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Twenty Point Programme – 2006 An Introduction

The Twenty Point Programme (TPP) was launched by the Government of India in 1975 and restructured in 1982 and again in 1986. Over the years, the need for restructuring the Programme has been felt in the light of our achievements and experiences, as well as the introduction of several new policies and programmes by the Government of India. Although the TPP has been in existence for the last 30 years, it is still relevant today as the desired objectives of eradication of poverty and improvement in the quality of life of the common man have yet to be completely attained.

- 2. TPP-86 has now been restructured and is called Twenty Point Programme-2006 (TPP-2006). The programmes and schemes under the TPP-2006 are in harmony with the priorities contained in the National Common Minimum Programme (NCMP), the Millennium Development Goals (MDGs) of the United Nations and SAARC Social Charter. The original nomenclature, namely the Twenty Point Programme, which has been in existence for the past three decades, and carries the stamp of familiarity among the people and administrative agencies, has been retained.
- 3. TPP-2006 has Points for the benefit of both the rural and urban people. Its thrust is towards programmes for eradicating poverty and improving the quality of life of the poor and the under-privileged people all over the country. The programme covers various socio economic aspects like poverty, employment, education, housing, health, agriculture, land reforms, irrigation, drinking water, protection and empowerment of weaker sections, consumer protection, environment, e-Governance, etc.
- 4. TPP-2006 has 20 Points and 66 items. All the 66 items of TPP-2006 (list at *Annexure-IV*) are not amenable to reporting on monthly basis. Also, some of the schemes/programmes are yet to be operationalsed by the Central Nodal Ministries concerned. These items will be monitored only after the schemes concerning them come into existence and their frequency of monitoring will be decided later. Out of the 66 items, 25 items will be monitored on monthly basis. Remaining items will be monitored on annual basis as the information in respect of these items will be made available on annual basis by the concerned Ministries. Out of 25 monthly monitored items, the performance in respect of 21 items shall be provided by the States/UTs and in respect of 4 items by the concerned Nodal Ministries. For the purpose of ranking, the performance of States on monthly basis in respect of 18 tentatively identified items/parameters have been evaluated.
- 5. The three-tier monitoring mechanism in TPP-1986 at District, State and Central level has been widened in TPP-2006 by including Block level monitoring. This will ensure proper and timely implementation of programmes/schemes by effective monitoring. State Governments/UT Administrations have been requested to ensure that the monitoring committees at various levels are put in place, where they do not exist. The comprehensive Guidelines on TPP-2006 have been issued and hoisted on the website (www.mospi.gov.in) of this Ministry.

List of items which have been operationalised subsequently

- (1) Rural Business Hubs in Partnership with Panchayats: Rural Business Hubs as a Centrally Sponsored Scheme has been approved during August-2007. The parameter/indicator to be monitored on annual basis is the "number of MOUs signed under various schemes".
- (2) *Rehabilitation of Scavengers*: The Self Employment Scheme for "Rehabilitation of Manual Scavengers" (SRMS) has become operational w.e.f. 9th January, 2007. The parameter/indicator to be monitored on annual basis is the "number of manual scavenges and their dependents assisted for rehabilitation".
- (3) Rights of Forest dwellers Owners of minor forest produce: The Bill concerning "Rights of Forest Dwellers" Owners of minor forest produce has been passed. The information on indicators/ parameters to be monitored and frequency of monitoring is awaited from Ministry of Tribal Affairs.

Item Merged

Dry Land Farming: Consequent to the decision of Ministry of Finance and Planning Commission on the EFC of "Enhancing Sustainability of Dry Land Farming System" for XI Five Year Plan, Dry Land Farming has been merged with new initiatives of the Department-'Rainfed Area Development Programme". As of now, there is no separate scheme on Dryland Farming.

Progress Report – (April-August, 2007)

This monthly progress report of Twenty Point Programme-2006 consists of two parts: **Part-I** contains an analysis of the overall performance, and **Part-II** deals with itemwise performance.

- 2. The report is compiled on the basis of data received from the Central Nodal Ministries and State Governments/UT Administrations. The data is received either through web enabled software developed by National Informatics Centre (NIC) Cell in this Ministry or through Fax/e-mail/post. The processing of data has been done in association with NIC Cell.
- 3. The analysis for the period April-August, 2007 shows that the performance under *eleven* items has been 'Very Good' (90% or above the targets). These items are:
 - (i) SHGs to whom income generating activities provided
 - (ii) Total Swarozgaries Assisted- SGSY
 - (iii) Seedlings Planted (Public and Forest Lands)
 - (iv) Habitations covered (NC and PC)- ARWSP
 - (v) Anganwadis Functional (Cum.)
 - (vi) ICDS Blocks Operational (Cum.)
 - (vii) Routine Immunisation of Children
 - (viii) Area Covered under Plantation (Public and Forest Lands)
 - (ix) Food Security (Antodaya Anna Yojana)
 - (x) Supply of Electricity
 - (xi) Villages Electrified- RGGVY
- 4. The performance of *one* item has been 'Good' (80% to 90% of target). The item is:
 - (i) Food Security (Targeted Public Distribution System)
- 5. The performance of *six* items has been **'Poor'** (below 80% of target). These items are:
 - (i) Road Constructed-PMGSY
 - (ii) SC Family Assisted
 - (iii) Pumpsets Energised
 - (iv) Houses Constructed IAY
 - (v) Slipped back Habitations with water quality problems covered—ARWSP
 - (vi) Houses constructed EWS/LIG
- 6. Some of items under TPP-2006 like National Rural Employment Guarantee Scheme-NREGS and Sapoorna Gramin Rojgar Yojana (SGRY) being demand driven are being monitored by concerned Ministries without targets. These items shall not be considered for the purpose of ranking. The items where quarterly/ annual targets have been provided by the Ministries concerned, monthly targets have been worked out on prorata basis.

- 7. Targets in respect of items/ parameters- "Total Land Distributed to landless", and "Individual Household latrines constructed in Rural Areas" from Ministry of Rural Development, "Pulse Polio Immunization" and "Delivery in institutions", from Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, "ST Families Assisted" from Ministry of Tribal Affairs, "Urban Poor Families Assisted under Seven Point Charter" from Ministry of Housing and Urban Poverty Alleviation, "Rehabilitation of Handicapped & Orphans" and "Welfare of Aged" from Ministry of Social Justice & Empowerment, and "Rehabilitation of Orphans" from Ministry of Women and Child Development, have not been received so far.
- 8. The Report does not include information from the State of Manipur and Nagaland due to non receipt of data up to the finalisation of the Report for the month of August, 2007.







Routine Immunisation comprising of Tetanus, DPT, Polio, BCG and Measles - Infants Immunised





ICDS Blocks Operational (Cumulative)





Area Covered under Plantation





Length of Road Constructed


