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A NOTE ON SOME CHARACTERISTICS OF HOUSEHOLD POULTRY
ENTERPRISE : NSS 30TH ROUND : JULY 1975 - JUNE 1976

SECTION ONE

INTRODUCTION

1.0 With a view to fill up the gap in the animal husbandry statistics, Governing Council of National Sample Survey Organisation (NSSO) decided to devote the entire 30th round (July 1975 - June 1976) of NSS to an enquiry on various aspects of livestock and live-stock enterprises. Along with various characteristics relating to number, products and enterprises, information on the consumption of live-stock products was also collected in this survey. A draft report no 288/1 had already been brought out on the estimates of the household dairy enterprise which constitute the main livestock enterprise in the household sector. Also a note dealing with some key characters of household dairy enterprise was published in Sarvekshana, Vol. III, No. 4, April 1980. In this report estimates on various aspects of household poultry enterprise have been presented

Scope, coverage, sample size and field work

1.1 The main survey on livestock number and products was carried out in 18,856 villages and 20,440 urban blocks spread over the whole of India. While investigation in Central Sample which consisted of 8512 villages and 9744 blocks, was carried out by the Field Operation Division of NSSO, the remaining sample villages and urban blocks were surveyed on a matching basis by the field staff of the different state statistical agencies.

1.2 For the purpose of this survey, a household was considered to have a poultry enterprise if on the date of listing, it possessed 20 or more poultry birds (fowls, ducks and other poultry birds taken together). However, those poultry enterprises which were registered under section 2m(i) or 2m(ii) of the Factory Act of India, 1948 were not covered in this survey. All the households reporting poultry enterprise (as per the definition given above) in the sample village/block were surveyed.

1.3 In the Central sample, out of the total sample villages and blocks surveyed, only 1376 sample villages and 772 sample blocks have reported household poultry enterprises at all-India level. The number of poultry households enumerated in the sample villages and blocks are 2794 and 1085 respectively.

1.4 With the definition adopted for poultry enterprise households, the aggregate estimates are of limited utility. Hence, important economic coefficients in the form of rates and percentages are presented in this report.

Explanatory note on tables presented in Appendix II

1.5 A set of nine tables giving various characteristics of household poultry enterprises at the state and all India levels has been presented separately for rural and urban sectors in Appendix II. All India and state estimates are based on the data of the Central sample only.

1.6 The following system has been adopted/numbering the tables: The left hand most number refers to the serial number of the table and the digits 1 and 2 following the first point from the left stand for the sector code i.e. rural and urban respectively. The individual state and union territory are first arranged in alphabetic order of their respective names and the respective tables are presented with the table heading 'contd' of the corresponding table number.

1.7 Table (1) provides the number of sample villages/blocks reporting poultry enterprises and the number of poultry households investigated. Tables (2) and (3) give the proportion of poultry enterprise households to all households and also the proportion of households having poultry as principal occupation to all poultry enterprise households. The average number of hired worker per working day in the poultry enterprise has also been presented in Table (3). Table (4) provides the percentage of hired and household labour days in poultry enterprise and also the average value of service charges and other expenses per month per enterprise household. Table (5) shows the average value of the assets (owned

or hired). per enterprise household and amount of outstanding loan per reporting household. While Table (6) gives the number and value of poultry birds possessed per enterprise household by size of poultry holding separately for fowl and duck, the number and value of eggs produced and sold per week per enterprise household separately for hen and duck classified by poultry holding class are presented in Table (7). Table (8) gives the quantity and value of consumption of poultry feed per month per enterprise household by size class of poultry holding. Finally, Table (9) provides average value of consumption of poultry feed per month per poultry enterprise household by items of poultry feed.

SECTION TWOIMPORTANT FINDINGS OF THE SURVEY

This section deals with some important characteristics of the household poultry enterprises such as the size of the enterprise, production and sale of eggs, utilisation of labour, assets and indebtedness position and expenditure on poultry feed incurred by the enterprise households. The discussion is, generally, restricted to the all-India estimates, separately for rural and urban sectors. However, the extent of variations exhibited by different states on the above mentioned aspects have also been touched upon.

2.1 The enterprise households . The potentiality of the poultry farming for augmenting the income and employment of the rural households particularly the small and marginal farmers have been recognised by the National Commission on Agriculture. However, the survey results indicate that the poultry farming has not been taken up as a business proposition by most of the households and, therefore, it has made little impact on the entrepreneurial activities either in the rural or the urban sector of India. The households, in general, run the poultry farming at a nominal scale of operation as most of them possess less than 20 poultry birds.

2.2 In the rural sector of India, of the total number of households estimated as 84635900, only 0.31 per cent is found to possess 20 or more poultry birds and hence only a small percentage of households is engaged in the poultry enterprise according to the definition of poultry enterprise adopted for the survey. Also, most of these enterprise households run the enterprise in their subsidiary capacity as poultry farming is reported to be the principal occupation for only 5.63 per cent of the poultry enterprise households (Ref : Table 3.1 of Appendix II). The percentage of the enterprise households to all households by land possessed class as given in Table (S.1) reveals that the said percentages are more in the higher classes than the lower ones indicating that the poultry farming has made least in-road among the small and marginal farmers.

2.3 The overall position in respect of poultry enterprise in the urban sector is less satisfactory than that in the rural sector. At the all-India level, the percentage of poultry enterprise households to all households is observed to be 0.10. However, compared to rural sector, proportionately more enterprise households in this sector have poultry farming as their principal occupation. It is revealed from Table (3.2) of Appendix II that the percentage of households having poultry enterprise as principal occupation to all poultry enterprise households is 11.53 in the urban sector. Table (S2) showing the percentage of poultry enterprise households to all households classified by household monthly per capita expenditure groups indicates an increasing trend of the said percentages over the expenditure groups upto the class Rs 40 - 59 and thereafter the same remains more or less stationary.

2.4 Among the states, the percentage of poultry enterprise households to all households is comparatively high in Assam (1.25), Maharashtra (0.79) and West Bengal (0.60) in the rural sector and in Kerala (0.43) and Orissa (0.22) in urban sector. However, it appears that the enterprise households of Haryana and to some extent those of Punjab have been operating this enterprise, in more business like fashion than those of the other states. In Haryana, as high as 39.93 and 50.00 per cent of their/poultry enterprise households operate this enterprise as their principal occupation respectively in rural and urban sectors. The said percentages for the two sectors of Punjab are 14.04 and 30.18 respectively.

2.5 Hired and household workers : In the prevailing situation, it may not be unlikely to expect that the poultry enterprise will provide little employment opportunity either to the household members or to the hired workers. The average number of workers per working day in an enterprise has been found as 1.35 and 1.48 in the rural and urban sectors respectively. The enterprises are, obviously, run mostly by household labour. The percentage of hired

labour days to total labour days is 6.03 in the rural sector at the all-India level. In comparison, the enterprise households in the urban sector use more hired labour and the said percentage is found to be 9.57 in urban India. (Ref: Tables 4.1 and 4.2 of Appendix II).

2.6 Size of the Enterprise : It is seen from Table (6.1) of Appendix II that, in the rural sector at all-India level, an enterprise household, on an average, possesses about 48 poultry birds. The percentage distribution of the number of poultry enterprise households over size class of poultry holdings shows that 67 per cent of the enterprise households possess birds between 20 - 29 and another 16 per cent between 30 - 39. Among the states, the average number of poultry birds possessed by the enterprise households is found to be 255, 190 and 120 respectively in Punjab, Haryana and Gujarat which are quite high in comparison to those of the other states. In Punjab and Haryana, as high as 42 and 36 per cent enterprise households fall in the highest class of poultry holding i.e. " 100 & above ". In the case of Gujarat, although only about 13 per cent of the enterprise households is in the class of 100 & above, the average number of poultry birds per enterprise household in the highest class of poultry holding is found to be 716 as against 564 and 459 in Punjab and Haryana respectively.

2.7 Compared to rural sector, the average number of poultry birds per enterprise household is fairly high in the urban sector. At the all-India level, the said average is observed to be about 94. Further, 51 per cent of the poultry enterprise households possess birds between 20 - 29 and another 14 per cent between 30 - 39. Among the states, Haryana has made a very good progress in poultry farming as the average number of birds possessed per enterprise household is as high as 1801. Although Punjab follows Haryana in this respect, an enterprise household, on an average, possesses only 367 birds. It is seen from Table (6.2) of Appendix II that in Haryana, unexpectedly high percentage of enterprise households (76) has been reported against poultry holding class of 100 & above. It may be mentioned here that in the urban sector of Haryana, only 6 sample blocks out of 144 have reported any poultry enterprise. Moreover, although an urban block contains, on an average, 150

households, only 8 households in all the 6 sample blocks taken together have reported poultry enterprises (Ref: Table 1.2 of Appendix II), some of which are found to be very big possessing, on an average, 1801 poultry birds.

2.8 Production and sale of eggs : From Tables (7.1) and (7.2) of Appendix II, it is observed that the average number of eggs produced per week in an enterprise in the urban sector is much higher than that in the rural sector for every size brackets of poultry holding whereas the position is just the opposite in case of duck eggs. The rural enterprise households at the all-India level produce, on an average, 53 hen eggs and 5 ducks eggs per week, while the corresponding figures in the urban sector are 199 and 2. It is thus apparent that so far as the total production of eggs are concerned, the contribution from duck is negligible.

2.9 Almost similar pattern is observed in the case of eggs sold by the enterprise households. The average number of eggs sold per week by an enterprise household is 46 and 5 respectively for hen, and ducks at all-India level in the rural sector. The corresponding averages in the urban sector are 181 and 2. At all-India level, the percentage of hen eggs sold to hen eggs produced by the enterprise households is 87 in rural sector and 91 in the urban sector. However, if all households are considered, the percentage of eggs sold to eggs produced comes down to 38 for rural sector and 57 for urban sector as estimated from the data of Schedule 19.1, 30th round.^{1/} So far as the states are concerned the households in the rural sector of Haryana, Gujarat, Punjab, Tamil Nadu, and Himachal Pradesh run their enterprises more or less on a commercial scale as the percentage of hen eggs sold to hen eggs produced is very high, the respective figures being 116, 97, 96, 93 and 90. In the urban sector, quite a number of states have the said percentage above 90. The highest is reported by Orissa (101), followed by Haryana (100), Karnataka (99) and Rajasthan (97). Since the data collected for sale in the reference week is not restricted to the production of eggs of the same week, the percentage of hen eggs

sold to hen eggs produced may exceed 100 in some extreme cases as found in the case of rural & urban sectors of Haryana and in the urban sector of Orissa;

2.10 The estimates presented in Table (S3) shows that at the all-India level, out of the total hen eggs sold by the enterprise households, about 88 per cent in the rural sector and 93 per cent in the urban sector are supplied by the households possessing 100 and above poultry birds. Interestingly, in the rural sector, a little over 5 per cent of the total hen eggs sold are supplied by the households belonging to the lowest class of the poultry holding whereas, only about 7 per cent is sold by the remaining households possessing 30 - 99 poultry birds. The percentage of hen eggs sold to hen eggs produced is found to have an increasing trend over the poultry holding classes in the urban sector. However, the same trend is not noticeable in the rural sector for the first four holding classes.

2.11 Assets and outstanding loan : The survey results do not reveal marked intersectoral variation in respect of the percentage of enterprise households reporting assets used for the enterprise at the all-India level. However, the average value of assets per enterprise household is observed to be about 4 times higher in the urban sector than that of the rural sector as seen from table (S4) given below :-

2.12 On the liability side, the estimates presented in Table (S4) indicate that the percentage of households reporting loan taken for the entrepreneurial purpose which remained outstanding on the date of survey is as low as 2 in rural sector and 6 in urban sector at the all-India level. However, the amount of outstanding loan per reporting household is quite substantial in both rural (Rs 4978) and urban (Rs 6880) areas. Among the states, number of enterprise households reported to be indebted in the rural sector is relatively more in Punjab, Haryana and Tamil Nadu, the percentage of enterprise households reporting outstanding loan being 19, 14 and 10 respectively. In the urban sector, about 22, 18, 17, 17 and 16 per cent of the enterprise households have been observed to be indebted in Jammu & Kashmir, Tamil Nadu, Rajasthan, Karnataka and Himachal Pradesh. In regard to the average amount of outstanding loan per reporting household, West Bengal is on the top of the list (Rs. 10,100) followed by Haryana (Rs. 9717) and Punjab (Rs. 5986) in the rural sector. In the urban sector this average is maximum in Madhya Pradesh (Rs. 15,000) followed by Karnataka (Rs. 12954) and Himachal Pradesh (Rs. 11,650).

2.13 Expenditure for household poultry enterprise : The all-India estimates of average value of consumption of poultry feed per month per enterprise household for different poultry holding groups are presented in Table (S5) :

2.14 As expected, the average value in each poultry holding group is more in the urban sector than that of the rural sector and in both the sectors it increases with the increase in the size of the poultry holding.

2.15 The estimates of average quantity and value of consumption for different items of feed per month per enterprise household are given in Table (S6)

2.16 The estimates of Table (S6) reveal that the quantity consumed for each item of feed is much more in the urban sector than that of the rural sector. The total quantity consumed comes from two sources, viz., home-grown stock and purchase. Between rural and urban sectors, while, for each item of feed, the quantity consumed out of home-grown stock is more in the rural sector, the quantity purchased is much higher in the urban sector.

2.17 In this context it may be noted that the item "other feed" shown in the table includes fodder, green grass, straw, oil cake, crushed pulse, bran, husk, oil seeds, gur, salt, other feeds and other chemicals excluding medicine. Contrary to expectation, the average value of consumption against "other feed" is found to be quite high. Since many of the poultry enterprise households are likely to possess some dairy animals and other livestock, it is not unlikely that part of the expenditure made against the purchase of feed for those livestock have been wrongly reported against the poultry enterprise.

APPENDIX - ISAMPLE DESIGN AND ESTIMATION PROCEDURE

1. Sample Design : The general sample design in the NSS Thirtieth round was stratified with two stage selection, the first stage units are village/blocks and the second stage units the households.
2. Sample size (central sample) : In the central sample, there were 8512 villages and 9744 blocks.
3. Works Programme : The survey period of 12 months (from July 1975 to June 1976) has been divided into 4 sub-rounds of 3 months each. Number of sample villages and blocks were equal for each of the four sub-rounds in each of the strata.

Rural Sample Design

4. Sampling Frame : The frame used for selection in the rural sector was the list of villages as per 1971 population census.
5. Stratification : The whole of India had been divided into a number of basic strata so that the basic strata did not cut across district boundaries. Districts with more than 1.5 million 1971 census rural population had been divided into 2 or more basic strata by grouping contiguous tehsils (or sub-divisions in Bihar, Orissa and West Bengal), homogeneous, as far as possible with respect to density of rural population and crop pattern, so that population of each basic stratum was less than 1.5 million. Each district with less than 1.5 million 1971 census/rural population formed one basic stratum by itself except in Gujarat where some district with less than 1.5 million rural population had been divided into two basic strata on consideration of concentration of the tribal population and dry areas of the state. Basic strata so formed had been treated as basic strata both for rural and urban areas. Out of 374 districts, 366 districts were within survey coverage of the NSS. The number of basic strata formed were 520 in rural sector.

6. Allocation : The all-India sample of villages had been allocated to the different states and union territories considering their investigator strength and rural population. Within each state and union territory, the allocated number of villages had been distributed over the constituent basic stratum in proportion to their rural population. These allocations had been made multiple of 4.

7. Selection of villages : The 1971 census list of villages had been used as the sampling frame for selection of villages. Sample villages within each basic stratum had been selected with probability proportional to 1971 census population and with replacement, in the form of two independent sub-samples.

In rural sector, the first stage sampling unit and also the unit of survey was the census village. In a few case the sampled census villages differed with the corresponding revenue villages. Nevertheless, if the sampled census village was clearly identifiable, it was surveyed. Otherwise, if the sampled census village contained two or more revenue villages wholly or partly, all these revenue villages taken together were taken as the unit of survey. On the other hand, if the sampled census village was wholly contained within a bigger revenue village which contained wholly or partly other census villages also, the bigger revenue village was surveyed.

In case of sample villages with large population content, the survey was conducted in one of the sub-divisions (selected at random) formed in a village called hamlet groups of nearly equal population contents.

8. Selection of sample household : Households possessing 20 or more poultry birds, on the date of survey (fowls, ducks and other poultry birds taken together) excluding those which are registered under section 2m (i), or 2m (ii) of Factory Act of India, 1948, had been selected.

Urban Sample Design

9. Sampling Frame : Urban frame survey (UFS) blocks in Cities and towns where UFS was done and 1971 census blocks where UFS had not been done, were used for final selection of blocks.

10. Stratification : Basic strata as described in rural sample design had been treated as basic strata for urban sector also. In the urban sector, however, some of the basic strata with very low urban population content had been merged together to form urban strata with sizeable urban population. In all such cases, however, the separate entity of the district had been retained in general, except in case of districts with very low urban population where such districts had been merged with neighbouring districts in the same region for urban strata formation. Out of 374 districts in India, 366 districts were within the survey coverage of the NSS. Total number of basic strata formed in the 366 districts was 380 in urban sector.

11. Allocation . The all-India sample of blocks had been allocated to the different states and union territories considering their investigator strengths and urban population contents. Within each state and union territory, the allocated number of blocks were distributed over the constituent urban strata in proportion to their urban population. These allocations were made multiple of 4.

12. Selection of blocks : Within each urban stratum the allocated number of blocks have been selected with probability proportional to size (pps) where size is a measure of population and with replacement in the form of two independent sub-samples.

13. Selection of sample household : The criterion as described in rural sample design under para 8 had been followed for urban sector too.
