FOREWORD

The CSO has been preparing the IOTTs for the Indian economy every five years following the same methodology, so that comparable information system may develop over the years for studying the input structures and final demand pattern. The methodology followed for construction of the present IOTT conforms, as in the past, to the basic principles enunciated in the System of National Accounts. The detailed matrices presented for 2006-07, are at 130 X 130 sector classification, which are identical to those adopted for IOTT 2003-04. The previous IOTT for the reference year 2003-2004 was published by the Central Statistical Organisation (CSO) in January 2008. Prior to that, IOTTs for the reference years 1968-69, 1973-74, 1978-79, 1983-84,1989-90, 1993-94 and 1998-99 were brought out by the CSO.

The Input-Output Transactions Table (IOTT) of the Indian economy for the year 2006-07, has been prepared as an update of the IOTT 2003-04, using the current data sets for the year 2006-07 and the ratios from IOTT 2003-04. It includes the complete basic two matrices viz. absorption and make matrix.

I would like to place on record my deep appreciation of the dedicated efforts and hard work put in by Shri A.C. Sharma, Director and Smt. Renuka Ravindran, Joint Director in bringing out the updated IOTT for 2006-07.
