## OFFICE MEMORANDUM

Subject: Review of Cadre Structure of Subordinate Statistical Services (SSS)seeking comments thereof.

Subordinate Statistical Service (SSS) was constituted vide Notification dated 12<sup>th</sup> February 2002 by merging Statistical Function posts lying in different Ministries / Departments / Organizations and service was operationalised w.e.f. 1st April 2004. Initially, service structure was as under:

- 2. On the basis of recommendation of 6<sup>th</sup> CPC, Subordinate Statistical Service (SSS) was reconstituted into two Grade Structure w.e.f. 1.1.2006:
  - (i) Statistical Investigator Grade I Grade Pay of Rs. 4600 under PB-2.
  - (ii) Statistical Investigator Grade II Grade Pay of Rs. 4200 under PB-2.
- 3. The sanctioned strength of Subordinate Statistical Service (SSS) after encadrement of some more Statistical function post, as on date, is as under:

- 4. It is proposed to consider the restructuring of Subordinate Statistical Service Cadre having regard to the provisions contained in draft Recruitment Rules which is likely to be approved shortly. As per draft RRs, there is provisions of Direct Recruitment in Statistical Investigator Grade II and the posts of Statistical Investigator Grade I would be filled in 100 % by promotion from the posts of SI Grade II. Further, SI Grade I is feeder Grade for JTS of ISS in PB 3 with Grade Pay of Rs. 5400. There are two grade pay in PB- 2 i.e. 4800 & 5400, which comes between the promotional hierarchies of SSS & ISS. These Grade Pay are being considered under 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> MACP to the SSS (DR) incumbents after rendering 20 & 30 years of service respectively.
- 5. The essential qualification as per old RRs is Bachelor Degree in Statistics / Economics / Mathematics / Commerce (With Statistics as one of the subjects) and the same has been revised in draft RRs as general graduate but the candidates are required to appear in a paper on Statistics in main examination conducted by SSC. After operationalisation of SSS in 2004 the rate of attrition from the service has been found at higher side and at the same time rate of joining of the candidate is very low. The same may be perused from the following table:

Due to low rate of joining and high rate of attrition there is shortage of manpower in SSS. On having deep analysis, it is considered view that lower Grade Pay in SSS in comparison to other Group B services, and lack of promotional avenues are the reasons for not attracting and retaining the talented candidates. Apart from this, service condition in field Establishments like NSSO (FOD), which constitutes 83 % of totals strength of posts, are very difficult and demanding on the incumbents. It is a therefore, imperative that the structure of SSS Service is reviewed for creating better functional mechanism as well as providing promotional opportunities.

- 7. In view of above, it has been decided by Cadre Controlling Authority of SSS to review the cadre structure of service in order to harmonise the functional needs of the organization and career progression of employees so as to mitigate the problem of stagnation. All stakeholders of Subordinate Statistical Service (SSS) including Head of Organisations, Individuals and Statistical Associations of SSS are requested to extend their views, comments for restructuring the service. While extending the views functional requirement, upward mobility of employees and budget neutrality may be kept in mind.
