THE ESTIMATES OF THE UNDER-NOURISHED POPULATION FROM ALTERNATIVE SOURCES

SUMMARY

National Nutrition Monitoring Bureau and National Sample Survey Organisation are the two sources providing information on nutritional intake of the population in India. Using calorie inadequacy norm as a measure for under-nourishment as per Indian Council of Medical Research recommendations of Recommended Dietary Allowances, the estimates of under-nourished population from these two sources are derived. In this paper an attempt has been made to caution the users against the possible temptation of comparing the two estimates from the two sources by highlighting the non-comparability between them.

NNMB is collaborating with NSSO in their 38th round (1983) on household consumer expenditure in the two States of Andhra Pradesh and Gujarat. In case the tabulation of the data from the two sources is done for the same sub-sample, a comparative picture is possible to emerge.

1. INTRODUCTION

Two agencies are at present involved in the collection of data on the nutritional intake of the population in India. The National Nutrition Monitoring Bureau (NNMB) has been collecting these data from the year 1975 onwards. The National Sample Survey Organisation (NSSO) has been conducting consumer expenditure Surveys annually right from the first round (Oct. 1950—March 1951) to 28th round (1973-74) and afterwards quinquennially. Data from these Surveys are being used for determining the incidence of poverty in the country based on a calorie consumption norm. The suitability of a calorie norm for defining poverty has already been studied by many scholars, prominent among the being Dandekar and Rath¹ at the non-official level and in the Sixth Plan document² in its various versions at the official level. In these studies, the poverty line is related to the per capita consumption of calories. By implication, those below the poverty line are also taken to be below the minimum calorie consumption norm and hence under-nourished. In this connection there have been some suggestions to compare the proportion of the under-nourished population from these two sources viz., the NSSO & NNMB.

2. In this note we argue that the estimates of the under-nourished population (as a proportion of the total from these two sources) are not a comparable because of differences in methods of collection, sample size, reference period, sample design and focus of two surveys. The differences in sample design, sample size, etc. reflect on the precision of the estimates as determined from the two sources. Differences in the methods of collection result in different levels of non-sampling errors. Hence, the comparison of two sets of estimates is not strictly valid.

2. BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF THE SOURCES

2.1 NNMB METHOD

NNMB has been collecting data on the nutrition intake by two methods viz. (i) by weighing of raw food and (ii) by oral enquiry. In the weighing method, total raw food intake of a household is weighed for the day of the visit. In the oral enquiry method total food intake on the day preceding the day of the visit is enquired orally from each individual of the selected household.

The NNMB surveys cover ten States—Kerala, Tamil Nadu, Karnataka, Andhra Pradesh, Maharashtra, Gujarat, Madhya Pradesh, Orissa, West Bengal and Uttar Pradesh at present. The sample design is a three-stage random sampling in each state where district, village and household are first, second and third stage units respectively. For the selection of a district, all the districts in a State are grouped into 4 strata with the help of a certain developmental index and from each stratum one district is selected at random without replacement every year. Within each district, villages are grouped in three strata on the basis of the size of the population in the 1961 Census, the three strata being less than 1000 (I), 1000-3000 (II) and 3000 and above (III). Within each stratum, villages are selected linearly systematically with a random start. From each selected village 5, 10 or 15 households are selected depending upon whether the village belongs to stratum I, II or III respectively. While selecting the households at random, in a selected village it is also ensured by the team of field workers that proper representation is given to different segments of the population e.g., harijans, artisans, landlords, labourers, small and medium landowners, and well-to-do group. The method by which the random selection of households is reconciled with the representation to different social classes is not clearly stated*.

*NSS also provides for the representation of different classes of households in the sample although the specification of the classes is different from the one adopted by NNMB. This is done by classifying the households at the houselisting stage on the basis of the means of livelihood and the area of land possessed. The total sample of households from each village is obtained by drawing a prespecified number of households at random from each broad class distinguished at the listing stage.

A fixed number of 500 households are selected in each State. These 500 households are then allocated to four selected districts in a given State in proportion to the size of the rural population in each district. The number of households in a district are further allocated to three strata in proportion to the size of the rural population in each stratum. The number of villages to be selected from each stratum is determined by dividing the allocated number of households by 5, 10 or 15 in case of stratum I, II or III respectively.

The developmental index for each district is constructed on the basis of the characteristics, such as, total foodgrains produced per year, the proportion of area under food crops to total irrigated area, the proportion of agriculturists to total number of persons engaged in agriculture.

For the purpose of deciding whether an individual is consuming inadequate calorie or protein, his/her age, sex and physiological level i.e., height, weight and nature of physical activity are taken into account and as per RDA (Recommended Dietary Allowance) his/her mean requirement of calories and proteins are determined. Again, to provide for normal variations in intake (Mean—2SD of recommended requirement) is considered as a cut-off level for an individual and (Mean—2SE of recommended requirement) at the household level, where $SE=SD/\sqrt{cu}$, and cu is the number of consumer units determined on the basis of physiological activity of individuals in a household and SD is assumed to be 15 per cent of the RDA. NNMB takes 2400 kcal/cu/day as RDA³. NNMB has used this criterion with the recommendations of ICMR on RDA.

2.2 NSSO METHOD

NSSO has been conducting surveys of households for collecting data on consumer expenditure. The sample design adopted by NSSO⁴ is two-stage stratified sampling where, districts generally constitute the primary strata within each State whereas the first and the second stage units are villages/urban blocks and households respectively. Within each stratum the villages have been selected with probability proportional to the population and with replacement and within each village the second stage units (12 households) have been selected circular systematically from the frame of households prepared after arranging households according to their means of livelihood. Within each State the total sample of villages have been allocated to the different rural strata in proportion to the rural population.

NSSO covered 8620 and 8136 (planned) sample villages during 27th round (1972-73) and 32nd round (1977-78) respectively at the all-India level. This resulted in getting the information from 72,270 and

97,632 (planned) households. The method of collecting information is through oral enquiry of all items of consumer expenditure during the 30 days preceding the day of the visit to the selected households and using recall method. The purpose of the survey is to collect information on consumer expenditure on all items of which food items yielding nutritional intake forms a subset.

2.3 SAMPLE SIZE : Table 1 presents statewise the number of households actually covered by the NNMB surveys for weighment and oral enquiry methods from 1977 to 1980 for the ten States (columns 2 to 9). The columns 10 & 11 of the same table give the number of households surveyed/planned to be surveyed by NSSO for those States which are covered by NNMB methods for the year 1972-73 and 1977-78.

3. DATA STUDIED

For the purpose of comparison, all the available NNMB reports for the year 1975 to 1980 were studied. (No report seems to have been brought out after the survey of 1980). NSS report No. 297 for per capita per diem consumer expenditure based on 27th round of NSSO (1972-73) and crash tabulation results for 32nd round of NSSO (1977-78) were also utilised for the purpose.

4. PRESENTATION OF RESULTS

Table 2 presents the percentage of households/individuals with inadequate calorie consumption based on the NNMB data at the aggregate level using the norms recommended by ICMR. Here the combined estimate for 1979 and 1980 has been obtained for households as well as individuals by assigning the total number of households/total number of individuals surveyed as weights, as the case may be. Table 3 presents the NNMB estimates of the percentage of individuals/households with inadequate calorie consumption by the two methods of weighment and oral enquiry from 1977 to 1980 for the ten States. Table 4 provides the pooled figures of the percentage of the under-nourished households and that of the individuals from NNMB survey for 1977-78 and 1979-80 separately. The estimates of the under-nourished population (as a percentage of the total population) derived from National Sample Surveys of Consumer Expenditure are reported in the last two columns of Table 4 for 1972-73 and 1977-78. It may be pointed out that it is not possible to derive the estimates of the percentage of under-nourished households from the existing NSS tabulations.

5. DISCUSSION

It is necessary to assess the comparability of data from the two sources (NNMB and NSSO) in terms of criteria such as objective of the two surveys, methods

of collection, sample designs, sample sizes, reference periods and units of data collection.

The paras below discuss briefly the above aspects—

(i) It may be noted that the basic focus of enquiry in the two surveys viz., NSSO and NNMB is different. NNMB surveys are planned entirely to assess the nutritional status of individuals and households with the help of two methods—oral enquiry and weighment. NSSO surveys are conducted with a view to collecting information on the detailed commodity composition household consumer expenditure including that on consumable services. In the process, the information on food purchases which can be converted into nutrition intake also gets collected as a part of the household consumer expenditure. Because of its exclusive focus on nutrition, the NNMB surveys are likely to capture the nutritional status at the household/individual level better than the NSSO surveys.

(ii) As already noted, the sampling designs adopted in the two surveys viz., NSSO and NNMB are different. It may be noted that the sample size of the ultimate unit of sampling viz. households, selected in NSS surveys is about 33 times of that selected for NNMB weighment survey and 130 times of that selected for NNMB enquiry method for all the States covered in the year 1978. Obviously, the efficiency of the NNMB estimate is likely to be much lower than that of the NSSO.

(iii) None of the two surveys provides the standard error of the estimates. It is, therefore, not possible to compare the precision of the estimates obtained from the two sources. However, from the 28th round of NSS (1973-74) for which the standard errors of the estimates were worked out by Rao and Sarma⁵, it is observed that the NSS estimates were reasonably precise at the State and all-India level. The percentage standard errors of the estimates for per capita consumption of cereals and food in terms of rupees for the States of Andhra Pradesh, Kerala, Madhya Pradesh, Maharashtra, Punjab, Tamil Nadu, Uttar Pradesh & West Bengal as obtained by them are in the range of 1.01 to 2.76 and 1.03 to 2.52 respectively. The efficiency of NNMB estimates with such a small sample size is going to be much lower even if the design had been identical.

(iv) As per the scheme of the NNMB surveys, all the districts are to be covered over a number of years. The estimates pooled over the years may be reasonably reliable at the State level. Naturally, these aggregate estimates will be based on data relating to many years and therefore, will not refer to any particular year. The NSS estimates are always available at the State or at the all-India level with reasonable precision for a particular year.

(v) In the NSS method, the unit of observation is always a household for which the information on all items of consumer expenditure for all the members of the households is collected mostly from the head of the household. In the NNMB surveys, household is the basic unit of observation in the weighment method and an individual in the oral enquiry method. Consequently, the data from NSSO and those based on the weighment method from NNMB provide the estimates based on the information collected at the household level. The oral enquiry method, of the NNMB surveys provides estimates of the percentage of the under-nourished individuals directly while the NSSO surveys provide such estimates indirectly by assuming equal distribution of food consumption across all the members of a given household.

(vi) The NSSO estimates are likely to be more precise; because of a very large sample size, but they may suffer from non-sampling errors arising from long recall period and the interview method. The sample size in the NNMB surveys is considerably small in both the methods (weighment and oral) and is, therefore, likely to provide a less precise estimate but the non-sampling errors are likely to be small because of the exclusive focus on nutrition, the use of the weighment method and short recall period. However, the short recall period is likely to introduce unusual fluctuations.

(vii) One more source of non-comparability may also be noted. The NNMB surveys directly estimate the proportion of the under-nourished population by observing the calorie intake at the household (weighment method) or the individual (oral enquiry method) level. The NSS estimate of the proportion of the

under-nourished population is derived from the grouped frequency distribution of the households ranked according to the size of per capita consumer expenditure and *not* the size of the calorie intake.

NNMB uses (Mean—2SD of recommended requirement) at the individual level and (Mean—2SE of recommended requirement) at the household level as threshold value for the classification of under-nourished individuals or households. This choice of threshold value is justified in view of the fact that the reference period for both the oral enquiry method and the weighment method is just one day which introduces day-to-day variability in the intake of calories. However, this choice of Mean—2SD or Mean—2SE is not favoured by Gopalan⁶. It has been emphasized by him that the mean recommended requirement should be used as a yard-stick for the measurement of under-nutrition. The estimates of the under-nourished from NSSO are obtained using the norms recommended by ICMR of 2400 kcal/cu/day same as used by NNMB. While working out NSSO estimates of the under-nourished, adjustment for standard deviation is not necessary as the data relate to average of per capita per diem intake of calories over 30 days at the household level which smooths out the day-to-day variation in the intake of calories.

Estimated percentage of under-nourished individuals and under-nourished households from NNMB surveys are presented in Table 2 for the years 1979, 1980 and 1979 & 1980 combined at the aggregate level and for the years 1977, 1978, 1979 & 1980 for ten States in Table 3. The difference between the two sets of estimates of the percent under-nourished households and individuals in these two tables can be assigned to two factors. First, they provide estimates for two different universes and hence are not likely to be close. Secondly, these two sets of estimates are not comparable because of differences in the methods of data collection, sample sizes and units of measurement. Dandekar⁷ has tried to explain the difference in the estimates of under-nourished households and individuals obtained from two methods of NNMB. He has argued that the estimates of under-nourished households will always be lower than the estimates of under-nourished individuals because of relatively larger average household size of the under-nourished households.** This argument seems to hold good only for the estimates at the aggregate level and for some States (Table 2 & Table 3). He has also argued that the percentage of under-nourished individuals is also higher in the under-nourished households. In case adjustment on account of these two factors are made in the percentage of

**Dandekar's reasoning is corroborated by the data of the 26th round of NSS on consumer expenditure wherein it is found that average household size for all households consuming less than 2500 kcal/cu/day which is 5.97 which is greater than the average household size for households consuming more than 2500 kcal/cu/day which is 5.01. For 2500 kcal/cu/day has been used as cut-off point, as 2400 kcal/cu/day is not a class boundary in the available tables. NNMB does not give household size in the class of inadequate consumption of calories. Hence it was not possible to verify the veracity of the above statement from NNMB data.

under-nourished households, these two estimates, one obtained directly from oral enquiry method and the other derived from weighment method of percent under-nourished individuals are likely to come further close. His argument of taking into account both these factors can not be verified because of non-availability of any information regarding the incidence of calorie inadequacy in under-nourished households. Further, it is not possible to verify the hypothesis put forth by Dandekar about such differences with any statistical method for making statements with any pre-determined level of significance. However, any such comparison is statistically not valid because of various items of non-comparability as pointed above.

An attempt of comparison between NSS and NNMB estimates of percentage of under-nourished population, if possible, can be made only between NSS estimates and NNMB estimates from oral enquiry method. It may be observed from Table 4 that for the year 1977-78 in three States of Tamil Nadu, Karnataka and Maharashtra, the difference in the percentage of under-nourished individuals from the two sources is less than 5 percentage points. For the remaining states the difference is more than 5 percentage points. However, we have already noted a wide variety of differences between the two sources making them statistically non-comparable. Apparent closeness between the estimates as observed in some States may be just fortuitous.

6. CONCLUSION

It may be observed from the above discussion that the estimates obtained from two sources — NSSO and NNMB — are not comparable because of differences in methods of collection, sample sizes, reference periods, sampling design and focus of two surveys. Hence the comparison of the two sets of estimates is not statistically valid, and should be avoided.

However, to have a comparable set of estimates from the two sources, NNMB has decided to collaborate with NSSO in two States — Andhra Pradesh & Gujarat in the 38th round of NSSO on consumer expenditure. For this purpose, NNMB will be covering a sub-sample of NSS sample households and will collect detailed information on nutritional aspects along with anthropometric measurement of individuals of these households. The effort should be made to tabulate the data corresponding to this sub-sample from both the surveys—NSSO and NNMB—so that meaningful comparison can be made.

A NOTE ON SOME SELECTED IMPORTANT RESULTS OF THE SECOND QUINQUENNIAL SURVEY (NSS 32ND) ROUND ON EMPLOYMENT AND UNEMPLOYMENT FOR THE DIFFERENT STATES

INTRODUCTION

The second country wide quinquennial survey on Employment and unemployment was carried out by the National Sample Survey Organisation (NSSO) in its 32nd round survey operations (July 1977—June 1978). Provisional estimates of two key indicators of employment and unemployment obtained through manual tabulation of selected items of data collected in this survey for the population of age 15—59 years have been released for all India and the different States/Union Territories in the NSSO Journal¹. Detailed results for all-India and some important summary results for all-India and States/Union Territories with brief notes have also been released². The results based on detailed tabulation of data relating to the various States/Union Territories are being progressively released in the NSSO miniographed report series numbered 298/1, 298/2 etc. and so far the results for 17 states have been released. In this document 10 tables giving estimates of some basic items of information on both the household characteristics and the employment-unemployment characteristics of population collected in the survey are presented separately for the States & Union Territories of Arunachal Pradesh, Goa, Daman & Diu, Manipur, Meghalaya, Tripura, Orissa, Pondicherry, Chandigarh & Nagaland. Results for other states have already been released³.

2. The details of sampling design, survey coverage, estimation procedure and salient features of the conceptual frame and data collection procedure adopted in the survey are given in the Report containing the all-India results. A brief summary of the scope and coverage of the survey, the concepts, definition etc. is given below.

3. **Geographical Coverage** : The survey covered the whole area of the Indian Union excepting Sikkim, Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Lakshadweep, Dadra and Nagar Haveli, Ladakh District of Jammu and Kashmir, rural areas of Pal and Samri Tehsils of district Bastar of Madhya Pradesh, rural areas of

Rajura, Sironcha and Gadchiroli Tehsils of district Chandrapur and Nelghat tehsil of district Amravati of Maharashtra and rural areas of Chandigarh, Mizoram and Nagaland.

4. **Sampling design and Sample size** : A stratified two-stage sampling design was adopted in the survey with census villages and urban blocks (Urban Frame Survey Blocks formed by NSSO) as the first stage units respectively for the rural and urban areas and households as the second stage units. But in the rural areas of the North Eastern States the first stage units were clusters of villages. Altogether 8820 villages and 4940 urban blocks were selected as the first stage units. In case of the selected first stage units, 12 households were selected as second stage units for the rural areas of North Eastern Region, 24 households were selected from each cluster of villages).

5. **Survey period and sub-round formation** : The survey was started in July 1977 and was completed in June 1978. The entire survey period of one year was divided into four sub-rounds of three months each coinciding approximately with the four agricultural seasons. The four sub-round periods were, July to September 1977, October—December 1977, January to March 1978 and April—June 1978. The sample villages and blocks were distributed over the four sub-rounds in equal numbers so as to provide valid estimates for each of the sub-rounds.

6. **Estimation procedure** : In order to reduce workload at the tabulation stage and to provide estimates at the regional level, the following estimation procedure was adopted :

Y = estimated rural/urban total of a characteristic for any region for any sub-round/all sub-rounds

y = rural/urban sample total of the characteristic for the region for the sub-round/all sub-round.

P = projected rural/urban population of the region for January 1978 and

p = total sample persons in the sample villages/blocks of the region surveyed in the sub-rounds.

The estimation was done separately for the rural and urban areas.

The values of 'P' have been arrived at using 'Estimates (provisional) based on Expert Committee-projections tentatively revised in the light of 1971 census data' [Source : Bulletin on Food Statistics, 25th Issue (1975), Table 1.2]. The estimates given in this set of projections relate to 1st July of each year. To centre them at 1-1-78, (the mid-point of the survey period covered by the 32nd round), the averages of the projected population figures for 1977 and 1978 have been used.

At the time of the preparation of this document, 1981 census population tables have become available for each state and union territory, with break-down by residence status (rural/urban) and sex. Using these provisional figures and the corresponding population totals of 1971 census, revised estimates of population as on 1-1-78 have been obtained by interpolation (assuming an exponential growth rate between the two *censal* time points) independently for males and females residing in urban and rural areas of each state. To make the estimates presented here conform to the revised estimates, adjustment factors have been computed for each population group as the ratio of the

revised estimate of population to the corresponding estimate given in the report. These ratios are given in the table below. Each aggregate estimate may be multiplied by its corresponding adjustment factor (i.e. that of the population group to which it belongs) to obtain a revised estimate of aggregate.

Ratios (rates, percentages etc.) involving distribution of any one state/union territory \times residence status \times sex group are unaffected by this adjustment. However, any ratio or proportion involving aggregation of more than one group will have to be built up by first computing the aggregates of its numerator and denominator separately by addition of relevant adjusted aggregates.

7. Salient features of the conceptual frame and data collection procedure : The main objective of the survey was to measure, in quantitative terms, the nature and extent of employment and unemployment at disaggregated levels. To achieve this objective the attempt in the survey was to classify the population as belonging to different activity categories, independently, by using three different approaches, namely, (i) the usual status approach, (ii) the current weekly status approach and (iii) the current day status approach.

Estimates of population presented in this document, projected population as on 1-1-78 and adjustment factors

Persons distributed according to the various activity categories were further classified by several meaningful correlates, such as age, sex, general and technical

education, industry, occupation etc. The different activity categories, adopted for the purpose were as under.

Persons assigned any one of the activities listed under the category codes 01 to 71 were treated as 'working' (or employed). Persons assigned activity category codes 81 or 82 were treated as 'seeking and/or available for work' (or unemployed). The remaining persons i.e. the persons assigned any of the activity category codes 91 to 99 were treated as 'not available for work' (or not in labour force). The data on activity particulars of the persons were, however, tabulated only for population of age 5 years and above.

8. Classification according to usual status approach:

For classification of population into various activity categories according to usual status, persons were first classified into three major activity status groups, namely, 'working', 'seeking and/or available for work' and 'not available for work' on the basis of a 'major-time-spent' criterion with reference to the period of 365 days preceding the date of survey. Accordingly, one was categorised as 'working' if one was reported to be engaged for a relatively long time during the reference period in one or more of the gainful activities (category codes 01-51), 'seeking and/or available for work' if one was reported to be either 'seeking or available for work' (category code 81 or 82) for a relatively long time during the same reference

period and 'not available for work' if one was reported to be not available for work during a relatively long time of the reference period. Within each of these three broad groups of categories, the detailed activity status categories were then determined by again using the 'major-time-spent' criterion.

9. Classification according to current weekly status approach :

For classification of person according to current weekly status, he or she had to be assigned a unique activity status with reference to a period of seven days preceding the date of survey. For a person pursuing more than one activity during the week, his/her unique status was decided by adopting a priority-cum-major time rule. Under the priority rule, the status of 'working' got priority over the status of 'not working but seeking/available for work' which in turn got priority over the status of 'not working and not seeking/available for work'. For a person classified under the first or the last category, his/her detailed activity status was determined by major-time-spent criterion i.e. the detailed activity on which major time was spent was considered his/her current weekly status. Further, if a person had worked for one hour on

any one day of the week he was considered 'working'. A person who had not worked during the week but was available for work even for one hour or any one day of the week was considered, 'seeking and/or available for the week'. Others constituted the category 'not available for work' (or not in labour force). Each person was thus assigned a unique activity status for the week. Aggregate of persons under the different activity status provided the distribution of persons by activity on an average in a week of the survey period of one year.

10. Classification according to current day status approach : In adopting the current day status approach attempt was made to account for two major activities pursued by a person on each day of the seven days reference week allocating 'half day' to each activity. The unit of classification according to this approach, was thus half day though data were collected for all the seven days of the reference week. In assigning the activity status on a day, a person was considered 'working' (or employed) for the entire day if he/she had worked 4 hours or more on the day, and assigned the one or two (as the case may be) work activities (01-71) to which he/she devoted the working time. But if the work was done for one hour or more but less than 4 hours, he/she was considered 'working' (or employed) for half day and 'seeking/available for work' (or unemployed) or 'not available for work' (or not in labour force) for the other half of the day depending on whether he/she was seeking/available for work or not on the day. On the other hand, if a person was not engaged in any gainful work even for one hour on the day but was seeking or available for work for four hours or more, he/she was considered 'unemployed' for the entire day. But if the reported availability for work was for less than four hours only, he/she was considered 'unemployed' for half day and 'not in labour force' for the other half of the day. A person who neither was having any gainful work to do nor was available for work even for half of the day was considered 'not available for work (or not in labour force)' for the entire day and assigned the one or two of the non-gainful activity statuses which he/she had during the day. The aggregate of person-days so classified under the different activity categories for all the seven days of the week, divided by seven gave the distribution of persons (strictly speaking, person-days) by activity category on an average on a day of the survey period of one year.

11. Probing questions : In order to understand the complex dimensions of the work pattern, the extent

of under-utilisation and the nature of reported preferences for additional work etc. among those classified as employed according to usual status, the types of work desired, efforts made to get work etc. for those classified as 'unemployed', students, persons engaged in domestic duties etc. some relevant probing questions were put to the above categories of persons to elicit the required information. These probing questions apart, a second set of probing questions were also canvassed in this round exclusively for those classified according to usual status as engaged in domestic duties with a view to eliciting information on the reasons for their usual attachment in household chores, whether they would report as available for work if work was provided at their residences etc.

12. Activity Category 93: It is known that part of the total working time of the women-particularly rural usually engaged in household duties is spent of certain activities to meet household needs. These activities are considered gainful if the goods or services produced as a result of such work are essentially for sale. It was generally felt that information on this aspect of participation in household activities of persons, mostly women, classified according to usual status as 'engaged in domestic duties' could not be obtained from the NSS surveys. In the 32nd round survey, therefore, attempt was made to subdivide persons who usually remain predominantly engaged in domestic duties into two sub-categories namely, (i) engaged exclusively in domestic duties and (ii) engaged in domestic duties as well as in the activities like free collection of fish, small games etc. listed above. The adoption of this new activity sub-category or those engaged in household chores was intended to identify separately those who alongwith their domestic duties also carryout the above activities from those who carry out only domestic duties.

13. Descriptions of the tables presented : It is already mentioned that here estimates of some basic items of information pertaining to household characteristics and the activity characteristics of the population for 4 (12) states are presented. The relevant results are presented in ten different tables. A brief description of these tables is given below :

Table (1) : The distributions of rural and urban households by household type and household monthly per capita expenditure are presented in this table. The survey households in the rural areas were categorised under five different types. They are :

- (i) households self employed in agricultural occupations

- (i) households self employed in non-agricultural occupations
- (ii) agricultural labour households
- (iv) non-agricultural labour households
- (v) other households

For the urban areas, only two different household types were considered, namely :

- (i) self employed households
- (ii) other households

Table (2) : The distribution of the rural and urban household by households monthly per capita expenditure and the principal household industry the household industry being considered as the source from which major income of the household was derived during the 365 days preceding the date of survey are presented in table (2). Here, only nine broad industrial categories have been considered. They are : agricultural, mining & quarrying manufacturing, electricity, gas & water construction, trace, transport, services and others.

Table (3) : The distribution of the rural and urban households by household monthly per capita expenditure and the proportion of persons economically, active to total persons are given in table (3). The employed and unemployed together constitute the economically active population.

Table (4) : In table (4) are presented the estimates of (i) total number of households (ii) total persons (iii) total economically active persons (iv) average household size and (v) average number of economically active persons per household for each household monthly per capita expenditure class. The estimates of 'persons' and 'economically active persons' are presented separately for each sex.

Table (5) : In table (5) are presented the distributions of males and females of age 5 years and above by age group and usual activity status. In this table the population has been shown as distributed between five age groups, such as, 5-14, 15-29, 30-44, 45-59 and 60 & above. The usual activity status categories are in terms only in columns (1) and (2) of the table. It is already indicated that the usual status of a person is determined on the basis of a 'major time' or a relatively 'long time' spent criterion with reference to a period of 365 days preceding the

date of survey. It may be noted that according to this criterion, some of the persons categorised 'not working' may be still pursuing some gainful activities (quite likely only marginally) during the reference period of 365 days. But such pursuances of gainful activity in a subsidiary capacity has not been considered in working out the distributions presented in table (5).

Table (6) : This table give the distribution of males and females of age 5 years and above by usual activity status taking also into consideration the subsidiary gainful status of those categorised as 'not working' during the reference year according to 'major time' spent criterion. The distributions are presented cross classified by age group and the activity status.

Table (7) : In table (7) is presented the distribution of males and females of age 5 years and above categorised 'working' according to usual status' classification by two digit major group of the industrial classification. The estimates for both the rural and urban areas are presented in the same table.

Table (8 R) & (8U) : The distributions of males and females of age 5 years and above categorised 'usually working' by specified groups of 'Occupation' are presented in table (8 R) for rural areas and table (8 U) for the urban areas. It may be noted that the occupation groups considered here are different for the urban and rural areas as occupation pattern in rural areas is known to be different from that in the urban areas.

Table (9) : The distributions of males and females of age 5 years and above by their current weekly activity and age-group are presented in table (9). The estimates given represent the average weekly situation obtaining for persons over the reference period of 365 days preceding the date of survey.

Table (10) : The activity situation obtaining for persons on an average day over the reference period of 365 days preceding the date of survey is presented in this table. The estimates represent the number of person days of persons of age 5 years and above occupied in various activities on an average day over the reference period of 365 days preceding the date of survey cross classified by different age-groups. These estimates are presented separately for males and females.

विभिन्न राज्यों के रोजगार तथा बेरोजगारी विषयक दूसरे पंचवर्षीय सर्वेक्षण (रा० प्र० सर्वे 32 वां दौर) के कुछ चुने हुए महत्वपूर्ण परिणाम ।

प्रस्तावना

राष्ट्रीय प्रतिदर्श सर्वेक्षण संगठन ने सर्वेक्षण के 32वें दौर (जुलाई 1977—जून—1978) में रोजगार तथा बेरोजगारी विषयक दूसरा पंचवर्षीय सर्वेक्षण आरम्भ किया। 15 से 59 वर्ष की आयु वाली जनसंख्या के इस सर्वेक्षण में संगृहीत आंकड़ों की चुनी हुई मर्दों के हस्त सारणीयन के माध्यम से प्राप्त रोजगार और बेरोजगारी के दो महत्वपूर्ण संकेतकों के अनंतिम अनुमान समस्त भारत, और विभिन्न राज्यों/संघ शासित क्षेत्रों के लिए राष्ट्रीय प्रतिदर्श सर्वेक्षण संगठन की पत्रिका में प्रकाशित किये गये। समस्त भारत से संबंधित विस्तृत परिणाम और समस्त भारत तथा राज्यों/संघ शासित क्षेत्रों के कुछ महत्वपूर्ण संक्षिप्त परिणामों के साथ सारांश टिप्पणियों को भी प्रकाशित किया गया।

1. विभिन्न राज्यों/संघ शासित क्षेत्रों से संबंधित आंकड़ों में विस्तृत पर सारणीयन आधारित परिणाम रा० प्र० सर्वे० संगठन की मिनियोग्राफ रिपोर्ट की अंकमाला 298/1 298/2 आदि में क्रमिक आधार पर प्रकाशित किये जा रहे हैं, और अब तक 10 राज्यों के परिणाम प्रकाशित किये गये हैं। इस प्रलेख में सर्वेक्षण में संगृहीत जनसंख्या संबंधी आंकड़ों से परिवारिक विशेषताओं और रोजगार तथा बेरोजगारी संबंधी विशेषताओं दोनों से संबंधित सूचना की कुछ आधारभूत मर्दों के अनुमान दर्शाने वाली 9 सारणियां अरुणाचल प्रदेश, गोआ, दमन व दीव, मनिपुर, मेघालय, त्रिपुरा, उड़ीसा, पांडिचेरी, चन्डीगढ़ और नागालड राज्यों के लिए अलग-अलग प्रस्तुत की गयी है।

2. सर्वेक्षण में अपनाये गये प्रतिचयन अभिकल्प, सर्वेक्षण की व्याप्ति, आकलन कार्य विधि और संकलनात्मक संरचना के मुख्य मुख्य अंगों के व्यौरे और आंकड़ा संग्रहण की कार्यविधि इस रिपोर्ट में दी गई जिसमें समस्त भारत के परिणाम संघारित हैं। सर्वेक्षण का विषय-क्षेत्र और व्याप्ति संबंधी संक्षिप्त सार संकल्पनाएँ, परिभाषाएँ आदि नीचे दी गई हैं।

3. भौगोलिक व्याप्ति : सर्वेक्षण में सिक्किम, अण्डमान व निकोबार द्वीप समूह, लक्षद्वीप, दादरा व नागर हवेली, जम्मू व काश्मीर का लद्दाख जिला, मध्य प्रदेश के बस्तर जिले की पाल और समरी तहसीलों के ग्रामीण क्षेत्र, महाराष्ट्र के चन्द्रपुर जिले की राजुरा, सिरौंचा और गढ़ चिरोली तहसीलों तथा अमरावती जिले की नीलघाट तहसील के ग्रामीण क्षेत्रों और चंडीगढ़, मिजोरम तथा नागालैंड के ग्रामीण क्षेत्रों को छोड़कर भारत संघ का समस्त क्षेत्रफल सम्मिलित है।

4. प्रतिचयन अभिकल्प एवं प्रतिदर्श आकार :—सर्वेक्षण एक स्तरीकृत दो चरण वाला प्रतिचयन अभिकल्प अपनाया गया जिसमें गणना गांवों और शहरी खण्डों (रा० प्र० सर्वे० संगठन द्वारा निर्मित शहरी ढांचा—सर्वेक्षण खंड) को ग्रामीण एवं शहरी क्षेत्रों के लिए प्रथम चरण की इकाई माना गया है और परिवारों को दूसरे चरण की इकाई।

किन्तु उत्तर पूर्वी राज्यों के ग्रामीण क्षेत्रों में ग्राम-समूहों प्रथम चरण की इकाई थे। कुल मिलाकर 8820 गांव और 4940 शहरी खंड प्रथम चरण की इकाई के रूप में चुने गये। चुनी गयी प्रथम चरण की इकाइयों से संबंधी 12 परिवारों को दूसरे चरण की इकाइयों के रूप में चुना गया है। (उत्तर—पूर्वी क्षेत्र के ग्रामीण क्षेत्रों में से 24 परिवार प्रत्येक ग्राम—समूह से चुने गये)।

5. सर्वेक्षण अवधि और उपदौर तैयार करना :—यह सर्वेक्षण जुलाई 1977 में आरम्भ हुआ और जून 1978 में पूरा कर लिया गया। सम्पूर्ण सर्वेक्षण की एक वर्ष की अवधि को तीन-तीन महीनों के चार उपदौरों में बांटा गया और प्रत्येक दौर में लगभग चार ऋषि मौसम सम्मिलित किये गये। चारों उपदौरों की अवधियां थी जुलाई से सितम्बर, 1977, अक्टूबर से दिसम्बर 1977, जनवरी से मार्च, 1978 और अप्रैल से जून 1978। प्रतिदर्श गांवों और खंडों को बराबर संख्या वाले चार उपदौरों में बांट दिया गया ताकि प्रत्येक उप-दौर के लिए वैध अनुमान प्रस्तुत किये जा सकें।

6. आकलन कार्यविधि : सारणीयन स्तर पर कार्य भार कम करने और क्षेत्रीय स्तर पर अनुमान प्रस्तुत करने के लिए निम्नलिखित आकलन कार्यविधि अपनायी गयी :

ग्रामीण और शहरी क्षेत्रों के लिए अलग-अलग अनुमान तैयार किये गये ।

P के मूल्य विशेषज्ञ समिति प्रक्षेपणों पर आधारित अनुमानों (अनन्तिम) को प्रयोग में लाते हुए तैयार किये गये हैं, जिन्हें 1971 की जनगणना के आंकड़ों को ध्यान में रखते हुए अस्थायी रूप में संशोधित किया गया है । (स्रोत :—खाद्य सांख्यिकी संबंधी विवरणिका 25वां अंक (1975) सारणी 1.2 प्रक्षेपणों के इस कुलक (समूह) में दिये गये अनुमानों का सम्बन्ध प्रत्येक वर्ष के प्रथम जुलाई से है । उन्हें 1-1-1978 (32वां दौर में समिश्रित सर्वेक्षण अवधि का मध्य काल) पर केन्द्रित करने के लिए वर्ष 1977 और 1978 के लिए प्रक्षेपित जनसंख्या सम्बन्धी आंकड़ों का काम में लाया गया है ।

इस प्रलेख को तैयार करते समय प्रत्येक राज्य तथा संघ राज्य क्षेत्र के लिए निवास स्थिति (ग्रामीण) (शहरी) तथा स्त्री-पुरुष के अनुसार विभाजन सहित 1981 की जनगणना को जनसंख्या सारणियां उपलब्ध हो गई हैं । इन अनन्तिम आंकड़ों तथा 1971 की जनगणना के तदनु रूप जनसंख्या के जोड़ों का प्रयोग करते हुए प्रत्येक राज्य के ग्रामीण तथा शहरी क्षेत्रों में रहने वाले पुरुषों तथा महिलाओं के लिए स्वतन्त्र रूप से अन्तर्वेशन द्वारा 1-1-1978 की स्थिति सूचित करने वाले जनसंख्या के संशोधित अनुमान (दो जनगणना अवधियों के बीच चर छाताकी वृद्धि पर) प्राप्त किये गये हैं यहां प्रस्तुत किये गये अनुमानों को संशोधित अनुमानों के अनुरूप बनाने के लिए प्रत्येक जनसंख्या समूहों के लिए (समायोजन) कारण तथ्य परिकलित किये गये हैं जैसा कि रिपोर्ट में तदनु रूप अनुमान की तुलना में जनसंख्या के संशोधित अनुमान का अनुपात दिया गया है । इन अनुपातों को नीचे दी गई सारणी में दर्शाया गया है । समाहार के संशोधित अनुमान प्राप्त करने के लिए प्रत्येक समाहार अनुमान को तदनु रूप समंजन कारण घटक (अर्थात् इससे सम्बद्ध जनसंख्या समूह) से गुणा करना चाहिए । किसी राज्य/संघ शासित क्षेत्र आवास स्थिति स्त्री-पुरुष समूह के विभाजित वाले अनुपात (दर, प्रतिशतताएं आदि) इस समायोजन से अप्रभावित हैं ।

तथापि एक से अधिक समूह के समाहारकरण वाले अनुपात अथवा तुलनात्मक अंश को संगत समायोजित समाहारों के अलग-अलग जोड़ द्वारा इसे हर और अंश को समाहारों के प्रथम परिकलन के माध्यम से तैयार करना होगा ।

7. संकलनात्मक ढांचे तथा आंकड़ा संग्रहण कार्य विधि के मुख्य अभिलक्षण :—सर्वेक्षण का मुख्य उद्देश्य विसमोहित स्तरों पर रोजगार तथा बेरोजगारी के स्वरूप तथा सीमा विस्तार की माप करना है । इस उद्देश्य के प्राप्ति के लिए तीन अलग-अलग दृष्टिकोण अर्थात् (1) सामान्य स्थिति दृष्टिकोण (2) वर्तमान साप्ताहिक कार्य स्थिति दृष्टिकोण तथा (3) वर्तमान दैनिक कार्य स्थिति दृष्टिकोण का स्वतंत्र रूप से प्रयोग करते हुए विभिन्न कार्यकलाप प्रवर्गों से सम्बन्धित जनसंख्या को वर्गीकृत करने का प्रयास किया गया है :—

विभिन्न कार्यकलाप प्रवर्गों के अनुसार विभाजित किये गये व्यक्तियों को आयु, स्त्री-पुरुष, सामान्य तथा तकनीकी शिक्षा, उद्योग, व्यवसाय आदि जैसे कुछ सार्थक सह-सम्बन्धों द्वारा आगे और अधिक वर्गीकृत किया गया । इस उद्देश्य से अपनाये गये विभिन्न कार्य-कलाप प्रवर्ग थे जिन्हें नीचे दर्शाया गया है ।

कार्य-कलाप प्रवर्ग संकेत 61,71 और 99 केवल वर्तमान कार्य स्थिति दृष्टिकोण के लिए प्रयोग किया गया है।

प्रवर्ग संकेत 01 से 71 के अन्तर्गत सूचीबद्ध किसी एक कार्यकलाप के लिए लगाये गये व्यक्तियों को कार्यरत (या नियोजित) माना गया है। प्रवर्ग संकेत 81 या 82 के कार्यकलाप के लिए लगाये गये व्यक्तियों को कार्य ढूँढ रहे और कार्यकलाप प्रवर्ग संकेत 61, 71 और 99 केवल वर्तमान कार्यस्थिति दृष्टिकोण के लिये प्रयोग किया गया है या कार्य के लिए उपलब्ध (या बेरोजगार) माना गया है।

शेष व्यक्ति अर्थात् प्रवर्ग संकेत 91 से 99 में से किसी एक कार्यकलाप के लिए लगाये व्यक्ति को "कार्य के लिए उपलब्ध नहीं" (अथवा श्रमिक बल में नहीं) माना गया है। तथापि व्यक्तियों के कार्यकलाप संबंधी व्यौरों के आंकड़ों 5 वर्ष और उससे अधिक आयु की जनसंख्या के लिए सारणीबद्ध किये गये हैं।

8. सामान्य कार्यस्थिति दृष्टिकोण के अनुसार वर्गीकरण :—सामान्य दशा के अनुसार विभिन्न कार्यकलाप प्रवर्गों में जनसंख्या के वर्गीकरण हेतु व्यक्तियों को सर्वेक्षण की तारीख से पूर्व 365 दिनों की अवधि के संदर्भ में "अधिकांश व्यतीत समय के मानदण्ड के आधार पर" कार्यरत, 1 कार्य ढूँढ रहे और/या कार्य के लिए उपलब्ध, तथा कार्य के लिए उपलब्ध नहीं हैं, नामक तीन महत्वपूर्ण कार्य-कलाप स्थिति समूहों में वर्गीकृत किया गया है। तदनुसार—किसी व्यक्ति को "कार्यरत" के रूप में प्रवर्गीकृत किया गया है, यदि उसमें एक या एक से अधिक लाभकारी कार्यकलाप में संदर्भ अवधि के दौरान लम्बे समय तक कार्यरत रहने की सूचना दी है। (प्रवर्ग संकेत 01—51), कार्य ढूँढ रहे और या कार्य के लिए उपलब्ध" यदि उसने संदर्भ अवधि के दौरान लम्बे समय से कार्य ढूँढ रहे या कार्य के लिए उपलब्ध" होने की सूचना दी है, संकेत प्रवर्ग 81 या 82 और" कार्य के लिए उपलब्ध नहीं" यदि उसने संदर्भ अवधि की संबंधित लम्बी अवधि के दौरान कार्य के लिए उपलब्ध न होने की सूचना दी हो। प्रवर्ग के इन तीनों विस्तृत समूहों में से प्रत्येक समूह में विस्तृत कार्यकलाप स्थिति संबंधी प्रवर्गों का "अधिकांश व्यतीत समय मानदण्ड" का पुनः प्रयोग करके निर्धारित किया है।

9. वर्तमान साप्ताहिक कार्यस्थिति दृष्टिकोण के अनुसार वर्गीकरण :—वर्तमान साप्ताहिक कार्य स्थिति के अनुसार किसी व्यक्ति के वर्गीकरण के लिए उस स्त्री या पुरुष को सर्वेक्षण की तारीख से सात दिन पूर्व की अवधि में एक खास किस्म का कार्य सौंपा जाना आवश्यक है। कोई व्यक्ति जो सप्ताह के दौरान एक से अधिक कार्यकलाप में अपने आप को लगाता है उसके कार्य विशेष का निर्धारण प्राथमिकता एवं अधिकांश समय नियम को अपना कर किया गया है। प्राथमिकता नियम के अधीन "कार्यरत व्यक्ति" की स्थिति "कार्यरत नहीं किन्तु कार्य ढूँढ रहा है। कार्य के लिए उपलब्ध है" ऐसे व्यक्ति से कहीं अच्छी है और आगे यह स्थिति "कार्यरत नहीं और कार्य नहीं ढूँढ रहा है। कार्य के लिए उपलब्ध नहीं है" ऐसे व्यक्ति से अच्छी है। प्रथम अथवा अंतिम प्रवर्ग के अधीन वर्गीकृत व्यक्ति के बारे में उसकी (चाहे वह स्त्री है या पुरुष) विस्तृत कार्यकलाप स्थिति का निर्धारण अधिकांश समय लगाया गया, मापदंड द्वारा किया गया है अर्थात् वह विस्तृत कार्यकलाप जिसमें उसका अधिकांश समय व्यतीत हुआ है, यहीं उसका (उस स्त्री या पुरुष) वर्तमान साप्ताहिक कार्यस्थिति है। इसके अतिरिक्त यदि किसी व्यक्ति से सप्ताह के किसी एक दिन भी कार्य किया है तो ऐसे 'कार्यरत' माना गया है। एक व्यक्ति जिसने सप्ताह के दौरान कोई काम नहीं किया किन्तु कार्य के लिए एक घंटे अथवा एक दिन भी उपलब्ध था उसे "कार्य ढूँढता और अथवा कार्य के लिए उपलब्ध" माना गया है। अन्य व्यक्तियों को "कार्य के लिए उपलब्ध नहीं (अथवा श्रमिक बल में नहीं)" प्रवर्ग में रखा गया है। इस प्रकार प्रत्येक व्यक्ति को सप्ताह के लिए किसी खास कार्यकलाप स्थिति में लगाया गया है। विभिन्न कार्यकलाप स्थिति के अधीन व्यक्तियों के समूह (समाहार) से एक वर्ष की सर्वेक्षण अवधि के एक सप्ताह में औसत रूप से कार्यकलाप के अनुसार व्यक्तियों को विभाजित किया गया है।

10. वर्तमान दैनिक कार्य स्थिति संबंधी दृष्टिकोण के अनुसार वर्गीकरण :—वर्तमान दैनिक कार्यस्थिति संबंधी दृष्टिकोण अपनाने में, संदर्भ सप्ताह के सात दिनों में से प्रत्येक दिन दो महत्वपूर्ण कार्यकलाप करने वाले किसी व्यक्ति के प्रत्येक कार्यकलाप के लिए छूट देने का प्रयास किया गया जिसमें प्रत्येक कार्यकलाप के लिए आधा दिन नियत किया गया है। इस प्रकार इस दृष्टिकोण के अनुसार वर्गीकरण की इकाई आधा दिन मानी गयी है यद्यपि संदर्भ सप्ताह के सभी सात दिनों के लिए आंकड़े संगृहीत किये गये हैं। किसी भी दिन कोई कार्यकलाप स्थिति सौंपते समय किसी व्यक्ति को 'कार्यरत' (नियोजित) पूरे दिन समझा गया है यदि उस पुरुष या स्त्री ने उस 4 घंटे का अधिक काम किया और उसे एक या दो (जैसा भी मामला हो) कार्यकलाप (01—71) सौंपा

गया जिसमें उस व्यक्ति ने अपना समय लगाया। किन्तु, यदि वह कार्य एक घंटा या एक से अधिक घंटे परन्तु चार घंटों से कम किया है तो उन्हें आधे दिन के लिए 'कार्यरत' (या नियोजित) माना गया है और बाकी आधे दिन के लिए 'कार्य ढूँढ रहे/कार्य के लिए उपलब्ध (बेरोजगार)' अथवा 'कार्य के लिए उपलब्ध नहीं है' (अथवा श्रमिक बल में नहीं) इस बात पर निर्भर करता है कि क्या वह उसी दिन कार्य ढूँढ रही/रही है/ कार्य के लिए उपलब्ध है।

दूसरी ओर यदि कोई व्यक्ति उस दिन में एक घंटे के लिए भी किसी लाभदायक कार्य में कार्यरत नहीं है, किन्तु चार या चार से अधिक घंटों के लिए कार्य ढूँढ रहा है या कार्य के लिए उपलब्ध है, उसे पूरे दिन के लिए बेरोजगार माना गया है। किन्तु यदि कार्य के लिए केवल चार घंटों से कम उपलब्ध होने की सूचना दी गयी है तो उसे आधे दिन के लिए 'बेरोजगार' माना गया है और दिन के दूसरे आधे दिन के लिए श्रमिक बल में नहीं माना गया है। यदि कोई व्यक्ति जो न तो किसी लाभकारी कार्य में लगा है और न ही काम के लिए आधे दिन के लिए भी उपलब्ध है, उसे पूरे दिन के लिए 'कार्य के लिए उपलब्ध नहीं' (अथवा श्रमिक बल में नहीं) माना गया है और एक या दो अलाभकारी कार्यकलाप स्थिति के अंतर्गत रखा गया है जिसे वह दिन के दौरान करता/करती है। सप्ताह के सभी सात दिनों के लिए विभिन्न कार्यकलाप प्रवर्गों के अंतर्गत इस प्रकार वर्गीकृत सभी श्रमदिवसों को सात से भाग देकर, एक वर्ष की सर्वेक्षण अवधि के एक दिन का, कार्यकलाप प्रवर्ग के औसत से व्यक्तियों का विभाजन (जिसे दृढ़तापूर्वक श्रम दिवस कहा जा सकता है) दर्शाया गया है।

11. **जांच पड़ताल संबंधी प्रश्न** :—कार्य प्रतिमान के जटिल आयाम (विस्तार) को समझने के लिए 'बेरोजगारों', छात्रों, घरेलू कार्यों में लगे हुए व्यक्तियों के रूप में वर्गीकृत लोगों के लिए सामान्य कार्यस्थिति, अपेक्षित कार्य के प्रकार, कार्य पाने के लिए किये गये प्रयास के अनुसार 'नियोजित' के रूप में वर्गीकृत व्यक्तियों के बीच अतिरिक्त कार्य आदि के लिए प्रतिबद्धित अधिमान्यताओं की प्रकृति तथा अल्प उपयोग की सीमा के बारे में अपेक्षित जानकारी प्राप्त करने के लिए उपर्युक्त प्रवर्ग के व्यक्तियों से कुछ जांच पड़ताल संबंधी प्रश्न किये गये। इन जांच पड़ताल संबंधी प्रश्नों के अतिरिक्त इस दौर में जांच पड़ताल संबंधी प्रश्नावली का एक दूसरा सेट एक मात्र उन व्यक्तियों के लिए तैयार किया गया है जो घरेलू कार्यों में लगे हुए व्यक्तियों के रूप में सामान्य कार्य स्थिति के अनुसार वर्गीकृत किये गये हैं जिसका उद्देश्य इन कारणों के बारे में जानकारी प्राप्त करना है जिससे ये घरेलू नीरस कार्यों से संलग्न हैं भले ही वे कार्य के लिए उपलब्ध हों यदि उस कार्य की व्यवस्था उनके घरों पर की जाती है।

12. **कार्यकलाप प्रवर्ग 93** :—यह ज्ञात है कि घरेलू कार्यों में लगी हुई स्त्रियों विशेष रूप से ग्रामीण स्त्रियों का कुल कार्यकारी समय का एक अंश ऐसे कार्यों में व्यतीत होता है जो पारिवारिक आवश्यकताओं को पूरा करने के लिए अपेक्षित है। इस कार्यकलाप को लाभकारी माना जाता है यदि उनके द्वारा उत्पादित माल या सेवाएं विक्रय के लिए प्रयुक्त होती हैं। सामान्यतः इस बात का अनुभव किया गया है कि व्यक्तियों, अधिकांश रूप से स्त्रियों के पारिवारिक कार्यकलाप में सहभागिता के इस पहलू से संबंधित जानकारी, जिसे सामान्य कार्य स्थिति के अनुसार "घरेलू कार्यों में लगे हुए" के रूप में वर्गीकृत किया गया है उसे राष्ट्रीय प्रतिदर्श सर्वेक्षणों से प्राप्त नहीं किया जा सका है। इसलिए सर्वेक्षण के 32वें दौर में उन व्यक्तियों को जो प्रधानता घरेलू कार्यों में लगे हुए हैं, दो भागों में उपविभाजित करने का प्रयास किया गया है अर्थात् (1) एक मात्र घरेलू कार्यों में लगे हुए स्वतंत्र रूप से मछली पकड़ने और छोटे मोटे शिकार जैसे कार्यकलाप के साथ साथ घरेलू कार्यों में लगे हुए जैसा कि पहले सूचीबद्ध किया गया है। घरेलू कार्यों में लगे हुए व्यक्तियों के बारे में इस नवीन कार्यकलाप प्रवर्ग को अपनाने का उद्देश्य केवल घरेलू कार्य करने वाले व्यक्तियों की तुलना में उन व्यक्तियों को अलग से पहचानना है जो अपने घरेलू कार्यों के साथ साथ उपर्युक्त कार्य भी करते हैं।

प्रस्तुत की गई सारणियों का विवरण :—इस बात का पहले ही उल्लेख किया गया है कि 12 राज्यों के लिए जनसंख्या की पारिवारिक विशेषताओं और कार्यकलाप संबंधी विशेषताओं से संबंधित सूचना की कुछ मूलभूत मदों के अनुमान यहाँ दर्शाये गये हैं। संबंधित परिणाम दस अलग अलग सारणियों में दर्शाये गये हैं। इन सारणियों का एक संक्षिप्त विवरण नीचे दिया जा रहा है।

सारणी (1) :—इस सारणी में, पारिवारिक आकार प्रकार के अनुसार ग्रामीण और शहरी परिवारों का विभाजन और परिवार के प्रति व्यक्ति का मासिक व्यय दर्शाया गया है। ग्रामीण क्षेत्रों में सर्वेक्षण के पारिवारिक को पांच विभिन्न प्रवर्गों के अंतर्गत वर्गीकृत किया गया है। ये प्रवर्ग निम्नलिखित हैं :—

(क) कृषि व्यवसायों में स्वनियोजित परिवार।

(ख) गैर खेतिहर व्यवसाय में स्वनियोजित परिवार।

(ग) कृषि मजदूरों के परिवार।

(घ) गैर खेतिहर मजदूरों के परिवार।

(ङ) अन्य परिवार।

शहरी क्षेत्रों के लिए केवल दो अलग अलग प्रकार के परिवारों पर विचार किया गया है। जो निम्नलिखित हैं।

(क) स्वनियोजित परिवार।

(ख) अन्य परिवार।

सारणी (2) :— परिवार के प्रतिव्यक्ति प्रतिमास व्यय तथा प्रमुख पारिवारिक उद्योग के अनुसार ग्रामीण तथा शहरी परिवारों का विभाजन सारणी (2) में दर्शाया गया है इसमें पारिवारिक उद्योग को एक साधन माना गया है जिससे सर्वेक्षण की तारीख से आरम्भ करके 365 दिनों के दौरान परिवार को प्रमुख आमदनी हुई है। यहां केवल नौ बृहद् औद्योगिक प्रवर्गों पर विचार किया गया है। ये प्रवर्ग हैं : कृषि, खनन तथा उत्खनन, विनिर्माणकारी कार्य, विद्युत, गैस एवं जल, निर्माण कार्य, व्यापार, परिवहन, सेवायें तथा अन्य।

सारणी (3) :—परिवार के प्रति व्यक्ति मासिक व्यय के अनुसार ग्रामीण तथा शहरी परिवारों का विभाजन तथा कुल व्यक्तियों की तुलना में आर्थिक दृष्टि से सक्रियाशील व्यक्तियों का अनुपात सारणी (3) में दर्शाया गया है। रोजगार प्राप्त तथा बेरोजगारों को मिलाकर आर्थिक दृष्टि से क्रियाशील व्यक्तियों की जनसंख्या का अनुमान लगाया गया है।

सारणी (4) :—सारणी 4 में (i) परिवारों की कुल संख्या (ii) कुल व्यक्ति (iii) कुल आर्थिक दृष्टि से क्रियाशील व्यक्ति (iv) परिवार का औसत आकार, और (v) प्रत्येक परिवार के प्रति व्यक्ति मासिक व्यय श्रेणी के प्रति परिवार के आर्थिक दृष्टि से क्रियाशील व्यक्तियों की औसत संख्या के अनुमान दर्शाये गये हैं। 'व्यक्तियों' तथा 'आर्थिक दृष्टि से क्रियाशील व्यक्तियों' के अनुमान स्त्रियों और पुरुषों के लिए अलग अलग दर्शाये गये हैं।

सारणी (5) :—सारणी (5) में आयु समूह के अनुसार पांच वर्ष की आयु वाले और उनसे अधिक आयु समूह के स्त्री और पुरुषों का विभाजन और सामान्य कार्यकलाप स्थिति को दर्शाया गया है। इस सारणी में जनसंख्या को 5-14, 15-29, 30-44, 45-59 और 60 तथा इससे अधिक पांच आयु समूहों में विभाजित करके दर्शाया गया है। सामान्य कार्यकलाप स्थिति प्रवर्गों को केवल सारणी के स्तम्भ (1) और (2) में दर्शाया गया है। यह पहले ही कहा जा चुका है कि किसी व्यक्ति की सामान्य कार्य स्थिति का निर्धारण 'अधिकांश समय' अथवा सर्वेक्षण की तारीख से आरम्भ करके 365 दिनों की संदर्भ अवधि सहित बनाये गये मापदंड 'संबंधित दीर्घकाल' के आधार पर किया गया है। इस बात का भी ध्यान रखा जाए कि इस माप दंड के अनुसार कुछ व्यक्ति जो, 'बेरोजगार' प्रवर्ग में रखे गये थे, अभी भी 365 दिनों की संदर्भावधि के दौरान किसी लाभकारी कार्यकलाप में नियोजित हैं। इस प्रकार का अनुसरण लाभकारी कार्यकलाप की गौण क्षमता पर ध्यान नहीं दिया गया ताकि सारणी (5) में दर्शाये गये विभाजन को स्पष्ट किया जा सके।

सारणी (6) :—इस सारणी में सामान्य कार्यकलाप स्थिति के अनुसार 5 वर्ष और अधिक आयु के स्त्री और पुरुषों का विभाजन दर्शाया गया है जिसमें अधिकांश व्यतीत किये गये समय मापदंड के अनुसार संदर्भावधि के दौरान 'बेरोजगार' के रूप में प्रवर्गीकृत व्यक्तियों की गौण लाभकारी स्थिति पर भी विचार किया जा रहा है। विभाजनों के आयु समूह तथा कार्यकलाप स्थिति के अनुसार दोहरे रूप से वर्गीकृत करके दर्शाया गया है।

सारणी (7) :—सारणी (7) में 5 वर्ष और उससे अधिक उम्र के पुरुषों और स्त्रियों का वर्गीकरण प्रस्तुत किया गया है जिन्हें औद्योगिक वर्गीकरण के दो अंक प्रमुख समूह द्वारा "सामान्य कार्य स्थिति" वर्गीकरण के अनुसार 'कार्यरत' प्रवर्गित किया गया है। ग्रामीण तथा शहरी दोनों क्षेत्रों के लिए अनुमान उसी सारणी में प्रस्तुत किये गये हैं।

सारणी (8) :—(ग्रामीण व शहरी) 5 वर्ष और उससे अधिक आयु वाले स्त्रियों और पुरुषों का विभाजन जिन्हें विशिष्ट समूहों के व्यवसाय के अनुसार सामान्यतः कार्यरत प्रवर्गित किया गया है उन्हें ग्रामीण क्षेत्रों के लिए सारणी-8 ग्रामीण, और शहरी क्षेत्रों के लिए सारणी 8 शहरी में दर्शाया गया है। इस बात पर ध्यान दिया जाए कि यहां पर दर्शाये गये व्यवसाय समूह ग्रामीण और शहरी क्षेत्रों के लिए अलग अलग हैं क्योंकि ग्रामीण क्षेत्रों में व्यवसाय प्रतिमान शहरी क्षेत्रों के व्यवसाय प्रतिमान से भिन्न हैं। 5 वर्ष और उससे अधिक की आयु वाले पुरुषों और स्त्रियों का विभाजन उनके वर्तमान साप्ताहिक कार्यकलाप तथा आयु वर्ग के आयु समूह के अनुसार सारणी 9 में प्रस्तुत किया गया है। दिये गये अनुमान सर्वेक्षण की तारीख से 365 दिनों की संदर्भावधि की तुलना में व्यक्तियों के बारे में औसत साप्ताहिक कार्य स्थिति का प्रतिनिधित्व करते हैं।

सारणी (10) :—इस सारणी में सर्वेक्षण की तारीख से पूर्व 365 दिनों की संदर्भावधि की तुलना में औसत रूप से उक्त व्यक्तियों के लिए कार्यकलाप स्थिति दर्शायी गई है। ये अनुमान विभिन्न आयु समूहों के अनुसार दोहरे रूप से वर्गीकृत सर्वेक्षण की तारीख से पूर्व 365 दिनों की संदर्भावधि की तुलना में औसत दिवस से संबंधित विभिन्न कार्यकलाप में लगे हुए 5 वर्ष और उससे अधिक आयु वाले व्यक्तियों के कार्य दिवसों की संख्या का प्रतिनिधित्व करते हैं। ये अनुमान पुरुषों और महिलाओं के लिए अलग अलग प्रस्तुत किये गये हैं।

इस प्रलेख में दर्शायी गयी जनसंख्या संबंधी अनुमान, 1-1-1978 को प्रक्षेपित जनसंख्या तथा समायोजन घटक
