wage labour and who had no cultivated land.

1.3 The identification of the weaker sections of the population on the above line follows essentially from the formulations made in the different Five Year Plan objectives. The Second Five Year Plan in elaborating the aim of Economic policy categorised this section of the population as 'disadvantaged classes' and also as 'the small man' who has so far had little opportunity of a higher standard of life for himself. The description of the weaker section provided in the Third Plan is more specific viz. "those in low income groups or lacking the opportunity to work". In the chapter on 'Approach and Policy' of the Fourth Plan, emphasis is placed on the "common man", i.e. the "weaker sections" and the less privileged group of population in particular the scheduled castes and the scheduled tribes. Reference to weaker sections of the people is also to be found in article 46 of the Constitution of India where 'scheduled castes' and 'scheduled tribes' are particularly mentioned among the 'weaker sections'.

1.4 Consistent with the objective of the enquiry the approach had to be comprehensive and integrated in the sense that along with the information on consumption expenditure, detailed account of the earning of the household, changes in its assets and information on the indebtedness of the household were collected. Also was collected in a simplified manner the time disposition record of the members of the households apart from the essentials of their demographic particulars. In addition, for the small cultivator households, particulars

regarding the type of tenure of their holding were collected. Lastly in addition to this quantitative information a few probing questions were put to 'small cultivator' households to know in a subjective manner how such a household would appraise the problem and prospects of its farm business. Also common probing questions were put to both 'small cultivator' and 'wage earner' households to know how they react to alternative sources of employment and means of livelihood.

1.5 *Period of Survey.*—The twentyfifth round of survey of NSS started in July 1970 and continued till the end of June 1971. Four independent sets of sample villages were covered in each of the four quarters (the four sub-rounds) of the one year survey period.

1.6 *Participation by states.*—In the NSS 25th round all the State Governments excepting that of West Bengal and Nagaland and all the Union Territories excepting Himachal Pradesh, Goa, Pondicherry and Chandigarh participated in the work of NSS on a full matching basis.

1.7 *Geographical Coverage.*—The survey had been extended over the whole of rural area of the Indian Union excepting North East Frontier Agency, Ladak, Mizo Hills, Nagaland, Union Territories of Andaman and Nicobar Islands and Laccadive, Minicoy and Amindivi Islands and a few tehsils of Madhya Pradesh, Maharashtra and Tripura.

1.8 The Governing Council of the NSSO decided to bring out on a priority basis the results relating to time disposition of the members of the households and the average weekly earning of the employee members as also a few other results concerning the employment situation of the small cultivator and the non-cultivating wage-earner households in the rural areas. These priority results have been presented in two sets of tables. Of these, the first set containing two main tables based on quantitative and objective information regarding the time disposition of persons (i.e. man-days spent on work and non-work) during the reference week and the average wage-rate of employee members are presented in the Part I of this report. The other set of priority tables which are derived from answers to the questionnaire of the problem and prospect of the weaker section households is contained in Part II of the report. These tables have been presented separately for the two sets of households and for each of the state and union territory and also for all-India rural and all union territories pooled.

1.9 The results presented here relate to sub-round 1 of the survey, in other words to the three months from July-70 to September-70. Part I of this report containing the same two tables on time disposition and wage-rate will be brought out for each of the four sub-rounds into which the entire survey was phased. The results presented here relate to central sample data for the small cultivator and non-cultivating wage-earner households separately.

CHAPTER TWO

CONCEPTS & DEFINITIONS

2.1 *Concepts.*—So far as the collection of information about activity particulars are concerned the usual procedure so long followed had been primarily to classify the population by labour force status that is, first of all it had to be ascertained whether a person is 'gainfully employed' or 'unemployed' or 'outside labour force' on the basis of the person's activities during the reference period. After classifying the population into these three status categories the details of a person's activities on each day of the reference period (usually seven days preceding the day of survey) were being collected for gainfully employed population only. In this round however the procedure of predetermining a persons's status was not attempted. For each person the details of his activities (including inactivity), no matter whether gainful or otherwise, were collected for each day of the reference week. For the purpose of the following ten activity codes were listed to cover the whole range of activities.

Definitions

2.2 *Household.*—A group of persons normally living together and taking food from a kitchen was considered to constitute a household.

2.3 *Activity codes.*—Out of the ten categories of activity listed in para 2.1, the codes 1 to 5 were under the 'gainful work' categories in the sense that those are economically productive activities and the total estimated number of man-days in this group of activity codes is the estimate of total employed man-days. Categories 6 & 7 are self explanatory and the active man-days in these categories do not belong to the 'gainful work' group. The total man-days with code 8 is the estimate of the man-days which were available for gainful work but remained unutilised due to non-availability of work that is, the estimate of 'unemployed' man-days, Code 9 indicate the category of man-days which was not available for gainful work though the concerned persons had job or enterprise to work but due to some reasons they voluntarily abstained themselves from participating in such activity. The last code 'O' stands for the residual category of man-days having no such activities as listed under codes 1 to 9.

2.4 *Man-day.*—For each individual listed in a sample household there were seven man-days of activity during the reference week. The activity of a person might not be the same on all the seven days of the reference period. Provisions were, therefore, made to record the actual activity of the concerned person on each of the seven days.

2.5 *Intensity code.*—On a particular day a person might have been engaged in one activity only. In such cases the recorded intensity code was 1, indicating that the person was full time engaged in that activity. If on the other hand, the person pursued more than one activity on the same day, the first two activities, considering the amount of time spent on those were recorded with intensity code '½' against each of the two. The decision whether the intensity is half or full would rest on the judgement of the informant. In case of doubt and difficulty, however, attachment for 4 hours or less was taken to be of half intensity and more than 4 hours attachment as full intensity.

2.6 *Employed man-day.*—A man-day utilised in any of the activities under codes 1 to 5 was considered to be an employed man-day.

2.7 *Unemployed man-day.*—If on a day a person had been seeking work or was available for work but could not secure one (activity code 8), that particular man-day was an unemployed man-day.

2.8 *Man-day with job but not at work.*—Man-days of voluntary abstention from gainful activities (activity code 9) were put under this category.

2.9 *Economically active man-days.*—All the man-days under the activity codes 1 to 5, 8 and 9 were treated as economically active man-days.

2.10 *Economically inactive man-days (man-days not in labour force).*—The man-days spent under the remaining activity codes viz. 6, 7 & 0 were treated as economically inactive man-days.

2.11 *Rate of unemployment.*—The rate of unemployment is defined as the percentage ratio of the man-days seeking work or available for work (activity code 8) to the total number of man-days.

2.12 *Wage rate.*—The total of the amount receivable in cash and in kind per man-day of gainful work was considered to be the wage rate. For imputing the value of wages in kind the prevailing retail market price had to be considered.

CHAPTER THREE

SOME FINDINGS

3.1 Some salient features of the observed results have been discussed in this chapter. The present report contains the material relating to the third quarter (July—September) of the year 1970. The activity pattern of the selected weaker section of the population covered by the survey, more so far the women among them is likely to be highly sensitive to seasonal variation. Hence, the rates shown in this report are specific for the particular season only.

3.2 *Presentation.*—In part I of this report, two sets of results have been presented—one for all India rural and the other for the rural areas of the Union Territories only¹. State-wise tables have also been presented in similar lay-out.

3.3 *Estimated number of households forming the weaker section.*—It has been stated in the introduction that selection of weaker section households was made by adopting a working definition, the aim of which was to sift out (1) the lowest rung of the rural cultivator households who would be deriving their livelihood mainly from farming their tiny holdings and working as wage labour in other's farm or non-farm enterprises, and (2) those non-cultivating rural households whose mainstay was nothing but wage labour in farm or non-farm enterprises. The activity pattern (in terms of proportion of man-days spent in different activities) of the latter group of households very definitely shows that they are rural wage-earner households without any land to cultivate.

3.4 The all-India estimate of his group of households on the basis of the first sub-round data comes to 8.9 million. It may be interesting to compare this estimate with the estimates of agricultural labour households without land in First ALE, Second ALE and First RLE and also with estimates of rural labour households in first RLE, which are shown in Table (1).

3.5 As regards the other group of households, the following considerations need to be kept in mind while attempting to identify and compare the estimate of these households with any other estimate. There being no *a priori* information as to the proportion of small-holding cultivators who have besides cultivation, other regular sources of income such as manufacture, trade, profession etc., the truncated population of lowest ten p.c. of cultivating households estimated from this survey may not be comparable with any of the earlier estimates of households from landholding enquiries.

3.6 The estimate of lowest ten p.c. of the cultivating households for rural all-India from the present inquiry comes to 3.7 million. But as has been indicated earlier, this estimate does not represent the whole of the lowest ten percent, but is somewhat less because of the exclusion of households having other source of regular earning like manufacture, trade etc. Now, according to the 1961-62 NSS land holding survey the estimated number of total operating households in the rural areas was 53 million, ten p.c. of which comes to 5.3 million. On some preliminary calculation based on listing schedule of the 25th round weaker section enquiry, it is found that about 25 to 30 p.c. of the lowest 10 p.c. of the cultivating households have not been eligible for survey because of the restriction introduced in the selection procedure.

Adjusting therefore for the non-eligible cultivating households of the lowest docile, it can be seen that the estimate of cultivating households in the 25th round bears good comparison with that of 1961-62.

3.7 Like the non-cultivating households, these small cultivator households also show the characteristics of a high proportion of wage-employment, in a large number of states, though not for all states. Another feature worth noticing about these households is that about 88% of them have a cultivated holding below 2.5 acres. This means that in terms of acreage, most of the cultivator households covered in this survey have really quite a small holding to operate which makes them dependent on wage labour to a large extent.

3.8 Thus it would appear that the two groups of households for which information is being presented here, largely comprise rural wage-earning households with and without-cultivated holding.

3.9 *Population age distribution.*—The rural small cultivator households and also the rural non-cultivating wage earner households have the same typical population age distribution with high concentration in the lower age groups. Thus from demographic angle the weaker section of the population have the same disadvantage of having a high dependency ratio as the general population. As a consequence, people are forced to participate in economic activities at early ages to partially reduce the dependency load.

Rural Small Cultivator Households

3.10 *Time disposition.*—Only 36.06 per cent of the man-days, 45.96 per cent for males and 25.34 per cent for females, were utilised in gainful work. The share of 'work in own farm' was 15.30 per cent for males and 8.21 for females. A substantial part of the man-days of the small cultivator households were spent for wage earning by working in others' farm. Utilisation of man-days on this account was observed to be the highest in the age group 15-44 for either sex. Those who hired labour might have a natural preference for able bodied men and women to derive more labour input per unit of wage paid. On the other side the concerned persons might also find it more profitable to work in others' farm rather than to work in the small household farm where the required labour input could be provided by other household members. From the tables it is observed that for males the percentages of man-days worked in others' farm for salary or wages are 11.87, 42.66, 36.18, 20.17 and 22.45 corresponding to the age groups 10—14 years, 15—44 years, 45—59 years, 60 years and above and all ages respectively. Whatever small piece of land the households might own, the ownership was more likely to rest on older members and this might also be the reason for these members to be more attached to family farm. Participation rates for females in others' farm for salary or wages follow a similar pattern, though its variation over different ages is less pronounced than what was found for males.

3.11 *Rate of unemployment.*—The rate of unemployment was found to be 2.77, 1.96 and 2.38 percent respectively for males, females and all persons.

3.12 *Attending educational institution.*—For males only 8.72 percent of the man-days in the age-group 0—9 years and 20.90 percent in 10—14 years were spent in attending educational institution. Even lower percentages of 3.17 and 8.63 of man-days in schooling for the age groups 0—9 and 10—14 years respectively were recorded for females.

3.13 *Activity pattern by States.*—The lowest percentage of economically active¹ man-days for males was recorded for Orissa (44.79) and the corresponding percentage was the highest in Andhra Pradesh (61.25) among all the states. The percentage of man-days economically active for males was 53 for all-India rural. The percentages of most of the states lie within 4 percentage points below or above the all-India average rate of 53 percent (i.e. between 49% to 57%). A part of this variation might be due to real difference in participation in economic activities in different states and the other part might be attributed to difference in age composition of the male population of rural areas of the states of India. For the female

Similarly the sum of the numbers of man-days with codes 6, 7 and 0 is labelled as the number of economically inactive man-days (or man-days not in labour force, or man-days not available for work). These two categories taken together thus cover the whole run of the activity codes.

population much wider variations were observed. For them, high percentage of economically active man-days were recorded in Mysore (44.59), Maharashtra (44.21), Rajasthan (43.81), and Madhya Pradesh (42.37). On the other side, the corresponding percentages in Jammu & Kashmir (7.79), Assam and Punjab (11.00), Haryana (12.38) and West Bengal (15.33) were much lower compared to the average all-India rural proportion of 30.19 percent.

3.14 Male members of the small cultivator households in Punjab spent 47.88 percent of the total man-days by working in their own farm; they had also significantly low percentage of man-days to spent in work in others' farm for salary or wages. Haryana, Jammu & Kashmir and Rajasthan had also a similar pattern, having very high rate of participation in 'work in own farm' and a very low rate in 'work in others' farm. Contrary to this, the percentage of man-days 'worked in own farm' in the State of Kerala (1.08), Orissa (4.89), West Bengal (5.94), Bihar (7.66) and Tamil Nadu (8.46) were very low. The percentage of man-days 'worked in others' farm for salary or wages' was the highest (35.14) for Andhra Pradesh. It was also high in Tamil Nadu (30.87) and Mysore (30.49). Given in Table (2) below are the highest and the lowest percentages of man-days in some selected activity/activity group of the male population of small cultivator households of different states of India.

3.15 *Wage rate.*—A large section of the small cultivator households have to supplement their income derived from other occupations in addition to the 'work in own farm'. The rates of wage (Rs. 0.00/man-day of work) the male population receive by 'working in others' farm' and by working in non-farm occupations are Rs. 1.98 and Rs. 2.64 respectively. For females the corresponding wage rates are Rs. 1.37 and Rs. 1.47. In farm occupation the wage rates for males is 61 paise more than the corresponding rates for females and in non-farm occupation the difference of Rs. 1.23 between male and female rate is more marked.

3.16 *Wage rate in States.*—The wage rates in Assam, Haryana, Jammu & Kashmir, Kerala and the Punjab were significantly higher than the All-India average (exceeding by more than a rupee). Gujarat, Uttar Pradesh, and West Bengal also recorded higher than the all-India average rate of wage; but the differences were of much lower order. Madhya Pradesh recorded the lowest wage rate of Rs. 1.36; Mysore, Andhra Pradesh, Rajasthan and Orissa with respectively average wage rate of Rs. 1.40, Rs. 1.42, Rs. 1.44 and Rs. 1.50 were not in any better position. The highest and the lowest rate of wage in broad occupation groups earned by persons belonging to small cultivator households of different states are shown in Table (3),

Rural Non-cultivating Wage Earner Households

3.17 *Time disposition.*—The over-all activity pattern of the rural non-cultivating wage earner households was not much different from that for the small cultivator households. For the male population 46.62 percent of the man-days were gainfully employed; for the female population the corresponding percentage was 24.83 and that for the total population was 35.68. More than 70 percent of these gainfully employed man-days were 'utilised in 'work in others' farm'.

3.18 *Rate of unemployment.*—The rate of unemployment was found to be 3.06, 2.44 and 2.75 percent respectively for males, females and all persons.

3.19 *Attending educational institution.*—Very low rate of schooling was indicated by the percentage of man-days attending educational institution for the lower age groups. In the age bracket 10-14 years only 24.22 percent of man-days for males were spent in schooling and the corresponding percentage for females was much lower—only 8.32. Similarly the proportion was also very low in the 0—9 years age group. But before drawing any conclusion, the matter need be probed in a more detailed manner. The reality might have to a large extent been concealed in the grouping of age itself. While a large section of population in the first age bracket were not grown up enough to take admission in a school, a considerably large chunk in the later ages of the group 10—14 years might have already completed primary schooling and have discontinued.

3.20 *Activity pattern by States.*—Although the over-all percentages of man-days economically active for all-India rural were more or less equal for the sets of households, they exhibited considerable variations when the figures for the states were compared. So far as the male population of the non-cultivating wage earner households are concerned, the lowest percentage of man-days economically active was recorded for Haryana (39.34), followed by Jammu & Kashmir (44.34), Kerala (47.12) and the Punjab (47.90). The corresponding percentage was the highest for Madhya Pradesh (60.97), closely followed by Maharashtra (60.54) and Andhra Pradesh (60.00). Very nominal percentage of economically active man-days was recorded by Jammu & Kashmir females (1.87). Females also recorded low percentage of economically active man-days in Kerala (9.65), West Bengal (18.27), Haryana (18.49) and Orissa (20.68).

3.21 So far as the utilisation of gainfully employed man-days were concerned, for males there were two groups of states which showed two distinctly different patterns. The first group consisting of Madhya Pradesh, Maharashtra, Andhra Pradesh, Gujarat and West Bengal spent high percentages of man-days in 'work in others' farm', those percentages being 44.27, 40.72, 39.06, 38.95 and 38.90 respectively. The other group comprising of the states of Haryana, Jammu & Kashmir and Kerala had significantly lower participation in such activity and a relatively higher percentage of 18.16, 28.51 and 39.22 respectively in non-farm occupations. The pattern of utilisation of female labour time was not much different from that for the males. In Table (4), the highest and the lowest percentages of man-days in some selected activities by the male population of non-cultivating wage earner households of different states of India are shown.

3.22 *Wage rate.*—In general the members of the wage earner households enjoy slightly higher rates of wage in both farm and non-farm occupations as compared to the rates reported by the members of small cultivator households. At least for the males, the wage rates in non-farm occupations are distinctly higher than the rates reported against farm occupations for both the group of households. In non-farm occupations, the males reported an average rate of wage of Rs. 3.03 and in farm occupations they showed an average wage rate of Rs. 2.16 per man-day. The corresponding rates for females were much lower. The observed differences between the wage rates for males and females were 67 paise for farm occupations and Rs. 1.72 for non-farm occupations.

3.23 *Wage rates in States.*—Much wider variation obtains in the wage rates for the persons belonging to the rural non-cultivating wage earner households of different states, although the ranking of the States with respect of wage rates follow, by and large, a similar pattern of those for the small cultivator households. The average wage rates for Kerala (Rs. 4.57), Jammu & Kashmir (Rs. 4.43), Punjab (Rs. 3.84), Assam (Rs. 3.62) and Haryana (Rs. 3.14) were much higher than the all-India average rate (Rs. 2.02). The rates of wage for Gujarat (Rs. 2.59), Rajasthan and Uttar Pradesh (Rs. 2.34), and West Bengal (Rs. 2.29) were also higher than but much closer to the all-India average. Lower wage rates were recorded for Tamil Nadu (Rs. 1.21), Madhya Pradesh (Rs. 1.35), Mysore (Rs. 1.57), Andhra Pradesh (Rs. 1.58) and Bihar (Rs. 1.69). Though lower, the rates for Maharashtra (Rs. 1.93) and Orissa (Rs. 1.99) were just less than the all-India average. The highest and the lowest rate of

wage earned by persons belonging to the non-cultivating wage earner households in farm and non-farm occupation for males and females among states are shown in Table (5).

3.11 Wage rate - In general the members of the wage earner households enjoy slightly higher rates of wage in both farm and non-farm occupations as compared to the non-cultivating wage earner households. As far as the males are concerned, the wage rates in non-farm occupations are distinctly higher than the rates reported against farm occupations for both the groups of households in non-farm occupations, the males reported an average rate of Rs. 3.03 and in farm occupations they showed an average rate of Rs. 2.16. The observed differences are marginal. The corresponding rates for females were much lower. The observed differences between the wage rates for males and females were of pace for farm occupations and Rs. 1.71 for non-farm occupations.

3.12 Wage rates in States - Much wider variation obtains in the wage rates for the persons belonging to the non-cultivating wage earner households of a State. The pattern of the ranking of the States with respect to wage rates for males and females is shown in Table (6) for the non-cultivating wage earner households. The average rates for males (Rs. 3.03) and females (Rs. 2.16) were much higher than the all-India average rate (Rs. 2.07) and (Rs. 1.49) respectively. States like Punjab and Uttar Pradesh (Rs. 6.67 and Rs. 2.88) were higher than the all-India average. Lower wage rates were reported for Bihar (Rs. 1.48) and Madhya Pradesh (Rs. 1.48). Through lower, the rates for Madhya Pradesh (Rs. 1.48) and Bihar (Rs. 1.48) were just less than the all-India average. The highest and the lowest rate of

APPENDIX I

Sample Design and Estimation Procedure

1.1 *Sample Design*.—The sample design of the rural survey of the NSS twentyfifth round was a stratified one with two-stage selection within each stratum. The first stage units were villages and the second stage units were households for the socio-economic enquiries. The sample design had been made *self-weighting* for each schedule of enquiry at the state level. The sample villages were usually selected in the form of two independent and interpenetrating sub-samples. Sub-sample 1 was surveyed by one party of investigators and sub-sample 2 by another party.

1.2 *Sample size (Central sample)*.—The total sample size for household enquiries in the rural areas was 8400 sample villages and the average sample size was expected to be 2 households in a village for each of the schedules 16.1 and 16.2.

1.3 *Work-Programme*.—The survey period (one year) of this round had been divided into four sub-rounds of three months duration each. In each sub-sample of a rural stratum there were 12 sample villages. These 12 villages were sub-divided into four sets of three villages each in a specified manner. Each set of 3 villages was surveyed in a specified sub-round. Thus, on the whole, all the 12 villages were covered once during the full survey period.

1.4 *Sampling frame*.—The frame was the list of villages as per the 1961 population census.

1.5 *Stratification*.—The country had been divided into 65 agricultural regions by grouping within each state or union territory, districts having similar population density and crop pattern. Strata were formed within each region, by grouping tehsils having (i) geographical contiguity, (ii) similar crop pattern and population density, and (iii) good transport facilities amongst them. The number of persons engaged in agricultural occupation was more or less the same for each stratum within a region.

1.6 *Allocation*.—The all-India sample size had been allocated to the states on a joint consideration of the rural population, area under cereal crops and available investigator strength. This was modified to (i) ensure a minimum of 360 villages in each state (excepting Haryana and Punjab), (ii) take account of state-wise variation in workload, and (iii) make the sample size a multiple of 24 in order to facilitate an allocation of 24 villages in each rural stratum.

1.7 *Selection of villages*.—For the central sample, in each stratum two independent sub-samples of 12 villages each had been selected circularly systematically with equal probability.

1.8 *Selection of households*.—All the households in a sample village were divided into the following three sub-strata: (1) households having no cultivated land, (2) the lowest ten percent of households having cultivated land and (3) remaining households. Households deriving more or less regular and major income in the last year from self-employment in trading establishment, manufacture, construction mechanised transport, professions or salaried employment or rent were excluded from both sub-strata 1 and 2 and were included in sub-stratum 3. Samples for schedules 16.1 and 16.2 were selected from sub-strata 1 and 2 respectively. Sample households were selected linearly systematically using interval and random starts specified for this purpose so as to get about 2 sample households on an average, from each sub-stratum.

PART II

ATTITUDE OF THE WEAKER SECTION OF THE RURAL

CHAPTER ONE

INTRODUCTION

In the twentyfifth round of the National Sample Survey, main emphasis was laid on the enquiry on economic conditions of the weaker section of rural population. Besides collecting particulars on demographic characteristics and time disposition, farm and other incomes, household consumer expenditure, inventory of transaction of assets and indebtedness of the households, probing questions were introduced to assess the problems and prospects relating to their economic life.

2. For the purpose of the survey, two strata of rural population formed at the village level, namely (i) lowest ten percent of households cultivating some land and (ii) households cultivating no land during the agricultural year 1969-70 comprised the weaker section of rural population provided these households did not have, more or less, regular and major income in the last year (i.e. 365 days prior to the date of listing of households in the sample villages) from self-employment in trade, manufacture and construction, mechanised transport and professions or from rent and remittances or salary income and pension. Where the household's share from all these sources taken together accounted for the major part of the total household income of the last year, such households were excluded from the frame constituting the weaker section of the rural population. The rural households thus sifted and selected constituted the two groups, namely (i) small cultivator households and (ii) non-cultivating wage earner households. The two almost similar schedules of enquiry, namely Schedules 16.1 and 16.2 were canvassed for the two groups of rural households respectively.

3. Regarding problems and prospects concerning the economic life of the weaker section of the rural population, views of the small cultivator and non-cultivating wage earner households were ascertained on their problems on different activities and their opinion on the prospects of an improvement of economic conditions through governmental measures were also sought through a set of probing questions. Besides giving the information on the needs of the weaker section of the rural population for betterment through economic development in agricultural and non-agricultural sectors, the enquiry also provides the views of the members of the households on the mobility in respect of employment opportunities outside the village. Part II of this report contains the latter aspect of the enquiry, namely, the attitude of the weaker section of the rural population towards accepting full time wage employment outside the village, particularly in public works.

4. The survey started in July 1970 and continued upto June, 1971. The survey period of the one year was split up into four sub-rounds of three months each. As the results presented in Part II are all based on the data of first sub-round only, the survey period assigned to each table is July to September, 1970.

5. It was planned to survey altogether 8784 villages in the Central sample in two independent and interpenetrating samples each of which could provide estimates of the characteristics of Delhi, Manipur, Tripura and Himachal Pradesh participated in this survey. The estimates presented in Part II are all based on the returns of first sub-round of the Central sample only (i.e. covering only one-fourth of the Central sample) in all the states except in Jammu and Kashmir where central and state samples were pooled together. Only the combined estimate of the two independent sample estimates has been provided. The details of sampling design and other relevant particulars of the survey are covered in Part I.

Results presented

6. Four identical tables have been presented in the Appendix separately for small cultivator households (based on the data of Schedule 16.1) and non-cultivating wage-earner households (based on the data of Schedule 16.2). Tables 1 and 2 give the percentage distribution of persons willing to accept full-time wage employment outside the village by different classificatory characteristics. While table (3) indicates the attitude of the people towards accepting

jobs in public works (which implies unskilled, manual type of employment e.g., on roads, dams etc.) table (4) shows the preference in securing employment other than in public works. All the tables have been provided for all-India and separately for each of the states and union-territories in the order as indicated below :

It may be noted that the estimate is nil for those states which do not appear in some of the tables.

Some findings

7. *Small cultivator households.*—The survey reveals that in rural India about 8 percent of the population belonging to small cultivator households expressed their willingness to move outside the village in the event of regular full time wage employment being offered to them. Males reported about 7 percent and females accounted for a little less than 1 percent. As far as the states are concerned, the attitude towards mobility was most favourable in Tripura (17 percent), followed by West Bengal (13 percent), Kerala (12 percent) and Orissa (11 percent). On the other hand Punjab recorded the minimum figure (a little above 3 percent) followed by Mysore and Jammu & Kashmir (about 4 percent). In other states, the percentage varies from 6 to 11. It is also noticed that the majority of people who wished to leave their villages for full time wage employment preferred to work in public works.

8. *Non-Cultivating wage-earner households.*—The non-cultivating wage-earner households showed more favourable attitude towards mobility than those of the small cultivator households. In rural India 12 percent of the population comprising the non-cultivating wage earner households expressed their views in favour of accepting regular full time wage employment outside the village. Males were available much more in number (a little less than 10 percent) than the females (about 2 percent). The same index of mobility was quite high in several states, namely, Tripura (17 percent); West Bengal (15 percent); Rajasthan, Punjab, Haryana, Andhra Pradesh and Orissa (14 percent each). The attitude towards mobility was most unfavourable in Bihar where only about 7 percent of the population showed willingness to move outside village in the event of full time wage employment being offered to them. As noticed in the case small cultivator households, people belonging to non-cultivating wage earner households also preferred to accept employment in public works than in other agencies.
